

1. Call Meeting To Order/Roll Call

Mayor Jeff Gore convened the Council Work Session at 6:00 P.M.

Anthony Rodgers took Roll Call.

2. **Approval of Minutes**

The following minutes were approved unanimously at the beginning of this meeting:

- June 20, 2023
- June 22, 2023

There were no changes or corrections to these minutes as submitted.

This Council Work Session was recorded by the City and the recording of this meeting will be posted to the City's website and will also be maintained by the City consistent with the City's records retention schedule.

3. Work Session Topics Of Discussion

City Manager Report

Bryan Chodkowski said City Staff met today with representatives of TEC Engineering regarding the traffic study for the Old Troy Pike area. He said the necessary data for the traffic study has been gathered and is ready for modeling. He said City Staff had requested that TEC Engineering provide a comprehensive traffic study report to the City by September, 2023 so that that funding for the road improvements in the Old Troy Pike corridor can be considered as part of the 2024 City Budget process. He said the Ohio Department of Transportation has given approval to the City to reconnect its traffic signal system to the ODOT traffic signal system at I-70 and Old Troy Pike to improve the timing of the traffic signals. He said Veolia Water has reported through June 30, 2023 that the City has had 14 water main breaks which would suggest the City is returning to a more normal water main break rate consistent with water main break rates prior to 2019. He thanked all of the City Staff and volunteers that were involved in the City's Star Spangled Heights events on July 1, 2023. He said City Staff have been in contact with Rozzi Fireworks over the delays and issues with the automated firing system for the fireworks display to see what can be done to ensure the situation is made right by the City. He said he has hired Jeffrey Adams, Jr. to fill the currently vacant Assistant To The City Manager position effective July 17, 2023.

Bryan Chodkowski answered questions from the City Council regarding items in the City Manager Report and other items.

Parks And Recreation Board Update

Vince King, Chair of the Parks and Recreation Board, distributed information regarding an update on the Parks and Recreation Board (see attached). He spoke about parks projects that have been completed and events that have taken place as well as upcoming projects and priorities for the City's parks.

The City Council posed questions to Vince King about the Parks and Recreation Board and expressed appreciation for the work of the Parks and Recreation Board.

Fire Division Staffing Update

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information regarding an update on Fire Division staffing (see attached). He also distributed an updated spreadsheet regarding an update on Fire Division staffing (see attached). He reviewed the updated spreadsheet and he said the spreadsheet will continue to be updated for each Council Work Session.

The City Council posed questions to Bryan Chodkowski about the Fire Division Staffing Update spreadsheet.

After discussion, the City Council agreed that this standing agenda item can be removed from the agendas of future Council Work Sessions.

New Medic Purchase – Fire Division

Battalion Chief John Russell distributed information and proposed legislation to authorize a contract for the purchase of an emergency medical ambulance for the Fire Division (see attached). He said the Fire Division is requesting approval to purchase a new ambulance. He said this vehicle will be placed into front-line status, allowing the remaining fleet to be rotated in such a manner as to spread out the overall mileage and wear-and-tear of the remaining vehicles. He said the oldest ambulance will be sold either through an approved auction site or as a direct sale. He said the Fire Division is requesting approval for the purchase of a new ambulance with a not to exceed amount of \$355,000.00 from Horton Emergency Vehicles. He said Horton Emergency Vehicles has contracted with the State of Ohio STS 233 Ambulance Pricing. He said the purpose of purchasing this medic, one year earlier than the 2021 5-year CIP is due to the delay in obtaining a completed medic unit. Before 2021, he said the medic units were delivered in about 300 days. He said the most recent medic unit purchase was ordered in 2021, and this vehicle will not be placed in service until sometime in August, 2023.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to authorize a contract for the purchase of an emergency medical ambulance for the Fire Division be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Splash Pad – Thomas Cloud Park

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information regarding the splash pad at Thomas Cloud Park (see attached). He said he had no specific comments, and this agenda item was for discussion by the City Council.

The City Council had a discussion about the maintenance, upkeep, water discharge processes, upgrades, and the possible replacement of the splash pad at Thomas Cloud Park.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that this agenda be placed on the agenda for further discussion and an update from City Staff at a Council Work Session in September, 2023.

<u> 2023 Water Main Replacement Project – Award Contract</u>

Russ Bergman distributed information and proposed legislation to authorize a contract for the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project (see attached). He said five bids were received for the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project. To expedite the construction process and complete the replacement of the water main and appurtenances in a timely manner, he said City Staff are recommending that the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project be awarded to two different contractors. Because of the higher cost, he said City Staff are recommending that the reconstruction of Section 7 be deferred to next year when more funding will be available. He said this legislation will authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with M & T Excavating for Sections 2, 3, and Section B - Phase 5 of the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project. He said the Water Fund will be utilized to construct those sections at a cost not to exceed \$2,284,200. He said this legislation will also authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with C. G. Construction and Utilities for Sections 1, 4, 5, and 6 of the 2023 Water Main Replacement

Project. He said the Water Fund will also be used for these sections at a cost not to exceed \$1,929,100.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to authorize a contract for the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting.

<u>Old Troy Pike Widening Project – Award Contract</u>

Russ Bergman distributed information and proposed legislation to award a contract for the Old Troy Pike Widening Project (see attached). He distributed additional handouts regarding the Old Troy Pike Widening Project (see attached). He said this legislation will authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with L. J. Deweese Company as the lowest and best bidder for the Old Troy Pike Widening Project at a cost not to exceed \$2,150,000. He said Old Troy Pike will be widened from the old Huber Road to I-70 to accommodate an additional northbound lane and additional widening on a portion of Merily Way. He said the project includes the installation of asphalt pavement, curb, curb ramps, curb radii, storm sewer, and a mast arms traffic signal at the Merily Way and Old Troy Pike intersection. He said the Capital Improvement Fund will be utilized for the construction of this project.

The City Council expressed concerns about the length of the timeline for completing the Old Troy Pike Widening Project after the contract award.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to award a contract for the Old Troy Pike Widening Project be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Water Infrastructure Update

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information regarding an update on the City's water infrastructure (see attached). He reviewed the spreadsheet and he said the spreadsheet will continue to be updated for each Council Work Session.

The City Council posed questions to Bryan Chodkowski about the Water Infrastructure Update spreadsheet.

Supplemental Appropriations

Jim Bell distributed information and proposed legislation to approve various supplemental appropriations for 2023 (see attached). He reviewed the supplemental appropriations including:

- \$3,000,000 advance from the General Fund to the Transformative Economic Development Fund for improvements at the CR Dayton property on Brandt Pike (to be reimbursed later in 2023 with a note issue).

Bryan Chodkowski distributed additional information regarding the improvements planned for the CR Dayton Property on Brandt Pike (see attached). He reviewed this information with the City Council.

Jim Bell said there was a need to revise the supplemental appropriations legislation to add another item:

- \$895,000 transfer from the Montgomery County TIF Fund to the Capital Improvements Fund for Old Troy Pike Widening Project to include an additional northbound lane.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed and revised legislation to approve various supplemental appropriations for 2023 be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with the waiving of the second reading and adoption of the proposed and revised legislation at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting.

City Code Amendments – Part Eleven – Planning And Zoning Code

Aaron Sorrell distributed information and proposed legislation to amend certain sections of Part Eleven – Planning and Zoning Code of the Huber Heights City Code (see attached). He said this ordinance contains

revisions to Part Eleven - Planning and Zoning Code that were recommended by the Ordinance Review Commission and/or the Planning Commission and City Staff.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to amend certain sections of Part Eleven – Planning and Zoning Code of the Huber Heights City Code be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with the second reading and adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Storage Facilities Moratorium

Nancy Byrge distributed information and proposed legislation to impose a temporary moratorium for one year on new self-storage facilities within the City (see attached). She said the self-storage facilities moratorium in the City would allow City Staff time to research regulations and standards for self-storage facilities in the City and to make recommendations to the City Council.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to impose a temporary moratorium for one year on new self-storage facilities within the City be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Annexation Moratorium

Glenn Otto distributed information regarding an annexation moratorium (see attached). He said he would like to propose a moratorium on all annexations in the City.

The City Council had a lengthy discussion on the proposed annexation moratorium and related matters.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that no further action be taken regarding an annexation moratorium at this time.

<u>City Renewal Levy – Ballot Measure</u>

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information regarding the ballot measure for the renewal of the City's tax levy (see attached). He said the City Council had requested discussion on this agenda item.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the two items of necessary legislation to place the renewal of the City's tax levy on the ballot for the November 7, 2023 general election be prepared and placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as emergency legislation (ordinance) and non-emergency legislation (resolution) with the second reading and adoption of the two items of legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

<u>City Code – Supplement 14 – Adopting Ordinance</u>

Anthony Rodgers distributed information and proposed legislation to adopt Supplement 14 to the City Code (see attached). He said this ordinance is to adopt Supplement 14 to the City Code for the period of January 1, 2023 to March 31, 2023. He said appropriate legal notice of this ordinance has been advertised as required by the Huber Heights City Charter.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend approval of the proposed legislation to adopt Supplement 14 to the City Code and requested that the proposed legislation be placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with the second reading and adoption of the legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Board And Commission Appointments

Anthony Rodgers distributed information regarding an appointment to the Arts and Beautification Commission (see attached). He said it was the recommendation of the City's interview panel to appoint Amanda Henry to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2026. He said a background check was completed on Ms. Henry by Human Resources.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend approval of the appointment of Amanda Henry to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2026 and requested that the motion be placed on the agenda for approval at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Executive Session – For Discussions With An Attorney For The City Concerning Disputes That Are The Subject Of Pending Or Imminent Court Action

Don Webb made a motion to go into Executive Session for discussions with an attorney for the City concerning disputes that are the subject of pending or imminent court action at 7:25 P.M. Anita Kitchen seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Ms. Baker, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, Mr. Otto, Mr. Lyons, Mrs. Kitchen, and Mr. Webb voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passed 7-0. The Council Work Session went into Executive Session at 7:25 P.M.

The Council Work Session adjourned from Executive Session at 7:39 P.M.

Other Business

There was no other business conducted at the Council Work Session.

Mayor Jeff Gore adjourned the Council Work Session at 7:39 P.M.


Bid Results Map Resolution



Supplemental Appropriation Background Information

As you will recall, the City established the Transformational Economic Development (TED) Program on August 28, 2019, by unanimous vote. The TED Program is specifically intended to empower the City Manager to initiate development and redevelopment opportunities at a pace driven by both the will of Council and the development market.

On February 25, 2020, City Council unanimously approved Resolution 2020-R-6853, authorizing the acquisition of the Marian Meadows strip mall on Brandt Pike and assigning same to the TED Program. On September 16, 2020, City Council unanimously approved Resolution 2020-R-6907 authorizing the acquisition of then-Sit, Stay, & Play as well as the CR Dayton strip mall, both located on Brandt Pike; assigning same to the TED Program.

Under the auspices of the TED Program, the architectural firm of LWC was engaged to provide design services for the rehabilitation of the CR Dayton strip mall. Following the completion of their work, LWC bid the project for the City in March of 2022. Although multiple sets of plans were pulled by multiple developers, only two bids were received and both bids were substantially over budget for several reasons; including but not limited to supply-chain issues; tight labor markets; and general economic volatility. In consideration of this situation, all bids were rejected in May 2022.


In July of 2022, staff met with LWC to discuss ways in which the City's object could be met in a more cost-conscious way. Utilizing their professional network, the City's relationships with APEX Real Estate, and significant review and research over several months; the decision was made to approach the project as Design-Build initiative. A design-build project provides that the hired builder construct an improvement that meets the City's expectations in look and layout for a fixed-cost by giving the builder flexibility in materials selection and building techniques.

Having defined a path forward, LWC began communicating with those builders who had initial interest in our project but other builders in the area. With cost and availability being the two biggest factors, Woodard Development was identified as the appropriate contractor for this design-build project. With a total project cost \$3,000,000; Woodard can begin the project within 30-days and complete exterior improvements by December 31, 2023.


Woodard's project scope includes the following:

- Finished exterior conditions to substantially resemble the attached concept drawing;
- New roof:
- New storefront windows and doors;
- New or reconditioned parking surfaces;
- Relocation of Posh Salon from north building to south building;

Contract language has been circulated between the Law Director and Woodard's legal counsel. Mutually agreeable contract language is expected the week of July 10 and pending Council's approval of the proposed supplemental appropriate; the contract will be executed upon consent of the Law Director.

CITY OF HUBER HEIGHTS STATE OF OHIO

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-O-

AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF PART ELEVEN, PLANNING AND ZONING CODE, OF THE CITY CODE OF HUBER HEIGHTS.

WHEREAS, the citizens of Huber Heights require City codified ordinances that are current, up to date, and reflect the current practices and processes of the City; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Ordinance Review Commission process, the Ordinance Review Commission has identified provisions within the Planning and Zoning Code that require updating or other changes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that revisions in Chapters 1103, 1109, 1171, 1121, 1123, 1172, 1175, 1181, 1185, 1199 are necessary to enhance the effective and efficient delivery of municipal services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

Section 1. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1103 – Definitions, Section 1103.39 - Person is hereby deleted and removed in its entirety:

1103.39 - Person.

Person means any natural person, firm, partnership, association or corporation, but this definition does not include governmental units.

(Ord. 83-O-124, Passed 7-11-83)

Section 2. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1103 – Definitions, Section 1103.54(c) - Thoroughfare, Street Or Road is hereby amended to read as follows:

1103.54 Thoroughfare, street or road.

(c) Collector street means a thoroughfare, whether within a residential, industrial, commercial or other type of development, which primarily carries traffic from local streets to arterial streets, including the principal entrance and circulation routes within residential subdivisions.

Section 3. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1109 – Subdivision Design Standards, Section 1109.12 - Special Street Types is hereby amended to read as follows:

1109.12 Special street types.

The following requirements shall apply to special street types:

(a) Permanent dead-end streets shall not be permitted. Temporary-dead end streets shall be permitted only as part of a continuing street plan.

Permanent dead-end streets shall be allowed at the City's corporation lines for streets which were in existence at the time of incorporation. These streets are defined as roadways which would be impacted adversely if a through connection were made. These streets include:

Powell Road (East) Jansin Place Lehar Place Hilgeford Drive Harshmanville Road

- (b) Dedication of new half-streets shall not be permitted. Where a dedicated or platted half-street exists adjacent to the tract being subdivided, the other half shall be platted.
- (c) Where a subdivision abuts or contains an existing or proposed arterial street (82 to 120 [feet] right-of-way widths) the City Planning Commission may require marginal access streets, reverse frontage with screen planting contained in a nonaccess reservation along the rear property line, or other such treatment as may be necessary for adequate protection of residential properties and to afford separation of through and local traffic. There shall be no direct vehicular access from residential lots to such arterial streets or highways.
- (d) Alleys shall not be approved in residential subdivisions, except where justified by extreme conditions. Alleys may be required in commercial and industrial districts if other provisions cannot be made for adequate service access. The minimum widths for alleys shall be 20 feet for the right-of-way and 18 feet for the pavement width.
- (e) Gated streets shall be allowed in order to separate public streets from private streets. These streets include:

Corby Way

(Ord. 2012-O-1939, Passed 2-13-12)

Section 4. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1113 – Flood Hazard Areas, Section 1113.05 - Building Site Improvements is hereby amended to read as follows:

1113.05 Building site improvements.

- (a) No subdivision or part thereof shall be approved if proposed subdivision development in a floodway will, individually or collectively, significantly increase flood flows, heights or damages.
- (b) No subdivision or part thereof shall be approved for floodway or floodway fringe areas which will substantially affect the storage capacity of the flood plain.
- (c) Building sites, residences, motels, resorts and similar uses for human occupation shall not be permitted in floodway areas. Sites for those uses may be permitted outside the floodway if the sites are elevated to a height at least one foot above the elevation of the regional flood or provisions otherwise made for elevating or adapting structures to achieve the same result. Required fill areas shall extend 15 feet beyond the limits of intended structures and, if the subdivision is not to be sewered, shall include areas for waste disposal.
- (d) Building sites for structures other than residences outside of floodway areas shall ordinarily be filled as provided in subsection (c) hereof. However, the City Planning Commission may allow subdivisions of areas for commercial and industrial use at a lower elevation if the subdivider agrees to protect the uses through structural flood-proofing as specified in Section 1113.10.
- (e) When the Commission determines that only part of a proposed p:at can be safely developed, it shall limit development to that part and shall require that the method of development is consistent with its determination.
- (f) When the subdivider does not intend to develop the plat himself, and the Commission determines that limitations are required to ensure safe development, it may require the subdivider to impose appropriate deed restrictions on the land. Such deed restrictions shall be inserted in every deed and noted on the face of the final recorded plat.

(Ord. 83-O-124, Passed 7-11-83)

Section 5. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1117 – Fees, Variances, and Enforcement, Section 1117.99 - Penalty is hereby amended to read as follows:

1117.99 Penalty.

The following penalties shall apply to the violations of these regulations:

- (a) Whoever violates any rule or regulation adopted by Council for the purpose of setting the standards and requiring and securing the construction of improvements within a subdivision or fails to comply with any order pursuant thereto is creating a public nuisance and the creation thereof may be enjoined and maintenance thereof may be abated by action at suit of the County or any citizen thereof. Whoever violates these regulations shall forfeit and pay not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$1,000.00. Such sum may be recovered with costs in a civil action brought in the Court of Common Pleas of Montgomery County.
- (b) A County Recorder who records a plat contrary to the provisions of these regulations shall be held in violation of Ohio R.C. 711.12.
- (e)(b) The owner or agent of the owner of any land within or without a municipal corporation who transfers any lot, parcel or tract of such land from or in accordance with a plat of a subdivision before such plat has been recorded in the office of the County Recorder, shall forfeit and pay the sum of not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each lot, parcel or tract of land so sold. The description of such lot, parcel or tract by metes and bounds in the deed or transfer shall not serve to exempt the seller from the forfeiture provided in this section. If such land is within a municipal corporation, such sum may be recovered in a civil action brought in the Court of Common Pleas of Montgomery County by the City Attorney in the name of the City.
- (d)(c) Any person who disposes of, offers for sale or lease for a time exceeding five years any lot or any part of a lot in a subdivision before provisions of these regulations are complied with shall forfeit and pay the sum of not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each lot or part of a lot so sold, offered for sale or leased, to be recovered with costs in a civil action, in the name of the City Treasurer for the use of the City.

(Ord. 83-O-124, Passed 7-11-83)

Section 6. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1121 – Purpose And Interpretation, Section 1121.07 - When Effective is hereby deleted and removed in its entirety:

1121.07 When effective.

As provided under Ohio R. C. Chapter 713, "Upon certification by the Board of Elections, the Zoning Ordinance shall take immediate effect if the plan is so approved".

Section 7. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1123 – Definitions, Section 1123.951 - Sexually Oriented Businesses is hereby amended to read as follows:

1123.951 Sexually oriented businesses.

Sexually oriented businesses are those businesses defined as follows:

- (a) Adult arcade means an establishment where, for any form of consideration, one or more still or motion picture projectors, slide projectors, or similar machines, or other image producing machines, for viewing by five or fewer persons each, are regularly used to show films, motion pictures, video cassettes, slides, or other photographic reproductions which are characterized by the depiction or description of "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas".
- (b) Adult bookstore, adult novelty store or adult video store means a commercial establishment which has as a significant or substantial (i.e., 50 percent or more) portion

of its stock-in trade or derives a significant or substantial (i.e., 50 percent or more) portion of its revenues or substantial (i.e., 50 percent or more) portion of its interior business or advertising to the sale or rental for any form of consideration, of any one or more of the following:

- (1) Books, magazines, periodicals or other printed matter, or photographs, films, motion pictures, video cassettes, slides, or other visual representations which are characterized by the depiction or description of "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas";
- (2) Instruments, devices, or paraphernalia which is designed for use or marketed primarily for stimulation of human genital organs or for sadomasochistic use or abuse of themselves or others.

An establishment may have other principal business purposes that do not involve the offering for sale, rental, or viewing of materials depicting or describing "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas", and still be categorized as an adult bookstore, adult novelty store, or adult video store. Such other business purposes will not serve to exempt such establishments from being categorized as an adult bookstore, adult novelty store or adult video store so long as one of its principal business purposes is offering for sale or rental, for some form of consideration, the specified materials which depict or describe "specified anatomical areas" or "specified sexual activities".

- (c) Adult cabaret means a nightclub, bar, restaurant, private club, juice bar or similar commercial establishment, whether or not alcoholic beverages are served, which regularly features:
- (1) Persons who appear nude or in a state of nudity or semi-nude state;
- (2) Live performances which are characterized by the exposure of "specified anatomical areas" or by "specified sexual activities";
- (3) Films, motion pictures, video cassettes, slides, or other photographic reproductions which are characterized by the depiction or description of "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas"; or
- (4) Physical contact (whether simulated or actual) of live males or females which is characterized by salacious conduct appealing to prurient interest for the observation by patrons provided that one or more of the parties appears in a state of nudity or semi-nude state. "Prurient" shall have that meaning given to it by the United States Supreme Court in Brocket vs. Spokane, 472 U.S. 491 (1985). "Private club" shall mean an establishment where patrons may bring in their own bottle or other container of alcohol (including beer, wine or liquor) and purchase a mixture for the same or use of a glass from the club or business.
- (d) Adult motel means a motel, hotel or similar commercial establishment which:
- (1) Offers public accommodations, for any form of consideration, which provides patrons with closed-circuit television transmissions, films, motion pictures, video cassettes, slides or other photographic reproductions which are characterized by the depiction or description of "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas" and which advertises the availability of this sexually oriented type of material by means of a sign visible from the public right-of-way, or by means of any off-premises advertising including but not limited to, newspapers, magazines, pamphlets or leaflets, radio or television; or
- (2) Offers a sleeping room for rent for a period of time less than ten hours; or
- (3) Allows a tenant or occupant to sub-rent the sleeping room for a time period of less than ten hours.

- (e) Adult motion picture theater means a commercial establishment where films, motion pictures, video cassettes, slides or similar photographic reproductions which are characterized by the depiction or description of "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas" are regularly shown for any form of consideration.
- (f) Adult theater means a theater, concert hall, auditorium, or similar commercial establishment which, for any form of consideration, regularly features persons who appear in a state of nudity or live performances that are characterized by exposure of "specified anatomical areas" or by "specified sexual activities", and which is not customarily open to the general public during such features because it excludes minors by reason of age.
- (g) Escort agency means a person or business association who furnishes, offers to furnish, or advertises to furnish escorts as one of its primary business purposes for a fee, tip, or other consideration. "Escort" means a person who, for any form of consideration, agrees or offers to act as a companion, guide, or date for another person, or who agrees or offers to privately model lingerie or to privately perform a striptease for another person or to private appear in the nude or in a semi-nude state for another person.
- (h) Massage parlor means any place where, for any form of consideration or gratuity, massage, alcohol rub, administration of fomentations, electric or magnetic treatments, or any other treatment of manipulation of the human body which occurs as a part of or in connection with "specified sexual activities" or where any person providing such treatment, manipulation or service related thereto, exposes his or her "specified anatomical areas". The definition of "sexually oriented businesses" shall not include the practice of massage in any licensed hospital, nor by a licensed hospital, nor by a licensed physician, surgeon, chiropractor or osteopath, nor by any nurse or technician working under the supervision of a licensed physician, surgeon, chiropractor or osteopath, nor by trainers for any amateur, semiprofessional or professional athlete or athletic team or school athletic program, nor barber shops or beauty salons in which massages are administered only to the scalp, the face, the neck or the shoulder, nor by any other individual licensed by the State of Ohio to perform massages.
- (i) Nude model studio means any place where a person, who regularly appears in a state of nudity or displays "specified anatomical areas" for any form of consideration is observed, sketched, drawn, painted, sculptured, photographed, or similarly depicted by other persons.
- (j) Sexual encounter establishment means a business or commercial establishment, that as one of its primary business purposes, offers for any form of consideration:
- (1) A place where two or more persons may congregate, associate, or consort for the purpose of "specified sexual activities" or the exposure of "specified anatomical areas"; or
- (2) Activities between male and female persons and/or persons of the same sex when one or more of the persons is in a state of nudity or semi-nudity nude.

The definition of "sexually oriented businesses" shall not include an establishment where a medical practitioner, psychologist, psychiatrist, or similar professional person licensed by the State engages in medically approved and recognized sexual therapy. Any of the foregoing shall be deemed a "sexually oriented business".

(Ord. 2000-O-1159, Passed 1-10-00)

Section 8. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1172 – (PR) Planned Residential District, Section 1172.01 - Principal Permitted Uses is hereby amended to read as follows:

1172.01 Principal permitted uses.

The following principal uses are permitted, provided that they are approved as provided for in this chapter:

- (a) All residential uses permitted in all other chapters of the Zoning Ordinance such as: one family dwellings, two family dwellings, multiple family dwellings, including garden apartments, row houses, quadraminiums and condominiums;
- (b) Churches and other places of worship:
- (c) Colleges, primary and secondary schools under School Board or Parochial supervision, and public libraries;
- (d) Public recreation buildings, parks, playgrounds and athletic fields under School Board, Parochial, other governmental supervision or "homeowners association" supervision; and
- (e) Uses designed solely to serve in a complimentary complementary way the needs of this District above.
- Section 9. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1175 (PMH) Planned Mobile Home Residential District, Section 1175.02 Permitted Uses is hereby amended to read as follows:

1175.02 Permitted uses.

The following principal principle uses are permitted:

- (a) Mobile home parks.
- (1) Mobile homes (not self-propelled vehicles).
- (b) Modular or sectional homes.

(Ord. 89-O-339, Passed 2-6-89)

Section 10. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1181 – General Provisions, Section 1181.12 - Outdoor Retail Sales And Displays is hereby amended to read as follows:

1181.12 Outdoor retail sales and displays.

- (a) For the purpose of this chapter the term "outdoor sales" includes any outdoor display of merchandise. No sale may be conducted outside an enclosed building in any zoning district except retail sales in the B-1, B-2, B-3 and PC Planned Commercial Districts and A Districts, except temporary sales (garage sales, etc.) permitted under Section 1181.15, and except retail sales in an I-1 District. Within a PC Planned Commercial District, the operation of outdoor sales shall not require Planning Commission approval, but nothing in this section would permit the outdoor sales in a Planned Commercial District where such sales are expressly prohibited by a given site's basic or detailed development plan.
- (b) All such outdoor retail sales shall comply with the following conditions, requirements and time restrictions (excluding temporary sales permitted and regulated under Section 1181.15).
- Application for a Zoning Certificate shall be filed with an accompanying fee not less than ten days prior to the requested sale.
- (2) Only the following specific types of outdoor retail sales may be permitted and only for the time periods described below:

- A. Farm produce and firewood may be sold seasonally as an accessory use to an agricultural use, but only to the extent they are grown on property owned or leased by the owner of the Agricultural District land where the sales occur. Such sales of firewood shall be limited to October 1 to February 1. Sales of produce shall be limited to May 1 to October 31.
- B. Garden and landscaping vegetation and materials, including but not limited to, peat moss, bark, mulch, fertilizer, marble chips, soil, sod, power lawn equipment, outdoor cooking equipment and accessories may be sold on a seasonal basis from April 1 to September 30 in B-1, B-2, B-3, PC and I-1 Districts. Power snow removal equipment may be sold on a seasonal basis from September 1 to February 28 in those same zoning districts.
- C. Christmas trees, tree stands and greenery may be sold on a temporary basis between Thanksgiving and Christmas in the B-1, B-2, B-3 and PC Planned Commercial Districts and in the I-1 District.
- D. Promotional sales of merchandise normally offered for sale by a City business may be conducted on the permanent building location of that business for a period not exceeding three days with a frequency of no more than two in any calendar year. Such promotional sales may occur only in the B-1, B-2, B-3 and PC Planned Commercial Districts and in the I-1 District.
- E. Outdoor sales of merchandise normally offered for sale (within proper zoning districts) by a City business engaged in the sale of farm implements, automobiles, trailers or boats, or in the lumber yard, greenhouse/nursery or monument business.
- (3) All cleanup of this area, including removal of merchandise, fixtures, etc., shall be completed within 48 hours after the sales activity and by the date specified on the zoning certificate otherwise no additional certificates shall be issued for 12 months after the date of the violation notice.
- (4) Sales area shall allow for adequate pedestrian walkways and shall not extend into any fire lanes. The placement of the sales area shall not encroach upon any parking requirements of the district.
- (5) The height of any stackable outdoor sales product(s) shall not exceed five feet. Examples include bagged mulch, soil, salt, or similar products.
- (6) The outdoor sales area shall be placed so as not to interfere with traffic circulation.
- (7) The outdoor sales area shall not utilize eonsume any of the required parking spaces for the business(s) for which it is located.
- (8) Outdoor sales areas shall be in good order and well maintained.

(Ord. 2012-O-1939, Passed 2-13-12; Ord. 2016-O-2217, Passed 5-9-16)

Section 11. Part Eleven, Planning and Zoning, Chapter 1199 – Flood Damage Prevention, Section 1199.07 - Basis for Establishing The Areas Of Special Flood Hazard is hereby amended to read as follows:

1199.07 Basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard.

- (a) Flood Insurance Study Montgomery County, Ohio and Incorporated Areas and Flood Insurance Rate Map Montgomery County, Ohio and Incorporated Areas both effective January 6, 2005.
- (b) Flood Insurance Study Greene County, Ohio and Incorporated Areas and Flood Insurance Rate Map Greene County, Ohio and Incorporated Areas both effective March 17, 2011.

- (e)(b) Flood Insurance Study Miami County, Ohio and Incorporated Areas and Flood Insurance Rate Map Miami County, Ohio and Incorporated Areas both effective August 2, 2011.
- (d)(c) Other studies and/or maps, which may be relied upon for establishment of the flood protection elevation, delineation of the 100-year floodplain, floodways or delineation of other areas of special flood hazard.
- (e)(d) Any hydrologic and hydraulic engineering analysis authored by a registered Professional Engineer in the State of Ohio which has been approved by the City of Huber Heights as required by Section 1199.20(f), Subdivisions and Large Developments. Any revisions to the aforementioned maps and/or studies are hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of these regulations. Such maps and/or studies are on file at the City at 6131 Taylorsville Road, Huber Heights, Ohio 45424.
- Section 12. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 13. This Ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage as provided by law and the Charter of the City of Huber Heights.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-O-

IMPOSING A MORATORIUM FOR A PERIOD OF THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE DAYS (ONE YEAR) ON THE ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS AND THE GRANTING OF ZONING PERMITS FOR NEW SELF-STORAGE FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY OF HUBER HEIGHTS, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio desires to have City Staff conduct a comprehensive evaluation regarding appropriate land use regulations related to Self-Storage Facilities and provide a report regarding any amendments to be recommended to the Huber Heights Planning Commission and the Huber Heights City Council; and

WHEREAS, a "Self-Storage Facility" shall be defined as a structure or building containing separate, individual and private storage spaces of varying sizes that are leased or rented on individual leases for varying periods of time and whose tenants have access to such spaces to store personal property; and

WHEREAS, this moratorium shall not apply to businesses engaged in the storage of goods, merchandise, and materials, not including self-storage facilities; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive report and evaluation will require time for City Staff to compile, including the research of the ordinances and regulations of Ohio communities; consultation with those communities and other subject matter experts; and consultation and review of the Law Director; and

WHEREAS, a moratorium on the acceptance of such applications and the granting of permits for new Self-Storage Facilities within the City of Huber Heights will allow the City time to accomplish these goals.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

- Section 1: The City Council seeks a moratorium on the acceptance of applications and issuances of permits for new Self-Storage Facilities within the City of Huber Heights, Ohio to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio.
- Section 2: The City Council seeks to limit the duration of the moratorium and to request the commencement of the immediate evaluation and report of said comprehensive review discussed herein within the one-year period of the moratorium.
- Section 3: The City Council hereby imposes a moratorium on the issuance of permits for new Self-Storage Facilities within the City of Huber Heights, Ohio with said moratorium to be for a period of three hundred sixty-five days (one year), except for those complete applications to the City of Huber Heights, Ohio prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.
- Section 4: The City Council further finds that a moratorium for one year is reasonable and will allow for a comprehensive evaluation and report from City Staff.
- Section 5. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 6. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that the moratorium needs to be instituted at the earliest possible date; therefore, this Ordinance shall take full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by Council.

IMPOSING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM FOR A PERIOD OF THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE DAYS (ONE YEAR) ON THE ACCEPTANCE, CONSIDERATION AND/OR GRANTING OF ANY APPLICATIONS FOR ZONING AND THE ISSUANCE OF ZONING , OCCUPANCY OR OTHER PERMITS FOR NEW SELF-STORAGE FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY OF HUBER HEIGHTS, OHIO.

WHEREAS, City Council desires to protect the health, welfare and safety of all citizens in the City of Huber Heights; and over a period of months has been addressing issues and questions related to Self-Storage Facilities within the City; and

WHEREAS, City Council and City Staff are concerned with the apparent proliferation of Self Storage Facilities throughout the City and the impact of such facilities in the City; and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to have City Staff conduct a comprehensive review and evaluation regarding appropriate land use regulations related to Self-Storage Facilities and provide a report regarding such review, including any recommended text amendments and/or zoning map amendments to be considered by the City's Planning Commission and City Council; and

WHEREAS, a "Self-Storage Facility" shall be defined as set forth in Section 1123.9301 of the City's Codified Ordinances and this temporary moratorium shall not apply to businesses engaged in the storage of goods, merchandise, and materials, not including Self-Storage Facilities; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive report and evaluation will require time for City Staff to compile and analyze various data and information, including research of the ordinances and regulations of Ohio communities; consultation with those communities and other subject matter experts; and consultation with and review by the Law Director; and

WHEREAS, City Council believes a temporary moratorium on the acceptance, consideration and/or granting any applications for zoning and the granting or issuance of any zoning permits for new Self-Storage Facilities within the City will allow City Council time to accomplish these goals, including any negative impact related to the proliferation of Self Storage Facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

- Section 1: A temporary moratorium on the acceptance, consideration and/or granting any of applications for zoning and the granting or issuance of any zoning permits for new Self-Storage Facilities within the City of Huber Heights, Ohio to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio is hereby enacted.
- Section 2: The duration of the temporary moratorium shall commence with the passage of this Resolution and shall end, unless otherwise extended or reduced by City Council, three hundred and sixty-five (365) days after such date of passage.
- Section 3: For purposes of this temporary moratorium Self-Storage Facility shall be defined as set forth in Section 1123.9301 of the City's Codified Ordinances.
- Section 4. This temporary moratorium shall not apply to Self-Storage Facilities for which site plan approvals, or permits have been issued by, or are pending with, the City, or for submitted applications for a Self-Storage Facility filed with the City prior to the enactment date of this legislation nor shall it apply to businesses engaged in the storage of goods, merchandise, and materials, not included within the definition of Self-Storage Facilities.
- Section 5: The City Council finds that a temporary moratorium for three hundred and sixty-five (365) days is reasonable and will allow for a comprehensive evaluation and report from City Staff.

Section 6. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 7. This Resolution shall go into effect upon its passage as provided by law and the Charter of the City of Huber Heights.

ANNEXATION AGREEMENT

BY AND BETWEEN

BETHEL TOWNSHIP (MIAMI COUNTY), OHIO

AND

THE CITY OF HUBER HEIGHTS, OHIO

Dated as of

June ____, 2023

ANNEXATION AGREEMENT

This Annexation Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into on or as of the _____ day of June, 2023 (the "Effective Date" herein) by and between the Board of Trustees of Bethel Township, the legislative authority of and for Bethel Township, a political subdivision duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Ohio ("Township" or "Bethel" herein), and the Council of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio, the legislative authority of and for the City of Huber Heights, Ohio, a municipal corporation duly organized and validly existing under its Charter and the Constitution and the laws of the State of Ohio ("City" or "Huber Heights" herein, collectively with the Township, the "Parties" and each a "Party" hereto).

WHEREAS, the Township and City are political subdivisions located adjacent and contiguous to each other and having, to a certain extent, overlapping jurisdictions within certain areas of Miami County, Ohio ("County" herein); and

WHEREAS, certain landowners have filed an annexation petition pursuant to the provisions of Section 709.023, which has subsequently been approved by the Miami County Board of County Commissioners and the City has expressed a desire to pursue and accept the annexation of the property consisting of 260.369+/- acres identified as Miami County Auditor tax parcel numbers A01-012300, A01-044400, A01-2200, A01-5000, A01-6400 (collectively the Current Annexation); and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree there is an additional acreage located next to the current property seeking to annex that may be annexed by the City in the future pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Parties believe that annexation of a certain parcels of real property, which include the Current Annexation parcels, located within Bethel Township, which parcels are listed and described in Attachment A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, will benefit the City in future development (collectively, the "Annexation Parcels"); and

WHEREAS, the Annexation Parcels are further depicted and shown on the map labeled "Annexation Parcel Map" attached hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment B, provided that in the event there is any discrepancy between Attachments A and B, the specific tax parcels reference contain in Attachment A shall prevail; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have further agreed that upon the annexation of the Annexation Parcels in the Annexation Parcel Map, that the City will conform the boundaries of such parcels pursuant to Chapter 503 of the Ohio Revised Code and the Township will waive any required statutory reparations due and owing to the Township; and

WHEREAS, the City has further agreed to an annexation prohibition during the term of this Agreement of all parcels located outside of the Annexation Parcels and Annexation Parcel Map that are located in the unincorporated area of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the City and Township are willing to entertain requests for economic development assistance in connection with infrastructure improvements and extensions of utility services affecting parcels in the Annexation Parcels and Annexation Parcel Map and potential future commercial, industrial and retail uses located in the unincorporated areas of the Township upon terms mutually satisfactory to both Parties; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is authorized under the provisions of Section 709.192 of the Ohio Revised Code and other applicable laws of the state of Ohio, and has been approved by the respective legislative authority of both Parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration for the mutual promises contained herein, the Parties covenant and agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

ANNEXATION OF ANNEXATION PARCEL AND LIMITATIONS

Section 1.1. Designation of Agreement Territory and Annexation Parcels. This Agreement shall cover and be applicable to all of the area within the unincorporated area of the Township (the "Agreement Territory"). This Agreement shall also apply to the annexation of the Annexation Parcels enumerated on Attachment A. The perimeter boundary of the Annexation Parcels contained in the Annexation Parcels Map is graphically set forth on Attachment B for purposes of reference only.

Section 1.2. Annexation of Annexation Parcels. The Township agrees and consents to the annexation of the Annexation Parcels to the City in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.

- A. <u>Current Annexation Petition</u>: Landowners have filed an annexation petition pursuant to Section 709.023 of the Ohio Revised Code for the Current Annexation. The Current Annexation was approved by the Miami County Board of County Commissioners. Said parcels are listed as Annexation Parcels and within the Annexation Parcels Map. In the event the parcels contained in the Current Annexation are subdivided, this Agreement shall apply to any new tax parcels created provided that such parcels are not located outside of the geographical area depicted in the Annexation Parcels Map. The Township agrees to support the Current Annexation based upon the City agreeing to an annexation moratorium as set forth in this Agreement. In addition, Township officials and representatives shall refrain from attending City Council meetings and/or otherwise opposing the Current Annexation petition for a period of six (6) months commencing upon the Effective Date of this Agreement.
 - B. <u>Future Procedure</u>: The petitioners for future annexations of any parcel listed in the Annexation Parcels to the City shall file the annexation pursuant to and shall comply with the provisions of "Expedited Procedure No. 1" as contained in Sections 709.021 and 709.022 of the Ohio Revised Code. The Township hereby

specifically consents to and does not oppose the annexation of any such property, provided such annexation complies with the terms of this Agreement. From and after the Effective Date of this Agreement, annexations of Annexation Parcels from the Township to the City shall only be accepted by the City if the annexation petition is filed pursuant to, complies with and is processed and approved under the provisions contained in Sections 709.021 and 709.022 of the Ohio Revised Code, collectively referred to as "Expedited Procedure No. 1," as such provisions exist on the Effective Date of this Agreement. It is the intention and agreement of the Parties to require that any petition seeking to annex property from the Township to the City be filed pursuant to, comply with and be processed and approved under the provisions of "Expedited Procedure No. 1," and to prohibit the City from accepting an annexation petition which fails to comply with this requirement or that is not an Annexation Parcel or outside of the Annexation Parcel Map. If the provisions of Expedited Procedure No. 1 are subsequently repealed or are modified in such a way as to adversely impact the purpose and intent of this Agreement, the Parties shall, upon the written request of a Party, meet within thirty (30) days after receipt of such request and revise the affected portion(s) of this Agreement in such a manner so as to accomplish the purpose and intent of this Agreement, with time being of the essence. Until the affected portion(s) of the Agreement is so revised, the City shall refrain from accepting any annexation petition.

If any annexation petition is filed and processed seeking to annex to the City any real estate property within the Township which does not comply with the terms of this Agreement, the City shall refrain from any act which would, directly or indirectly, contribute to the success of such petition. This obligation shall include, without limitation, refusing to furnish any City services to the area proposed to be annexed; signing and providing affidavits and furnishing representatives to provide factual testimony in any proceeding in order to oppose the annexation; vigorously resisting, in both administrative and judicial forums, and with the assistance of the City's legal counsel, any action seeking such an annexation; refusing to accept any such annexation; and otherwise undertaking such actions as may be reasonably requested by Bethel.

C. Effect of Annexation: The City shall conform the boundaries of all Annexation Parcels, including the Current Annexation, which have previously been or may be annexed to the City from the Township which have not yet been conformed under and pursuant to Section 503.07 of the Ohio Revised Code in order to exclude the Township from such area(s). The City shall conform the boundaries of the Annexation Parcels within six (6) months following the City's acceptance of an annexation petition. Upon the exclusion of the Township from any such area, the City shall not be required to make any compensation payments to Bethel as set forth in Section 709.19 of the Ohio Revised Code, as said Section exists on the Effective Date of this Agreement.

- D. Township Tax Increment Financing District. The Township passed legislation Bethel Township Resolution Numbers 21-12-095 and 21-10-076 pursuant to Section 5709.73(B) of the Ohio Revised Code creating a tax increment financing over a portion of the area covering the Annexation Parcels. The Township Board of Trustees shall within six (6) months following the City's acceptance of the Current Annexation, pass the appropriate legislation rescinding Bethel Township Resolution Numbers 21-12-095 and 21-10-076 thereby removing the Annexation Parcels from the tax increment financing district. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent the Township from passing legislation implementing tax increment financing in the Agreement Territory outside of the Annexation Parcels.
- E. <u>Cooperative Efforts</u>: Utilities for the Annexation Parcels are within the existing Facility Planning Area provided by Miami County and Clark County utility systems. The Township will not oppose the extension of such utilities to the Annexation Parcels.

ARTICLE 2

ANNEXATION PROHIBITION

Section 2.1. Annexation Limitation. No property located within the Agreement Territory, except those identified as Annexation Parcels, shall be annexed to or accepted for annexation by the City under any of the annexation procedures provided for in Chapter 709 of the Revised Code (or any similar statutes of like tenor or effect) during the term or any renewal of this Agreement unless such annexation has been approved, in writing, by the Board of Trustees of the Township. For so long as this Agreement is in effect, the City shall not (i) accept any such annexation petitions for any property located within the Agreement Territory, (ii) process or assist in the processing of an annexation petition seeking to annex any property located in the Agreement Territory to the City, or (iii) assist property owners to annex their property located in the Agreement Territory to the City.

Section 2.2. Collaborative Efforts. The Township is willing to entertain requests for economic development assistance without annexation in connection with infrastructure improvements and extensions of utility services affecting parcels in the Agreement Territory that are outside of the Annexation Parcels contained in this Agreement for potential future commercial, industrial and retail uses located in the unincorporated areas of the Township upon terms mutually satisfactory to both Parties.

ARTICLE 3

TERM OF AGREEMENT

Section 3.1. Term and Renewal. The initial term of this Agreement (the "Initial Term") shall be for a period of fifty (50) years, commencing on the Effective Date and shall, upon timely prior written notice, terminate at midnight, _______, 207_. Unless all legislative authorities of the Parties affirmatively act to terminate this Agreement within one (1) year prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or any subsequent twenty-five (25) year term provided for in this Section, this Agreement shall automatically be renewed for an additional period of twenty-five (25) years, and this Agreement shall continue to be automatically renewed thereafter for similar twenty-five (25) year periods at the end of each renewal period with no limit upon the number of such renewals. The provision herein for automatic extension of this Agreement recognizes that the accrual of benefits to the Parties from this Agreement may take decades. The "Term" of this Agreement shall include the Initial Term and any extensions thereof pursuant to this Section.

ARTICLE 4

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Section 4.1. Support of Agreement. In the event that this Agreement, or any of its terms, conditions or provisions, is challenged by any third party or parties in a court of law, the Parties agree to cooperate with one another and to use their best efforts in defending this Agreement with the object of upholding this Agreement. Each Party shall bear its own costs in any such proceeding challenging this Agreement or any terms or provisions thereof.
- Section 4.2. Signing Other Documents. The Parties agree to cooperate with one another and to use their best efforts in the implementation of this Agreement and to sign or cause to be signed, in a timely fashion, all other necessary instruments, legislation, petitions and similar documents, and to take such other actions as either Party may reasonably request in order to effectuate the purposes of this Agreement.
- Section 4.3. Mediation. In the event the Parties have a dispute as to any of the terms of applicability of this Agreement, the Parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve the dispute through a mutually acceptable mediation process prior to any party filing a lawsuit. Each Party participating in mediation shall pay its own costs of mediation, including its proportionate share of the compensation and administrative expenses required by the mediator and by the mediation services provider selected by the Parties. If a mediator has not been selected by the Parties within sixty (60) days after one of the Parties has requested that a dispute arising under this Agreement be mediated, or if the dispute has not been resolved within ninety (90) days after notice of the dispute has been provided to the other Party, then any of the Parties may commence a lawsuit or commence such other method of pursing such remedies as may be available to any of the Parties.
- Section 4.4. Default. A failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement shall constitute a default hereunder. The Party in default shall have ninety (90) days, after receiving

written notice from the other Party of the event of default, to cure that default. If the default is not cured within that time period, the non-defaulting Party may sue the defaulting Party for specific performance under this Agreement or for damages or both; or may pursue such other remedies as may be available. In any litigation between the Township and the City, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to recover from the losing Party all reasonable costs and expenses of suit, including reasonable attorney fees.

- Section 4.5. Character of Payments. Nothing in this Agreement is to be interpreted as the sharing of the proceeds of any tax levy by and between any Parties. Any language within this Agreement which employs an amount of any tax to be collected as part of a calculation for determining a sum to be paid by one Party to the other Party is intended, and therefore to be interpreted, as a reasonable, practical and convenient mechanism which the Parties have agreed to use to compute, in a less controversial manner, the payments to be made by one Party to another for services and other items of value to be received by the paying Party. No payments to be made under this Agreement are intended to be a sharing of proceeds of any tax levy proscribed by Section 709.192(D) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- <u>Section 4.6.</u> <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be amended only by a writing approved by the legislative authorities of all of the Parties by means of appropriate legislation authorizing such amendment. Any amendment, in order to be effective, must be authorized by appropriate legislation passed by each of the Parties.
- <u>Section 4.7.</u> <u>Immunities Preserved.</u> By entering into this Agreement, none of the Parties intend to relinquish or waive any of the immunities they now have or may hereafter be accorded under state and/or federal laws, including, without the limitation of any such immunities, all those immunities accorded to governmental entities and their officers and employees under O.R.C. Chapter 2744.
- Section 4.8. No Personal Liability. All covenants, obligations and agreements of the Parties contained in this Agreement shall be effective to the extent authorized and permitted by applicable law. No such covenant, obligation or agreement shall be deemed to be a covenant, obligation or agreement of any present or future member, officer, agent or employee of any Party in other than their official capacity, and no official or member of a legislative authority executing this Agreement on behalf of any Party or any present or future member, officer, agent or employee of any Party shall be liable personally by reason of the covenants, obligations or agreements of the Parties contained in this Agreement.
- Section 4.9. Powers Preserved. This Agreement is not intended to be in derogation of the powers granted to municipal corporations by Article XVIII, Ohio Constitution, or any other provisions of the Ohio Constitution or of the Ohio Revised Code; nor is it intended to be in derogation of the powers granted to township under any provisions of the Ohio Constitution or of the Ohio Revised Code. The Parties hereby acknowledge their belief as to the lawfulness of this Agreement and agree not to challenge or contest it, or any provisions contained herein.
- <u>Section 5.10</u>. <u>Beneficiaries</u>. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the Parties and their respective successors. This Agreement shall not inure to the

benefit of anyone other than as provided in the immediately preceding sentence. Except for the Parties, this Agreement is not intended to and does not create rights or benefits of any kind for any other persons or entities that are not a party to this Agreement.

<u>Section 4.11.</u> <u>Agreement.</u> The Parties acknowledge and agree that this Agreement is intended to and shall serve as an annexation agreement pursuant to Section 709.192 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4.12. <u>Liberal Construction</u>. The Parties agree that just as Section 709.192 of the Ohio Revised Code is to be liberally construed to allow the Parties to enter into Annexation Agreements, the Parties further agree that this Agreement shall be liberally construed in order to facilitate the desires of each of the Parties to carry out this Agreement. Each provision of this Agreement shall be construed and interpreted so as to permit maximum advantage to the Parties allowed by Section 709.192 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4.13. Notices. All notices, demands, requests, consents or approvals given, required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed sufficiently given if actually received or if hand-delivered or sent by recognized, overnight delivery service or by certified mail, postage prepaid and return receipt requested, addressed to the other Party at the address set forth in this Agreement, or to such other address as the recipient shall have previously notified the sender of in writing, and shall be deemed received upon actual receipt, unless sent by certified mail, in which event such notice shall be deemed to have been received when the return receipt is signed or refused. For purposes of this Agreement, notices shall be addressed to:

The Parties, by notice given hereunder, may designate any further or different address to which subsequent notices, consents, certificates, requests or other communications shall be sent.

<u>Section 4.14.</u> <u>Captions and Headings</u>. The captions and headings herein are for convenience only and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any provisions or Sections hereof.

Section 4.15. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts or duplicate signature pages with the same force and effect as if all required signatures were contained in a single original instrument. Any one or more of such counterparts or duplicate signature pages may be removed from any one or more original copies of this Agreement and annexed to other counterparts or duplicate signature pages to form a completely executed original instrument.

Section 4.16. Governing Law and Choice of Forum. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio or applicable federal law. All claims, counterclaims, disputes and other matters in question between the Parties or their respective agents and employees arising out of or relating to this Agreement or its breach will be decided in a court of competent jurisdiction within Miami County, Ohio.



ORDINANCE NO. 2023-O-

APPROVING THE EDITING AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AND/OR RESOLUTIONS AS PARTS OF THE VARIOUS COMPONENT CODES OF THE CITY CODE OF HUBER HEIGHTS, OHIO; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION AND PUBLICATION OF NEW MATTER IN THE UPDATED AND REVISED CITY CODE AS SUPPLEMENT 14; AND REPEALING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, Municipal Code Corporation has completed its updating and revision of the City Code of Huber Heights, Ohio within Supplement 14; and

WHEREAS, certain provisions within the City Code of Huber Heights, Ohio were changed to conform with current State law as required by the Ohio Constitution; and

WHEREAS, various resolutions and/or ordinances of a general and permanent nature have been passed by the City Council which should be included in the City Code of Huber Heights, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

- Section 1. The resolutions and/or ordinances of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio, of a general and permanent nature, as edited, revised, codified and re-codified, rearranged and consol-dated into component codes, titles, chapters and sections within Supplement 14 to the City Code of Huber Heights, Ohio for the period of January 1, 2023 to March 31, 2023, a copy of which is available for copying and inspection in the Office of the Clerk of Council, and incorporated herein by this reference, are hereby approved and adopted.
- Section 2. The provisions within the City of Huber Heights Code that mirror provisions as contained in the Ohio Revised Code as set forth within Supplement 14 to the City Code of Huber Heights, Ohio for the period of January 1, 2023 to March 31, 2023, a copy of which is available for copying and inspection in the Office of the Clerk of Council, and incorporated herein by this reference, are hereby approved and adopted to conform with current State law.
- Section 3. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of the new matter adopted in Section 1 or 2 of this ordinance are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this ordinance except as follows:
 - (a) The enactment of such sections shall not be construed to affect a right or liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or an action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision, nor to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purposes of revision and recodification.
 - (b) The repeal provided above shall not affect any legislation enacted subsequent to March 31, 2023.
- Section 4. Pursuant to Section 5.08(B) of the Huber Heights City Charter, the Clerk of Council shall cause a notice of this proposed adopting Ordinance to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the City at least seven days prior to adoption and no further publication shall be necessary. Such publication shall constitute sufficient notice of all new material contained therein.
- Section 5. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage as provided by law and the Charter of the City of Huber Heights.
