

1. <u>Call Meeting To Order/Roll Call</u>

Mayor Jeff Gore convened the Council Work Session at 6:01 P.M.

Anthony Rodgers took Roll Call.

2. **Approval of Minutes**

The following minutes were approved unanimously at the beginning of this meeting:

- July 5, 2023
- July 12, 2023
- July 13, 2023

There were no changes or corrections to these minutes as submitted.

This Council Work Session was recorded by the City and the recording of this meeting will be posted to the City's website and will also be

maintained by the City consistent with the City's records retention schedule.

3. Work Session Topics Of Discussion

City Manager Report

Bryan Chodkowski said the City will hold its annual shredding event on July 22, 2023 from 9:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. at both the Rose Music Center and Thomas Cloud Park. He said as a follow up from discussions with Rozzi Fireworks regarding issues with the fireworks display for the Star Spangled Heights, Rozzi Fireworks has agreed to give the City a 10% discount on the fireworks display. He said all of the coordination of the traffic signals on Old Troy Pike between the City and the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will be completed by the week of July 24, 2023 to help improve the traffic flow and congestion in this area. He said the City will host a movie night at the Eichelberger Amphitheater on July 21, 2023. He said the City is in the process of rebuilding the City's website, but the full redo of the website will not be completed until later this year. He said in the meantime some features have been added to the City's website, including Google Translate and a personal accessibility feature. He said the Zoning Division has begun posting new information on code enforcement and code violations on the Zoning Division page of the City's website.

Bryan Chodkowski answered questions from the City Council regarding items in the City Manager Report and other items.

Property Maintenance Review Board Update

Richard Winkler, Chair of the Property Maintenance Review Board, distributed information regarding an update on the Property Maintenance Review Board (see attached). He spoke about the processes and cases involved with the Property Maintenance Review Board and he introduced the members of the Property Maintenance Review Board present at the meeting.

The City Council posed questions to Richard Winkler about the Property Maintenance Review Board and expressed appreciation for the work of the Property Maintenance Review Board.

Purchase Of Snowplow Dump Trucks – Public Works Division

Mike Gray distributed information and proposed legislation to authorize the purchase of two (2) Class 7 snowplow dump trucks for the Public Works Division (see attached). He said the Public Works Division requests authorization to purchase two (2) new snowplow dump trucks and appurtenant equipment to update equipment in the Public Works Division.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to authorize the purchase of two (2) Class 7 snowplow dump trucks for the Public Works Division be placed on the agenda at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Increase Not To Exceed Amount – Zashin & Rich – Labor Counsel

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information and proposed legislation to increase the not to exceed amount for Zashin & Rich for additional professional services for 2023 (see attached). He said Attorney Jonathan D. Downes of the law firm Zashin & Rich provides legal representation for the City on matters involving employment, employee matters, and collective bargaining issues. He said additional monies are necessary to ensure the City has appropriate representation in these matters through December 31, 2023.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to increase the not to exceed amount for Zashin & Rich for additional professional services for 2023 be placed on the agenda at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

County Assessments Authorization – Delinquent Utility/Nuisance

Jim Bell distributed information and proposed legislation to approve individual assessments amounts for delinquent utility amounts and to certify the assessments amounts to the applicable County Auditor for collection (see attached). He said Montgomery County requires all communities to pass separate legislation for assessments that are to be added to the tax duplicate. Before the City can assess property for such things as grass/weed charges, property maintenance abatement, unpaid water and sewer, etc., he said the City must pass legislation specifically identifying the property and the amount of the assessment. He said the details of each assessment can be found in Exhibit A, which is attached to this legislation. He said the assessments requested in this legislation are only for delinquent utility account balances. He said the assessments are based on collection for City services previously provided; therefore, City Staff are asking that this item be passed as emergency legislation.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to approve individual assessments amounts for delinquent utility amounts and to certify the assessments amounts to the applicable County Auditor for collection be placed on the agenda at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as emergency legislation with the second reading and adoption of the proposed legislation at the August 14, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Natural Gas Aggregation

Russ Bergman distributed information and proposed legislation to approve the Plan Of Operation and Governance for the Miami Valley Communications Council Natural Gas Aggregation Program for the purpose of jointly establishing and implementing a natural gas aggregation program (see attached). He said this legislation will allow Council to approve and adopt the plan of Operation and Governance of the Miami Valley Communications Council's (MVCC) Natural Gas Aggregation Program. He said this legislation also allows the City to join MVCC to act jointly with other member communities with group purchasing efforts for the acquisition and aggregation of the natural gas supply.

Representatives of MVCC's energy consultant for natural gas aggregation answered questions from the City Council.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to approve the Plan Of Operation and Governance for the Miami Valley Communications Council Natural Gas Aggregation

Program for the purpose of jointly establishing and implementing a natural gas aggregation program be placed on the agenda at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Fishburg Road Widening Project – Solicit Bids

Russ Bergman distributed information and proposed legislation to solicit bids for the Fishburg Road Improvement Project (see attached). He said this legislation will allow the City Manager to solicit bids for the Fishburg Road Widening Project. He said the south side of Fishburg Road will be widened from Old Troy Pike to Tomberg Street to make the road three lanes wide to match the rest of Fishburg Road from Old Troy Pike to Brandt Pike. He said the City has applied through the Ohio Public Works Commission and has received Issue II funding for the construction of this project. He said 49.9% of the cost will be reimbursed from the grant. He said the Capital Issue II Fund will be utilized to cover the City's local share of the cost.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to solicit bids for the Fishburg Road Improvement Project be discussed again at the August 8, 2023 Council Work Session and be placed on the agenda at the August 14, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the August 14, 2023 City Council Meeting.

<u>Powell Road Realignment Project – OPWC Application</u>

Russ Bergman distributed information and proposed legislation to authorize an application to the Ohio Public Works Commission for funding for the Powell Road S Curve Realignment Project (see attached). He said this legislation will authorize the City Manager to submit an application to the District IV Integrating Committee for funding to construct the Powell Road S Curve Realignment Project. He said it is necessary to secure funding to construct this project; and Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) funds are an appropriate source for the City to seek funding for this project.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to authorize an application to the Ohio Public Works Commission for funding for the Powell Road S Curve Realignment Project be placed on the agenda at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

<u> 2023 Water Main Replacement Project – Award Contract</u>

Russ Bergman distributed information regarding the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project (see attached). He shared details of City Staff's efforts to expedite the construction process in a timely manner while working around concerns from members of the City Council about construction on streets near schools during the school year. He said he had managed to work out arrangements with the contractors to complete work on streets near schools during the summer of 2024. He said Council had passed the authorizing legislation for the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting, but City Staff were waiting on the execution of the contracts until this discussion.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the concerns that Council had expressed had been addressed satisfactorily and the City Manager could execute the contracts for the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project.

Water Infrastructure Update

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information regarding an update on the City's water infrastructure (see attached). He reviewed the spreadsheet and he said the spreadsheet will continue to be updated for each Council Work Session.

The City Council posed questions to Bryan Chodkowski about the Water Infrastructure Update spreadsheet.

Monita Field Lease Amendment

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information and proposed legislation to terminate the lease between the City and Huber Heights Softball Baseball Association for Monita Field Park (see attached). He said the Huber Heights Softball Baseball Association has notified the City it does not need to utilize the fields at Monita Field Park. He said this legislation will terminate the lease pursuant to the terms of that lease.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the proposed legislation to terminate the lease between the City and Huber Heights Softball Baseball Association for Monita Field Park be placed on the agenda at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting for a first reading as non-emergency legislation with adoption of the proposed legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Board And Commission Appointments

Anthony Rodgers distributed information regarding appointments to the Arts and Beautification Commission (see attached). He said it was the recommendation of the City's interview panel to appoint Ashley Berg to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2026 and to appoint Lori Woodruff to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2025. He said background checks were completed on Ms. Berg and Ms. Woodruff by Human Resources.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend approval of the appointments of Ashley Berg to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2026 Lori Woodruff to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2025 and requested that the motion be placed on the agenda for approval at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

<u>City Renewal Levy – Ballot Measure</u>

Bryan Chodkowski distributed information regarding the ballot measure for the renewal of the City's tax levy (see attached). He said the City Council had requested discussion on this agenda item.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the two items of necessary legislation to place the renewal of the City's tax levy on the ballot for the November 7, 2023 general election be prepared and placed on the agenda at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting for a second reading as emergency legislation (ordinance) and non-emergency

legislation (resolution) with the adoption of the two items of legislation at the July 24, 2023 City Council Meeting.

Gas Stations Moratorium

Anita Kitchen distributed information regarding a gas stations moratorium (see attached). She said was concerned about the large number of gas stations coming into Huber Heights and she proposed a moratorium on new gas stations coming into the City. She cited information previously provided from City Staff indicating there was a disproportionate number of gas stations in the City for the size of the City.

The City Council had a discussion on a gas stations moratorium in the City.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that no further action be taken at this time regarding a gas stations moratorium.

Annexation Discussion/Type II Application Timeline Review

Richard Shaw distributed information regarding annexations and the processes for annexations (see attached). He discussed annexations and an annexation moratorium and requested that the Law Director prepare a brief summary and timeline for a Type II annexation process for Council.

The City Council had a discussion on annexations and related issues.

After discussion, the City Council agreed to recommend that the Law Director prepare a brief summary and timeline for a Type II annexation process for Council.

The Council Work Session went into Executive Session at 8:07 P.M.

The Council Work Session adjourned from Executive Session at 9:25 P.M.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-O-

APPROVING INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENTS AMOUNTS AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE OR HIS/HER DESIGNEE TO CERTIFY THE AMOUNTS TO THE APPLICABLE COUNTY AUDITOR FOR COLLECTION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6, Article XVIII of the Ohio Constitution, the General Assembly has enacted general laws stating purposes for which municipalities may assess specially benefited property; and

WHEREAS, these laws include Ohio Revised Code Sections 727.01, 727.011, 727.012, 727.013, 729.06, 729.11, 1710.01(h) and others, which authorize the City to levy and collect special assessments upon the abutting, adjacent, and contiguous, or other specially benefited, lots or lands in the municipal corporation, for among other things, any part of the cost connected with the improvement of any street, public road, place, boulevard, parkway, or park entrance or an easement of the municipal corporation; sidewalk construction; sewers; sewage disposal works and treatment plants, sewage pumping stations, water treatment plants, water pumping stations, reservoirs, and water storage tanks or standpipes, together with the facilities and appurtenances necessary and proper therefore; drains, storm-water retention basins, watercourses, water mains, or laying of water pipe; lighting; any part of the cost and expense of planting, maintaining, and removing shade trees thereupon; any part of the cost and expense of constructing, maintaining, repairing, cleaning, and enclosing ditches; and

WHEREAS, for such approved assessments, the County Auditor is to act at the direction or on behalf of a municipality with respect to collection of such assessments R.C. 727.30; (R.C. 727.33); and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has also enacted laws that require a County Auditor to act at the direction or on behalf of a municipality with respect to collection of certain costs assessed to properties including but not limited to R.C 743.04, 715.261 and 731.51-54; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the foregoing, the City of Huber Heights has passed, and will in the future pass, laws to assess real property for all or part of the cost of a public improvement and/or certain permitted costs of abatement or collection, including but not limited to Ordinance No. 97-O-997 codified as Huber Heights Code Section 175.04 Assessments for Capital Improvement Projects (for sanitary sewer, water, sidewalks and drive aprons, roadways and storm sewers); Ordinance No. 90-O-419 codified as Huber Heights Code Section 919.01 (street lighting); Ordinance No. 2009-O-1771 codified as Huber Heights Code Section 929.16 (unpaid water service); Ordinance No. 1996-O-856 codified as Huber Heights Code Section 923.08 (unpaid sanitary sewer); Ordinance No. 2002-O-1325 codified as Huber Heights Code Section 922.32 (stormwater); Ordinance No. 2014-0-2096 codified as Huber Heights Code Section 521.11 (nuisance in the right of way); Huber Heights Code Section 911.02 (sidewalk repair); Ordinance No. 2002-O-1324 and No. 2011-O-1897 (weed cutting assessment); Huber Heights Code Sections 925.05 (lower Rip Rap Road sewer district assessment), 952.04 (nuisance abatement for false alarms), 521.081, (littering and deposit of garbage) and such other ordinances or resolutions that may be passed from time to time pursuant to these codified laws; and

WHEREAS, in order to better track and account for authorized legal assessments and the amounts due to the City, City Council has determined it is in the best interest of the citizens to pass this Ordinance setting forward the applicable properties and assessment amounts to be certified to the County for collection; and

WHEREAS, the assessments set forth in Exhibit A have been authorized by the City Council of the City of Huber Heights and are required by law to be assessed and collected by the County on behalf of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

- Section 1. The properties set forth on the attached Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein by this reference, are to be assessed in the amount also set forth on the applicable section of Exhibit A unless payment is made within the time frame set forth in the applicable section of Exhibit A.
- Section 2. In the event a payment for the amount or any portion of the amount set forth in Exhibit A is received by the City prior to final assessment date set forth in Exhibit A, which is the same date set forth in the notice sent to such property owner, the Director of Finance, or his/her designee is authorized to remove or revise such assessment from Exhibit A prior to certification to the County Auditor.
- Section 3. The Director of Finance or his/her designee is instructed to certify this Ordinance, including the final assessed properties in Exhibit A, to the applicable County Auditor for collection.
- Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that finalizing and certifying assessment at the earliest time is necessary to timely establish a lien and protect the City's interest in payment of amounts owed to the City; therefore, this Ordinance shall take full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by Council.

APPROVING THE PLAN OF OPERATION AND GOVERNANCE FOR THE MIAMI VALLEY COMMUNICATIONS COUNCIL NATURAL GAS AGGREGATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF JOINTLY ESTABLISHING AND IMPLEMENTING A NATURAL GAS PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the City of Huber Heights Council enacted legislation authorizing the City to establish a natural gas aggregation program pursuant to Section 4929.26, Ohio Revised Code (the "Aggregation Programs") for the residents, businesses, and other natural gas consumers in the City, and for that purpose, to act jointly with any other municipal corporation, township, or county or other political subdivision of the State of Ohio, as permitted by law; and

WHEREAS, by joining the Miami Valley Communications Council ("MVCC"), the City will be able to act jointly with other member political subdivisions and thereby maximize the potential benefits of natural gas deregulation through group purchasing efforts; and

WHEREAS, Council, pursuant to Section 4929.26 of the Ohio Revised Code, has held two (2) public hearings on the Plan of Operation and Governance for the MVCC natural gas aggregation programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

- Section 1. It is hereby found and determined that this Council held two (2) public hearings, with the first hearing taking place on Monday, July 17, 2023 at 3:00 p.m., and the second hearing taking place on Monday, July 17, 2023 at 5:00 p.m., with each hearing meeting the necessary notice requirements as set forth in Section 4929.26 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 2. This Council hereby approves and adopts the Plan of Operation and Governance of the MVCC natural gas aggregation program presented to this Council and on file with the Clerk of Council with a copy of said plan attached in a substantially similar form as Exhibit A.
- Section 3. This Council hereby joins MVCC to act jointly with other members and affiliate political subdivisions for the acquisition and aggregation of natural gas supply.
- Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 5. This Resolution shall go into effect upon its passage as provided by law and the Charter of the City of Huber Heights.

Introduction

The Miami Valley Communications Council ("MVCC") has developed this Plan of Operation and Governance on behalf of its member and affiliate communities regarding government aggregation of firm, full requirements power supply of natural gas for its consumers (the "Plan" or "Aggregation Program"). The Plan contains information on the structure, governance, operations, management, funding, and policies of the Aggregation Program to be utilized for participating consumers.

MVCC was formed in 1975 as a council of governments according to chapter 167 of the Ohio Revised Code. MVCC has acted as an agent for its members and affiliate communities to monitor, regulate and administer common cable television franchise agreements, manage the operation of the council's cable access television channels, and develop and implement intergovernmental projects. The council is governed by a policy-making body consisting of delegates representing member cities. The council also has affiliate agreements with 24 other Miami Valley cities.

Now MVCC communities wish to proceed jointly to authorize MVCC to perform as their agent for development and administration of the Aggregation Program. Current communities expressing an interest in natural gas aggregation are Centerville, Germantown, Kettering, West Carrollton, Trotwood, Brookville, Englewood, Xenia, Miamisburg, Moraine, Huber Heights, Union, Clayton, Riverside, Troy, Eaton, Fairborn, and Monroe. The Program may add other communities and thereby combine additional residential and small commercial customers into a buying pool that will be attractive to third party suppliers (Suppliers). Participation in the Program is voluntary. Any individual customer can decline to be a member of the aggregation program and remain with Centerpoint's (Local Utility) standard choice offer pricing or enter into a supply contract with any competitive retail natural gas service (CRNGS) supplier.

The MVCC communities have passed the necessary ordinances to place the issue of natural gas governmental aggregation on the ballot. Voters in each community approved natural gas aggregation and the community decided to utilize MVCC and the following Plan outlined below. This Plan will not be adopted until two public hearings are held in accordance with Section 4928.20(C) of the Ohio Revised Code.

Process

This Plan allows municipalities to join as either an opt-in municipality ("OIM") or an opt-out municipality ("OOM").

If a community joins the Program as an OIM, that community's eligible residential and small business customers in the authorized areas shall receive an offer letter setting forth the rates, terms, and conditions of the program. To participate the eligible residential and

small business customers must affirmatively enroll in the Program by a specific deadline described in the offer letter.

If a community elects to become an OOM, all eligible residential and small business customers in the authorized areas of MVCC are automatically included as participants in the Aggregation Program unless they opt-out of the program by providing written notice of their intention not to participate. As required by Ohio Law, the various communities jointly participating in the MVCC natural gas governmental aggregation passed a Resolution or Ordinance, which authorized submitting the selection of opt-out aggregation to the community's voters. The voters approved opt-out aggregation in each community and the community decided to join the MVCC Program.

In addition to each community joining the MVCC program, it is also required to comply with various PUCO regulations. As required by PUCO regulations MVCC will file an application with the PUCO for certification as a Government Aggregator after MVCC approves this Plan. As required by regulations, MVCC advertised public hearing dates to discuss the Plan and held two hearings on the Plan.

MVCC anticipates selection of a Provider after receiving approval from the PUCO as a governmental aggregator. Upon Provider selection an opt-out notice for the MVCC Program will be sent to all eligible natural gas customers in MVCC's OOM communities setting forth the rates, terms, and conditions of the program. This notice will provide potential Aggregation participants with at least 21 days to return an opt-out card or other similar notice.

MVCC Aggregation Program

The purpose of the aggregation program is to reduce the amount consumers pay for natural gas. MVCC will not buy and resell natural gas for the participants of the program. Instead, MVCC will work with its energy consultant to competitively bid and negotiate a contract with a CRNGS to provide natural gas to the members of the aggregation program.

MVCC will obtain the list of customers within its boundaries from Centerpoint or other natural gas distribution utility, either by zip code or by method provided by the utility. MVCC will have its CRNGS cleanse the data to ensure that it does not contain customers with alternate suppliers, PIPP customers, and any other excludable consumers, and only those who live within the jurisdictional boundaries of MVCC communities. MVCC will then have its CRNGS send an opt-out notice to each eligible customer which discloses the offered price for natural gas along with any applicable contract terms. The opt-out notice will clearly inform potential customers that they may opt-out of the program during the 21-day period following the mailing of the notification, along with instructions on how to opt-out. Customers who opt-out of MVCC's aggregation program during this initial notification period will continue to receive SCO supplies until the customer chooses an alternative CRNGS or chooses to opt-in to the aggregation program later.

Operation

Existing MVCC staff, the program energy consultant and the CRNGS will provide all necessary technical analysis, competitive procurement of services, regulatory approvals, accounting and fiscal management, contract maintenance, communications, program coordination and administrative support.

Funding

The primary expenses associated with operating this program are printing and mailing cost of the opt-out notices, and fees for an energy consultant. Instead of paying for these costs upfront, MVCC expects to embed its fees into the chosen CRNGS rates offered to potential program participants.

Notification of Customers

All eligible customers in an MVCC municipality will receive opt-out information in the mail. MVCC will adhere to all eligibility requirements of R.C. 4929.26. Essentially, eligible customers cannot be under contract to buy natural gas from an alternate CRNGS or a mercantile customer.

The opt-out notice shall clearly inform customers of the offered rate, and that they have the right to opt-out of MVCC's aggregation program within twenty-one days after the mailing of the notice without paying a switching fee. The opt-out notice will fully describe how to opt-out. After the completion of the opt-out process, the residents who did not opt out will be included in MVCC's aggregation program.

Customer opt-out

Customers may opt-out of MVCC aggregation program at no charge within the twenty-one-day period following the mailing of the notice containing the rates and terms of the aggregation program. Customers who return the required opt-out notice will continue to receive SCO supplies through Centerpoint. MVCC will offer the twenty-one-day period during which customers can opt-out of the aggregation program without charge at least every two years pursuant to state law.

Customer opt-in and Refresh Mailings

MVCC intends on having its supplier allow customers who move into or within MVCC's municipalities to opt into MVCC's aggregation program by calling and voluntarily signing up with the supplier. MVCC will strive to provide these new customers with a similar rate to those already participating in the aggregation. Additionally, MVCC's supplier may obtain a refreshed customer list from Centerpoint approximately every six

months. MVCC's supplier may then send aggregation information to newly eligible customers identified on the refresher list. Whether this information is in opt-in or opt-out format will depend on the negotiated language of the supplier contract. If interim opt outs are to take place; a twenty-one day opt-out will occur in the manner described above.

Disputes

The procedure for handling complaints will be in accordance with the rules set by the PUCO and managed by the CRNGS. Dispute resolution provisions will also be in accordance with PUCO regulations. The opt-out package will contain the telephone numbers and websites for the PUCO and the Ohio Consumers Counsel, as well as the supplier's toll-free number.

MVCC's supplier will maintain this toll-free number for all customer related questions and complaints. MVCC shall require that the personnel assigned to answer these calls are trained and provided the knowledge specific to MVCC's program.

Termination of natural gas supply program

The natural gas supply program may be terminated at the expiration of the supply contract without any extension, renewal or subsequent supply contract being negotiated.

In either event, the aggregation pool customers will return to Centerpoint unless and until they switch to an alternate supplier. Each individual customer receiving natural gas supply service under MVCC aggregation program will receive notification of the termination of the program before termination.

Rates

MVCC shall authorize its energy program consultant to receive proposals on its behalf from CRNGS using a competitive selection process. Bidders will provide pricing offers such as a fixed price, floating price, a percent off rate, or a combination of the above. If consumers have the option of choosing between fixed and floating prices, the opt-out package will contain ample and easy to understand information to aid the consumer in deciding which option best suits their natural gas needs. MVCC will decide which pricing structure(s), to offer based on the bids received, and an analysis of the current and projected market status as well as the bids received.

Billing and Payment

MVCC will continue to have Centerpoint invoice customers using an itemized format approved by the PUCO. MVCC will not become involved in any payment delinquency issues and thus will not require any type of consumer credit or deposit. If MVCC's

supplier wishes to pursue payment delinquency issues, details of the supplier's credit and deposit policies will be included in the opt-out package.

Centerpoint will continue to deliver the natural gas purchased on MVCC's aggregation program through its natural gas distribution system. Participants with questions or concerns regarding service delivery or safety, such as a natural gas outage or gas odor should continue to contact Centerpoint. Meter readings and other billing questions should also continue to be directed to Centerpoint.





Five bids were received for the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project including the following sections on the following streets:

Section 1: Hubbard Drive from Handel Court to 6827 Hubbard Drive

Section 2: Chesham Drive from Cruxten Drive to Tilbury Road

Sandbury Drive from Chesham Drive to Queensbury Road

Cardiff Court from Chesham Drive to Cul de Sac

Section 3: Tewkesbury Drive from Tomberg Street to Tilbury Road

Section 4: Hartwick Lane from Corsica Drive to Rosebury Drive

Section 5: Alter Road from Celestine Street to Menlo Way

Section 6: Longford Road from Harshmanville Road to Montague Road

Section 7: Storck Drive from Farmborough Drive to Rosebury Drive

Section B, Phase 5: Tomberg Road from Fishburg Road to Powell Road

To expedite the construction process and complete the replacement of the water main and appurtenances in a timely manner, City Staff are recommending that the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project be awarded to two different contractors. Because of the higher cost, City Staff are recommending that the reconstruction of Section 7 be deferred to next year when more funding will be available.

The legislation to authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with M & T Excavating for Sections 2, 3, and Section B - Phase 5 of the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project was adopted at the July 10, 2023 City Council Meeting (see attached). The Water Fund will be utilized to construct those sections at a cost not to exceed \$2,284,200. This legislation also authorized the City Manager to enter into a contract with C. G. Construction and Utilities for Sections 1, 4, 5, and 6 of the 2023 Water Main Replacement Project. The Water Fund will also be used for these sections at a cost not to exceed \$1,929,100.

This agenda item is for discussion on the details of the contracts prior to the execution of the contracts by the City Manager.



ORDINANCE NO. 2023-O-

PROVIDING FOR THE CONTINUATION OF AN EXISTING .25 PERCENT LEVY ON INCOME EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2025 AND EXPIRING DECEMBER 31, 2034, AND TO SUBMIT THIS ORDINANCE TO THE ELECTORATE FOR APPROVAL OR REJECTION AND CONTINGENT UPON SUCH ELECTION APPROVAL, AMEND SECTION 192.012(B) OF CHAPTER 192, INCOME TAX, OF TITLE 9, TAXATION PART I, ADMINISTRATION TO REFLECT THE TAX CONTINUATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, at the general election on November 4, 2014, a majority of the electors of the City of Huber Heights voted to approve a .25% levy on income, effective January 1, 2015, for a 10-year period expiring December 31, 2024, in order to provide for police and fire public safety and support, which did not tax social security benefits, pensions, interest payments, inheritance and other items excluded by the City income tax ordinance; and

WHEREAS, after deliberation the Council of the City of Huber Heights seeks to continue the existing .25% income tax rate of income tax beyond December 31, 2024, for an additional ten years; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10.04 of the Charter of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio, and the Ohio Revised Code, City Council must submit this issue to the electorate of the City for approval or rejection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:

- Section 1. Subject to approval of the electors of the City of Huber Heights Ohio, a continuation of an existing .25% levy on income to provide for police and fire public safety and support, which shall not tax social security benefits, pensions, interest payments, inheritance and other items excluded by the City income tax ordinance effective January 1, 2025 and expiring December 31, 2034 is adopted.
- Section 2. The proposed continuation in the rate of income tax shall be submitted by ballot to the electorate of the City for approval or rejection, on November 7, 2023, the date of the general election.
- Section 3. If a majority of the electors voting thereon approve the proposed continuation in the rate of income tax, the income tax levy shall be so continued effective January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2034.
- Section 4. Contingent upon such election approval, Section 192.012(B) of Chapter 192 Income Tax, of Title 9, Taxation Part 1, Administration of the Ordinances of the City of Huber Heights, Ohio shall be amended by adding the following language at the end of Section 192.012 (B):
 - "Beginning January 1, 2025, the income tax of .25% shall remain in effect for ten years to provide for police and fire public safety and support, as approved by the voters on November 7, 2023."
- Section 5. The levy of the annual income tax continuation is made in accordance with Chapter 718 of the Ohio Revised Code, the same being incorporated herein, and pursuant to said Chapter 718, the annual tax continuation authorized herein shall be levied on the income of every person residing in or earning or receiving income in the City of Huber Heights and shall be measured by municipal taxable income and shall be subject to the credit for taxes paid to other municipalities as is provided in Section 192.081 of the Huber Heights Codified Ordinances.
- Section 6. The Clerk of Council is directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the Board of Elections of Montgomery County and Miami County and to take all steps necessary to place this issue on the ballot.

Section 7. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public and in conformance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 8. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that the deadline for filing this ordinance with the Boards of Elections requires that this Ordinance is effective immediately; therefore, this Ordinance shall take full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by Council.

TO PLACE THE ISSUE ON THE BALLOT.
WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2023-O, passed concurrently with the adoption of this Resolution, provides for submitting to the electorate of the City of Huber Heights a proposal to continue the existing .25% levy on income, effective January 1, 2025; and
WHEREAS, Huber Heights Charter and Section 718.04 of the Ohio Revised Code requires that any income tax in excess of 1% shall not be levied without first having been approved by a majority of the electors voting on the issue.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Huber Heights, Ohio that:
Section 1. November 7, 2023 is specified as the date of the election to be held to submit to the electors of the City of Huber Heights for their approval Ordinance No. 2023-O which provides for the continuation of an existing .25% levy on income, effective January 1, 2025 for a 10-year period expiring December 31, 2034, in order to provide for police and fire public safety and support, which will not tax social security benefits, pensions, interest payments, inheritance and other items excluded by the city income tax ordinance.
Section 2. The Clerk of Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections of Montgomery County and Miami County, Ohio, together with a copy of said Ordinance 2023-O and to take all steps necessary to place this issue on the ballot.
Section 3. The Board of Elections of Montgomery County and Miami County, Ohio, are directed to place on the ballot, in the election to be held on November 7, 2023 for submission to the electorate of the City of Huber Heights, the question of whether Ordinance No 2023-O shall be approved. The form of the ballot to be cast at such election shall read substantially as follows, subject to any required changes by the Secretary of State or Board of Elections:
Shall the Ordinance providing for the continuation of an existing .25% levy on income effective January 1, 2025, and expiring December 31, 2034, to provide for police and fire public safety and support be passed?

Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public and in conformance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
Section 5. This Resolution shall go into effect upon its passage as provided by law and the Charter of the City of Huber Heights.
