Avoid close contact with people who are ill.



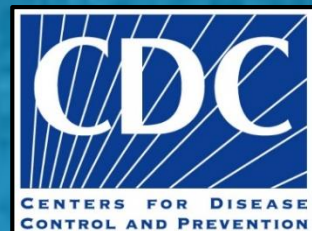
Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

**Remember to vote in the 2020 General Municipal Election (November 3, 2020)**
