DOJ Bulletproof Vest Grant Application - Police Division

Purpose and Background

The City of Huber Heights supports the need for additional police related equipment, specifically bulletproof vests for replacement upon expiration and the purchase of new vests for new hires. The U.S Bureau of Justice Assistance provides the allocation of funding in the form of the Bulletproof Vest Partnership program for purchasing new or additional replacements. The Huber Heights Police Division has been a past recipient of Bulletproof Vest Partnership funds which provide for a 50% reimbursement to the City for the purchase of bulletproof vests.

The BPV grant will reimburse 50% of funds spent to purchase replacement vests for sworn employees whose vests have reached expiration. The Police Division expect the replacement of the vests (not including additional covers) to cost approximately \$5,700.

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT GRANT FUNDS FROM THE BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE BULLETPROOF VEST PARTNERSHIP FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING REPLACEMENT PROTECTIVE BODY ARMOR.

WHEREAS, the City of Huber Heights supports the need for additional police related equipment, specifically bulletproof vests; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Bureau of Justice Assistance provides the allocation of funding in the form of the Bulletproof Vest Partnership program for purchasing new or additional bulletproof vests; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Justice Assistance Bulletproof Vest Partnership Act of 2000 requires that funding priority be given to jurisdictions with populations under 100,000; and

WHEREAS, the Huber Heights Police Division has been a past recipient of Bulletproof Vest Partnership funds which provide for a 50 percent reimbursement to the City for the purchase of bulletproof vests.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

Section 1. The City of Huber Heights hereby endorses and supports the submission of an application for the Bulletproof Vest Partnership program and authorizes the necessary actions to implement said grant, if approved by the U.S. Bureau of Justice Assistance.

Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to apply for and, if awarded, enter into an agreement with the U.S. Bureau of Justice Assistance to administer the grant to implement the Bulletproof Vest Partnership program.

Section 3. Reimbursement made to the Police Division under this grant will be re-appropriated to the Police Fund.

Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO INCREASE THE 2022 NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT WITH VENDOR LANDSCAPE STRUCTURES/PENCHURA FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING AND INSTALLING PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT FOR THE CITY OF HUBER HEIGHTS AND WAIVING THE COMPETITIVE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS.

WHEREAS, the playground equipment at Community Park was vandalized and needs replacement and playground equipment is also needed at the Eichelberger Amphitheater in the City of Huber Heights; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter requires that City Council approve all work performed by a single vendor in excess of \$25,000.00 in any given year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

Section 1. The City of Huber Heights is authorized to purchase playground equipment, including installation, from Landscape Structures/Penchura in 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$100,000.00.

Section 2. Consistent with provisions of the City Charter of Huber Heights and the Huber Heights Codified Ordinances, Section 171.12(a)(4), the competitive bidding requirements are hereby waived.

Section 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, City Council under Resolution No. 2022-R-7091 has previously authorized the securing of bids for the 2022 Street Program; and

WHEREAS, construction bids were received on March 4, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to secure inspectional services from outside sources for the 2022 Street Program; and

WHEREAS, Bowser-Morner, Inc. is uniquely qualified to perform these services; and

WHEREAS, this project will be funded by the Street Improvement and Gas Tax Funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for Section A: Street Improvements of the 2022 Street Program with John R. Jurgensen, Company as the lowest and best bidder at a cost not to exceed \$1,210,000.00 on the terms and conditions as substantially set forth in the specifications of the contract.

Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for Section B: Reclamite Surfacing of the 2022 Street Program with Pavement Technology, Inc. as the lowest and best bidder at a cost not to exceed \$26,000.00 on the terms and conditions as substantially set forth in the specifications of the contract.

Section 3. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Bowser-Morner, Inc. for inspectional services for the 2022 Street Improvement Program at a cost not to exceed \$15,000.00.

Section 4.
