ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Patrol has completed the annual training for this month.
- Officer Troy and Officer Fulkerson have been released to light duty status from their injuries they sustained on duty.
- Received 7 more patrol units for SRO Unit, Traffic Unit, and one for Patrol.
- Attended the 29th Annual NMIACP.
- Sgt. R. Rodriquez assigned to SRO Sergeant.
- Sgt. Reese was moved back to Patrol Sergeant position.
- Light Parade was completed and no issues.
- Getting officers that work the airport overtime badged. (Airport badges per TSA)

PLANS FOR NEXT MONTH

- Patrol is continuing to conduct traffic details in problem areas or intersections.
- OT will still be posted for the STEP/ENDWI/BKLUP.
- Get in more units and get them out on the street.

ISSUES AND CONCERNS

- Vehicles are still an issue. I know vehicles are coming and we got the 5 that graduated from the academy vehicles but are down to only a couple of old spare units. Some of the Dodge Durangos are having issues with radiator hoses, oil coolers, battery issues and recalls are now coming in for the new Durangos. I talked with Dodge staff and learned the oil coolers on the Durangos are faulty and to expect a large recall for them in January 2025. I know we are getting more, but Patrol needs more to fully staff Patrol with a good fleet.
- Patrol Officers are not signing up for overtime details other than Airport detail/chief's overtime. I believe this is due to our very young Division and wanting to have some life after work, not just work, but then again Airport Detail does not require reports and traffic tickets. I believe this is due to low pay and the city not being competitive in pay like other cities/counties or even other states. Sgt. Cavin and Officer Watkins are out on on-the-job injuries and will not be returning for several months. I also have Officer Troy and Officer Fulkerson injured, but are on light duty status at this time and not sure when they will be released for active duty.
- Patrol Officer U. Jimenez (6-yr. officer) put in his two weeks' notice due to the call from Chief of Grand Prairie TX signing his papers, so his last date is January 10, 2025. Officer M. Sedillo (4 ½-yr. officer) is starting the testing process with same agency due to a higher salary. We are still losing officers to other agencies due to higher pay. This also brings up issues with promotions, especially to Sergeants coming to Patrol with inadequate experience and leadership that we are seeing or the lack of interest in promotions. Sgt. Cavin is having issues healing and will more than likely not be released for active duty until March 2025 or later. Patrol Sergeants are struggling due to working double shifts. Sgt. Best will be assisting Patrol Sergeants to alleviate stress until Sgt. Cavin is released to active duty.

SWAT

No call outs in December.

Training: On 12-19-24 The SWAT team met at the range for their quarterly qualifications. We then met at RHS for our annual PT test. The team then met in the afternoon for entry training at CCJDC.

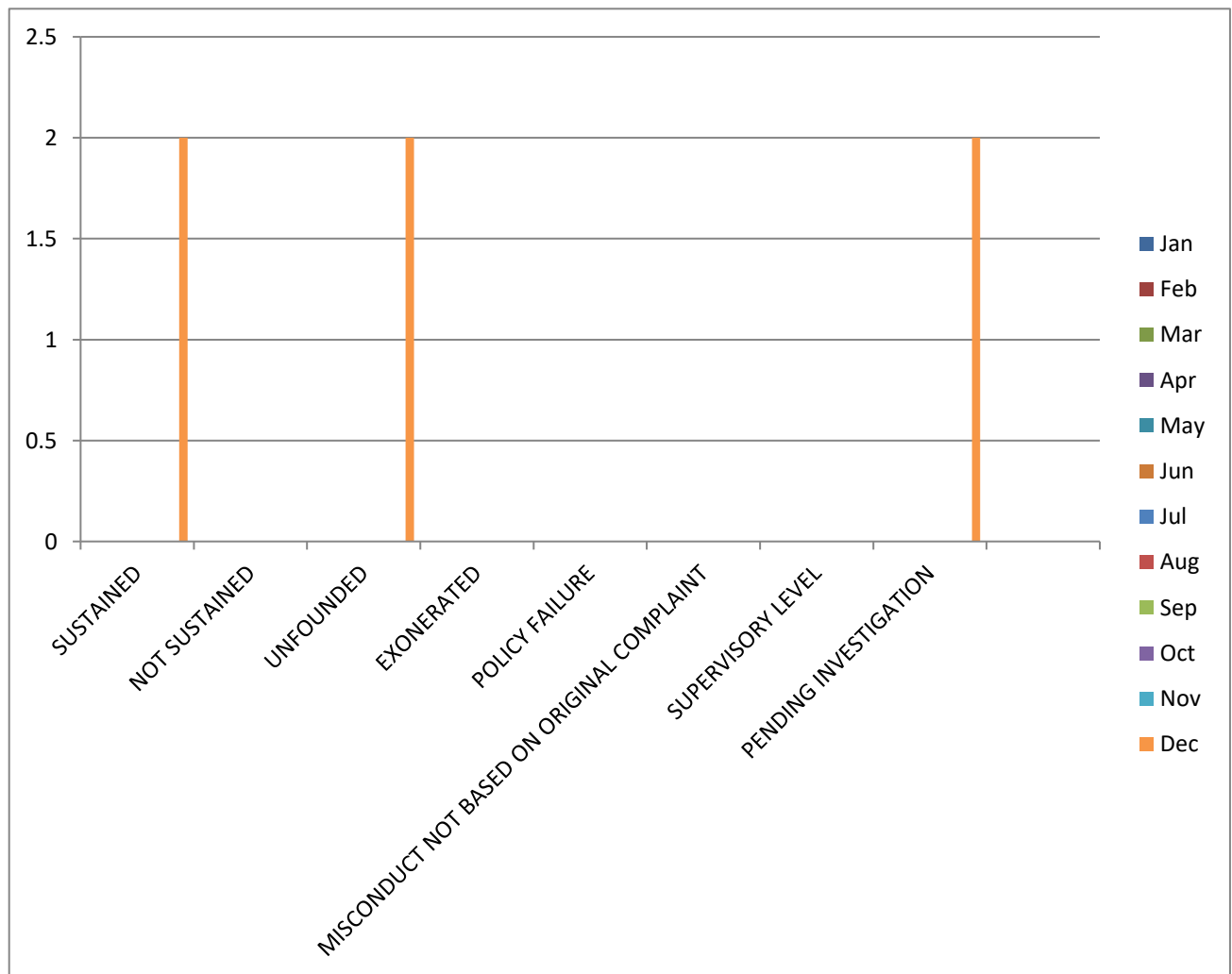
Accomplishments: Put on an active-shooter class where 11 officers attended.

Internal Investigations Monthly Report-December 2024



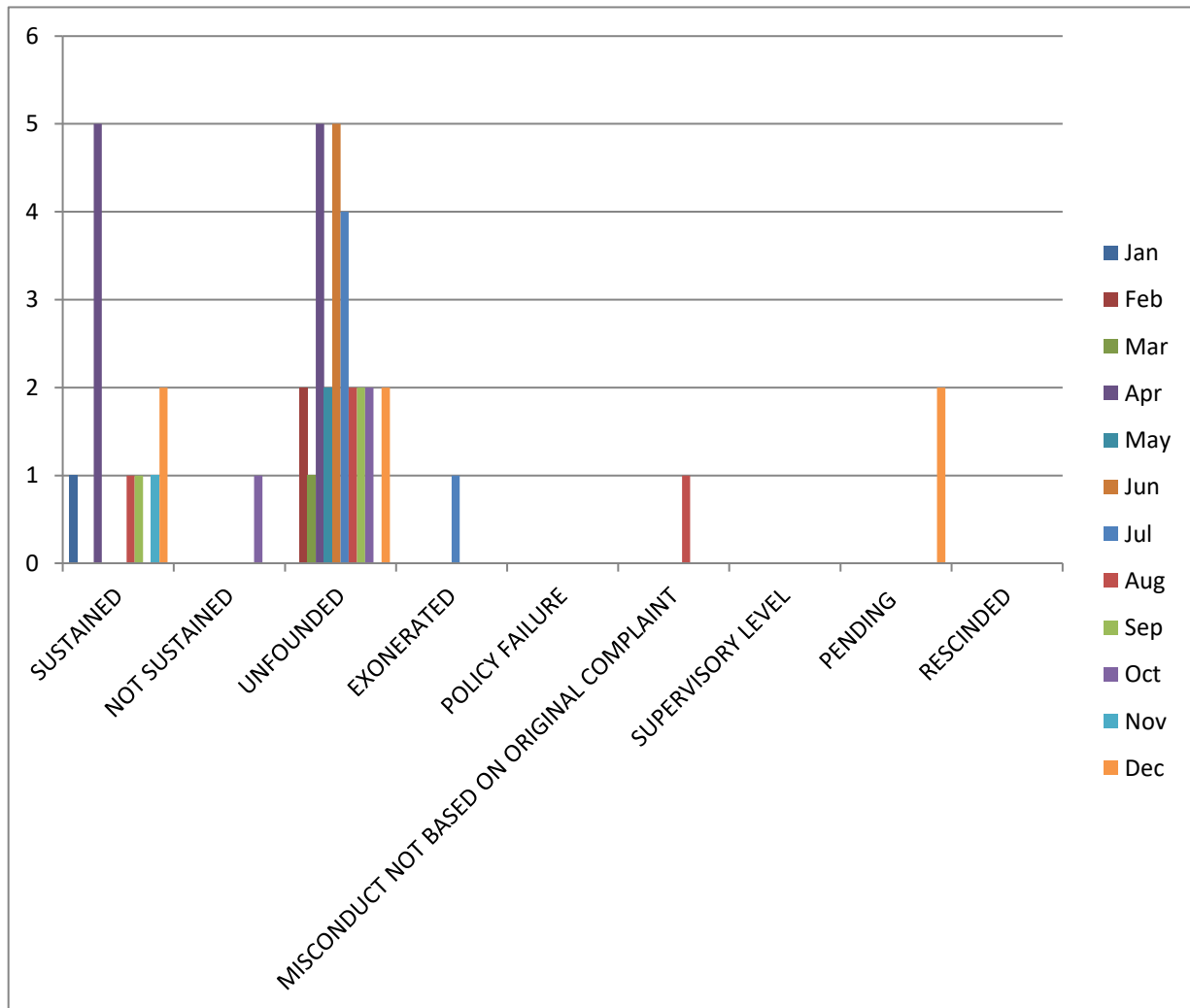

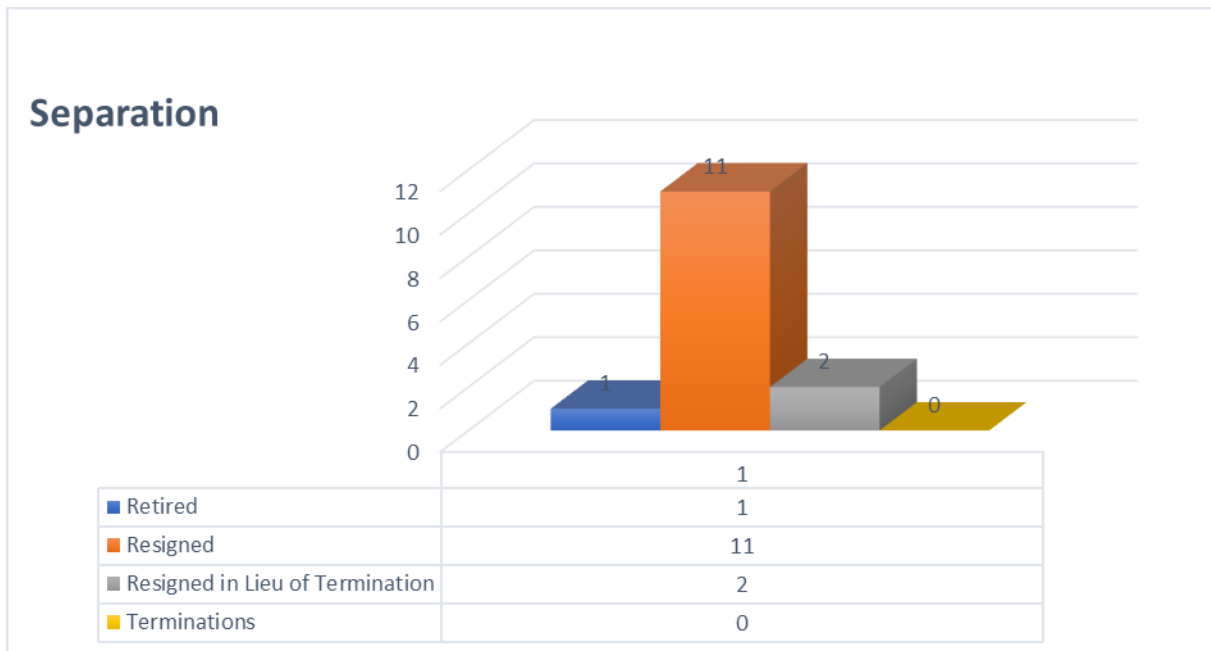
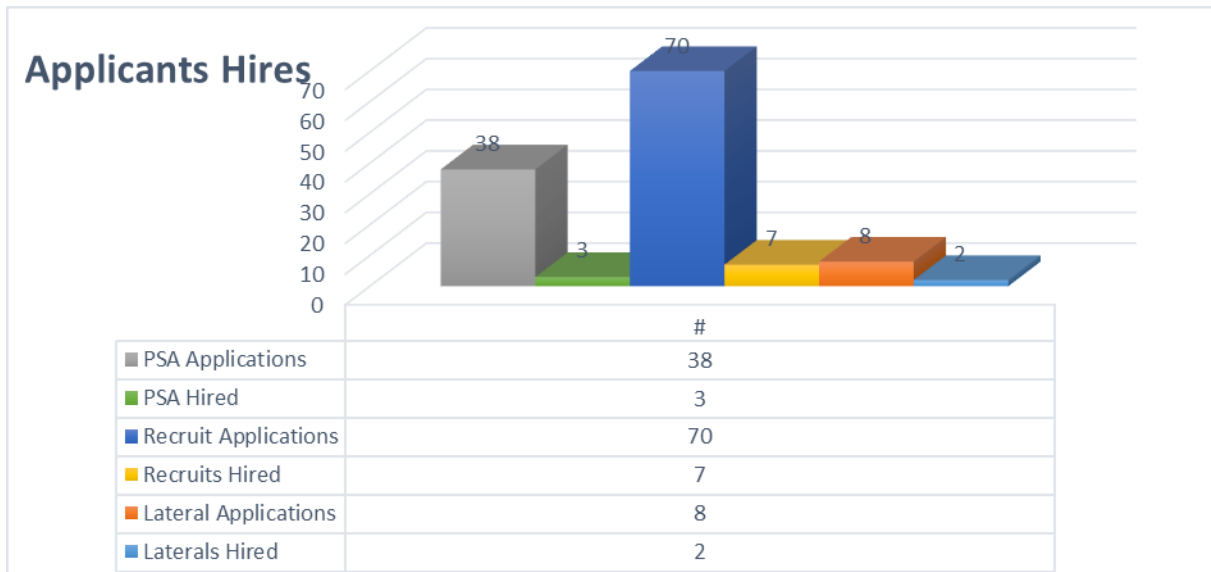

DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

COMMUNITY OUTREACH:

December 17:

RPD helped deliver these Christmas gifts to the homes of the children served by CASA.



TRAININGS:

December 27 & 30:

Sergeant Trong Nguyen and Sergeant Scott Wrenn facilitated firearm biennium training, which is mandatory for all sworn officers to complete within the 2024-2025 biennium. The training was held at the New Mexico Military Institute, and surrounding agencies from the county were also invited to participate in order to assist the region in meeting state training requirements.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH (OFFICER H. GONZALEZ):

Officer Gonzales has been in contact with neighborhoods throughout the month. No meetings were scheduled for the month due to holidays. Officer Gonzales has completed and is still currently occupied with completing backgrounds in order to assist with the hiring process.

Special Investigations Div./Chaves County Metro Narcotics Task Force

New Activities – 42 new activities were generated this month. Agents executed 8 search warrants, made 4 controlled buys of narcotics, seized 10 firearms, made 24 arrests and had 6 activities that were classified as “Other.”

Criminal Investigations Division

Tuesday 12-3-2024

Det. Juarez obtained a search warrant for a cell phone as follow-up from the homicide at 3rd/Orchard.

Wednesday 12-4-2024

Det. Ness obtained a search warrant for Google and two banks as part of a credit-card fraud investigation.

Det. Barrientos obtained a search warrant for 315 E. Ballard and 314 ½ E. Church for a stabbing incident. The victim in the case later decided to not pursue charges.

Thursday 12-5-2024

Det. Barrientos obtained a search warrant for Bath and Body Works for a larceny case.

Det. Castillo was called out to 111 S. Lincoln for a shooting. He was able to charge Nehemiah Horton with Aggravated Battery and Tampering with Evidence, however, when the victim (Iverson Smith) was released from the hospital in Lubbock he did not want to press charges.

Det. Duran obtained an arrest warrant for Ethan Anderson for 5 counts of Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, 4 counts of Conspiracy to Commit Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, 2 counts of Unlawful Purchase or Transfer of a Firearm to Another, and Distribution of a Controlled Substance.

Det. Barrientos obtained an arrest warrant for Vanessa Hernandez for Embezzlement.

Det. Ness obtained four search warrants, including one for 1407 S. Monroe, in reference to a burglary investigation at 901 N. Pennsylvania. The suspects have all been identified and charges are pending.

Det. Ness obtained a search warrant for a cell phone from a burglary case.

Det. Castillo obtained a search warrant for a black Toyota SUV for an aggravated battery investigation.

Det. Castillo was called out for a drive-by shooting at 113 Ballard. During his investigation, he obtained a search warrant for 105 Ballard #5 and was able to identify the two suspects. 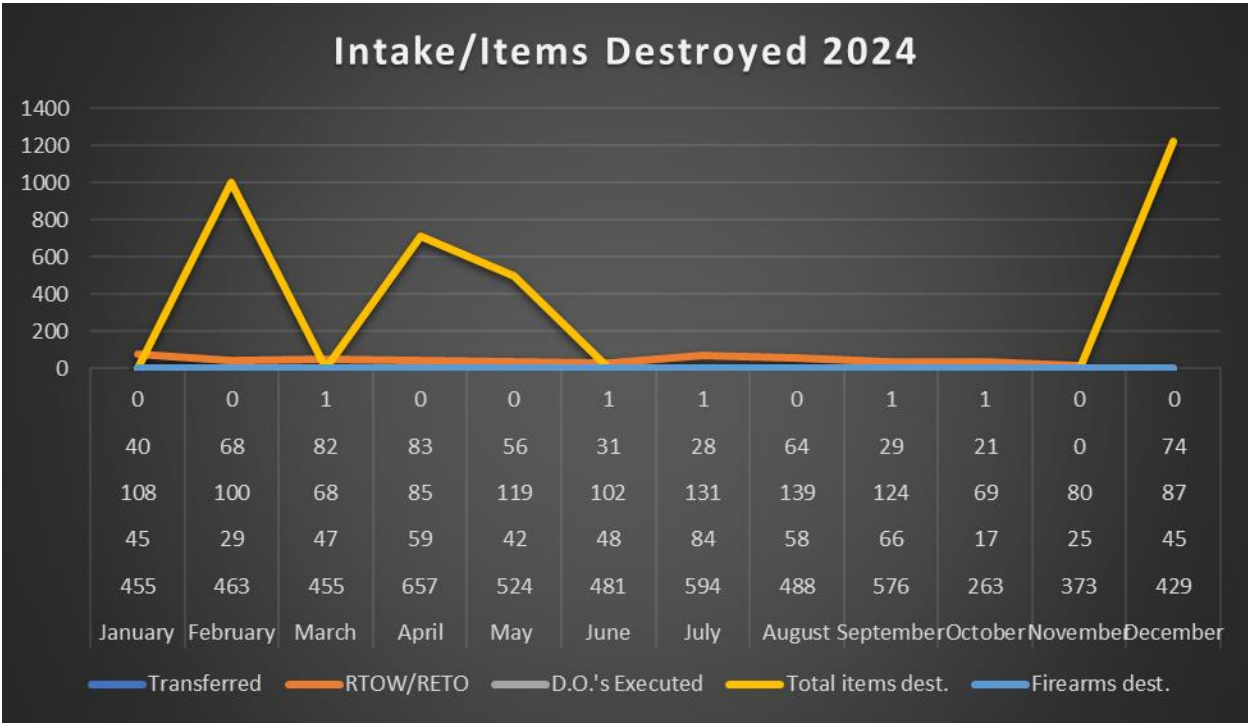
