PPEP, Inc.'s Employment and Training Program for Migrant and Seasonal Farm Workers

PPEP, Inc. has been the sole Arizona grantee of US Dept. of Labor's Workforce Investment Act, Section 167, National Farmworker Jobs Program, since 1983.

Services are provided **FREE** to farm workers and their dependents who:

- Are Legal Aliens or US Citizens & can show proof of residency
- Have a Wage-earner, who worked 25 days or earned \$800 or more from farm work within the past 24 months (proof of income required, but not that of legal status)
- Meet low income guidelines
- If male, are registered with Selective Service (if born after December 31, 1959)

PPEP, Inc. is an Equal Opportunity Employer and its programs are Equal Opportunity, as well. All persons may participate & receive program benefits regardless of national origin, handicap, race, color, religion, sex or age, providing they meet the qualifications for WIA 167 services.

Services Include:

Vocational Assessment—Assistance in finding out what career is right for you.

Vocational Training

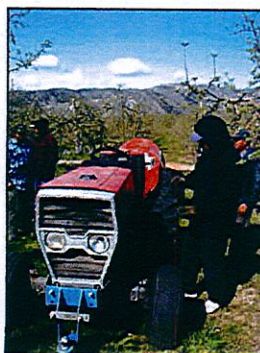
– Job-skills training that ends in a certificate, including Commercial Driving (Class A &/or B), or occupations in the medical field or any other growth industry, through public & private training-providers.



On-the-Job Training (OJT) – Specific job skill training, provided on the worksite by the employer, who receives a salary reimbursement from PPEP, Inc.

Work Experience program (WEP) –

Short-term work experience for workers who are new to the world of work, where PPEP, Inc. pays the wages.



Agricultural Upgrade:

For those who wish to remain in the agricultural industry, an upgrade of skills, resulting in a higher salary, & more hours worked in year-round employment.

Job Search Assistance: Assistance in finding openings, filling out applications, designing resumes and preparing for interviews. Interview clothing purchased.

Educational Services – GED or High School Equivalency, High School Diplomas, English as a Second Language & Adult Basic Education, including primary & secondary certificates from INEA through PPEP's Plaza Comunitarias.



Apprenticeships – in any growing trade.

Supportive Services – Assistance while in training, such as food, gas and other training-related expenses, on an as-needed basis; relocation assistance.

Career Advancement — It's not over when you land a job. Assistance provided in increasing your income, earning a promotion, getting benefits and/or finding the job you really love!

Emergency Assistance - to help with food and other basic needs when a crisis occurs.



Micro Loans - Small business loans are available to eligible individuals who are self-employed.

Other PPEP, Inc. Services

ENCOMPASS – an integrated service for people with developmental disabilities, assisting them in moving towards economic and social self-sufficiency.

PMHDC – financial services, including micro loans and technical assistance for small business owners, economic development activities.

Housing – Self-Help Home-Ownership, Down Payment Assistance, Owner-Occupied Home Repair programs & assisting rural communities in building infrastructure, such as water and sewer improvements.

PPEP Tec High Schools – charter schools, providing a computer-based curriculum, aligned with the Arizona Academic Standards, plus individualized attention.

Human Services – Emergency & Disaster Assistance; Food, Clothing and Rental Assistance; Emergency Utilities Assistance; Crisis Intervention Counseling; Services to the Elderly; and Information and Referral, funded by Pima County.

Counseling—Behavioral Health counseling, provided for residents of the greater Tucson area, with an emphasis on Anger Management and DUI issues.

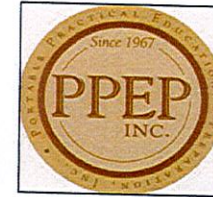
