(Councilor Jaime Stout)

Councilmember Jaime Stout asked John Tyler Hammons to discuss the need to establish the Roxy Trust Authority for the purpose of more effective fundraising and operations oversight.

John Tyler Hammons stated he is there to represent the Roxy Theater, Oxford Productions, Inc., the management company for the Roxy Theater. Mr. Hammons is asking to establish a Roxy Community Trust and create a separate business that will allow the management company to go forth and solicit charitable donations to benefit the Roxy. There are approximately thirty (30) Roxy Theaters left in the United States which gives Muskogee a unique cultural entity within the City. There is a request to expand the Roxy Theater by using private funds, and to do this there needs to be a separate entity. Mr. Hammons stated by establishing a separate community trust it will allow Oxford Productions to go forth and raise money at no additional cost to the City.

Councilmember Patrick Cale asked what the chain of ownership would be and what would or would not change.

Mr. Hammons stated it is being proposed that ownership of the Roxy would go to a Roxy Trust and the Roxy Trust would be owned by the City of Muskogee. City Council would appoint nine (9) members to oversee that the City is maintaining control of the Roxy. The Roxy will not be sold to a private investor or Oxford Productions, it will remain in a public trust controlled by the City of Muskogee.

Mayor Bob Coburn asked Mr. Hammons to address what happens in twelve (12) to twenty-four (24) months if the City decides this is not the route it wants to pursue.

Mr. Hammons stated the plan is not to take power away from City Council or to be insulated from the political system, but asking for a separate entity to raise charitable donations. If this experiment does not work in two (2) or three (3) years, there is nothing that would prevent this body from being revoked. Mr. Hammons is simply asking for permission to raise money.

Councilmember Patrick Cale believes this an excellent idea. He feels the Roxy Trust Authority will allow the Roxy to grow, expand, and become a big success.

Councilmember Wayne Johnson asked City Attorney Roy Tucker how this would look from a legal aspect by going from City to a Trust.

City Attorney Roy Tucker stated it would be the same as how the City handled the Martin Luther King Center. If approved, Council will direct Staff to bring forth the appropriate documentation for the Council, as a body to approve the following on Monday, March 26, 2018. Documentation would include a Trust Indenture, which will establish the number of trustees, their powers, and obligations. Additionally, there will be an assignment of the contract between the City of Muskogee and Oxford Productions, to the Roxy Theater Community Trust to manage that contract. The Roxy

Theater Community Trust would have the authority to hire and fire it's own management company. With this assignment, Oxford Productions will continue to manage Roxy Theater. Additionally, Mr. Tucker requests this be transferred by a Deed of Trust to be held for the beneficiary, meaning the City of Muskogee will be the beneficiary. This will give the Trustees the authority to do what they need to as long as it continues to benefit the City as the sole beneficiary of the Roxy Theater Community Trust. Also, an ordinance will be required accepting the beneficial interest. Per the City Charter, any trusts created for the City's benefit must be accepted by ordinance. An ordinance will need to be established that will create the Roxy Theater Community Trust. The documents have been prepared by Oxford Productions Council and presented to Mr. Tucker for review and shall be ready for adoption if the Council so desires, at the Monday, March 26, 2018 City Council meeting. From that point forward the Roxy Trust will have whatever meetings their Trustees deem necessary to conduct the business of the trust, but all of it is to the benefit of the City of Muskogee as the beneficiary.

Councilmember Dan Hall asked how many City Councilmembers are going to be on the trust board.

Mr. Hammons stated each Councilmember is allowed one appointed member whether it be themselves or a member of the community.

Councilmember Dan Hall stated he is excited there is an opportunity to get more money flowing into the Roxy to allow for upgrades, expansion, and growth.



A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE AS A COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE; HAVING THE SHARED PURPOSE OF UNDERSTANDING POVERTY AND SUPPORTING PROGRAMS WHICH ASSIST THOSE LIVING IN POVERTY ACHIEVE SELF-SUFFICIENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Muskogee finds that many of its citizens are living in poverty, without adequate means to reach self-sufficiency;

WHEREAS, the City of Muskogee finds that having citizens living in poverty reduces the quality of life for all members of the community and creates issues of homelessness, hunger, and detrimental effects on mental and physical development that perpetuate and contribute to poverty;

WHEREAS, the City of Muskogee finds that perceptions of those in poverty or receiving public assistance – by those not in those circumstances – tend to reflect attitudes and stereotypes that attribute poverty to personal failings rather than socioeconomic structures and systems and that ignore strengths and competencies in these groups, and public policy and anti-poverty programs continue to reflect these stereotypes:

WHEREAS, the City of Muskogee finds that the social costs of poverty, strengthening the workforce and building a more prosperous, sustainable and vital community is a paramount public purpose proper for Council consideration of the same;

WHEREAS, the City of Muskogee finds it appropriate and necessary for citizens living in poverty to have a voice on health, social and economic issues that affect their plight;

WHEREAS, Building Bridges for the Future of Muskogee is a community agency, with programs designed to assist individuals living in poverty to transition to a state of self-sufficiency, to reduce social costs associated with poverty, to improve educational attainment and job skills and build sustainable communities.
