- M. Discussion/approval/disapproval of the ratification of Award Agreement CJTIP-25-018 under the Arizona Criminal Justice and Treatment Improvement Plan (AZCJTIP) program between the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission and Pinal County, through the Pinal County Board of Supervisors, beginning April 17, 2025, ending September 30, 2026, for \$191,113. Adult Probation will use this award to pay vendors that provide counseling, detox, residential treatment, drug testing, and sober living services for probationers supervised by Pinal County Adult Probation. Acceptance requires an amendment to the FY25/26 budget and transfers reserve appropriation from Fund 213 (Grants/Project Contingency) to Fund 221 (APD/GPS) to increase revenues and expenditures. Adult Probation will use this award to support the transportation of probationers in the veterans' treatment court program to attend court hearings, veterans centers, community-based outpatient clinics, VA Hospitals, mentor support groups, court-mandated substance abuse counseling, and court-mandated mental health counseling. Funding will also be used to pay for emergency housing options during a critical transition period when participants are experiencing a housing crisis. Further, the funds will be used to cover any emergency situation applicable to a participant in the veterans court program experiencing a crisis during FY26. The award was budgeted in the FY 25/26 budget. There is no impact on the general fund. (John Fuery)

Acceptance amends the FY 25/26 budget and transfers reserve appropriation from Fund 213 (Grants/Project Contingency) to Fund 135 (Juvenile Prob/Diversion Intake) to increase revenues and expenditure appropriations. All other program awards are budgeted for in the FY 25/26 budget. There is no impact on the General Fund. (Jeanne Brandner)
- P. Discussion/approval/disapproval of the retroactive award under the FY26 CASA of Arizona program between the Administrative Office of the Courts and Pinal County Superior Court, through the Pinal County Board of Supervisors, beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026, for \$230,640. This grant will be used by Juvenile Court Services to provide the personnel, EREs, and operating costs that support the program. The award is budgeted for in the FY25/26 budget. There is no impact on the General Fund. (Jeanne Brandner)

- Expressed concern regarding; veteran and farmer suicide rate, financial strain, school closures, and the Maricopa City Council, and requested the Board conduct an audit of said council to protect the rights of District #1 and county residents; Barry McCain, City of Maricopa.
- Thanked the Board and Public Works for promptly addressing flooding at Kings Ranch Road and Highway 60 and for clearing debris from culverts that run under Sleepy Hollow, noting there is one additional ongoing traffic concern at the intersection of Kings Ranch Road and Highway 60 however, looks forward to a resolution; David Coward, Gold Canyon Community Inc.
- Expressed confusion and vindication regarding Brad Miller, County Attorney's Monday news conference regarding the 287(g) agreement, and reflected on the Christmas season and her hope is for a temporary respite from division in favor of peace and goodwill; Dea Podhajsky, Unincorporated Pinal County.
- In opposition of Item 10. A., regarding the Troutt v. Russell case and asked why the codefendants in this case were not taken before the Civil Hearing Office; Arlin Troutt, Gold Canyon, and for the Record provided a handout to the Clerk of the Board.
- Questioned Brad Miller, County Attorney's pursuit of the 287(g) agreement, which lacks support of local crime data and legal justification, citing research and Pinal County criminal case statistics. Immigrants are not disproportionately responsible for crime and expressed concern that significant county resources are being directed toward immigration enforcement rather than broader public safety needs; Roberto Reveles, Gold Canyon.
