The City of Muskogee is required to participate in the State of Oklahoma Bridge inspection program. This program is funded with 100% Federal funds. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) provided four (4) options for participation they are:

- 1. Select one of ODOT's overqualified engineering firms.
- 2. Elect to do bridge safety inspections with your own forces using inspection teams and an oversight engineer fully qualified as mandated by the NBIS (National Bridge Inspection Standards).

A list of the prequalified inspection firms is provided. Funding will be 100% Federal funds. To comply with the National Bridge Inspection Standards and avoid federal-aid sanctions, all the Local Governments are required to do one of the following by *December 1, 2017*:

(1) Select one of the consulting firms on the attached "Qualified Consultant List". You will be required to evaluate the Consultant's Letter of Interest (LOI) and the Consultant's response packet to determine which firms to interview. Please refer to the following web site: http://www.okladot.state.ok.us/projmgmt/off-system-bridge-inspection-consultants-2017/

You must interview a minimum of three (3) firms and make your selection from the attached list of qualified inspection consultants. Phone interviews are acceptable, but we must have documentation from the interviews including who was on the committee, interview questions, and the ranking matrix that you had for the three (3) or more Consulting firms with their final composite scores. The interview committee must have three or more persons on it. Each member of the interview committee will need to sign a nondisclosure form (Please refer to the enclosures for a copy of this form).

- (2) You may elect to do bridge safety inspections with your own forces provided the bridge inspection teams and program manager are fully qualified as mandated by the NBIS (National Bridge Inspection Standards - please refer to attached NBIS requirements) and as approved by ODOT Bridge Division. Payment will be based on actual rates and payroll additive for benefits, etc., and vehicle mileage rates.
- (3) Use the same firm that the County selects.
- (4) Let ODOT select for you.

You are respectfully requested to make your choice before **December 1, 2017**, by Resolution stating your choice as noted above. In order to obtain the required contract signatures, our April time line is very tight. It is critical that we receive your resolution in a timely manner. If we do not hear from you by December 1, 2017, we will make the selection for you. **Please note that, once you select your bridge inspection team, no changes can be made until the next contractual period.**

Approval of a one (1) year renewal of the Traffic Signal Maintenance Contract, as negotiated, with SignalTek, Inc., including, but not limited to the repair, installation, maintenance and twenty-four hour call for traffic signals as recommended by Staff, or take other necessary action. BACKGROUND:

This agreement in its original form has been active since March 13, 2014. SignalTek and the City have continued to exercise their renewal option as provided for in the maintenance contract since this time. The pricing has changed from \$25.00 to \$30.00 per month per signal in this agreement. There are 45 total signals covered under this contract. The agreement has also been adjusted to better fit our needs with regard to repair items. This agreement, at the election of the City of Muskogee can be extended on an annual basis.

SignalTek has done an exceptional job with this agreement to date and we have had no issues. Therefore, we believe it is in the City's best interest to continue this agreement with SignalTek, as negotiated, for the future work.

The previous cost is budgeted in the Traffic Signal Account and there are adequate funds in this account to cover the increase for the remainder of the year.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Approve renewal of the Traffic Signal Maintenance Contract, as negotiated, with SignalTek, Inc. that includes but is not limited to the repair, installation, maintenance and 24 hour call for traffic signals and flashing school signals as recommended by Staff.

MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR TRAFFIC SIGNAL INTERSECTIONS

Dear City of Muskogee:

SignalTek, Inc. (hereafter referred to as SignalTek) is a traffic signal maintenance company designed to provide a complete program to ensure all traffic signals operate safely and as efficiently as possible for cities, towns, counties, and municipalities (hereafter referred to as "Agency"). We are on call 24 hours a day to handle any problems that may arise. SignalTek, Inc. presently works with more than 60 agencies in Oklahoma and Arkansas, maintaining in excess of 300 signalized intersections and 100 school zone signs. Our technicians and engineering staff have over 70 years of combined experience in traffic signal engineering, maintenance, electrical engineering, and have been tested and certified by the International Municipal Signal Association (IMSA) as level I, and level II traffic signal technicians.

The following policies are included with the acceptance of this maintenance agreement:

- 1. Upon notification of any trouble at an intersection, we will send a technician to assess the problem, and make repairs on-site, if possible. If the equipment cannot be repaired on-site and it requires to be taken to the lab for testing and repairs, we will install loaner equipment at no rental charge until your equipment is either repaired or replaced. We keep an inventory of cabinets, controllers, conflict monitors, detectors, time switches and other traffic signal related equipment to relieve you of the need to keep your own inventory of spare equipment. Specialized equipment could possibly need to be ordered, i.e., un-interruptible power supplies.
- 2. Your signal equipment is covered by the Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement, and will be checked and tested for proper operation annually. Records of these checks and tests (and all subsequent service) are kept in our computer database. The periodic testing of critical monitoring equipment at each signalized intersection includes a test of the conflict monitor and its associated circuitry to verify proper operation. Also included in the annual inspection is maintenance of the control cabinet interior (such as changing the air filter and testing the cooling fan). If there are any minor parts needing to be replaced, we will install them and you will be invoiced for parts only.

Annual inspections will take place in January each year. Results will be submitted to the City by the end of March.

- 3. We create a Repair and Maintenance Activities Log of any service calls, repairs, maintenance, testing, or signal timing modifications. A printed report will be furnished with your monthly invoice reflecting date, time, nature of the service call, and activities we performed at any location covered under this agreement. These records are kept in our database indefinitely, and additional reports are available to you upon request.
- 4. Each year, the City of Muskogee agrees to pre-approve an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the replacement of traffic signal cabinet components and intersection equipment. SignalTek will seek approval from the City of Muskogee before replacing any single item that costs more than \$100.00.
- 5. At the City of Muskogee's request and under their direction, this agreement includes the ability to do major maintenance, repairs and/or replacement of traffic signal equipment, as needed. This includes but not limited to traffic control cabinets, mast arms and/or poles, signal heads, signal wiring, LED lenses, pre-emption, loops and anything needed to make the signalized intersection safe to the public.

In accordance with the hourly rates set forth below and in the attached price list, SignalTek agrees to provide whatever services are required to allow the City of Muskogee to maintain existing traffic signals and respond quickly in the event of traffic accidents, acts of nature, etc.

- \$100.00 Signal Technician
- \$100.00 Superintendent
- \$65.00 Laborer*

The terms of this agreement are as follows:

1. Monthly Rate:

The monthly rate is \$30.00 per signalized intersection, \$25.00 per flashing signal, and \$15.00 per school zone sign (or \$30.00 / pair). This covers all preventive and scheduled maintenance work and reports. The addition or deletion of a signalized intersection, flashing signal, or school zone sign installed or removed from service subsequent to the initial agreement, will affect the monthly rate. The hourly rate will not be affected.

2. Activity & Repair / Hourly Rate:

The hourly rate for labor under this agreement is \$100.00 per hour. This applies to services performed on-site or in our shop during regular business hours weekdays M - F (8 A.M. – 5 P.M.). Service calls made at the Agency's request after regular business hours, including week-ends and holidays, will be charged an overtime rate of \$150.00 per hour. A minimum of 1 ½ hour is charged per service call. Charges are accumulated and are invoiced monthly. No mileage will be charged for service calls to municipalities within a 40 mile radius of our office in Tulsa, OK. The mileage exceeding a 40 mile radius of our office in Tulsa, OK will be charged at \$1.00 per mile. A typical response time is two hours or less during normal workdays and hours. Response time during off-times should be 4 hours or less, but can be variable due to the nature and severity of services required and emergency nature of the service call.

3. Materials Used for Repairs:

Authorization by the Agency will be required for repair parts in excess of \$100.00 prior to installation. However, when emergency repairs due to signal damage or failure creates an immediate and clear hazard to the public, and requires expeditious action, additional and separate authorization for such parts exceeding \$100.00 in cost will not be required.

^{*}The number of laborers required will vary between 1 and 2 depending on the scope of work.

SignalTek will however make every effort to seek authorization for such parts, if Agency staff members are available to make such authorization. Repair parts will be charged at a cost plus 25% markup, which includes sales and use tax. Any parts originally obtained through SignalTek needing to be replaced within six months of installation by SignalTek, that are covered under a factory warranty, will not be charged a repair charge or service call. Any parts needing to be replaced that are City owned, whether installed by City or SignalTek, and covered by warranty, will be charged a service fee as well as shipping and handling costs incurred with said part warranty.

4. Preventive and Scheduled Maintenance Work:

All on-site visits to service Agency equipment will be coordinated with the Public Works Department Maintenance Technician and/or Field Operations Supervisor prior to work being performed. This person will be designated at a later date by the Agency after this agreement is executed.

When school zones are added to the contract, we will provide the annual one-time service of entering school zone dates and times to the time clocks at no cost to you.

5. Duration of Agreement:

The term of this agreement shall commence upon execution and shall automatically renew annually under the same terms and conditions set forth herein subject to funding allocation in the City budget. Each renewal authorized by the parties shall be good for a period of (1) fiscal year, commencing on July 1 and expiring on June 30.

Invoicing will be done on the 1st of each month.

If SignalTek determines it is necessary to change the terms of this agreement in any way, a notice will be sent 60 days prior to renewal date.



INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into by and between the following parties:

The BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of Muskogee County, Oklahoma ("County"), and,

The CITY OF MUSKOGEE, Oklahoma, a municipal corporation ("City").

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Statutes provide general authority for counties and municipalities to enter into agreements with each other for their mutual benefit; and,

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, 74 OKLA. STAT. §§ 1001-1008 ('Interlocal Act''), "permit[s] local governmental units to make the most efficient use of their powers by enabling them to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage." Id. § 1001; and,

WHEREAS, the City has hosted regional livestock shows at the Muskogee Fair Grounds for many years; however, within the last decade, the barns and area surrounding have fallen into disrepair, and the utility of the property has been repurposed for another governmental purpose;

WHEREAS, both the City and the County find that in an effort to enhance, improve and increase agricultural and ranching education and exposition within the region, a new venue should be constructed at a more suitable location for such activities, with more ample available parking, as well as, increased ease of access, visibility and proximity to state highways ("the Project");

WHEREAS, the Project, to be located at the Love-Hatbox Sports Complex within the City, will allow improved and expanded opportunities for participation in the ongoing agricultural and ranching events, providing significant economic benefits to the City and County, as well as, educational opportunities for their citizens;

WHEREAS, the City and the County find that a partnership under the Interlocal Act would provide the best opportunity for the pooling of resources of each party for the success of the Project;

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of the parties herein wish to execute the agreement in order to facilitate the proposed partnership.

THEREFORE, the parties do hereby enter into this Agreement to cooperatively facilitate the construction of a new venue housed within the City at the Love-Hatbox Sports Complex as outlined below:

1. The City shall perform all necessary planning, funding and primary construction for the project on land it already owns, subject to the County's contribution identified in paragraph 3.

- a. Grading of the livestock show area within the Project, including gravel and turf areas shown on attached Exhibit A, as needed.
- b. Transport of approximately 350 cubic yards wood chips and approximately 100 cubic yards of soil in and around the livestock show area of the Project, as identified by the City.
- c. Setup and tear down of approximately 550, 5'x5' cattle pens and tie out panels.
- d. Other labor and equipment as become known to the parties through the design and planning process of the project.

All other work toward the project shall be completed by the City.

- 4. The parties agree there will be an authorized point of contact during the planning and implementation of this agreement.
- 5. The parties further agree that the terms of this Agreement are not assignable to another party without the express written consent of the parties to this Agreement.
- 6. The parties agree that no real or personal property shall be acquired jointly during the course of this Agreement. Any property individually acquired by a party to this Agreement shall remain the property of that party upon termination of this Agreement.
- 7. This Agreement shall be in force and effect from the date all parties have signed it and the Attorney General has approved it, as provided in Title 74, Oklahoma Statutes, Section 1004(f) and shall expire June 30, 2018. This Agreement shall automatically renew at the end of each current fiscal year for an additional one-year period unless: i) either of the parties takes appropriate affirmative action as provided herein to terminate this Agreement, or, ii) if either party fails the necessary funding allocation. In accordance with this paragraph, either party may terminate this agreement upon 60 days' written notice to the other party. Notice will be deemed given is sent by regular mail to the governing body of the party to this Agreement.
- 8. The parties agree that this written Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties, and that it cannot be modified except by a written instrument executed by the parties.
- 9. A copy of this Agreement shall be submitted to the Attorney General's Office, State of Oklahoma, for his approval as required by law.

Approve application of Oklahoma Recreation Trail Fund Grant for extending Centennial trail to south Main.


