The Huber Heights City Council met in a Regular Session on June 8, 2026.
Vice Mayor Fred Aikens called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Campbell made a motion to excuse the absence of Mayor Jeff Gore; Mrs. Byrge seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Ms. Baker, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, Mr. Aikens, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, and Mr. Davidson voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

A. City Council Meeting Minutes – May 14, 2026

8. Citizens Comments - Agenda Items

9. City Manager Report

City Manager John Russell provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the City Manager Report (see attached). He congratulated the Wayne High School Boys Track and Field Team for winning the Ohio High School Athletic Association state championship. He said the YMCA will be hosting a free summer playground program for children of all ages on Tuesdays from June 2, 2026 to July 28, 2026 from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at Shullgate Park. He said the Huber Heights Community Garage Sale will take place from June 11, 2026 to June 14, 2026. He said registration for the Huber Heights Garage Sale ended on June 8, 2026. He said the City’s Juneteenth Music Festival will be held at the Eichelberger Amphitheater on June 20, 2026 from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. He said the Montgomery County Jobs and Family Services Mobile Unit will provide services at the Huber Heights Chamber Of Commerce on July 13, 2026 from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. He said the Montgomery County Jobs and Family Services Mobile Unit will also be available

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at the Eichelberger Amphitheatre during the June 20, 2026 Juneteenth Celebration. Deputy Clerk of Council Adam Clevenger said this item relates to the appointment of Ms. Pam Whited to the Citizens Water and Sewer Advisory Board for a term ending January 1, 2028. He said the necessary background check on Ms. Whited had been completed.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mr. Davidson made a motion to adopt; Mrs. Byrge seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, Mr. Aikens, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, and Ms. Baker voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

- B. Mr. Clevenger said this item relates to the appointment of Ms. Darla Cade to the Military and Veterans Commission for a term ending December 31, 2026, the appointment of Ms. Amanda Fitch to the Military and Veterans Commission for a term ending December 31, 2027, and the appointment of Mr. Randall Fletcher and Mr. Benjamin Morgan to the Military and Veterans Commission for a term ending December 31, 2028. He said the necessary background checks on Ms. Cade, Ms. Fitch, Mr. Fletcher, and Mr. Morgan had been completed. He thanked the Military and Veterans Commission Vice Chair Charles Hancock, Clerk of Council Anthony Rodgers, and the City's interview panel for an excellent job in recruiting and selecting the appointees to fill the many vacancies on the Military and Veterans Commission.

Mr. Clevenger said this item relates to the reappointment of Mr. Gregory Fox to the Arts and Beautification Commission for a term ending June 30, 2029. He said the necessary updated background check on Mr. Fox had been completed.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mr. Looney made a motion to adopt; Mr. Webb seconded the motion.

Mr. Webb thanked Mr. Fox for his longtime and continued service to the City of Huber Heights.

On a call of the vote, Mr. Aikens, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, Ms. Baker, Mr. Campbell, and Mrs. Byrge voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

- D. A Motion To Direct The Clerk Of Council To Respond To The Ohio Division Of Liquor Control With No Objections In Reference To The Transfer Of Liquor Permit #10014216-1 For Ameristop At 5983 Old Troy Pike, Huber Heights, Ohio, 45424.

Mr. Clevenger said this item relates to the transfer of C-1 and C-2 liquor permits at the 5983 Old Troy Pike property for Ameristop due to a change in ownership. He said the Fire Division and Police Division have no objections to this transfer.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mrs. Byrge made a motion to adopt; Mr. Webb seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, Ms. Baker, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, and Mr. Aikens voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

- E. A Public Hearing Scheduled For June 8, 2026 By The Huber Heights City Council For Case CBDP 26-11. The Applicant Is Blaze Properties Huber Heights, LLC. The Applicant Is Requesting Approval Of A Combined Basic And Detailed Development Plan For The Construction Of A Chipotle Mexican Grill For Property Located At Brandt Pike And Miami Valley Way And Further Described As Parcel Number P70 03912 0138 On The Montgomery County Auditor's Map.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens opened the Public Hearing for Case CBDP 26-11.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked City Staff to make the initial presentation for Case CBDP 26-11.

Assistant City Manager Aaron Sorrell gave a PowerPoint presentation on Case CBDP 26-11. He said Case CBDP 26-11 was to approve a Combined Basic and Detailed Development Plan for the construction of a Chipotle Mexican Grill

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(Chipotle) for property located at Brandt Pike and Miami Valley Way. He said the proposed land for the Chipotle is zoned for Mixed Use and is appropriate for the restaurant. He said Chipotle will share a curb cut with the existing Cassano's Pizza on Brandt Pike. He said a new access point will also be constructed off of Miami Valley Way. He said the Chipotle street sign is one foot taller than the maximum currently allowed by the Brandt Pike Overlay District, but City Staff determined the sign is appropriate for the area. He said City Staff recommend approval under the condition that Chipotle install a bike rack per the Brandt Pike Overlay District requirements and that it comply with all Fire Division requirements. He said the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of this item.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked if any representatives from Blaze Properties Huber Heights, LLC had any comments or wanted to provide any additional information.

Mr. Jonathan Evans of Evans Engineering said it has been a pleasure working with City Staff on this project. He said the construction project for Chipotle should be a straightforward process, and he did not expect any difficulty adhering to the recommended City guidelines.

Mrs. Byrge asked if Chipotle will have a drive-through.

Mr. Evans said Chipotle did not have a drive-through, but the building will have a pick-up window.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked if the Law Director had any comments or wanted to provide any additional information.

Seeing none, Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked if there was anyone present to speak in favor of the approval of this issue.

Seeing none, Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked if there was anyone present to speak against the approval of this issue.

Seeing none, Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked if any member of the City Council had any comments, questions, or wanted to provide any additional information.

Mrs. Kitchen asked if Council should look into voting to increase the sign height allowance on Brandt Pike in order to be fair to all of the businesses in the area.

Mr. Sorrell said the Chipotle sign, while a foot taller than is allowed by the Brandt Pike Overlay District, is a narrow and modest sign. He said City Staff are reworking the Zoning Code at the present time, and he did not feel it was necessary to pursue changing the sign height requirements along Brandt Pike at this time.

Mr. Davidson asked if the Chipotle on Old Troy Pike will be closed.

Mr. Sorrell said the construction of the new Chipotle on Brandt Pike should not affect the operation of the Chipotle on Old Troy Pike.

Mr. Webb asked if the new curb cut from Chipotle onto Miami Valley Way would allow Chipotle customers to turn left and right out of the exit.

Mr. Sorrell answered affirmatively.

Mr. Webb said this exit will benefit both Chipotle and Cassano customers by providing an ability to use the Miami Valley Way traffic signal to easily go north onto Brandt Pike.

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Ms. Gloria Smith said she was the owner of the Cassano's building on Brandt Pike. She asked where the construction equipment would be entering the property to perform construction on the new Chipotle.

Mr. Sorrell said construction equipment will be entering the property off of Miami Valley Way.

Ms. Smith said the new curb cut exit will be very beneficial to the customers at Cassano's.

Mr. Campbell asked if Mr. Sorrell would be working with the Chipotle management team regarding Tax Increment Financing (TIF) and Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) processes.

Mr. Sorrell said he had not had those conversations with the developer, but he certainly would. He said any information regarding these incentives would be discussed when the development agreement is brought before Council to vote on in the future.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens asked one last time if there was anyone to speak in favor of or against the approval of this issue.

Seeing none, Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said, barring further comments, this Public Hearing of the City Council for Case CBDP 26-11 is hereby closed.

- I. A Resolution Authorizing The City Manager To Enter Into An Agreement Or Partnership With Dayton Children’s Medical Center For Eligible Programming Related To The OneOhio Opioid Settlement Program And The Use Of OneOhio Opioid Settlement Funds.
(first reading)

Mr. Russell said this item regarding the partnership with Dayton Children's Medical Center for the use of OneOhio Opioid Settlement funds was presented by Mr. Sorrell and representatives of the Dayton Children's Medical Center at the June 2, 2026 Council Work Session.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mrs. Kitchen recused herself from the vote due to personal and business relationships with Dayton Children's Medical Center and left the room at 6:40 p.m.

Mrs. Byrge made a motion to adopt; Mr. Looney seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, Mr. Aikens, Mr. Looney, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, and Ms. Baker voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 7-0.

Mrs. Kitchen returned to the room at 6:42 p.m.

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- J. A Resolution Authorizing The Real Property Located At 6800 Executive Boulevard In The City Of Huber Heights, Ohio For The Acceptance Of An Electric Vehicle (EV) Charger(s).
(first reading)

Mr. Russell said this item authorizes City Staff to include the Rose Music Center as a location for future EV chargers through the federal RIDES grant program. He said if this item is approved, the federal RIDES grant money will be used to fund Level 3 chargers to replace the Level 2 chargers currently at the Rose Music Center. He said the existing Level 2 chargers would be relocated to other City-owned facilities for fleet use.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mr. Webb made a motion to adopt; Mrs. Kitchen seconded the motion.

Mr. Davidson asked what the cost was to install a Level 3 charger.

Mr. Sorrell said the cost to install each charger is \$55,000.00.

Mrs. Byrge asked how many Level 3 chargers City Staff expect to get through the federal RIDES program.

Mr. Sorrell said he expects the City would be approved for one (1) Level 3 charger, possibly two (2) chargers.

Mr. Davidson asked about the cost benefits of the existing EV chargers.

Mr. Sorrell said the City is currently recouping electrical costs from the use of the electric chargers at the Rose Music Center; however, the City is not recouping its subscription cost for the system. He said City Staff is working on a pricing plan to come closer to breaking even on the costs. He said more utilization of the chargers would help bring in more money, which could occur with the significantly faster Level 3 chargers.

On a call of the vote, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, Mr. Aikens, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, and Ms. Baker voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

- K. A Resolution Petitioning The Board Of County Commissioners Of Miami County, Ohio To Adjust The Boundary Lines Of Bethel Township So As To Exclude That Territory That, As A Result Of Annexation, Now Lies Within The Corporate Boundaries Of The City Of Huber Heights (Annexation Of Approximately 296.236 ± Acres By Resolution No. 2024-R-7455 And Approximately 7.220 ± Acres By Resolution No. 2025-R-7573).
(first reading)

Mr. Russell said this item authorizes City Staff to petition the Miami County Board Of Commissioners to conform the City's boundaries with Bethel Township as a result of an agreement between Bethel Township and the City of Huber Heights regarding annexation.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mr. Webb made a motion to adopt; Mrs. Byrge seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Mr. Aikens, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, Ms.

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Baker, Mr. Campbell, and Mrs. Byrge voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

- L. An Ordinance Providing For The Issuance And Sale Of Tax Increment Financing Revenue Bonds, Series 2026, In The Maximum Aggregate Principal Amount Of \$5,000,000, For The Purpose Of Paying The Costs Of The Construction Of Certain Public Improvements, Authorizing Various Related Documents And Instruments, Including A Bond Placement Agreement, A First Supplemental Trust Agreement, And A Private Placement Memorandum, And Declaring An Emergency.
(first reading)

Mr. Russell reminded Council that the bonds attached to this legislation are not the obligation of the City, but rather the bonds are secured by the developer and repaid through Minimum Service Payments (MSP).

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to waive the second reading and to adopt this item.

Mrs. Byrge made a motion to waive the second reading; Mr. Davidson seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Mr. Looney, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, Ms. Baker, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, and Mr. Aikens voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

Mr. Looney made a motion to adopt; Mrs. Byrge seconded the motion. On a call of the vote, Mrs. Kitchen, Mr. Webb, Mr. Davidson, Ms. Baker, Mr. Campbell, Mrs. Byrge, Mr. Aikens, and Mr. Looney voted yea; none voted nay. The motion passes 8-0.

Mr. Russell said this item authorizes City Staff to enter into contract with Outdoor Enterprise, LLC as the lowest and best bidder for the Brandt Pike Sanitary Lift Station Improvement Project. He said the Brandt Pike Sanitary Lift Station Project will involve the construction of a new sanitary lift station to replace two aging lift stations near Walmart.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.

Mrs. Kitchen made a motion to adopt; Mrs. Byrge seconded the motion.

Mr. Davidson asked what the cost would be to demolish the existing lift stations.

Mr. Sorrell said he did not believe the cost would be significant, but he would speak to City Engineer Russ Bergman for clarification and inform Council of his findings.

Mr. Russell said this item authorizes City Staff to utilize grant funds received from the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC) to design a paved bike

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path from Chambersburg Road to the Miami Valley Bikeway and the Great Miami River Trail. He said Choice One Engineering has been chosen to prepare the necessary plans for this project.

Vice Mayor Fred Aikens said the Council Work Session recommendation was to adopt this item.
