AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE SAN LUIS CITY CODE, CHAPTER 152 ZONING REGULATIONS, SECTIONS 152.259(B) AND 152.260 RELATING TO TEMPORARY SIGNS AND POLITICAL SIGNS; REPEALING ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of San Luis to have the regulation of signs conform to the holding of the U.S. Supreme Court in *Reed v. The Town of Gilbert*;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the mayor and council of the City of San Luis, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1: Section 152.259 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of San Luis, Arizona, is hereby amended to repeal subsection 152.259(B) in its entirety. Subsection 152.259 (C) shall be renumbered to be subsection 152.259 (B) and subsection 152.259 (D) shall be renumbered to be subsection 152.259 (C).

Section 2: Section 152.260 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of San Luis, Arizona, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§152.260 POLITICAL SIGNS ON PUBLIC STREETS

The Arizona Revised Statutes control the removal of political signs.

Section 3: In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance, resolution, regulation, or policy within the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are hereby repealed, superseded, and replaced, and the provisions of this ordinance shall govern.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or said reference regulations.
