**Re: Public Hearing – Rancho La Habra SUPPORT**

Dear Mayor Beamish and Members of the City Council,

People for Housing Orange County is a Chapter of YIMBY Action Network, a non-profit organization that works to build welcoming communities where everyone can thrive. We are the voice of Orange County residents who that the only way to keep Orange County strong is to build additional housing to support the needs of current and future residents.

The Rancho La Habra proposal is an excellent housing project for the City of La Habra and one which the Planning Commission and the City Council should support. As you know, SCAG has issued draft Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) numbers and **La Habra is required by the State to plan for more than 800 new housing units in the City.** With this project the city has the opportunity to **meet the above-moderate (market rate) housing need** on land that the property owner has identified and offered up for housing development.

Cities' greatest **challenge in planning for their RHNA is identifying sites** appropriate for housing, which **must include a letter from property owners** stating they are receptive to have their land reused for infill development. In the case of Rancho La Habra, the **property owner is self-identifying this site for new housing development.** It provides an opportunity for **infill development** on land that is no longer viable for a private golf course business. This project is the exact type of project that the Planning Commission and City Council should be approving.

The primary benefit of this proposal is new housing itself; however, in addition to new homes, **this project will also deliver a public park and walking trails for use by the entire community of La Habra at no cost to the city.** In doing so, this development makes park space more accessible to the public than the current use, a private golf course, which is currently only accessible to people who pay for it. The Rancho La Habra project will also **contribute funds to the City of La Habra, which can be used to leverage additional funds for future affordable housing development.**

**If Rancho La Habra is not approved, the city will have an extremely difficult time meeting its state-mandated RHNA goals and could face very serious consequences due to its general plan housing element being out of compliance with state law.** Only by working to approve good projects like Rancho La Habra will the City of La Habra be able to comply with State Housing mandates. This project will be a great step in that direction.

Honorable Mayor and Councilmembers:

California Infill Federation is coalition advocating for infill housing construction. We urge approval of Rancho La Habra on your council agenda Monday, October 19. It is an outstanding infill project.

Sacramento did little in its last legislative session to increase construction of affordable housing. Certainly its accomplishments were far below available for family and workforce housing.

Fortunately the project before you does not need legislative approval or state financial assistance. The applicant will make a substantial monetary contribution to the city in addition to vast open and public space.

CIF applauds your council for repurposing this private golf course for broader public purpose. It is the essence of urban infill housing.

The development has many outstanding features:

- It is a classic urban infill project in close proximity to the employment centers of Los Angeles and Orange counties.
- Affordable family-housing that is consistent the governor's housing allocation policies.
- Extensive community benefits at no cost to property owners.
- Vital financial benefits for the city treasury to lessen the fiscal blow caused by federal and state budget cuts – past and future. This could help maintain present levels of essential services like police, fire, and EMS.

- Requires that all household utilities must meet GHG emission free and maximum water conservation standards.

We understand there is aggressive opposition from the adjacent Westridge gated-community. Its homeowners-association instead proposes a self-serving no-growth housing initiative on the 2022 ballot. They want the city to do what the legislature has been doing: delaying.

Such objections are quite common among neighbors against any development they believe threatens their lifestyle. Most NIMBY objections however, while understandably emotional, were not proven accurate. Especially with housing as well planned and with as much public input as Rancho La Habra. We doubt anyone that bought a home near Westside Golf received any guarantees or deed restrictions that it would remain a golf course forever.

Finally while white nationalists in other regions of the nation demand a restrictive, exclusive society, there is no such indication in your community. In fact, this project is *de facto* a powerful testament against xenophobia.

We recognize the importance and magnitude of this pending approval. City government is where talk becomes action and where equal opportunity is more than political rhetoric.

It has been said a homeownership is the American Dream achieved. We are confident that dream is in good hand with you. Thank you for taking time to consider this professional perspective.

Honorable Mayor:

Housing has been California's biggest crisis for the past few years and it has affected many of us. The inability to construct new homes and apartments has led to higher prices, fewer homeownership opportunities, over-crowding, increased poverty, and homelessness.

Sadly, California has the highest poverty and homelessness rates in the country. And now, the COVID-19 pandemic has created unimaginable health risks, caused too many deaths, and economic disruption that is affecting everyone. The housing crisis is worse, but you and the City of La Habra can contribute to a partial solution.

The 450-housing unit development proposed for the City of La Habra is critically important because it creates homeownership opportunities for first-time home buyers, including young families who want to achieve the California Dream of homeownership.

Homeownership for Latinos was not widely possible until seventy years ago. We faced numerous forms of discrimination now known as "redlining:" and banks would not make mortgage loans to Latino families and home sellers could not sell to ethnic minorities. In addition, cities created zoning laws that banned the construction of affordable homes.

Federal and State laws outlawed discrimination, and hard-working Latino families began to enjoy home ownership in many communities that were off-limits in previous decades. And then in 2008, the Great Recession hit the country, and ethnic minorities lost \$45 billion of home equity - by far their largest source of wealth. Ten years after the Great Recession, Latinos and Blacks have not regained their previous homeownership rates.

I have been working diligently to create better communities for my great-grandchildren and your families too. The Greenlining Institute and now California Community Builders/The 200 (both non-profit organizations that I co-founded) have made some progress but, 900 families need your help. Rancho La Habra will create homeownership opportunities for 450 families in La Habra, and enable an additional 450 "move-up" families to become homeowners.

We look forward to joining you, council members and community members at your groundbreaking day ceremony soon.

Re: City of La Habra Is Likely to Violate State Housing Law if it Fails to Entitle Rancho La Habra

Dear Mayor Beamish and Members of the City Council:

My name is Kenneth Stahl. I am an attorney and law professor who specializes in land use and local government law, writing on behalf of a concerned party in the entitlement of Rancho La Habra. I am writing this letter to encourage you to approve the requested entitlements for the Rancho La Habra project. As explained below, if the project is not approved, the city will have an extremely difficult time meeting its state-mandated Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA), and could face very serious consequences due to its general plan housing element being out of compliance with state law. Furthermore, if the council fails to approve the project and then the proposed "Citizens Initiative for Preservation of Open Space in La Habra" ("Open Space Initiative.") is enacted at the November election, the city will face even greater difficulties ensuring it has a compliant housing element and may face even more serious consequences. For these reasons, I urge you to approve the project.

As I'm sure you are aware, and as discussed more fully below, there have been sweeping changes to state housing law in the last few years as the state has been faced with a severe housing crisis resulting from a lack of housing supply at all income levels. Under these new laws, cities are required to make realistic plans to accommodate their fair share of the regional need for housing at all income levels, and face serious consequences if they fail to do so. The state Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) has been emboldened with new powers, and the Governor and Attorney General have made enforcement of these housing obligations a top priority. Therefore, the city must be extremely wary of taking any actions, like failing to entitle the Rancho La Habra project, that will impair the city's ability to comply with state housing law.

This letter initially describes the difficulty the city will face complying with state law if it does not entitle the Rancho La Habra project. Then, it describes the consequences the city may face if it does not comply with state law.

**In order to comply with state law, the City of La Habra Must Identify Sites in the City that Can Realistically Accommodate a RHNA of at Least 803 New Homes**

According to state law, cities are required to adopt a housing element that identifies sites within the city that can realistically accommodate their entire RHNA, which is the city's fair share of the regional need for housing. (Gov. Code § 65583.). In this case, if the city of La Habra does not entitle the Rancho La Habra project, it is difficult to see how the city can adopt a general plan housing element that meets its RHNA. The city simply does not have enough sites that can realistically accommodate the number of homes it is required by state law to accommodate in its housing element without entitling a significant amount of housing on the Westridge Golf Club site.

According to the latest estimates from staff at the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), the city of La Habra will be required to adopt a general plan housing element for the 6<sup>th</sup> RHNA cycle covering the period from October 2021 to October 2029 that accommodates 803 new homes (191 very low income; 116 low income; 130 moderate income; and 367 above-moderate income).

Although the city's current RHNA of 803 is an estimate, the final number is very unlikely to be much lower than 803 and may actually be higher. While La Habra may be considering an appeal of its RHNA to SCAG, any appeal is very unlikely to result in a lower RHNA. Governor Newsom and the state Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) have made it clear that cities in southern California must be assigned large RHNA shares in order to address the state's housing crisis. Newsom was recently quoted as saying: "We're going to get aggressive with these RHNA goals. Just ask my friends at SCAG."<sup>1</sup> Nor is La Habra's RHNA likely to be reduced through litigation against SCAG. (City of Irvine v. Southern California Assoc. of Gov'ts, (2009) 175 Cal. App. 4<sup>th</sup> 506 (holding that courts have no power to review SCAG's RHNA allocations). In fact, there is a good chance that after the appeal process La Habra will end up with an even higher RHNA than 803 because cities are permitted to appeal RHNA allocations to neighboring cities, and La Habra's RHNA is far lower than neighboring cities like Brea (2,360), Fullerton (13,180), and Buena Park (8,899). For all these reasons, the city needs to begin planning for a RHNA of at least 803.

**There Are Very Few Sites in The City of La Habra Other than the Westridge Golf Club That Can Realistically Accommodate a Significant Share of the City's RHNA of at Least 803 Homes.**

As described above, cities are required to adopt a housing element that identifies sites within the city that can realistically accommodate the city's entire RHNA share. (Gov. Code § 65583.). That means the city of La Habra will be required to identify realistic sites for approximately 803 homes, broken down into the four income categories described above. State law has been revised in recent years to specify what it means for a site to be realistic, and one thing the law makes clear is that non-vacant sites (sites already occupied with an existing land use) are much less likely to be considered realistic sites for housing than vacant sites. Non-vacant sites may only be counted towards the RHNA if they have "realistic and demonstrated potential for redevelopment during the planning period" (Gov. Code § 65583(a)(3)), and the city's housing element must analyze several factors before determining whether a nonvacant site has realistic and demonstrated potential for redevelopment, including: local development trends, regulatory incentives to encourage housing development, applicable leases for current uses, market demand for the existing use, prior experience converting non-vacant land to higher-density residential, and the extent to which existing uses are an impediment to housing development. (Gov. Code § 65583.2(g)(2).)

The city of La Habra has very few vacant sites, which means the city will have to accommodate virtually all of its RHNA of 803 homes on non-vacant sites. In its housing element for the current, 5<sup>th</sup> cycle, the city identified only four vacant sites in the entire city that were suitable for residential development, and at least two of those sites, 306 S. Monte Vista St. and Beach Blvd north of Imperial Highway, are no longer vacant. (<https://www.lahabracity.com/DocumentCenter/View/194/Housing-Element-PDF>.) The remaining two sites were designated to accommodate only 24 units in total.

Incidentally, it looks very likely that the city's present, 5<sup>th</sup> cycle housing element is itself out of compliance with state law. Under the state's "no net loss" law, the city is required to maintain capacity for its entire RHNA for the full planning cycle. (Gov. Code § 65863(c)). So if a city designates a site for a portion of the RHNA but then subsequently allows a project to be built on the site that does not meet that portion of the RHNA, the city must identify another site that can accommodate the unmet portion. (Gov. Code § 65863(c)(2).). Here, the city designated the Beach Boulevard site as suitable for 319 lower income housing units, but entitled a market-rate apartment complex on that property called "Valentia," with very few low income units. According to HCD, La Habra has to date entitled only 12 of the 77 lower income units it is required to accommodate in its current housing element. (<https://www.arcgis.com/apps/View/index.html?appid=8ea29422525e4d4c96d52235772596a3#>) To my knowledge, the city never designated an alternative site for the remaining lower income units after entitling the Valentia project. Therefore, it appears the city's existing housing element is out of compliance with state law.

Returning to the 6<sup>th</sup> cycle housing element, La Habra will face a very difficult challenge meeting its RHNA without the Westridge Golf Club site because not only are there very few vacant sites in La Habra, but there are also very few non-vacant sites that have realistic and demonstrated

potential for redevelopment to meet the city's RHNA of 803 homes.<sup>2</sup> It is difficult to imagine what sites the city would identify that could accommodate a significant share of the 803 homes if the Westridge Golf Club is not one of them. On the other hand, if the city were to entitle the Rancho La Habra project with 442 homes, it could satisfy its entire above-moderate income RHNA share on just one site. Furthermore, the project will generate \$1 million in fees for the city's affordable housing fund that can be put towards meeting the city's lower income RHNA share. For that reason, the city's decision on Rancho La Habra may well determine whether the city is able to adopt a housing element that complies with state law.

**If the City Fails to Entitle Rancho La Habra and then the Open Space Initiative Passes, The City May Be Unable to Comply With State Law Unless it Files a Lawsuit to Invalidate the Initiative**

As described above, if the city fails to entitle Rancho La Habra, the city will have an extremely difficult time adopting a compliant housing element, regardless of whether the open space initiative is adopted. But if the city declines to entitle the project and then the voters adopt the open space initiative, the city will face additional barriers to obtaining a compliant housing element. State law requires that cities' housing elements identify and remove any constraints to housing development. (Gov. Code § 65583(c)(3).) The open space initiative, which requires voter approval before redesignating or rezoning any open space for housing, would clearly be such a constraint, especially since the only privately-owned open space in the city is also the most suitable property in the city for housing development. Consider what recently happened in the city of Encinitas. Encinitas was unable to adopt a compliant housing element because of a voter initiative that required voter approval of any major general plan amendments or zoning changes. HCD declared the initiative to be a constraint on housing development and refused to certify the city's housing element as compliant with state law until the city took steps to address the initiative.<sup>3</sup> HCD certified Encinitas's housing element only after the city filed a declaratory judgment action in superior court to have the initiative declared legally invalid.<sup>4</sup>

In this case, the city can avoid Encinitas's fate if it entitles Rancho La Habra. In that event, even if the open space initiative passes, it would be inapplicable to Rancho La Habra and would not be a constraint on housing development. On the other hand, if the city fails to entitle Rancho La

Habra and then the open space initiative passes, the initiative would be a constraint on housing development and the city would likely have to file a lawsuit to declare the open space initiative invalid in order to enact a compliant housing element.

For all of these reasons, the city of La Habra is very unlikely to adopt a compliant housing element for the 6<sup>th</sup> RHNA cycle unless it entitles the Rancho La Habra project

### **The City May Face Serious Consequences if it Does Not Adopt a Compliant Housing Element**

The city should be very wary of undertaking any action, such as failing to entitle Rancho La Habra, that would prevent it from adopting a compliant housing element because cities that fail to adopt compliant housing elements are likely to face significant consequences, many of which are described below. Although in the past there were few real consequences if a city failed to adopt a compliant housing element, that has clearly changed in the last few years. As the state now faces an enormous and unprecedented housing crisis, due largely to an inadequate supply of housing at all income levels, the Governor, state legislature, Attorney General, HCD, and housing advocacy organizations have all made housing element compliance a top priority.

### **The City May Lose Significant State Funding if it Fails to Adopt a Compliant Housing Element**

Cities that lack a compliant housing element are ineligible for several substantial funding sources. For example, cities must have a compliant housing element to qualify for state planning funds under SB 2 or park funding under the state's Housing-Related Parks Program.<sup>5</sup> Officials at the city of Huntington Beach estimate that the city's failure to adopt a compliant housing element cost the city \$625,000 in SB 2 money last year, as well as other funding.<sup>6</sup>

The city of La Habra is likely to be disadvantaged in attempting to obtain additional sources of state funding in the future if it does not have a compliant housing element. Last year the state legislature enacted the Prohousing Designation Program, which empowers HCD to designate jurisdictions in the state as "prohousing" and give them additional points and preference on several funding programs, including the Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC), Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) and Infill Incentive Grant (IIG) programs.<sup>7</sup>

Additional funding sources are likely to be contingent on housing element compliance as well. For instance, Governor Newsom has indicated an interest in possibly withholding transportation funding from cities that are not meeting their RHNA goals.<sup>8</sup>

### **The City of La Habra May Be Sued by the State of California**

If HCD determines that a city's housing element is out of compliance with state law, it can refer the matter to the Attorney General for enforcement. (Gov. Code § 65585(i); (j)). In 2019, the state of California filed suit against the city of Huntington Beach alleging that the city's housing element was out of compliance with state law.<sup>9</sup> The city eventually settled with the state and agreed to adopt a compliant housing element after losing a demurrer (motion to dismiss the state's case). As part of the terms of the settlement, the city was required to rezone several parcels to permit housing developments with 20% affordable housing "by right," meaning that the projects would be entitled to approval without discretionary review by the city.<sup>10</sup>

### **The City of La Habra May Be Sued by Private Parties**

Developers, housing advocacy groups, and ordinary citizens can also bring suit in the event a city fails to adopt a housing element that complies with state law. (Gov. Code § 65587.). Furthermore, citizens may bring suit to compel the city to rezone sites for housing or remove constraints such as an anti-growth ballot measure. The city would bear the burden of proof in such an action. (Gov. Code § 65587(d)(2)). In addition, private plaintiffs can be awarded attorney fees if they prevail in litigation, which may add tens or even hundreds of thousands of dollars in litigation costs. (Gov. Code § 1021.5.). The cost of litigation will of course be magnified if the city is also required to bring a declaratory judgment action to declare its own ballot initiative invalid, as described above.

### **A Court Is Required to Suspend the City's Land Use Authority if the City Has Not Adopted a Compliant Housing Element**

If a plaintiff successfully proves that the city has not adopted a compliant housing element, the plaintiff is entitled to a judicial order enjoining the city from exercising some or all of its land use powers until it has a compliant housing element. Under Government Code section 65755(a), if a court finds that a jurisdiction's housing element is out of compliance with state law, it must order either the suspension of some of the city's authority to approve new development or mandate the approval of certain housing projects. In practice, that means homeowners could be unable to obtain permits to remodel their homes or make other improvements, the city could be unable to approve new commercial projects, or the city could be stripped of its ability to reject or place conditions on the approval of new subdivisions.

**The City May Be Required to Approve Dense Housing Projects By Right on Any Residential Site (Housing Accountability Act)**

Under the Housing Accountability Act, Gov. Code § 65589.5(d)(5)(B), if a city has failed to identify sufficient sites in its housing element inventory to meet its RHNA for all income categories, then the city may neither disapprove nor conditionally approve any housing development project with at least 20% affordable units on any site designated for residential use in any element of the general plan, or any site designated for commercial use where residential uses are conditionally permitted.<sup>11</sup> For example, if a developer proposed to build a four-story, dense housing project with 20% affordable units and minimal setbacks on a parcel of land zoned exclusively for two-story single-family detached homes with large setbacks, and the city has not identified sufficient sites in its housing element to meet its RHNA, the city would be required to approve the project. Notably, a significant majority of the land in the city of La Habra is designated under the general plan land use element for residential use, so there are many sites in the city that would be eligible for by-right approval under this provision of the HAA if the city were unable to identify sufficient sites in its housing element to meet its RHNA. **The City Will Be Required to Approve Certain Housing Projects Ministerially, Without Applying Any Discretionary Standards, if it Does Not Meet its RHNA Goals (SB 35)**

All of the above-described consequences may occur if the city fails to adopt a compliant housing element. But there are additional consequences if the city fails to meet its RHNA goals. Under Senate Bill 35, any city that is not meeting its RHNA goals in the above-moderate income category must ministerially approve housing projects that are consistent with the city's objective land use standards, propose at least 10% affordable housing, pay prevailing wages for construction work, and meet a few other requirements.<sup>13</sup> Ministerial approval means the city may not hold a discretionary hearing on the project or subject it to any CEQA review, must limit its review to ensuring the project meets the objective criteria of SB 35, may only hold a truncated design review process that cannot materially impact the project height or density, and cannot require more than one parking space per unit. In its SB 35 guidelines, HCD has declared that it may take action under its enforcement authority against cities that are not adhering to the guidelines.<sup>14</sup> Private litigation by developers or outside groups is also available.

In conclusion, if the city fails to entitle the Rancho La Habra project, it is difficult to imagine how the city can adopt a housing element that complies with state law. And if the city is unable to adopt a housing element that complies with state law, the city may soon find itself embroiled in expensive litigation, deprived of significant sources of state funding, and stripped of some of its land use powers. For all these reasons, and because the applicant appears to have complied with CEQA and has presented to you a well-mitigated and well-designed project, I urge you to approve the project.
