Good afternoon Ms. Macuil,

Per our previous discussion, I have taken the portion of our contract that indicates our agreement for payment and added the language that I would like to propose to the City of San Luis. It is my belief that we can decrease the amount of unwanted and abandoned animals in your community by targeting our spay/neuter campaigns, along with providing proper identification, to areas of your community with the highest amount of stray animals. This program will be extremely beneficial to your community as we know many want to have their pets spayed or neutered, but they just don't have the means to do so.

5. Consideration.

In consideration for HSOY's performance of duties listed herein, the City shall pay the HSOY the total flat rate sum of \$50,000. Payments shall be made in equal installments of \$4,166.67 for each month of service. *Additionally, the City will pay HSOY a lump sum in the amount of \$20,000, at the beginning of the fiscal year, to provide low-cost spay/neuter and microchip services to residents of the City. The low cost program will be managed by HSOY and the funds will be reported quarterly to the City. The report will include the number of animals served by the funding, as well as, the breed, sex and species.*

*HSOY agrees to alter approximately 150 community cats through the following break-down. Female cats will be \$55.00 while male cats will be \$40.00. Each cat will have its left ear tipped indicating it has been altered and it will be provided a Rabies vaccination.*

*HSOY will provide approximately 100 surgeries for your community dogs. The fee for the dogs will be \$100 each. This fee will include the alteration surgery, a Rabies vaccination and a microchip. The owners of the pets will be responsible for the license fee of \$13.00 and a DA2PPCVK at \$22.00. All of the domesticated animals will have green tattoos placed next to their incisions indicating the animal has been altered.*


**STATEMENT**
