Council Update

Chamber Gala. There is still space available at the City of Ramsey table for the Chamber Gala. Please let Jo know if you are interested in attending. The event is Friday, February 22 at Greenhaven. Social hour begins at 5:30 – dinner at 7:00. Your ticket would be paid for – if you plan to bring someone, the cost is \$62.50. *Attached to the Weekly Update is a Flyer for the Anoka Area Chamber of Commerce Casino Royal Gala.*

Armstrong Interchange project. Mayor Strommen and Council Member Tossey joined Senator Petersen, and Doug Fischer from Anoka County in testifying before the Minnesota Senate Transportation Committee on Wednesday for the Armstrong Interchange project. The presentation lasted about 20 minutes and Committee members asked several questions, stating that it was a “compelling” story. County Commissioners West and Look were also present. The state is being asked to fund \$17 million of the \$33 million project. The bill was passed forward to be part of the omnibus transportation bill.

IT

- Resolved an issue that prevented access to both city websites when LOGIS cut over to the new Apache servers. We’ve since rolled back to the original servers to do more testing.
- Completed the creation of a Police Department imaged PC (many thanks to Captain Katers for his help and diligence). This will allow the coming computer setups in PD to be done much quicker than before, which in turn reduces staff downtime. It will also allow us to repair hardware failures and potential virus attacks in minutes as opposed to hours. Four PD computers are scheduled on being replaced by the end of February.
- Set up a new scanner for Crime Prevention, and three new printers for the Public Works Utilities and Street departments.

Parks

- With frequent snow events, Parks Staff has been ‘cycling’ between snow removal on streets, cul-de-sacs, trails, sidewalks and rinks. One opportunity to flood the rinks so far this week.
- Department of Corrections crew assisted with snow removal at Central Park’s rinks and the balance of the day was spend removing snow off the two largest, and well traversed boardwalks at Sweet Bay Ridge and Lake Itasca.
- (An early sign of Spring?) Additional activity occurring with the Ramsey Foundation with respect to The Draw Summer Concert Series – only four more sponsorship’s needed. Concerts costs run from a few hundred dollars to about \$800, with co-sponsorship opportunities a-plenty. Sponsorship benefits packets for businesses are available by request. *Attached to the Weekly Update is the Schedule of Concerts for 2013 Draw Event Series* (with open sponsorship dates listed).

Police

- **Murder-Suicide.** On 2-12-13 at 1032 hrs, officers were dispatched to an address of 8500 block of 176th Ln to check the welfare of a couple after a relative had received an email with suicidal overtures. Ramsey Officers responded to the home and found the home was secure and no new foot tracks in the snow or vehicle tracks in the driveway were present. Entry was made and the Ramsey Officers discovered two adults deceased in a bedroom with gunshot wounds. There were a number of pet cats found who were also killed by gunshots. The victims are a 67 year old female and a 65 year old male. Indications at the scene suggest that the female had died several hours before the male. The case remains under the investigation by the Ramsey Police Department, the Anoka County Sheriff's Office, and the Anoka County Medical Examiner's Office.
- **Reserves Recognized.** At the Tuesday evening City Council meeting, the City recognized two Ramsey Reserves for their efforts at a medical situation that occurred on February 2nd. Reserve Officers James Bagne and Jennifer Grant were the first to arrive at a medical in which a person had collapsed and was not breathing. They performed CPR until other emergency personnel arrived. Their efforts were successful in getting the heart started again. Unfortunately, the victim did pass away February 8th, but the reserve officers responded and performed duties in a difficult and stressful situation. For their efforts, Reserve Officers Bagne and Grant received Distinguished Service Awards.

Public Works

- All snow plowing all the time! We had two citywide plowing events this week with clean up in between.


Utilities

- During snow plowing activities on Sunday evening we received a call regarding a pump failure at lift station #4 @ 155th and Iodine Street. Several attempts were made to reset the pump but were unsuccessful. Pump #2 was shut down and the station was running only on pump #1. Monday a contractor was called and he found that the pump start relay was damaged and needed to be replaced. Parts were shipped to the site and the relay was swapped out. After the relay was repaired the pump started but would trip out after a short run. We called the City of Anoka and borrowed their boom truck to pull the pumps to figure out the problem. On Tuesday morning we pulled pump #2 and found a large knot of rags twisted up in the impellers. Once pump #2 was cleaned out and reinstalled we pulled pump #1 and found, and removed, another pile of rags.
