RULES

- Regulation Helmets, Elbow Pads, and Knee Pads are Required.
- Skate Zone Closed During Inclement Weather.
- Children Under 14 Years of Age are Prohibited without Adult Supervision.
- Motorized Vehicles, Bicycles, Scooters, and Other Types of Apparatus are Prohibited.
- Additional Ramps, Jumps, or Obstacles May Not Be Brought into the Skate Zone.
- Defacing City Property is Strictly Prohibited.
- Please Report Any Damage or Hazardous Conditions to Anaheim Community Services at (714) 765-5191.
- Skateboarding and Skating are regarded as presenting substantial risk of injury and therefore constitute hazardous recreational activities (under the meaning of California Government Code Section 831.7 (b)). Use of this facility may result in serious bodily injury, permanent disability, or even death.

§ 12.00.130 SKATE PARKS.

A. Skateboarding, in-line skating and/or roller skating is deemed to be a hazardous activity, and the city shall not be liable for injuries incurred by persons who participate in any such hazardous activity.

B. City skate parks are designed and maintained, and are hereby designated as, skate parks in which skateboarding, in-line skating and/or roller skating is permitted pursuant to the provisions of this section.

1. Use of any city skate park for any purpose not expressly permitted by this section is prohibited, unless such user is in possession of written permission from the Community Services Department.

2. Any person utilizing any city skate park for skateboarding, in-line skating and/or roller skating is deemed to be knowledgeable of its inherent dangers.

3. Having such knowledge, each such person is further deemed to have expressly assumed all risks of injury, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

C. Every person riding a skateboard, or utilizing in-line skates or roller skates in any city skate park, must:

1. Wear a fully-functional helmet, elbow pads, and knee pads;
2. Be supervised by an adult if under the age of fourteen (14); and
3. Comply with all posted rules and regulations.

D. The Community Services Department is authorized to establish, post and/or revise rules and regulations deemed appropriate for any city skate park. It shall be unlawful and a citable offense for any person to violate any provision of this section, or any such posted rule or regulation.

- RULES AND REGULATIONS -

USE OF THIS FACILITY IS A PRIVILEGE AND SKATERS WILL HELP TAKE CARE OF THIS SKATE PARK BY FOLLOWING THESE GUIDELINES:

1. Skateboards and in-line skates only (Municipal Code 12.32.030).
2. No bicycles, scooters or motorized vehicles (Municipal Code 12.32.030).
3. Failure to wear helmets, knee pads and elbow pads will subject persons to removal and citation (Municipal Code 12.32.020).
4. Reckless operation on adjacent park curbs and city property is prohibited.
5. No graffiti, tagging, applying stickers or vandalism to city property.
6. Please dispose of trash in trash receptacles. No glass bottles.
7. No smoking, alcohol, drug use or loud music.
8. No unauthorized pieces of equipment, obstacles or apparatus may be brought into the skate area.

9.14.010. Purpose and intent.

The City Council finds and declares that the purpose of this chapter is to promote the public peace, morals, health, safety and general welfare of persons in the City by regulating the activity of skateboarding on public property and private property which is accessible to the general public and to establish a Skate Park to create a safe and accessible place for people of all ages to skateboard and roller skate in a clean, enjoyable environment.

9.14.020. Definitions.

- A. "Safety Equipment" shall mean, at a minimum, legal or approved helmets, elbow pads and knee pads.
- B. "Skateboard" shall mean all wheeled objects, coasters, toys, conveyances, or similar devices used for transportation or sport which are propelled by human power and which are not classified as bicycles or roller skates.
- C. "Skate Park" shall mean any area designated by resolution of the City Council as a skate park for exclusive use of skateboards and roller skates.
- D. "Roller skate" shall mean any footwear or device which may be attached to the foot or footwear, to which wheels are attached and such wheels may be used by the wearer for moving or propulsion, including but not limited to in-line skates commonly known as roller blades.

9.14.030. Skate Parks.

- A. The City Council may, from time to time, designate certain areas as a Skate Park. A Skate Park shall be designated as such by Council resolution and shall be posted with all signs required by the California Health and Safety Code Section 115800 et seq. as may be amended.
- B. All persons using a Skate Park must wear required safety equipment. Failure to wear said safety equipment shall be deemed a violation of this chapter and shall be subject to the penalty set forth in Section 9.14.050.
- C. Skate Parks shall have signs posted stating that all persons using the Skate Park shall wear a helmet, elbow pads and knee pads and that failure to do so will result in the issuance of a citation pursuant to Fullerton Municipal Code Section 9.14.050.

9.14.040. Skate Park Regulations.

The following regulations shall apply for all Skate Parks:

- A. No person shall skateboard or roller skate at any times other than those established as the hours of operation.
- B. No person shall use the Skate Park for uses other than for skateboarding and rollerskating.
- C. No person shall use the Skate Park without wearing the required safety equipment, as posted.
- D. No person shall ride, or cause to be ridden, a bicycle on the skating surface of the Skate Park.
- E. No person shall use, or be under the influence of, alcohol or drugs while using the Skate Park.
- F. No person shall litter or place trash or debris in or on the skating surface. All trash shall be placed in a designated trash receptacle and failure to do so shall be grounds for removal from the Skate Park.
- G. No person shall apply, or cause to be applied, any vandalism, including but not limited to, graffiti, tagging, stickers or decals, to any facilities in the Skate Park.
- H. All persons shall skateboard or roller skate only on the skating surface, and shall not skateboard or roller skate on the

curbs and driveways of the City-owned area surrounding the skating surface.

9.14.050. Penalty for Violation.

A. Any violation of the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed to be an infraction, and punishable as such, notwithstanding the fact that at the discretion of the City or District Attorney, the violation of any section of this chapter may be filed as a misdemeanor. The complaint charging such violation shall specify whether the violation is a misdemeanor or an infraction. Each day that a violation of any provision of this chapter continues shall be considered a new and separate violation. A violation of any of the provisions of this chapter shall constitute a nuisance and may be abated by the City through civil process by means of restraining order, preliminary or permanent injunction, or in any other manner provided by law for the abatement of such nuisances.

B. Any provision of this Code or appendices thereto inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter, to the extent of such inconsistencies and no further, is hereby repealed or modified to that extent necessary to effect the provisions of this chapter.

C. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this chapter is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this chapter. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this chapter and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases or portions be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

D. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this chapter and shall cause the same to be published and posted pursuant to the provisions of law in that regard and this chapter shall take effect 30 days after its final passage.

SKATE PARK REGULATIONS

- Skating activity shall be limited to the park hours of 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- No skating activity with safety equipment (helmet, elbow pads, and knee pads)
- No use of items other than skateboards or other approved wheeled recreational devices (skates, scooters, and bikes)
- No reckless use of skateboards or other approved wheeled recreational devices.
- No use of obstacles not permanently affixed to the Skate Park by the City.
- No skate activity on curbs, sidewalk areas, fences, railings, seating areas, walls, or areas surrounding the Skate Park
- Only City approved organized activities, events, or competitions may occur at the Skate Park.
- No skating if hazardous conditions exist.
- No littering.
- No possession or use of alcohol, drugs, or glass containers.
- No graffiti or tagging in or around the Skate Park.
- No animals.
- No skateboards or other wheeled recreational devices on the basketball court.

Violators of Skate Park regulations or other rules may be punishable as a misdemeanor or infraction. (LPMC 3.78.010 et seq.)

7115 SKATEPARK RULES AND REGULATIONS

- a. In addition to the general park rules and regulations provided in this chapter, the following provisions shall apply to any City skatepark. As used in this section, the term "skatepark" shall mean any facility owned and operated by the City of Tustin that is designed and maintained for recreational skateboard, scooter, bicycle, in-line skate, roller skate, and/or wheelchair use:
- (1) No person shall utilize the skatepark for anything other than skateboard, scooter, bicycle, in-line skate, roller skate and/or wheelchair use. Motorized conveyances, whether electric or gas powered, are prohibited.
 - (2) Spectators are not allowed inside the skatepark.
 - (3) All persons using the skatepark must wear a helmet, elbow pads, and knee pads.
 - (4) No person shall place, position, erect, or use any outside equipment, obstacles, ramps, rails, or other similar objects inside the skatepark.
 - (5) Except for recreation instructors employed or contracted by the City, no person or entity shall provide instruction, coaching, or teaching at the skatepark for any fee or compensation. No person shall pay another person at the skatepark for instruction, coaching or teaching.
 - (6) No person or entity shall organize any group activity, demonstration, event, or competition at the skatepark without prior written permission from the Director of Parks and Recreation.
 - (7) No person shall consume or possess food, beverages, glass bottles, or any breakable glass item in the skatepark.
 - (8) Notwithstanding any posted hours of operation, the Director of Parks and Recreation may, at their discretion, close the skatepark due to inclement weather or as may be needed for maintenance.
 - (9) Skateboarding, scootering, bicycling, skating, or wheelchair riding outside the designated skatepark area in a City park is prohibited. This prohibition does not apply to the use of such devices as a means of transportation.

The Director of Parks and Recreation is authorized and empowered to enact rules and regulations in addition to those set forth herein regulating the use of any skatepark which they deem appropriate, provided that signs describing such rules and regulations are posted and placed at each skatepark.

b. Posting of Signs.

Signs shall be posted in one (1) or more conspicuous and visible area(s) at the skatepark to afford reasonable notice of the provisions of this Section, and that pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 115800, any person using the skatepark must wear a helmet, elbow pads, and knee pads, and that any person failing to do so will be subject to citation.

c. Enforcement.

- (1) The privilege of any person to use the skatepark is expressly conditioned upon compliance with the provisions of this Section. Any violation of the provisions of this Section is unlawful and may be prosecuted pursuant to the provisions of Part 2 of Chapter 1 of Article 1 of this Code.
- (2) Any violation of any provision of this Section shall subject the violator to immediate ejection from the skatepark and/or citation and prosecution.

Skate Park Rules and Regulations

Hours: Sunrise to Sunset

Skate-At-Your-Own-Risk

This is a Non-Supervised Facility.

Required Protective Equipment: Helmets, knee pads, and elbow pads.

- No person under the age of 12 unless accompanied and supervised by an adult.
- No unauthorized equipment, additional ramps, obstacles or apparatus.
- No modifications to the skating surface or features (no wax).
- No motorized vehicles.
- No food, beverages or glass containers.
- No pets.
- No alcohol, drugs or smoking.
- Report any damage immediately to park staff.
- Spectators must be seated at the bleacher area or lawn area.

Violators of these rules are subject to immediate citation and removal.
