The request complied with the Land Use Map adopted by the City of Muskogee on June 4, 2012. When the rezoning was denied (2/12/2018), City Council requested that Staff review the Land Use Map and consider changing the classification. Since the request to rezone by Mr. and Mrs. Coppin was denied, Staff has reviewed the Land Use Map and based on the following information has determined that amending the Land Use Map is not recommended for this large industrial area. The large industrial area also contains two (2) railroad tracks running parallel with each other through the middle of the area. The area classified as industrial by the Land Use Map contains 1,718 acres (2.7 square miles) and consists of several existing industrial uses, large parcels, vacant land, floodplain and is isolated from established residential areas. There is approximately 60 residential structures within the 1,718 acres. The large majority of the area is currently zoned industrial. Additionally, the area where the rezoning was denied and being considered under the proposed resolution (Cherokee Street, Cherokee Drive, Missouri- Pacific Railroad, and Peak Blvd./ Hwy 165) containing 58 +/- acres is all currently zoned commercial or industrial, there is no residential zoning within this area. Amending the Land Use Map to Transitional Residential would allow new residential structures to be located within this area. Many industrial uses have outdoor storage, repair bays, and fuel whose appearance, light, noise, and odors make them incompatible with residential uses. This area is an ideal location for industrial uses, due to the existing zoning, large parcels, access to rail and the highway system, and isolation from established residential. The notice was published in the paper on March 6, 2018. A Public Hearing will be held on the following days:

He feels the City Manager has downsized the Fire Department from 94 to 92 members and would like to know if this is something that Council has approved. If this has been approved he cannot find the information in the Council minutes or meetings from the past (3) years. He stated he would like to have the two (2) positions filled and this is a decision that should be made by City Council, as stated in the City Charter, and not a decision made by the City Manager.

City Manager Mike Miller stated funding was down across the board and not just the Fire Department is being affected, but Staff has been cut back as well.

BACKGROUND:

As you are aware, the Management Contract between Spectra and the City of Muskogee was terminated on March 1, 2018. Upon the City of Muskogee resuming the management duties of the Civic Center, staff determined the rates currently set by Spectra needed to be reviewed and modified. As part of the review process, staff requested the Facilities Board review the current rates (Spectra Rates) and suggest any changes to the fees, charges and rates.

On February 8, 2018 the Facilities Board established a sub-committee to review the rates. The sub-committee consisted of Perline Boyattia, Wayne Johnson, David Ragsdale and Pete Roberts. The sub-committee met twice over the past few weeks comparing the current rates with the rates of other centers including, Martin Luther King Jr. Community Center, Hamlin's El Toro Event Center, Kilharen's Lodge, Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame, and the rates of the Civic Center when previously under the City of Muskogee management (FY2014-15). Upon review, the sub-committee recommended the suggested rates to the Facilities Board (see attached comparison).

On May 10, 2018 the Facilities Board approved the suggested rates and is recommending City Council approve and adopt the amended rates. A copy of the Resolution and amended rates are attached for review. The amended rates decreased approximately 40% from what Spectra was charging. Below is an example of what Spectra charged and the proposed new rate.

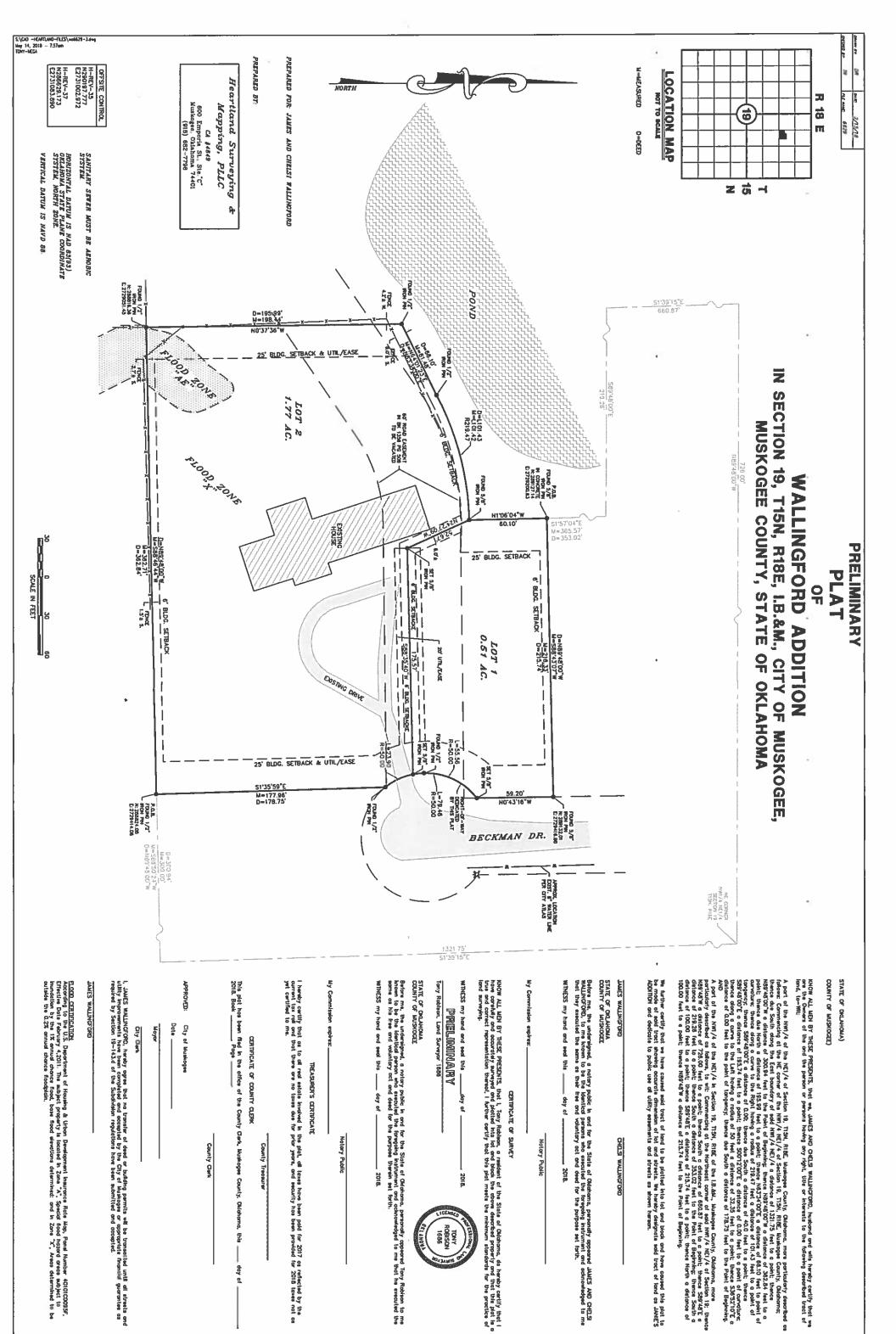

BACKGROUND:

As was discussed at the Special Call Council meeting on May 21, the Council gave direction to include an allocation of \$100,000.00 for fiscal year 2019, to be used for unrestricted economic development projects. The proposed ordinance creates a new subsection within Economic Development general account for this specific one-year allocation. This amendment does not disturb the 75%/25% allocation to the general account and opportunity account, respectively. Rather, it creates authority for the Council, under this one-year allocation, to determine whether funding should be allocated to a specific Economic Development project of the Council's choosing. Should any portion of the \$100,000.00 remain unexpended at the close of FY 2019, any remaining funds will remain in the general account, but may then only be used in accordance with the existing criteria established by sections (a), (b) and (f).

ORDINANCE NO. 4047-A

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 74, TAXATION, ARTICLE VIII, USE TAX, BY AMENDING SECTION 74-237, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND, ESTABLISHING A ONE-YEAR APPROPRIATION TO THE GENERAL ACCOUNT TO BE USED FOR UNRESTRICTED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SEVERABILITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE, OKLAHOMA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 74-237, Economic Development Fund, in the City of Muskogee Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 74-237. - Economic development fund.

- (a) There is hereby created an "economic development fund" for the city as fund is defined in section 2-551 of the Code. The fund shall consist of all monies, including interest thereon, deposited therein pursuant to section 74-236 and as may from time to time be appropriated by the city council. The monies accruing to the credit of the fund may be budgeted and expended only for the following purposes:
 - (1) To provide revenue to provide incentives to be used to create new jobs and retain existing jobs for high-impact business projects as defined below;
 - (2) To pay for debt service on obligations issued to assist in the establishment of manufacturing or distribution facilities;
 - (3) To fund job creation incentives and capital improvements, including the acquisition of land and facilities;
 - (4) To fund infrastructure improvements serving the proposed development area;
 - (5) To fund marketing of the city to prospective companies or to implement such program through contractual services with other agencies; and
 - (6) To provide for necessary city staff or consultants and supplies to implement this activity.
- (b) Within the economic development fund there shall be a general account. The account shall consist of all such monies, including interest thereon, deposited therein pursuant to this section. Monies accruing to the credit of the general account may be budgeted and expended for any purpose of the economic development fund.
 - (1) For Fiscal Year 2019 only, \$100,000 shall be set aside within the general account to fund such unrestricted economic development projects, which the City Council, in its sole discretion, deem appropriate and for the public purpose.

- (c) Within the economic development fund there shall be an economic opportunity account. The account shall consist of all such monies, including interest thereon, deposited therein pursuant to this section. Monies accruing to the credit of the economic opportunity account may be budgeted and expended for only those purposes set out in subsection (1) below.
 - (1) a. For the purpose of assisting in the development of a high-impact business project or facility or retaining such project or facility, a high-impact business project is defined as a retail or nonretail development activity that creates new, high-skill, high-wage jobs which foster the sound growth of the local economy. "New jobs" includes both the expansion of existing local firms, as well as relocation of firms from outside the area;
 - b. For the purpose of assisting in the development or redevelopment activities located in areas targeted for development and redevelopment in the city's comprehensive plan, such as, but not limited to, blighted areas or urban renewal project areas; or
 - c. For the purpose of assisting in projects that will make a unique or unequaled contribution to development or redevelopment efforts in the city, due to the project's magnitude, significance to the community or aesthetic quality.
 - (2) A two-thirds majority vote (six votes) of all the members of the city council is required to authorize any expenditure of monies from the economic opportunity account.
 - (3) The city council shall not consider approval of any payments from the economic opportunity account unless the city has received the following information, as appropriate, and presented the same to the city council:
 - a. The number of jobs created by a new business establishment;
 - b. The number of jobs retained by the existing business establishment;
 - c. The average salary of jobs to be created by a new establishment;
 - d. The average salary of jobs to be retained by an existing business;
 - e. The total capital investment to be made by the business establishment;
 - f. The likelihood of other business establishments locating within the same vicinity or within the Muskogee metropolitan area as a result of the business activity; and
 - g. Such other factors as the city council may determine to be relevant including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Cost of the development assistance (including labor costs of city staff);
 - 2. Cost of city services such as police and fire;
 - 3. Wear and tear on city streets and roads serving the proposed development;
 - 4. Increased burden on water, sewer and storm systems;
 - 5. Estimated "transfer losses" from existing merchants.

- (d) For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and each fiscal year thereafter, all revenue deposited within the economic development fund shall be distributed and apportioned monthly as follows:
 - (1) Sixty percent shall be deposited into the general account; and
 - (2) Forty percent shall be deposited into the economic opportunity account until such time as the amount of said account equals \$5,000,000.00. All monies directed to the economic opportunity account by this subsection not necessary to maintain this balance shall be deposited into the general fund of the city.
 - (3) For a one-year period only, beginning July 1, 2018, the distribution referenced in subsections (1) and (2) shall be modified as follows:
 - (i) Seventy-Five percent shall be deposited into the general account; and
 - (ii) Twenty-Five percent shall be deposited into the economic opportunity account.
- (e) All monies accruing to the credit of the economic development fund that are not expended by the end of the then current fiscal year shall be redeposit within said fund for use in the next fiscal year.
- (f) Amounts set aside in the city budget as "economic development fund" may be expended for purposes other than those established in subsections (a), (b) and (c) of this section only when certain specific circumstances exist. The circumstances requiring the expenditure of economic development funds are not expected to recur on a routine basis. The circumstances when it is necessary to appropriate or spend economic development fund amounts are subject to the objective criteria outlining the parameters of acceptable uses of these funds are as follows and must be declared by a two-thirds majority vote of all of the members of the governing body establishing that one or more of the criteria listed below exists:
 - (1) Expenditures for emergency situations as defined above for life, health, or public safety issues for which no existing appropriation exists;
 - (2) Situations where an expense or unexpected revenue decline or arises that could not have reasonably been foreseen, and for which new revenue is not available to offset and transfers of existing appropriations are not considered feasible or appropriate in maintaining existing service levels;
 - (3) Situations where the proposed use is of a nonoperational nature involving capital or equipment purchases having a useful life of greater than five years;
 - (4) Situations where the proposed use is of a nonrecurring nature, such as a study, or for start-up costs of a program whose ongoing costs are otherwise funded;
 - (5) To temporarily satisfy a judgment from a court of competent jurisdiction that will be reimbursed from property tax levies;
 - (6) To pay debt service on economic development projects;
 - (7) To pay levies of ad valorem taxes on behalf of the City of Muskogee Urban Renewal Authority.

<u>Section 2</u>. REPEALER. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in direct conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of the conflict only.

<u>Section 3</u>. SEVERABILITY. Should any part section, subsection, sentence, provision, clause or phrase hereof be held invalid, void, or unconstitutional for any reason, such holding shall not render invalid, void, or unconstitutional any other section, subsection, sentence, provision, clause, or phrase of this ordinance, and the same are deemed severable for this purpose.

<u>Section 4</u>. EMERGENCY. This ordinance being designated to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Muskogee, Oklahoma, and its passage being immediately necessary, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

This Agreement made this ___ day of May 2018, between the City of Muskogee, Oklahoma, Hereinafter referred to as the "City" and Heritage Environmental Services of __(City)______, _(state)_____, hereinafter referred to as "Heritage" herby authorizes Heritage Environmental Services to perform services as follows:

The Parties, in consideration for mutual covenants contained herein, agree as follows:

- 1. Heritage agrees to provide the City with services associated with the collection, transportation, ensuring reuse opportunities and disposal of residentially generated household chemical waste (hereinafter referred to as "HHW") materials.
 - A. The collection event will be on June 2, 2018 and October 20, 2018 at a site to be specified by the City. The one-day event will be open to the public at 9:00 a.m. and end at 3:00 p.m. All residents of Muskogee will be eligible to deliver HHW materials to the site during the collection period.
 - B. All HHW materials with the exception of automotive batteries collected during the events will be transported by Heritage to the Heritage processing facility located in <u>(City)</u>

 (State) ______for proper handling and processing.
 - C. Heritage agrees to provide an on-site reuse center during the collection events. Heritage considers a material reusable if it meets the following conditions: (a) contained within the original container with legible product labeling and usage information, (b) not banned, illegal, or otherwise restricted from use, and (c) on fourth or more by volume.
 - D. Heritage agrees to provide the City with an event SUMMARY REPORT detailing the; (a) types of HHW material collected, (b) total weight of each material collected, and (c) total weight of materials directed to reuse or beneficial reuse.
- 2. Heritage will be responsible for ensuring a reasonably safe and secure operating environment for the collection event and shall have responsibility for cleaning any waste that is spilled on-site and or on equipment used during the event.
- 3. Heritage agrees to operate in accordance with the requirements of all federal, state, and local laws, regulations and ordinances having appropriate jurisdiction. Heritage will maintain the insurance coverage's indicated in the Certificate of Insurance and provided to the City.

4. INDEMNIFICATION

A. Heritage hereby agrees to indemnify and hold the City and its officers, directors, employees, agents, owners, affiliates and contractors harmless from and against any and all loss and damage, suits, liability and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable investigation, legal expenses and attorney's fees) arising out of any clam for loss of or damage to property, including Heritage property, and injuries to or death of persons, including Heritage employees, caused by, resulting from, or growing out of the services described herein, only to the extent that such loss or damage is directly due to Heritage's actions.

- B. To the extent provided by law, the city hereby agrees to indemnify and hold Heritage and its officers, directors, employees, agents, owners, affiliates and contractors harmless from and against any and all loss and damage, suits, liability and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable investigation, legal expenses and attorneys' fees) arising out of any clam for loss of or damage to property, including the City's property, and injuries to or death of persons, including City employees, caused by, resulting from, or growing out of the services described herein, only to the extent that such loss or damage is directly due to the City's actions.
- 5. The City agrees to compensate Heritage payable within 15 days of the date of invoice. Total invoice cost will be based upon a fixed set-up/mobilization fee plus the waste disposal cost as stated in attached Exhibit A entitled, "Cost Proposal Part #1" and Exhibit B, entitled "Cost Proposal Part #2: Material Disposal Costs," with both exhibits incorporated herein. Waste categories and units of measurement used for invoice purposes shall be the same as those shown on said exhibits.
- 6. This Agreement shall become effective upon the date of execution and shall expire at the end of a one (1) year period. Said contract may be renewed annually at the mutual agreement of both parties. Written notice of termination must be received by either party (30) days prior to contract termination.
- 7. Any notice required to be given by the terms of this agreement shall be delivered to the parties as follows: City of Muskogee Attn: Greg Riley, Director of Public Works, 301 S. Cherokee, Muskogee, Ok 74403 and for Heritage Attn: (Name,) (Title) (Address)
