COVID-19 HEALTH TIPS

Avoid close contact with people who are ill.



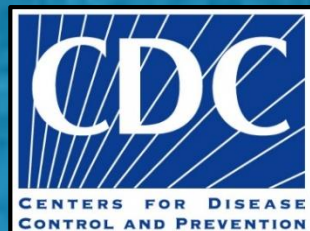
Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

2020 General Municipal Election

Remember to vote in the 2020 General Municipal Election (November 3, 2020)

Beginning in 2020, voting procedures will be different. Instead of your old polling places, voters may cast their votes at home by mail-in ballot, by dropping your ballot off at a secure ballot drop box, or in-person at any voting center in Orange County.

Ballots will be sent to registered voters the week of October 5th.
