# MAPS COVID-19 Data

The highest case rates were observed in the 0-4 age group, peaking around 1150 in early February. Other significant peaks occurred in the 35-39 age group (around 1300) and the 55-59 age group (around 950). The case rates generally decreased as the age group increased, with the lowest rates observed in the 85-89 and 90+ age groups.
