To the Members of the City Council:

I have been a resident of La Habra since 1976 when my parents moved my family here. My husband (a lifelong resident) and I chose to remain in La Habra and raise our children here despite the 23 mile commute my husband made to and from work each day. We purchased homes, got involved in school and youth organizations and encouraged others to reside here. We made these choices because of the small town feel, sense of community and suburban lifestyle this city afforded us. The choice to live here has provided us with the opportunity to raise our children in a culturally diverse community, where lifelong relationships could be forged and nurtured. A place where our children would choose to become a part of in adulthood.

However, we now find ourselves facing the possibility of moving away from La Habra in our retirement. The systematic urbanization of the community the past few years has led us to question the livability of this city, High density housing invading every available open space has brought traffic, noise and pollution at a level we have never seen before. Large three story structures towering over what once was private backyards in a quiet neighborhoods, pavement and sidewalk replacing trees and green space, speed bumps on once quiet neighborhood streets and an influx of residents who want only a place to sleep have overtaken our city and altered the lifestyle we chose to live.

Now, we are faced with the possible rezoning of some of the last remaining designated green space to make way for even more development. More traffic, more noise, and more anonymity infecting our quiet community. I am struggling to understand how more development will be "good for" our city. As I see it, this development is only good for wealthy land developers who wish to destroy our lifestyle for their personal gain; allowing them the ability to live in a quiet wealthy community protected from the kind of destruction they wish to impose on us.

Before the council moves forward with a vote on this developments, I believe they need to take into consideration the flawed data provided by Environmental Impact Reports particularly as it pertains to the affect of traffic and pollution on this community. Each EIR submitted by a developer need only consider the impact that exists within the boundary of the development. It does not need to consider the cumulative effect of the seven other recent developments in the surrounding area. One has to wonder if we added up all the recent high density developments that have been built in the past few years, what the report would look like. I expect the "little impact" reported individually would probably instead be significant. The council must also consider the impact to schools and roads. Larger developments must provide compensation to mitigate the impact that development has on the community. Compensation that is not being given as a result of the piecemeal nature of development within the city limits.

I have read and considered the argument that this development would prevent further encroachment into our green spaces. This makes no sense. The original developer of the Chevron property agreed to maintain a certain amount of green space in exchange for being allowed to build a certain number of houses. The owner of that property knew when the purchase was made that the land they purchased was designated green space. Why is the property owner being allowed to force the rezoning to fit their money making scheme. Since when do private land owners get to dictate to cities how they can use their properties. Can I put a nine unit apartment building on my property that now is zoned for a single family residences; or perhaps a commercial building in that space. The city has the right to dictate zoning of the properties within its boundaries. Purchasers of that land accept the zoning requirements for that land when they purchase it. Furthermore, what guarantee do we have that future owners will not strong arm the city into rezoning even more of our open space at that site.

Finally, I have even greater concern that the city council has even agreed to address this issue just 14 days before a vote by the citizens of this city. A vote that could potentially prevent the rezoning of those same green spaces, as well as restructuring the council itself. Choosing to address such a contested issue in the middle of a pandemic, limiting residents ability to exercise their right to voice their opinion gives the appearance of underhanded governmental practices designed to weaken the constitutional rights of its citizens. You have been entrusted by the citizens of this city to make decisions that are in the best interest of the residents of this city, not the wealthy outsiders who have no vested interest in the livability of the community. The plan for redevelopment of the golf course is not a new issue. It was a hotly contested

issue long before the lock down or the election. One cannot help but wonder why there is push to address this issue now and not table it until the will of the people is known as recommended by the Planning Commission. If you listened to the Planning Commission hearings on this issue, then you must be fully aware that the citizens of this community are against any rezoning of that property. The desire to keep the city's open spaces open is not confined to residents overlooking the golf course. It is a city wide desire to stop the further urbanization of our city.

I am asking to act in the best interest of the city, respect the will of the people and deny the rezoning of the green space in the Rancho La Habra area.

I want to say that I believe the above named project is a mistake. All I see is the city is more interested in MONEY again and not it's people. I say this because the council/members of the governing body that represents this city whether they are current or past members have made many mistakes through the years. When I say mistakes I'm referring to two of the larger ones. The K-Mart project that was passed and bragged about by the mayor during the ground breaking ceremony. He announced that the permits were passed in SEVEN (7) days. Where is K-Mart now? And what about the Adult or Gentlemen's Club that the city allowed to be opened and operated many years ago. After the community complained about the goings on in and outside the club which could be seen by our children the Club was closed. The city paid the owner off to get rid of the problem and eye sore. That payment cost the city millions of dollars for which the people of the city had to pay. I ask the council where is the income from these mistakes the city allowed to happen. This time I'm glad to see the council is listening to the people of this great city. Whether you hear us or not only time will tell.

Earlier I said the project was a mistake. It is on these grounds that the different studies have brought to light since the project was announced. To add nearly four hundred and fifty (450) homes will add to the issues that already exist in the city. He announced that the permits were passed in SEVEN (7) days. Where is K-Mart now? And what about the Adult or Gentlemen's Club that the city allowed to be opened and operated many years ago. After the community complained about the goings on in and outside the club which could be seen by our children the Club was closed. The city paid the owner off to get rid of the problem and eye sore. That payment cost the city millions of dollars for which the people of the city had to pay. I ask the council where is the income from these mistakes the city allowed to happen. This time I'm glad to see the council is listening to the people of this great city. Whether you hear us or not only time will tell.

Earlier I said the project was a mistake. It is on these grounds that the different studies have brought to light since the project was announced. To add nearly four hundred and fifty (450) homes will add to the issues that already exist in the city. It will add to overcrowding, an environmental impact, impact our schools and last but not least impact the traffic issues throughout the city.

Let's us assume that each household will have two children as well as two vehicles that will add over nine hundred (900) more in each category. I challenge any member of the council to drive from Beach Blvd. to Harbor Blvd. and complete the one way trip in less than ten (10) minutes due to traffic, number of signals between the two points and poorly set signals from 4-6 pm on any given week day. This test may not hold true now due to the COVID-19 virus where we have less vehicles on the roads. Let us not forget the possibility of adding nine

hundred (900) children to a single school site in the immediate or closest vicinity to the project. This number is equal to an entirely new school. Having worked in a school district myself, (LBUSD) being the third (3rd) largest district in California, I know what the number nine hundred means to the district.

Therefore I ask the council to take all issues into consideration knowing how they are going to affect this city and vote no on the Rancho La Habra Plan.

To the Members of the City Council:

I have been a resident of La Habra since 1976 when my parents moved my family here. My husband (a lifelong resident) and I chose to remain in La Habra and raise our children here despite the 23 mile commute my husband made to and from work each day. We purchased homes, got involved in school and youth organizations and encouraged others to reside here. We made these choices because of the small town feel, sense of community and suburban lifestyle this city afforded us. The choice to live here has provided us with the opportunity to raise our children in a culturally diverse community, where lifelong relationships could be forged and nurtured. A place where our children would choose to become a part of in adulthood.

However, we now find ourselves facing the possibility of moving away from La Habra in our retirement. The systematic urbanization of the community the past few years has led us to question the livability of this city, High density housing invading every available open space has brought traffic, noise and pollution at a level we have never seen before. Large three story structures towering over what once was private backyards in a quiet neighborhoods, pavement and sidewalk replacing trees and green space, speed bumps on once quiet neighborhood streets and an influx of residents who want only a place to sleep have overtaken our city and altered the lifestyle we chose to live.

Now, we are faced with the possible rezoning of some of the last remaining designated green space to make way for even more development. More traffic, more noise, and more anonymity infecting our quiet community. I am struggling to understand how more development will be "good for" our city. As I see it, this development is only good for wealthy land developers who wish to destroy our lifestyle for their personal gain; allowing them the ability to live in a quiet wealthy community protected from the kind of destruction they wish to impose on us.

Before the council moves forward with a vote on this developments, I believe they need to take into consideration the flawed data provided by Environmental Impact Reports particularly as it pertains to the affect of traffic and pollution on this community. Each EIR submitted by a developer need only consider the impact that exists within the boundary of the development. It does not need to consider the cumulative effect of the seven other recent developments in the surrounding area. One has to wonder if we added up all the recent high density developments that have been built in the past few years, what the report would look like. I expect the "little impact" reported individually would probably instead be significant. The council must also consider the impact to schools and roads. Larger developments must provide compensation to mitigate the impact that development has on the community. Compensation that is not being given as a result of the piecemeal nature of development within the city limits.

I have read and considered the argument that this development would prevent further encroachment into our green spaces. This makes no sense. The original developer of the Chevron property agreed to maintain a certain amount of green space in exchange for being allowed to build a certain number of houses. The owner of that property knew when the purchase was made that the land they purchased was designated green space. Why is the property owner being allowed to force the rezoning to fit their money making scheme. Since when do private land owners get to dictate to cities how they can use their properties. Can I put a nine unit apartment building on my property that now is zoned for a single family residences; or perhaps a commercial building in that space. The city has the right to dictate zoning of the properties within its boundaries. Purchasers of that land accept the zoning requirements for that land when they purchase it. Furthermore, what guarantee do we have that future owners will not strong arm the city into rezoning even more of our open space at that site.

Finally, I have even greater concern that the city council has even agreed to address this issue just 14 days before a vote by the citizens of this city. A vote that could potentially prevent the rezoning of those same green spaces, as well as restructuring the council itself. Choosing to address such a contested issue in the middle of a pandemic, limiting residents ability to exercise their right to voice their opinion gives the appearance of underhanded governmental practices designed to weaken the constitutional rights of its citizens. You have been entrusted by the citizens of this city to make decisions that are in the best interest of the residents of this city, not the wealthy outsiders who have no vested interest in the livability of the community. The plan for redevelopment of the golf course is not a new issue. It was a hotly contested

issue long before the lock down or the election. One cannot help but wonder why there is push to address this issue now and not table it until the will of the people is known as recommended by the Planning Commission. If you listened to the Planning Commission hearings on this issue, then you must be fully aware that the citizens of this community are against any rezoning of that property. The desire to keep the city's open spaces open is not confined to residents overlooking the golf course. It is a city wide desire to stop the further urbanization of our city.

I am asking to act in the best interest of the city, respect the will of the people and deny the rezoning of the green space in the Rancho La Habra area.
