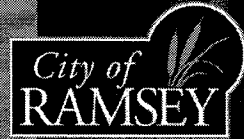

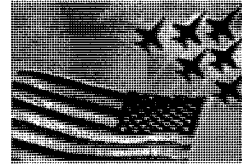

Council Update

Residence @ The COR. A temporary Certificate of Occupancy has been issued to the Residence @ The COR for roughly a quarter of the building. Their goal is to have the whole building open sometime in August, in the meantime there will be one more Temporary Certificate of Occupancy to include another section of the building. You will see the west end of the buildings landscaping and driveway entrance being worked on next. A Grand Opening event is being planned for mid-July – stay tuned for details.

Washington, D.C. trip a success. Mayor Strommen and City Administrator Ulrich were in Washington, D.C. this week to meet with members of Congress regarding the funding of Highway 10 and the Armstrong Interchange. Meetings were held with Senator Klobuchar, and staff from Senator Franken's office, Representative Nolan, Representative Walz, Representative Bachmann and Representative Shuster (Chair of the House Transportation Committee). There was broad support for the City current federal grant application and a willingness to consider new program options tailored to address the safety concerns of intersection in the next federal transportation reauthorization bill. More information will be provided at the Council meetings on Tuesday.

Notice – Single Lane Operations of TH47. On Thursday, May 23, MnDOT Maintenance forces are planning to perform microsurfacing on a 0.4-mile stretch of Highway 47 near the Anoka County Fairgrounds. The microsurfacing will address cracks in the pavement and extend the life of Highway 47. During this work, there will be a flagging operation on Highway 47. Northbound and southbound traffic will take turns using the one available lane, while the other lane undergoes microsurfacing. To limit the impact on those who use Highway 47, Thursday's work will start no earlier than 9:00 a.m., and must be concluded by 3:00 p.m. The first half of the microsurfacing work at this location took place Tuesday, May 21. I regret that I was not aware of the microsurfacing until today; otherwise I would have offered advanced notice of Tuesday's work. The microsurfacing is expected to be finished on Thursday, May 23.


Pet Clinic. The last of the spring pet clinics was held at Fire #2 on Sunday, May 19, from 11:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. Staff issued 111 dog licenses and 2 cat licenses. The veterinarian has not provided their numbers, but they estimate approximately 150 pets received their services. The overall turnout was lower than average. Again, the weather probably contributed to the smaller turnout, yet the rain held out for the entire event. And due to the 3-year dog license that coincides with the 3-year rabies vaccination, we will probably see a reduced number of licenses issued next year, as well.

Mississippi River Trail and No Parking Requirements. A letter and map are being sent to residents and businesses along Riverdale Drive, Tungsten Street and Rivlyn Avenue advising them of future No Parking conditions in several areas. The letter was discussed and approved by consensus at the April 9th, 2013 City Council work session. *Attached to the Weekly Update is the Letter and Map Regarding Mississippi River Trail and No Parking Requirements.*

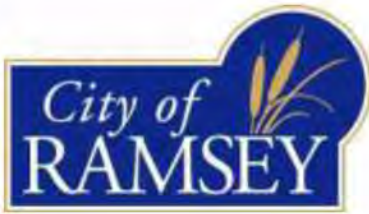

Subj: Mississippi River Trail and No Parking zones

Dear Resident:

For two decades the cities of Anoka and Ramsey have been working toward a trail connecting our two communities south of Hwy's #10 & #169. A couple of years ago Ramsey and Anoka successfully collaborated in applying for Federal funding for this trail that will emanate from Anoka's Mississippi Community Park, across approximately one-mile of King's Island to Ramsey's side, then 'up the hill' to the terminus of Rivlyn Avenue. This trail will be part of a larger system of trails that will extend west to Mississippi West Regional Park, ultimately across the highway to The COR and eventually to the City of Elk River, east to the Coon Rapids dam, and beyond.

In addition to the many destinations this trail will connect, most notably are parks and open spaces. Below is an aerial view of the 80-acre King's Island (east of Rivlyn Avenue) to provide an example of but one of the park spaces this trail will provide immediate access to.



The trail when completed will allow you and your family to safely access miles of biking and amenities and at the same time give you choices in mobility other than in an auto. Further, the trail will measurably improve your property's value – if not monetarily, then at least in terms of pedestrian access to recreation and areas beyond your neighborhood.

As mentioned above, Ramsey secured \$440,000 in Federal funding to supplement the Park Trust fund for construction of the Mississippi River Trail. The trail will be built and available to you in late 2013 or by mid-summer 2014.

When funding was applied for, the City understood that shorter segments of the trail would have to use existing roadways as connectors to the off-road segments. This is necessary to minimize impacts to trees, landscaping and other improvements in the boulevard areas that construction of an off-road trail would require through some areas. As a result, parking restrictions will be required in some areas to allow for a continuous on-road/off-road trail system to be created. No parking will be required along Riverdale Drive from Feldspar Street to just past Dolomite Street, and also between Sunfish Lake Boulevard and Tungsten Street. No parking will also be required along Tungsten Street, although this is primarily through areas of commercial driveways. Rivlyn Avenue will also require a no parking zone, although this will be limited to one side (North) of the street.

The attached exhibit depicts the areas of no parking required for the project. It is my sincere hope that any inconvenience to you from the No Parking zones is far off-set by the value and convenience this new trail in your neighborhood brings.

Also enclosed with this letter is an exhibit that shows the larger scope of the Mississippi River Trail and destinations soon to be easily accessible for you.

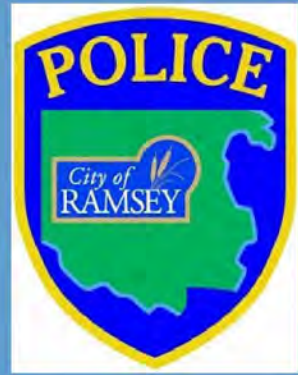
