

Bellevue Ave Street Project (2026)

The proposed 2026 Bellevue Ave street project includes a possible narrowing of the street by two feet and addition of sidewalks. To gain insights into the proposed project a door to door survey of homeowners affected by the project was performed. Since these changes are only being proposed for Bellevue Ave and not for the two side streets, Jay Ro Ct and Riverview St, only residents of Bellevue Ave were included in the survey.

Here is a brief explanation of how the survey was conducted:

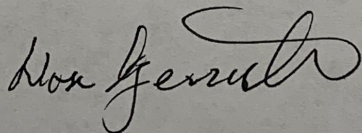
Each house on Bellevue Ave was approached and asked to comment on the proposed street project. Each address was asked if they wished to participate and their responses were recorded on the attached page. The project was described as one that would include two possible changes:

- 1) the inclusion of a sidewalk on one side of the street and,
- 2) a narrowing of the street by two feet.

To reduce the risk of the appearance of bias by the interviewers, for those participants who chose 'No' to the proposed changes a follow up question was asked. The question was: Are there any effects these two changes would have that might be beneficial? Regarding sidewalks, participants saw no benefit because of the low number of walkers and minimal car traffic aside from residents. As related to the street width, most felt the street was already too narrow. There were also comments about snow taking up part of the street thereby reducing the width of the street. Additionally, when cars are parked in the street some felt the street was too congested at the current width so any more narrow would be a concern.

There were two houses that residents did not answer their door. The surveyors tried on two occasions to seek contact with those houses but without success. The survey was conducted on the evening of September 19 and morning of September 20, 2025.

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Bellevue Ave will be replaced starting in 2026. As part of the project consideration is being given to the addition of sidewalks and reduction of the street width by 2 feet. The neighborhood can voice its support or lack of support for these two changes. Please indicate if you support or do not support these efforts. **Yes** means you support and **No** means you do not want this change.
