

WHEREAS, the said project will serve a public purpose in that the Road forms an integral part of the County road system and the improvements to the road are in the best interest of both the County and City;

NOW, THEREFORE, County and City, in consideration of the mutual covenants expressed hereinafter, agree as follows:

1. The parties agree to cooperate in making the necessary improvements to the Road as described herein.
2. County agrees to provide all labor, machinery and material necessary for reconstruction of the Road.
3. County will, to the extent reasonably possible, follow the County's standard specifications for reconstruction of the Road improvements unless otherwise agreed in writing by both parties.
4. County and City will coordinate work schedules in order to provide for minimal disruption to the public and to the operational fiscal affairs of the parties, and will complete the Project no later than one hundred fifty (150) days from the execution of this Agreement.
5. City has authorized County to perform the work herein described pursuant to Tex. Trans. Code §251.012.
6. Each party agrees to conform to its own applicable purchasing laws, regulations, policies, and procedures with respect to the portion of the work under this Agreement performed by each party.
7. Upon final completion of the Project described herein, the parties agree that the County will be released of all duties imposed by this Agreement.
8. **Conflict of Applicable Law:** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed so as to require the commission of any act contrary to law, and whenever there is a conflict between and provisions of their Agreement and any present or future law, ordinance or administrative, executive or judicial regulation, order or decree, or amendment thereof, contrary to which the parties have no legal right to contract, the latter shall prevail, but in such event the affected provisions or provision of the Agreement shall be modified only to the extent necessary to bring them within the legal requirements and only during times such conflict exists.

9. **No Waiver:** No waiver by any party hereto of any breach of any provisions of the Agreement shall be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach of the same or any other provision hereof.
10. **Entire Agreement:** This Agreement contains the entire contract between the parties hereto, and each party acknowledges that neither has made (either directly or through any agent or representative) any representation or agreement in connection with this Agreement not specifically set forth herein. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by agreement, in writing, executed by the City and County, and not otherwise.
11. **TEXAS LAW TO APPLY:** This agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligation of the parties created hereunder are performable in Hidalgo County, Texas. The City hereby consent to personal jurisdiction in Hidalgo County, Texas.
12. **INDEMNIFICATION: TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED UNDER THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, THE CITY AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS AND DEFEND THE COUNTY, ITS AGENTS, EMPLOYEES AND OFFICERS FROM AND AGAINST ANY CLAIM, LOSS, DAMAGE, LIABILITY AND EXPENSE, INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES, INCURRED OR SUFFERED BY IT, BY REASON OF ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS OR CAUSES OF ACTION ASSERTED OR THAT MAY BE ASSERTED, AGAINST ANY OR ALL OF THE ABOVE NAMED PARTIES, WHETHER ALLEGING INTENTIONAL OR NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS, AND WHETHER SEEKING COMPENSATORY OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, AND INVOLVING, ARISING OUT OF, OR IN ANY MANNER RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT.**
13. **Notice.** Except as may be otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, all notices, demands, requests or communication required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall either be (i) personally delivered against a written receipt, or (ii) sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid and addressed to the parties at the addresses set forth below, or at such other addresses as may have been theretofore specified by written notice delivered in accordance herewith:

Each notice, demand, request, or communication, which shall be delivered or mailed in the manner described above, shall be deemed sufficiently given for all purposes at such time as it is personally delivered to the addressee or, if mailed, at such time as it is deposited in the United States mail.

14. **Additional Documents:** The parties hereto covenant and agree that they will execute such other and further instruments and documents as are or may become necessary or convenient to effectuate and carry out the terms of this Agreement.
15. **Successors:** This Agreement shall be binding upon and to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns where permitted by this Agreement.
16. **Assignments:** This Assignment shall not be assignable.
17. **Gender and Number:** All pronouns used in this Agreement shall include the other gender, whether used in the masculine, feminine or neuter gender, and singular shall include the plural whenever and so often as may be appropriate.
18. **Authority to Execute:** The execution and performance of the Agreement by City and County have been duly authorized by all necessary laws, resolutions and corporate action, and this Agreement constitutes the valid and enforceable obligations of City and County in accordance with its terms.
19. **Governmental Purpose:** Each party hereto is entering into this Agreement for the purpose of providing for governmental services or functions and will pay for such services out of current revenues available for the paying party, as herein provided.
20. **Commitment of Current Revenues Only:** In the event that, during any term hereof, the Commissioners Court does not appropriate sufficient funds to meet the obligations of County under this Agreement, County may terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days written notice to City. County agrees, however, to use reasonable efforts to secure funds necessary for the continued performance of this Agreement. The parties intend this provision to be a continuing right to terminate this Agreement at the expiration of each budget period of County. *Agreements for the acquisition, including lease of real or personal property under Tex. Loc. Govt. Code §271.903:* In the event that, during any term

hereof, the Commissioner's Court does not appropriate sufficient funds to meet the obligations of County under this Agreement, County may terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days written notice to City, County agrees, however, to use a best effort attempt to obtain and appropriate funds for payment of the Agreement. The parties intend this provision, if applicable, to be a continuing right to terminate this at the expiration of each budget period of County in accordance with Tex. Loc. Govt. Code §271.903 (Vernon Supp. 1996).

21. **Term:** The effective date of this agreement shall be the date first written above. The term of the Agreement shall be for the time period referenced above.
22. **Termination:** Either Party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice to each other.
23. **Liability Insurance:** Each entity will carry sufficient liability insurance at the statutorily required limits, pursuant to the Texas Tort Claims Act.
24. **Immunities:** It is expressly understood and agreed that, in the execution of this agreement, neither the City nor County waive, nor shall be deemed hereby to waive, any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it against claims arising in the exercising of governmental powers and functions.
25. **Non-Discrimination:** City and County, including subcontractors, assignees and successors in interest, ensures that no person shall on the grounds of race, religion, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability, or any other protected class under law, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination or retaliation in any federally or non-federally funded program or activity when providing any services described herein under this contract/agreement. *See* Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.
26. **Required Contract Provision for Contracts Subject to Federal Award (if applicable):** Pursuant to 2 CFR 200.326, a non-federal entity's contracts must contain the applicable provisions described in appendix II to 2 CFR 200-Contract Provisions for non-Federal Entity Contracts under Federal Awards. Additionally, County contracts under Federal award which are subject to assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) are also required to contain additional contract clauses. The applicable required contract clauses can be found in the revised 2 CFR 200.
27. **Governing Provisions:** Parties shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations. A non-exclusive list of regulations commonly applicable to Federal and State grants and

equipment can be found in the revised 2 CFR 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements.

28. **Legal Construction/Severability:** In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement will for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability will not affect any other provision thereof, and this Agreement will be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
29. **Headings:** The headings and captions contained in this Agreement are solely for convenience reference and shall not be deemed to affect the meaning or interpretation of any provision of any paragraph hereof.
30. **Prior Agreements:** This Agreement supersedes and terminates all previous Interlocal Agreement(s) between the parties hereto concerning the subject matter hereof, except for any Interlocal Agreement dated prior to this Agreement to the extent work is being performed under said Agreement at the time of executing this Agreement. Once ongoing work under any such previous Interlocal Agreement(s) is completed and payment is remitted such previous Interlocal agreement shall terminate at such time.

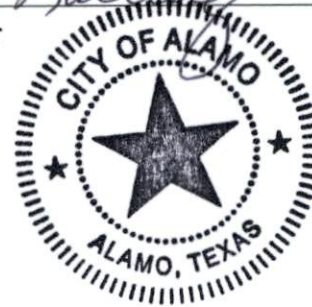
