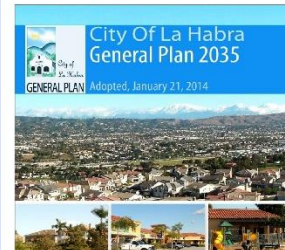

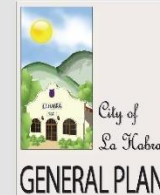
ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING FOR LA HABRA HOUSING ELEMENT

Background: The Housing Element is a mandatory element of La Habra's General Plan. Its purpose is to ensure that current and future housing needs for all residents in the community are addressed. The Housing Element is updated every 8 years and is subject to detailed statutory requirements and review by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. The City's Housing Element Update will cover the planning period of 2021 through 2029 and will address the changing needs of residents as well as changes to State housing law.



GPAC Meeting: The upcoming General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC) meeting on March 23, 2021 will be virtual and open to the public. At this meeting, GPAC members will discuss the City's strategy for addressing its housing production goals for the Regional Housing Needs Assessment. This will include:

- State law requirements for addressing the RHNA
- Vacant and underutilized sites where housing is planned
- Fair Housing - Social Equity Considerations
- Recent development projects and accessory dwelling units
- Other sites identified by the GPAC for consideration
