CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Mayor Post called the meeting to order at 8:45 AM. He directed the Town Clerk to call the roll. **Vice Mayor Ziegler** and **Council Member Comerford** were absent. All other Council Members were present, constituting a quorum. Also present were **State Representative Rachel Keshel**, **State Representative Kevin Volk**, **State Senator Vince Leach**, **Triadvocates Public Affairs Advisor Roxanna Pitones**, **Triadvocates Principal Julie Rees**, **Town Manager Terry Rozema**, **Assistant to the Town Manager Andrea De La Cruz**, **Town Attorney Jane Fairall**, and **Town Clerk Jill McCleary**.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATION/MOMENT OF SILENCE

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mayor Post asked for a motion to approve the agenda.

Council Member Cavanaugh moved to approve the agenda as presented. Council Member Officer seconded the motion. Motion passed, 5-0.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION / POSSIBLE ACTION

D1 Relating to Intergovernmental Relations; discussion with the Town's legislative delegates regarding the Town of Marana, including the Town's operations, projected growth, and legislative priorities (Terry S. Rozema)

Mayor Post welcomed **Representative Keshel**, **Senator Leach**, and **Representative Volk**, and thanked them for attending the meeting. He acknowledged the one-year anniversary of the late Mayor Ed Honea's passing. The current draft of the 2026 Marana Legislative Policy Priority Program document was available to attendees. A copy is on file with the Town Clerk's Office.

Mayor Post opened with an overview of current topics affecting Marana.

Mayor Post, **Representative Keshel**, **Representative Volk**, **Senator Leach**, Council Members, and Town staff participated in a discussion regarding the Town's legislative priorities and the representatives' legislative priorities for the upcoming 2026 Legislative Session. General topics included data centers, referendum laws, engagement with residents, growth, water resources and water laws, affordable housing, the ability of municipalities to govern themselves, the history of the Regional Transportation Authority, RTA Next, economic development, traffic and transportation infrastructure, the Ironwood Forest National Monument, potential uses of a former Marana prison, and the upcoming state budget.

Mayor Post thanked everyone for coming.
