MINUTES

OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE, OKLAHOMA MET IN A SPECIAL CALL SESSION IN COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF CITY HALL APRIL 8, 2024

The City Council of the City of Muskogee, Oklahoma, met in a Special Call Session at 5:30 p.m., on April 8, 2024, in Council Chambers, Municipal Building, 229 W. Okmulgee Ave., Muskogee, Oklahoma, with Mayor Marlon J. Coleman presiding.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Marlon J. Coleman and the City Clerk called the roll as follows:

Receive presentation relating to the proposed Tax Increment Districts of the City of Muskogee and Muskogee County, and take other necessary action. (Mike Miller)

City Manager Mike Miller explained the Port of Muskogee, working with City and County officials, has identified industrial development opportunities that will create new jobs and benefit both the City and County. However, certain critical infrastructure improvements arose, such as utilities and rail, that are necessary to allow the development to move forward. He stated on October 9, 2023, Council voted to appoint a TIF Review Committee to make findings and a recommendation for this proposed project. With Mayor Coleman as Chair, the committee met at least three (3) times. On March 15, 2024, Council recommended approving two (2) districts, and voted to hire the Public Finance Law Group to help guide us through the process.

Mayor Marlon J. Coleman stated he had the opportunity to visit as a joint TIF Committee with City of Muskogee officials as well as County officials.

Nate Ellis, Public Finance Law Group, LLC, presented a PowerPoint of the Proposed

Tax Increment Districts.

Mr. Ellis stated there are three (3) separate hearings that are tied together in a joint project plan between the City of Muskogee and Muskogee County. A joint review committee looked at project plans and decided to create TIF District #6 (six) and TIF District #2 (two), while terminating an existing TIF District #1 (one) that did not come to fruition.

Mr. Ellis explained a TIF District is an economic development tool that allows a city or county to identify a specific area for future development, and to capture the increment of new tax revenues generated because of that development, utilizing that revenue stream to help offset costs related to making that development move forward.

Mr. Ellis stated the termination of TIF District #1 (one), Project Faith, is necessary as the proposed development did not come to fruition, and future development would not be supported by the existing parameters.

Proposed projects for the new Muskogee Increment Districts are:

- Project Heart Construct a battery-grade lithium refinery as a proposed \$1.13 billion capital investment and creating hundreds of new jobs.
- Project Structure Construct a new fabrication facility for an existing Muskogee business as a proposed \$20+ million capital investment and creating 15-20 new jobs.
- Project Bifrost Construct a bitcoin data center as a proposed \$200+ million capital investment and projected to create 20 new jobs.

Projected TIF Project Costs are:

- Industrial road and utility improvements \$18,251,068.00
- Rail infrastructure improvements \$6,069,805.00
- Organizational costs combined for both TIFs \$200,000.00
- Administration costs combined for both TIFs \$340,000.00
- Financing costs not to exceed \$27.1 million

Mr. Ellis stated there are other potential funding sources. A \$1.2 million grant for the trestle bridge replacement project has been confirmed. A request of \$5.45 million in funding assistance from ODOT for 53rd Street and \$2 million in funding assistance from the Oklahoma P3 program has been requested. Potential Project Heart option for expansion could allow for reduction in the scope of the SSIP East Loop Road project from \$4.6 million, to approximately \$1.7 million. Potential local construction sales tax TIF revenue matching funds from Oklahoma Local Development and Enterprise Zone Incentive Leverage Act, an estimated \$3.9 million.

Tax Increment District #2, Muskogee County, is a 15-year term ending not later than December 31, 2039. It will capture 100% of new ad valorem increment revenue and 50% of new construction sales tax increment revenue.

Tax Increment District #6, City of Muskogee, is a 17-year term ending not later than December 31, 2041. It will capture 100% of new ad valorem increment revenue and 50% of new construction sales tax increment revenue.

Hold a Public Hearing regarding the proposed creation of Increment District No. 6, City of Muskogee and the Southside Industrial Park Economic Development Project Plan, or take other necessary action. (Mike Miller)

City Manager Mike Miller provided a presentation explaining General Obligation Bonds (GO Bonds) are used to fund large public projects that do not fit into the annual budget and must be approved by a vote of the people. At the Budget Retreat in April 2023, Council gave direction to pursue the GO Bond as a way to fund some capital projects. In May 2023, Council gave direction to hold an election in 2023 for a 25-year, \$77 million bond. Then in July of 2023, Council gave direction to continue work on the GO Bond, moving it to 2024.

Mr. Miller stated it is necessary to analyze survey data and use it to determine which categories are most important to the public. It will be necessary to finalize proposed project lists based on public input and needs assessment. In June, July, and August, the publicwill be educated via a dedicated website, public meetings, videos, fliers, media, social media and other communication as necessary to ensure everyone has ample opportunity to fully understand the propositions on the ballot and the projects those propositions would fund. The election would be tentatively held August 27, 2024.

Mr. Mark Hughes stated he is concerned that the survey will not be scientific or will be too generic for citizens.

City Manage Mike Miller stated there are many important economic development projects underway currently. City Council began this process on October 9, 2023, and established a TIF Review Committee that has met three (3) times since.

Nate Ellis, Public Finance Law Group, stated a TIF District is an economic development tool that allows a city to identify a specific geographic area to capture the incremental new tax revenue that is generated as a result of development, and use that revenue to help offset infrastructure costs and other necessary costs related to making these projects move forward. It is created by City Ordinance or County Resolution after completion of the TIF process.

Mr. Ellis explained the TIF Process as first requiring a determination of eligibility, then the development of a project plan, and the creation of a TIF Review Committee comprised of representatives of City, County, City Planning Commission, County Commissioners, affected taxing jurisdictions and other at-large community members. The TIF Review Committee and City's Planning Commission review the project plan. Two (2) Public Hearings must be held, after which Council will consider an Ordinance to approve the project plan and creating a TIF, and County Commissioners consider a Resolution approving the project plan and creating the TIF.

Increment District No. 1 (one), Muskogee County, is an existing county TIF for proposed termination. It was formerly proposed as a manufacturing facility that did not come to fruition.

Proposed projects for the new Muskogee Increment Districts are:

- Project Heart Construct a battery-grade lithium refinery as a proposed \$1.13 billion capital investment, creating hundreds of new jobs.
- Project Structure Construct a new fabrication facility for an existing Muskogee business as a proposed \$20+ million capital investment, creating 15-20 new jobs.
- Project Bifrost Construct a bitcoin data center as a proposed \$200+ million capital investment, creating a projected 20 new jobs.

Projected TIF Project Costs are:

- Industrial road and utility improvements -- \$18,251,068.00
- Rail infrastructure improvements -- \$6,069,805.00
- Organizational costs combined for both TIFs -- \$200,000.00
- Administration costs combined for both TIFs -- \$340,000.00
- Financing costs not to exceed -- \$27.1 million

Mr. Ellis stated there are other potential funding sources. A \$1.2 million grant for the trestle bridge replacement project has been confirmed. A request of \$5.45 million in funding assistance from ODOT for 53rd Street, and \$2 million in funding assistance from the Oklahoma P3 program has been requested. Potential Project Heart option for expansion could allow for reduction in the scope of the SSIP East Loop Road project from \$4.6 million, to approximately \$1.7 million. Potential local construction sales tax TIF revenue matching funds from Oklahoma Local Development and Enterprise Zone Incentive Leverage Act, an estimated \$3.9 million.

Tax Increment District #2, Muskogee County, is a 15-year term ending no later than December 31, 2039. It will capture 100% of new ad valorem increment revenue and 50% of new construction sales tax increment revenue.

Tax Increment District #6, City of Muskogee, is a 17-year term ending no later than December 31, 2041. It will capture 100% of new ad valorem increment revenue and 50% of new construction sales tax increment revenue.

The total projected TIF revenues for Increment District No. 2 (two) are estimated at \$4.88 million, and \$38.35 million for Increment District No. 6 (six).

The City and County will apportion TIF revenues pursuant to the respective Project Plan. The City Manager and County Commissioner Chairperson are in charge of implementation, and City/County will approve public agreements with developers as appropriate.

The Projects are expected to impact the community by increasing the population and associated needs (capital infrastructure and service demands). Temporary construction and permanent employment will greatly increase retail spending opportunities within the City and the County, helping generate new tax dollars. Ancillary development outside the TIF District may generate additional revenue for taxing entities. New business inside Increment District areas will create short-term and long-term employment opportunities, likely resulting in increased retail spending, benefiting local businesses.

On March 15, 2024, the TIF Review Committee completed their third meeting, recommending approval of the TIF Districts. The first Public Hearing was held on April 8, 2024. The City of Muskogee Planning Commission reviewed the information on April 15, 2024, and recommended approval. The second Public Hearing is April 22, 2024, and Council will consider adoption of the ordinance to create Increment District No. 6 (six). On April 29, 2024, Muskogee County Commissioners will consider adoption of TIF Resolutions (termination of Increment District No. 1 (one) and creation of Increment District No. 2 (two)).

The City Council of the City of Muskogee, Oklahoma, met in a Special Call Session at 9:00 a.m., on April 30, 2024, at Muskogee-Davis Regional Airport, 1201 Sabre Street, Muskogee, Oklahoma, with Mayor W. Patrick Cale presiding.

INVOCATION - MAYOR W. PATRICK CALE

Meeting was called to order by Mayor W. Patrick Cale and the City Clerk called the roll as follows:

Discuss the FY2024-2025 Budget for the City of Muskogee, public opinion survey results, give direction to Staff, and take possible action for consideration in future General Obligation Bond and/or Capital Improvement Sales Tax votes, or take other necessary action. (Mike Miller)

City Manager Mike Miller explained the goal for today is twofold. One goal is to make key decisions regarding the FY FY2024-2025 budget, receiving enough information to hold a Public Hearing on May 13, 2024, with possible budget adoption. The second goal pertains to the General Obligation (GO) Bond. He stated he will be providing the results from the GO Bond survey, presenting a list of projects based on City Council input, and receive direction from City Council, with a proposed Special Call Council meeting to be held on May 20, 2024, to call for an election to be held in August 2024.

Mr. Miller stated areas of City Council interest for specific discussion include the following topics:

- Staffing List Over Time
- Contract Labor/temps
- Organization Chart
- Parades
- Community Picnic
- Free Rodeo/Fireworks
- Tourism Authority
- Museum Funding/Special Project Fund
- Economic Development

He explained the City has many great projects currently in progress, such as an \$80 million sewer plant, \$1 billion in economic development projects, plus TIF, the largest street project in history, a GO Bond, the Grandview Park Adventure Park, the Swim and Fitness remodel, and the Water Park refurbishment.

Strategic Initiatives include the following:

- Streets and Infrastructure
- Public Image
- Economic Development
- Housing
- Tourism

Mr. Miller stated the Reserve Fund currently rests at 21%, with best practice at 20% - 30% of the General Fund. He explained 30% would provide a total of approximately three (3) months of funding for the City. The City's budget is based on the following budgeting principles:

- Keep expenses less than revenue
- Budget for good surprises
- Strategic initiatives have priority
- Mid-year budget review is very important
- Do not budget carryover
- Do not budget reserves

The following funds were discussed:

- General Fund
- Dedicated Sales Tax Fund
- Hotel/Motel Tax Fund
- Enterprise Funds

Mr. Miller stated the trend shows most cities our size are all experiencing the same issues. He stated it will be a tough budget year with the following things taken into account when preparing the proposed budget:

- Sales tax is down about 1% for the year
- Staff reduced operating budgets by 2.25%
- More than 2/3 of the General Fund is employee compensation
- Two (2) long-vacant positions eliminated; no new ones created
- Significant savings in workers' compensation

Mr. Miller explained the General Fund expenses have risen more than \$620,000.00, which includes increased health insurance premiums of \$439,500.00, the community picnic of

\$45,000.00, and a deficit of \$135,000.00 relating to the MRA/Civic Center.

Assistant City Manager Roger Kolman explained that in the past several years, the Civic Center has incurred more expenses than revenues, causing a shortfall. It has recently been discovered the previous Civic Center Manager was not charging room rentals, or at a rate severely lower than the authorized rate. Mr. Kolman explained in 2018, City Council approved a fee schedule for room rentals, and even those rates are at a subsidized rate. The estimated cost to operate the Civic Center is approximately \$1,000.00/day.

Mr. Miller explained Justin O'Neal has recently taken the position of the Civic Center Manager and has received backlash from individuals and groups who do not want to pay for room rentals moving forward, as they have not been charged in the past. He has been placed in a very difficult situation and is working diligently to get the Civic Center back on the right track.

Mayor Patrick Cale directed Staff to research and determine how high room rental rates would need to be raised in an effort to break even moving forward.

Councilmember Tracy Hoos stated each individual event should be considered to determine the return on investment the City may receive from the event being held in our City.

Councilmember Melody Cranford stated she feels "marketing is key" in an effort to move the Civic Center forward.

Discussion followed.

Staff was given direction to better market the Civic Center, honor the previous year's contract amounts for renters, with notification that fees will be charged in the next year, to look for opportunities for discounts or other in-kind donations based on the event, continue with the current fee schedule currently in place with no rate increases, and enforce rates currently established moving forward.

Mr. Miller stated there is currently \$45,000.00 budgeted for the Community Picnic. He explained there has been discussion among Councilmembers as to whether to continue holding the event and asked for Council input at this time.

Mayor Patrick Cale stated continuing to fund this event may not be the right thing to do. He is not in favor of spending that amount of money out of the General Fund to support the event.

Vice Mayor Derrick Reed stated he feels if the Community Picnic is removed from the budget, the \$60,000.00 that has been budgeted for the Community Rodeo should also be removed from the budget.

Councilmember Dan Hall stated with the upcoming election for a GO Bond, the City needs to be frugal with their spending to avoid sending the wrong message to the citizens.

Councilmember Melody Cranford explained the City will be asking the citizens to support the Bond. In turn, the citizens will be asking "what is in it for us?"

Vice Mayor Derrick Reed explained the picnic could be held for less than \$45,000.00, but

insists it continue to take place.

Mayor Patrick Cale recommended reducing the current budgeted amount by 75%, leaving an amount of \$12,000.00 in the budget to fund the Community Picnic.

Councilmember C.B. Abel suggested combining the picnic with the National Night Out Event.

Discussion followed.

Direction was given to Staff to budget an amount of \$12,000.00 for the Community Picnic.

Mr. Miller explained the City has previously spent \$15,000.00 for the cost of parade floats for Council participation. This amount allowed for a total of two (2) floats for each of the five (5) parades held. He asked for direction from Council as to how they wish to proceed for the upcoming budget year.

Direction was given to Staff to proceed with only one (1) Mayor and City Council float for parades moving forward.

Mr. Miller provided a General Fund Summary, asking for direction and/or changes moving forward with budget preparation.

No changes were recommended.

Motion was made by Councilmember Tracy Hoos, seconded by Councilmember Dan Hall to approve to take a five (5) minutes recess.

City Manager Mike Miller explained the Hotel/Motel Tax is a fund that can only be spent on tourism related items. Traditionally, there have been six (6) specific items funded through the hotel/motel tax:

- Community Rodeo
- Oklahoma Music Hall Of Fame (OMHOF)

- 3 Rivers Museum
- Hatbox Events
- War Memorial Park (U.S.S. Batfish)
- Roxy Theater

Mr. Miller explained the Muskogee Tourism Authority (MTA) has a budget proposal they wish to present to City Council for consideration. Mr. Miller explained the main question regarding the proposal is whether City Council wishes to continue to decide funding of those six (6) specific items, giving the remainder of the funds to the MTA, or does City Council wish to give all the funding to the MTA, allowing them to make those decisions. He wished to point out that if the MTA decides not to continue funding, there is a possibility those entities will approach the City for funding and there will be no tourism funding in which to give them.

Mr. Marlon Coleman, MTA Executive Director, presented City Council with the following proposal:

- MTA to receive all Hotel/Motel Tax
- MTA to fund facilities at the same level as currently
- MTA to fund War Memorial Park at its current level, if it is open
- MTA to fund Hatbox Arena operations at a \$65,000.00 reduction (total \$165,000.00)

Mr. Coleman explained the rodeo funding is not included in their proposal as the rodeo "was given to them, not something tourism had advocated for." He stated MTA feels those funds could be better allocated for several other projects. He expressed their desire not to fund the rodeo moving forward. Mr. Coleman also stated MTA feels it can function better as an entity if the budget does not contain individual line items.

Discussion followed.

Mayor Cale stated he feels MTA is better qualified than City Council at raising funding and promoting events.

Mr. Miller wished to point out based on the MTA proposal, there will be a \$65,000.00 deficit for Habox that will have to be funded from the General Fund. He suggested MTA leave the funding at \$165,000,00 for the upcoming year, reducing it by \$65,000.00 in the following year. This would allow the City time to determine from where the funds will come.

Councilor Tracy Hoos asked who would be responsible for the auditing of hotel/motel tax revenue. Mr. Miller stated it will be the responsibility of the City. However, MTA may be asked to share in that cost. Councilor Hoos also asked how the City will monitor the funding given to the MTA. Mr. Coleman explained MTA will be willing to meet whenever necessary, to provide reports and updates for the City Council.

Mayor Cale agreed with Mr. Miller in maintaining the \$165,000.00 support for Hatbox for the upcoming year, reducing it by \$65,000.00 in the following year.

Councilor Dan Hall stated with the removal of the rodeo funding of \$60,000.00, that would almost cover the \$65,000.00 difference.

Discussion followed.

Motion was made by Mayor Patrick Cale, seconded by Councilmember Dan Hall to approve the transferring of all Hotel/Motel Tax revenue under the purview of the Muskogee Tourism Authority, accepting their proposal with the following amendments: Hatbox funding will remain at \$165,000.00 for FY2024-2025, \$100,000.00 thereafter, funding of \$65,857.00 for War Memorial Park (Batfish), and full discretion of the MTA for rodeo funding.

Since this is an event which brings in tourism to the City, it would be an appropriate use of the funds.

There was discussion to determine if funding for the cattle tie outs should be paid for out of the Special Projects Fund in November, or the \$455,000.00 previously discussed for the MTA transfer.

Motion was made by Mayor Patrick Cale, seconded by Councilmember Dan Hall to immediately fund the requested tie outs project in the amount of \$106,000.00 from the Hotel/Motel Tax funding balance (\$455,000.00), and based on availability of funding in the Special Projects Fund at mid-year, reimburse the Hotel/Motel Tax funding in the amount of \$106,000.00, transferring those funds to the MTA.

He explained this sales tax is set to expire this year. He is requesting City Council approve to renew this tax with an election to be held in August 2024.

Discussion began related to the General Obligation (GO) Bond. Mr. Miller explained in May 2023, Council gave direction to hold an election in 2023 for a 25-year, \$77 million bond. In July 2023, Council unanimously voted to continue to work on the bond. However, they requested it be held in 2024 rather than 2023. In April 2024, Council authorized a public opinion survey to be conducted. Mr. Miller stated it is time to provide Council with the survey results, so they may decide which projects will be included in the GO Bond.

Mr. Nate Ellis, with The Public Law Finance Group, was available to provide direction and answer questions.

Ms. Tera Shows, Media Specialist, provided the results of the public survey. She stated there were a total of 593 responses with 69% in support of the GO Bond.

Mr. Miller presented a list of proposed projects for consideration for the GO Bond and the renewal of the CIP Sales Tax:

Hold a Public Hearing to discuss the City of Muskogee Budget for FY2024-2025, and take other necessary action. (Mike Miller)

Mayor W. Patrick Cale opened the Public Hearing.

City Manager Mike Miller explained Staff and Council have been working on the budget since February. Council requested a balanced budget, discussing any changes and providing rationale for those changes.

Mr. Miller stated there are exciting projects in progress for our city. We have begun construction on an \$80 million sewer plant. There are TIF projects that will bring in 800+ jobs and a billion dollars worth of industrial development sites. We have had the largest street projects in history.

The budget goal is to have revenue remain above expenses, with focus being on strategic

initiatives, areas of interest, reserve, budget overview/principles, General Fund, and strategic funds. The foundation of the budget is to make certain we have a good savings account for emergencies, and best practice is to have 20-30% of the general fund in savings.

Mr. Miller explained the General Fund can be used for any governmental purpose and is funded primarily from sales taxes (57.7%) with the rest from fees for services. Sales tax is down about one percent (1%) for the year, so Staff was instructed to cut 2.25% of operating budgets in an effort to reduce the impact on services. Two (2) long-vacant positions were elimated, and no new ones were created. The community picnic was reduced to \$12,000.00, and the parade float funding was reduced by half.

Mr. Miller explained expenses have increased due to inflation and rising utility costs. Health insurance premiums increased by \$439,500.00.

\$1,500,000.00 has been set aside for Economic Development from use tax. Operations Account \$900,000.00

- Port/Industrial Development \$500,000
- Main Street Muskogee \$100,000.00
- Civic Center Events \$50,000.00
- Contract Services and Events \$133,000.00
- Operations/Housing/Retail \$117,000.00

Mr. Miller stated there has been a Capital Account Request to repurpose \$500,000.00 of housing incentive fund for the Port of Muskogee.

Councilmember Tracy Hoos stated the Port has requested \$500.000.00 from the housing incentive fund to be transferred to the Port's capital fund.

Discussion followed.

Motion was made by Mayor Patrick Cale, seconded by Councilmember Dan Hall to approve the one-time funding of \$500,000.00, transferring from the Special Project fund (housing incentive) to the Muskogee City-County Port Authority for capital expenditures, effective July 1, 2024.

The estimated carryover will be available July 1, 2023 and will be \$455,000.00 with a capital request from the livestock show for animal pens.

Councilmember Jaime Stout asked if the money could be transferred before July 1, 2024.

Councilmember Hoos asked if the money is transferred before then, would the FY2024 budget have to be amended.

Mr. Miller explained that yes, if the money was transferred before July 1, there would have to be a budget amendment because those funds have already been appropriated.

Deputy Mayor Reed stated he would like to hear from tourism as to the urgency of immediately transferring the funds.

Avery Frix stated with the projects planned, the July date will work, as long as the amount is still \$455,000.00.

Deputy Mayor Reed inquired if the livestock pens would be purchased before the \$455,000.00 transfer; Mr. Frixed stated no.

Mayor Patrick Cale stated the pens could be purchased in November 2024, and Councilmember Stout recommended using the Special Project Fund.

Mr. Miller stated we will amend the budget transfer to not include the pens and transfer the \$455,000.00 on July 1, 2024.

Motion was made by Councilmember Tom Martindale, seconded by Councilmember Dan Hall to transfer the estimated carryover amount of \$455,000.00 from the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund to the Muskogee Tourism Authority (MTA), effective July 1, 2024.

Mr. Miller explained in this years' budget requests, there are more requests than we have money. He stated the key takeaways are that it has been a tough year for the general fund, but strategic initiatives can still be accomplished through dedicated funds:

- 1. Raises through dedicated sales tax
- 2. Tourism through hotel/motel tax
- 3. Streets through dedicated sales tax/foundation match

4. Water and sewer infrastructure through MMA

Mr. Miller explained the strategic initiative summary as:

- more than \$10 million for street projects
- increased funding for water quality and water line replacements
- facilities maintenance and capital budgets both increased dramatically
- record funding for economic development
- \$925,000.00 in housing incentives available (minus the \$500,000.00 for the Port Authority)
- tourism funding increased
- public safety priorities addressed

Mr. Miller stated the next step would be to pass the budget.

Deputy Mayor Reed stated he would like to wait in an effort to gain additional knowledge.

Mayor Cale suggested waiting a week and bringing it for discussion at the Special Call meeting on May 20, 2024.

Mayor Cale closed the Public Hearing.

City Manager Mike Miller stated Council and Staff have been in the planning process for more than two (2) years for a General Obligation Bond (GO Bond). He explained he requested both the Police and Fire Chief to put together a capital program, analyzing needs as far as public safety. Another one was created for the City in an effort to see the current and future needs, and investigate current and future funding. He stated what was discovered was that funding through the sales tax alone is not working. Other cities are using the GO Bond to meet their city's needs.

Mr. Miller explained at the Budget Retreat 2023, Council gave direction to pursue the GO Bond with an emphasis on deferred maintenance and facilities. In May 2023, Council directed Staff to hold an election in 2023 for a 25-year, \$77 million bond. In July 2023, Council voted unanimously to continue work on the bond, but to postpone until 2024. Council authorized the public opinion survey to be conducted, and chose projects for Bond consideration in April 2024. Now, we have reached the point to consider calling an election to extend the CIP Sales Tax and implement a GO Bond.

Mr. Miller explained A GO Bond is ad valorem tax money and cannot be used for any purpose other than those approved by voters. By State Statute, the specific use for at least 70% of the bond funds must be attached to projects and dollar amounts in the ordinance used to call for the election. He stated 100% of bond funds must be used in accordance with the category of project type as approved by voters or individual propositions on the ballot, whether specifically allocated to a project or not. The bonds must be sold at a competitive price at an appointed date and time. The interest rate on the bonds cannot exceed 10%, and the term cannot exceed 25 years.

Mr. Miller stated the monthly cost for a \$100,000.00 home would be \$12.50 per month for the new 15 mill levy and would begin in the 2025 tax year.

The questionnaire was completed by 593 citizens and 69% were in support of a bond, with infrastructure being most important at 88%. All categories showed strong support.

Mr. Miller stated there are 92 days between now and the election which is a great opportunity to educate the community.

Mandy Vavrinak, Crossroads Communications, a firm hired by the City to assist with the GO Bond, is working to make sure we have a robust community education program. Ms. Vavrinak explained the public information process is a critical piece of involving voters, and the goal is for everyone in Muskogee to vote.

Discussion followed.

Ivory Vann spoke in favor of the GO Bond.

Mason Cale spoke in favor of the GO Bond.

City Manager Mike Miller stated there are three (3) propositions for the GO Bond: community facilities, street and bridge projects, and public safety.

Fire Chief Jody Moore stated it was approximately two (2) years ago when the City Manager approached him about the needs of the fire department. The station on York Street has issues with structural integrity, and it sits too close to the street. A new station would be on this same property, but further back from the street. He explained fire trucks cost around \$600,000.00, but also, if we ordered one (1) today, it would be two (2) years before we received it. Without working equipment, it could be detrimental to our citizens. Extracation equipment is due for replacement. Mr. Moore stated the City provides mutual aid to departments outside of the city, and specialty equipment is used to help those in our surrounding areas.

Police Chief Johnny Teehee stated the potential for the GO Bond has increased morale in the police department. Currently, they are housed inside the City Hall building in the old arena. The building is always cold, and space heaters are in use. There is not adequate space to store evidence. More than once, a pipe has busted and ruined an office. Chief Teehee stated they lose employees to other agencies because of more money and/or better equipment.

Discussion followed

City Manger Mike Miller stated this is a half cent sales tax from 2019 that is expiring in 2025. He explained there is about \$23,000,000.00 in projected revenue from this half cent sales tax. The new tax would go into effect on October 1, 2025 for six years, ending September 30, 2031, keeping the tax rate exactly what it is today. This will be used for Capital Improvements: Street Maintenance, Rehabilitation of City Hall, Rehabilitation of Public Works Building, HVAC and interior improvements at the Library, and Water

Treatment Plant flood protection at the Port of Muskogee.

BACKGROUND:

The Certified Local Governments program assists local governments that adopt and enforce historic preservation ordinances to strengthen their preservation programs. We were awarded \$17,500 in total funding for grant year 2024 (October 1, 2023–September 30, 2024). For grant year FY25, the focus of preservation was going to be on the downtown, specifically to designate the downtown as an historic and to list it on the National Register of Historic Places. In order to do this, the planning department was planning on using the next three years to conduct a survey of our historic resources and to complete and submit an application for status to the National Parks Service. \$53,195 has become available for this grant year. With the 60/40 cost match stipulated in the CLG Guidelines, we would have to match this funding with \$35,463 for a total funding amount of \$88,658. With this funding, we will be able to start our project in July and finish up with the nomination fully submitted in 12–18 months rather than up to 3 years or more. Getting this status has many perks. Not only does it act as a badge of honor, having a nationally registered historic downtown will help to promote tourism through redevelopment. Listing in the National Register is the first step towards eligibility for National Park Service-administered federal preservation tax credits that have leveraged more than \$45 billion in private investment and National Park Service grant programs like Save America's Treasures and Preserve America.

BACKGROUND:

The Orchard Parkway 10'x3' Reinforced Concrete Box (RCB) project, which received official approval as Project 2022031, is now substantially complete. This project aimed to address the deteriorating condition of the existing 3-48" Corrugated Metal Pipes beneath Orchard Parkway, replacing the cross drain to ensure continued functionality and improve the safety of the overall drainage system.

During the course of construction, an unexpected challenge emerged: two (2) 18" corrugated metal stormwater culverts running north and south were discovered beneath two (2) existing homes, specifically, 605 Damson Ct and 606 Elberta Ct. These existing pipes served as primary drainage conduits for the curb inlets of Damson Ct and Elberta Ct. Their condition had significantly deteriorated, posing a potential risk of collapse, which would compromise the structural integrity of the homes and increase the likelihood of flooding in the area.

To address this issue, a strategic plan was developed. Utilizing an existing utility easement, the two (2) corrugated metal pipes were rerouted from their original location to a more secure and resilient position approximately 50 feet to the east. This relocation not only ensured the safety of the existing homes but also contributed to a reduced flood risk, as the existing drainage system would have been severely compromised if the existing pipes were to have failed.

In summary, the project scoped encompassed both the original objective of replacing the failing Orchard Parkway CGMP culverts and the additional necessary actions to address the unexpected discovery of deteriorating pipes beneath the two (2) homes, 605 Damson Ct and 606 Elberta Ct. This project improved the safety and functionality of the drainage system and mitigates potential flood risks in the area, aligning with the broader goals of the City of Muskogee Public Works Department.

<u>Discussion on Land Use Map Amendment</u>

Sediment tubes are elongated tubes of compacted geotextiles, curled excelsior wood, natural coconut fiber, or nardwood mulch. Straw, pine needle, and leaf mulch—filled sediment tubes are not permitted.



DIMENT TUBES — GENERAL NOTES Sediment tubes may be installed along contours, in drainage conveyance channels, and around inlets to help prevent

Sediment tubes are elongated tubes of compacted geotextiles, curled excelsior wood, natural coconut fiber, or nardwood mulch. Straw, pine needle, and leaf mulch—filled sediment tubes are not permitted.

off-site discharge of sediment-laden stormwater runoff.

- The outer netting of the sediment tube should consist of seamless, high—density polyethylene photodegradable materials treated with ultraviolet stabilizers or a seamless, high—density polyethylene non-degradable material.
- Sediment tubes when used as checks within channels should range between 18-inches and 24-inches depending on channel dimensions. Diameters outside this range may be allowed where necessary when approved.
- Curled excelsior wood, or natural coconut products that are rolled up to create a sediment tube are not allowed.
- Sediment tubes should be staked using wooden stakes (2-inch X 2-inch) or steel posts (standard "U" or " sections with a minimum weight of 1.25 pounds per foot) at a minimum of 48-inches in length placed on 2-foot centers.
- Install all sediment tubes to ensure that no gaps exist between the soil and the bottom of the tube. Manufacturer's recommendations should always be consulted before
- The ends of adjacent sediment tubes should be overlapped 6—inches to prevent flow and sediment from passing through
- Sediment tubes should not be stacked on top of one another, unless recommended by manufacturer.
- 10. Each sediment tube should be installed in a trench with a depth equal to 1/5 the diameter of the sediment tube. 11. Sediment tubes should continue up the side slopes a


of 1-foot above the design flow depth of the channel.

12. Install stakes at a diagonal facing incoming runoff.

SEDIMENT TUBES - INSPECTION & MAINTENANCE

- 1. The key to functional sediment tubes is weekly inspections, routine maintenance, and regular sediment removal.
- 2. Regular inspections of sediment tubes shall be conducted every calendar week and, as recommended, within 24-hours after each rainfall even that produces 1/2-inch or more of
- 3. Attention to sediment accumulations in front of the sediment tube is extremely important. Accumulated sediment should be continually monitored and removed when necessary.
- 4. Remove accumulated sediment when it reaches 1/3 the of the sediment tube.
- 5. Removed sediment shall be placed in stockpile storage areas or spread thinly across disturbed area. Stabilize the removed sediment after it is relocated.
- 6. Large debris, trash, and leaves should be removed from in front of tubes when found.

BACKGROUND:

On July 10, 2023, City Council directed staff to propose amendments to the City of Muskogee Code of Ordinances regarding the discharging of fireworks within City ordinances. This direction was given following the events of July 3rd and 4th of 2023, where the City of Muskogee Police Department and Fire Department responded to a number of calls regarding fireworks and injuries to persons or property. Different proposals have been presented to the council but no conclusions were reached on amendments. During the past week, individuals in Muskogee have used fireworks as weapons against persons and dwellings, thus creating an emergency situation that threatens the health, safety and welfare of citizens. The proposed ordinance will allow a person to be prosecuted for violating the provisions under City of Muskogee Code of Ordinances Chapter 22, Business Regulations, Article IV, Fireworks, by describing and prohibiting the unlawful discharge of fireworks within the municipal boundaries and making the penalty for such unlawful discharge a misdemeanor. This proposed ordinance amendment also needs to be declared as an emergency so it can be enacted immediately for the protection of citizens.

A NEW ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING CHAPTER 54, OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, AMENDING ARTICLE IV, OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC PEACE, AMENDING DIVISION 2, FIREARMS AND DEADLY WEAPONS, ADDING SECTION 54-218, UNLAWFUL DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS PROHIBITED; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, REPEALER, SEVERABILITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE, OKLAHOMA, AS FOLLOWS:

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Section 1. Section 54-218, Unlawful Discharge of Fireworks Prohibited, is hereby created and added to Chapter 54, Offenses And Miscellaneous Provisions, Article IV, Offenses Against Public Peace, Division 2, Firearms And Deadly Weapons of the Muskogee Code of Ordinances as follows:

Section 54-218, Unlawful Discharge Of Fireworks Prohibited.

- A. It shall be unlawful and an offense for any person or persons to discharge fireworks at another person, or person's property, within the municipal boundaries.
- B. No person shall discharge fireworks on municipal property, including but not limited to municipal parks and the municipal airport, personal property where the property owner has not given explicit consent, or within 500 feet of any church, hospital, public school, area where flammable fuels are sold or dispensed, or where fireworks are stored, sold or offered for sale.
- C. No person shall allow for or cause any provision of Chapter 22, Business Regulations, Article IV, Fireworks, to be violated within the municipal boundaries.
- D. Any person violating or causing another to violate any provision of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days, or by imposition of a fine, according to a schedule of fines as may be modified from time to time by the City Council, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- E. The fire marshal, or any police officer shall seize as contraband any illegal fireworks or fireworks utilized in a manner which violated this ordinance, or as defined under the terms of Chapter 22, Business Regulations, Article IV, Fireworks. Fireworks seized in this enforcement shall be held in the custody of the police department. The party surrendering the fireworks, if aggrieved by the action, may file an appeal in writing to the municipal judge. Upon hearing the appeal, the municipal judge may authorize the return of part or all of the confiscated fireworks; otherwise, the court shall authorize and direct that such contraband fireworks be destroyed.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, SELSER SCHAEFER ARCHITECTS dba NARRATE, THE CITY OF MUSKOGEE, OKLA., AND THE OKLAHOMA MUSIC HALL OF FAME

1. Purpose

This Memorandum of Agreement ("Agreement") is by and between the Oklahoma Department of Commerce ("ODOC"), Selser Schaefer Architects dba Narrate ("Narrate"), the City of Muskogee, Okla. ("Muskogee"), and the Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame ("OMHOF") regarding the renovation, remodeling, and rebranding of the OMHOF within the Frisco Freight Depot building located at 401 S. 3rd St., Muskogee, OK 74401. ODOC, Narrate, Muskogee, and OMHOF may collectively be referred to as the "Parties."

2. Authority

Authority to enter this memorandum exists pursuant to 74 O.S. §5003.6.

3. Agreement of Parties

To carry out the purpose of this Agreement, the Parties agree to act as follows:

- 3.1 ODOC shall perform the following duties:
 - 3.1.1 ODOC Representative(s) act as the central point of contact for all Parties
 - 3.1.2 Provide funding to Narrate for all agreed costs associated with basic services including, but not limited to, architectural, structural enginerring, and mechanical/electrical/plumbing engineering, as outlined in the Scope of Work (Attachment A)
 - 3.1.3 Provide funding to Muskgoee for all agreed costs associated with construction as outlined in the Opinion of Probable Cost (Attachment B)
 - 3.1.4 ODOC will work with Muskogee for the proper submission of applications for potential funds available via ODOC's P3 Pooled Finance Program
 - 3.1.5 ODOC will work with OMHOF to explore fundraising opportunities to contribute private funds to overall construction as outlined in the Scope of Work and/or Opinion of Probable Cost and to establish revenue for future programming of OMHOF
 - 3.1.6 In conjunction with Narrate, Muskogee and OMHOF representative(s), act as decision-making authority for all construction-related questions and/or adjustments to the original Scope of Work and/or Opinion of Probable Cost
- 3.2 Narrate shall perform the following duties:
 - 3.2.1 Act as lead project manager during all phases of construction as outlined in the Scope of Work
 - 3.2.2 In conjunction with Muskogee, assist in the construction bidding phase to secure General Contractor necessary for execution of construction as outlined in the Scope of Work and/or Opinion of Probable Cost

- 3.2.3 Work directly with Muskogee to obtain necessary permits and inspections
- 3.2.4 In conjunction with ODOC, Muskogee and OMHOF representative(s), act as decision making authority for all construction-related questions and/or adjustments to original Scope of Work and/or Opinion of Cost
- 3.2.5 Provide periodic reports to Parties, upon reasonable request, regarding the progress of construction as outlined in the Scope of Work

- 3.3.3 With assistance from Narrate, manage the competitive bidding phase to secure General Contractor necessary for execution of construction as outlined in the Scope of Work and/or Opinion of Probable Cost
 - 3.3.3.1 Management of phase to include, but not limited to, establish bid process, review of submitted applications, and award project bid
- 3.3.4 Work directly with Narrate to submit and obtain all necessary permits and inspections to complete construction as outlined in the Scope of Work

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

Muskogee City-County Port Authority

&

City of Muskogee

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is made and entered into on June ___, 2024 (the "Effective Date"), between Muskogee City-County Port Authority ("Port Muskogee") and the City of Muskogee (the "City" and together with Port Muskogee, the "Parties") for the purpose of establishing an understanding between the two Parties regarding the collaboration and financial support for the sewer extension project to construct a 3,800 feet sewer extension at Southside Industrial Park owned by and for the benefit of the City of Muskogee (the "Project").

WHEREAS, Port Muskogee has been awarded a grant by the State of Oklahoma pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act in the amount of \$1,960,000.00 (the "ARPA Funds") for the purpose of funding the Project;

WHEREAS, Port Muskogee, as administrator of the ARPA Funds, and the City desire to collaborate in the implementation of the Project;

WHEREAS, the City has agreed to allocate \$500,000.00 from its budget as outlined in the separate Industrial Economic Development Capital Improvement Contract to be used in the implementation of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Project Description</u>. The Project includes improvements to construct a 3,800 feet sewer extension located at the Southside Industrial Park owned by and for the benefit of the City of Muskogee. The infrastructure developed through the Project will at all times, during construction and after completion, be owned by the City.
- 2. Roles and Responsibilities. The Parties will regularly communicate, coordinate activities, and take other steps necessary to ensure the successful implementation of the Project. Port Muskogee agrees to administer the ARPA Funds for completion of the Project. The City agrees to assume ownership of the infrastructure developed through the Project, and agrees to be responsible for inspecting the Project to ensure compliance with applicable regulations and standards.
- 3. <u>City's Funding Commitment</u>. The commencement of the Project by the Port Muskogee is contingent upon the City providing \$500,000.00 as outlined in the separate Industrial Economic Development Capital Improvement Contract to be used for site readiness, land acquisition, legal expenses, or other items necessary for the completion of the Project.
- 4. Overages. The Parties hereby agree that the City will be solely responsible for any cost overages or expenses incurred during the course of the Project. In the event City Council does not allocate funds to cover any such cost overages or expenses, the Port shall not be liable for the additional overage costs.
- 5. <u>Confidentiality</u>. All non-public, confidential or proprietary information provided by one Party (the "Disclosing Party") to the other Party (the "Receiving Party"), including, but not limited to, the terms of this MOU and the Project, whether disclosed orally or disclosed or accessed in written, electronic, or other form or media, and whether or not marked, designated, or otherwise identified as "confidential," in connection with this MOU ("Confidential Information") is confidential, solely

for the Receiving Party's use in performing this MOU and may not be disclosed or copied unless authorized by Disclosing Party in writing. Confidential Information does not include any information that: (a) is or becomes generally available to the public other than as a result of Receiving Party's breach of this MOU; (b) is obtained by the Receiving Party on a non-confidential basis from a third party that was not legally or contractually restricted from disclosing such information; (c) Receiving Party establishes by documentary evidence was in Receiving Party's possession prior to Disclosing Party's disclosure; or (d) was or is independently developed by Receiving Party without using any Confidential Information. Upon Disclosing Party's request, Receiving Party shall promptly return all documents and other materials received from Disclosing Party. In addition to all other remedies available at law, Disclosing Party shall be entitled to seek specific performance and immediate injunctive and other equitable relief for any violation of this Paragraph. Each Party's obligations under this Paragraph will survive the termination or expiration of this MOU for a period of three years.

- 6. <u>Term.</u> This MOU shall be effective from the Effective Date and shall remain in effect until completion of the Project, unless earlier terminated.
- 7. <u>Termination</u>. This MOU may be terminated by either Party in the event the other Party materially fails to perform any of its obligations under this MOU and does not cure the same within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice from the non-breaching Party specifying the failure.
- 8. <u>Amendment</u>. This MOU may be amended or modified only in a writing signed by both Parties.
- 9. <u>Governing Law</u>. This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma, without regard to conflicts of law principles thereof.
- 10. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither Party may assign this MOU without the prior written approval of the other Party.
- 11. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>.
