Receive report on the COVID-19 Pandemic in Muskogee, and if necessary, take appropriate action to authorize and approve a subsequent amendment to Resolution No. 2801 declaring a local emergency, or City-County Joint Resolution No. 2803. (Mike Miller)

Emergency Management Tyler Evans stated to-date there are 615 active cases in the City of Muskogee. He explained over 12% of our population has tested positive since this same time last year. The State of Oklahoma currently has .82 % active cases, while the City of Muskogee has has 1.6%; this is twice the State average.

Mr. Evans stated according to the Facebook page posted by the Oklahoma State Department of Health, they have administered over 300,000 vaccines.

Doug Walton, Muskogee County Health Department, stated has been a decrease in the number of active cases. He explained he Muskogee County Health Department is entering a new phase of the -19 vaccine process and will begin administering the second dose of shots for those who are eligible.

Mr. Evans stated no-cost testing is being performed at Express Wellness, Urgent Care, and CAREATC.

Discussion followed.

Trish German, Muskogee County EMS, stated call volume is up 8.5% and they are executing many long-distance transfers.

Discussion followed.

Mayor Coleman questioned if the Health Department might be able to organize a group of non-profit partners in an effort to set up small hubs to assist seniors who do not have access to technology for scheduling vaccine appointments.

Mr. Walton stated he would share this information with the senior leaders.

City Manager Mike Miller stated an amendment to the resolution has been prepared for City Council consideration, however he would prefer the Public speak at this time.

Bonnie Pierce (RN), 229 Kendall Blvd., Muskogee, Oklahoma, spoke in favor of extending the mask mandate.

Sharica Cole, 725 N. Terrace Blvd., Muskogee, Oklahoma, explained she is the President of Muskogee Education Association. She wished to make the public aware that educators want to return to the classroom with their students. She is in favor of the extending the mask mandate.

Valorie Aldridge, 22 Persimmon Dr., Muskogee, Oklahoma, explained is present on behalf of the Muskogee Education Association; she supports the extension of the mask mandate.

City Manager Miller stated the proposed amendment will extend the existing mask mandate an additional 90 days.

Motion was made by Councilmember Jaime Stout, seconded by Councilmember Traci McGee to approve a sixth amendment to Resolution No. 2801, to extend this mask mandate without any changes for a period of 90 days, expiring Monday, April 26, 2021.

2 (No Action Taken): Hold a Public Hearing to discuss the Community Development Block Grant- Coronavirus Response (CDBG-CV 2020) application for funding to prevent, prepare for, and respond to Coronavirus, or take other necessary action. (Tish Callahan)

Mayor Marlon Coleman opened the Public Hearing.

Planning Director Tish Callahan stated the City of Muskogee is applying to the Oklahoma Commerce (ODOC) Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Response (CDBG-CV 2020) funding assistance program. All activities must be in relation to the virus and have started after the first case of the Coronavirus identified in the United States on January 21, 2020.

She explained CDBG-CV grants are a flexible source of assistance for addressing the health and economic challenges brought on by the Coronavirus Pandemic. These funds are intended to pay costs not covered by other forms of assistance and specifically benefit persons of low and moderate income. The Federal Register further details the rules, waivers, and alternative requirements for CDBG-CV (Vol. 85, No.162, 51459).

The total amount of funding available for the 2020 CDBG-CV program is \$8,680,036.00. The funds will be allocated among the participating 18 communities that are eligible (based on population) 2020 Units of Local Governments.

Under the State's CDBG-CV program, a community may request up to three (3) activities under one (1) single application. The eligible activities are:

- Utility Assistance
- Rental/Mortgage Assistance
- Medical Assistance
- Mental Health Assistance
- Nutrition Assistance

Mark Hughes, 907 Nelson Dr., Muskogee, Oklahoma, stated the requirement by the ODOC plan states the Citizen Participation Plan requirements does not constitute a valid plan. All written Citizen Participation Plans must explain how an applicant of Local Government will provide for and encourage citizen participation. He feels if there is need from the low income population, then there needs to be a way to reach these people.

Mayor Marlon Coleman closed the Public Hearing.

City Manager Miller explained Mr. Hughes is actually speaking in reference to Agenda Item

#3, which is the Applicant Resolution.

These funds are earmarked by City Ordinance No. 3855-A for the operation of the City's Tourism Program and as such must be used exclusively for this purpose. This resolution further restricts use of

6 Consider approval to authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute a site ground lease agreement with Branch Towers III, LLC, to operate a telecommunications facility on the site, including the installation of a cell tower and supporting equipment and structures, or take other necessary action. (Gary D. Garvin)

Assistant City Manager Gary Garvin stated Branch Towers III, LLC, is requesting approval of a site ground lease agreement to operate a telecommunication facility on property owned by the City of Muskogee, located on South 34th Street, north of the Muskogee County Health Department. The lease would allow the lessee to install, maintain, and operate an antenna tower or pole and foundation, utility lines, transmission lines, air conditioned equipment shelter, electronic equipment, radio transmitting and receiving antennas, supporting equipment, and structures.

The basic terms of the lease include the following:

- The initial term of the lease will be five (5) years with option to renew automatically up to nine (9) additional five (5) year terms under the same terms and conditions.
- Lessee shall notify lessor within ninety 90 days if lessee intention is to not renew the Agreement.
- Lease shall be \$600.00 a month with an annual increase of two (2) percent of the base rent.
- Lessee shall maintain the property to ensure compliance with all City property maintenance codes.
- Lessor shall provide the lessee access to the tower to allow the City to place an antenna on the tower at no cost.

7 **(No Action Taken):** Receive report on new sanitation solid waste trucks, including proposed changes to sanitation cart procedures for residents and related public education program, and take other necessary action. (Mike Stewart)

Assistant Public Works Director Stephen Morton presented a report on the new solid waste trucks. The new system is scheduled to begin February 1, 2021.

Mr. Morton explained new guidelines for the solid waste containers:

- 1. All carts shall be placed within two (2) feet of the curb or curb line;
- 2. Carts shall be placed on a level surface with the lid opening facing the street;
- 3. Carts shall not be placed on any driveway;
- 4. Carts are not to be obstructed from the sanitation workers view such as behind a parked car, hedges, etc.;
- 5. Carts must be placed a minimum of six (6) feet away from any parked cars and not be place within two (2) feet of a mailbox or other obstructions;
- 6. If a residence has two (2) carts, there must be a separation of two (2) feet between each cart;
- 7. The cart shall be placed for collection no earlier than 7:00 p.m. the day prior to pickup, and no earlier than 7:00 a.m. the day of collection, and returned to its storage place no lather than 7:00 p.m. the day of collection;
- 8. The cart shall not be filled to a level that obstructs the unaided complete closure of the

cart lid;

- 9. No bags or weights shall be placed on the cart lid to keep it closed;
- 10. The cart, when full, may not exceed 200 pounds; and
- 11. Residents are allowed five (5) extra 32 gallon bags, but cannot weigh in excess of 35 pounds.

BACKGROUND:

City Staff submits for Council consideration the following projects for Letters of Intent (LOI) submission to the City of Muskogee Foundation (COMF):

\$100,000.00 - JUVENILE AND ADULT COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

The City of Muskogee City Attorney's Office is re-applying for funding to continue operating an adult and juvenile community service program for those who have been criminally charged and adjudicated through our municipal court program.

Over the years, the community service program has been managed by the City Attorney's office and the juvenile program has been operated by Muskogee County Council on Youth Services with funding provided by the foundation. Statistically, there are generally thirty (30) new juvenile cases filed in our court per month. On either a plea or finding of guilty, the juvenile is assessed a range of sixteen (16) to fifty-six (56) hours of community service depending on the nature of the charge. These hours must be completed before the juvenile is released from court supervision. The Municipal Court Judge, has ordered that community service hours for adults may be credit toward fines at the rate of \$15 per hour. This year we have included allowing offenders to get out of jail that are there on municipal fines. They are in jail because of the inability to pay their fines. By allowing them to participate in community service, it is allowing the jail additional needed space for other uses, provides the inmate with credits for 2 days for each 1 day served. This has allowed a significant increase in participation. We believe this will have a substantial impact on community beautification and revitalization. Unfortunately, for approximately the last 8 or so months, we have not been permitted to check out inmates. This is due in part because of the pandemic and due to the influx of contraband into the jail. We are confident that we will be able to restart inmate check out in the coming year. The Juvenile program has been run for 8 full years with great success. The adult program has been operational for 7 years and appears to be of great benefit.

\$200,679 – MPD BEARCAT ARMORED VEHICLE- SPECIAL OPERATIONS

This is a request for a matching grant to accompany the \$150,000 the council appropriated last month

for this purpose. This vehicle will replace the current special operations vehicle which we acquired as federal surplus several years ago and is well past its useful life.

The City of Muskogee is unique due to its geographical location, demographics, economic level, and diverse population. The types of calls for service that the Muskogee Police Department responds to are comparable to larger cities across the nation. On average the police department responds to approximately 45,000 calls for service each year. In those calls officers responded to shootings, stabbings, armed robberies, armed and barricaded subjects, armed and suicidal subjects, and high risk search warrants. The Muskogee Police Department holds the safety of the public and its officers at the highest level. This requires our officers to respond to and resolve any situation they are confronted with as safely and effectively as possible. This requires our officers to be trained to handle these high risk situations and to have the necessary tools and safety equipment at their disposal. The City of Muskogee, with its limited budget, has done the best it can to provide much needed equipment and training. This limited budget has made the police department use forfeited drug funds and grant money from multiple organizations to supplement its needs. Over the last twelve years the police department has received over \$1.5 million dollars from these grants: Weed and Seed, Buffer Zone Protection Plan (railroad), Justice Assistance Grants, and the City of Muskogee Foundation. The money from these grants has allowed us to purchase equipment that the City of Muskogee did not have the money to provide. This equipment includes: laptop computers and software, digital cameras, vehicles, Tasers, body armor, night vision, binoculars, spike strips, weapons, body cameras, and MDTs in every patrol car.

\$130,000 - TEEN CENTER & YVC PROGRAM

The Teen Center provides a safe and supervised environment that offers participants a chance to learn new skills, socialize with peers in a positive manner, enjoy recreational activities, and receive homework help and encouragement from caring adults- the Teen Center is filling real needs. It is centrally located in the Old Amory Building on Callahan St. Our programming offers a full gym for basketball, volleyball and futsol (indoor soccer), a weight room with fixed weights and cardio equipment, a six station computer lab, and game room with video games, air hockey, and pool and ping pong tables. The Youth Volunteer Corps of Muskogee offers volunteer opportunities for teen participants for civic engagement, leadership and skill building. Through our collaboration with MPS, members may ride the bus from Alice Robertson, Muskogee High School, Rougher Alternative Academy or Sadler Elementary School. Neighborhood youth walk or ride bikes and others are dropped off by parents, siblings or may even drive themselves. We are open every afternoon from 3-7 p.m. and offer extended hours for special events or when school is not in session.

\$100,000 - MOBILE STAGE

The mobile stage will enhance current and new events planned by the Parks and Recreation Department as well as other partners. The Parks and Recreation Department will manage the stage for city and community use. Events planned in Honor Heights Park, Hatbox Field and Hangars, and downtown Depot Green events will all benefit with use of this stage. The stage is a self-contained unit that is easily transportable by a truck. The stage set up is easy with minimal man power and use of hydraulic system.

\$115.000 - HATBOX BASEBALL IMPROVEMENTS

(50/50 match with CIP funding-\$230,000 project)

Hatbox Improvements are included in the projects for the current list of CIP projects for the city. Improvements to the Sports Complex include a new restroom building at the baseball complex, renovation of the south concession, and concrete walkways throughout the complex. These improvements are critical to the continued success of the existing sports programs and facilities. Local youth sports programs are an important aspect of Quality of Life and supported by the hundreds of

families who participate in sports programs at Love-Hatbox each year. The economic impact of sports events and weekend tournaments positively impacts the entire community through hotel stays, restaurants, and additional spending by visitors during these events.

\$100,000 - DEPOT DISTRICT TRAIN

Trackless train to be utilized year round for community events, private rentals, and seasonal holiday activities. The train will be used to enhance our "depot" theme and the Depot District community events, activities, and tourism.

\$300,000 - DEMOLITION/CLEAN-UP PROGRAM

This program is to demolish up to sixty (60) severely dilapidated structures within the City, all of which have gone through all of the hearings processes. Removal of these unsafe and severely dilapidated structures will enhance the "live, work and play" for residents and guests along with providing safety, security and beautification.
