8. CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Mr. Jose Yopez, 440 W. Spring Street, Somerton, AZ, congratulated the city employees being recognized for their hard work and dedication to the City of San Luis adding that it takes a great team to make the city what it is and a great team needs great leadership. He invited everyone present to attend the 13th Annual Josefina Yopez Cancer Walkathon which will be held on November 30, 2019 at the Somerton/San Luis Walk-In Clinic to the Cocopah Casino and back. Last year they managed to raise \$10,000.00 and were able to assist 23 people with those funds. He thanked all those who support this event.

6. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS:

6.A. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the Architectural Services Agreement with Thompson Design Architects, P.C. to provide necessary professional services to complete the Senior Center Expansion Project, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) #105-20. (Mary French-Jones, Grants Writer)

Ms. Mary French-Jones, Grants Writer, explained that the senior center expansion project is the first phase. The city issued a request for proposal (RFQ) on September 9, 2019, the document was posted on the city's website, required city locations and published in the Yuma Sun two (2) days. An optional pre-proposal meeting and there were three (3) architectural firms that participated. During the process of the RFQ she issued eight (8) packets to consultants and two (2) packets to planners. The bid opening took place on September 30, 2019 and four (4) complete proposals were obtained. She added that the top selected consultant, Thompson Design Architects P.C., was notified and entered into negotiations.

Mayor Gerardo Sanchez stated that this is something very much needed and will be a difference to the seniors. He thanked everyone involved for accomplishing this.

Council Member Matias Rosales suggested to add to the conceptual design of the senior center what will be the add-ons or changes so the different areas can be seen.

6.B. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding authorization to increase the financial budget necessary for the acceptance of a technical assistance grant and provide a monetary match for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. (Jenny Torres, Economic Development Manager)

Ms. Jenny Torres, Economic Development Manager, explained that one of the biggest issues is making sure that the city has the infrastructure in place. There are two (2) industrial parks and there is no natural gas. Both San Luis Rio Colorado and San Luis, Arizona have been trying to bring natural gas to the east part of the city. There is not a lot of manufacturing in San Luis, Arizona but there is in San Luis Rio Colorado and the city focused it on the binational project and was able to apply for a technical assistance grant from the North American Development Bank (NAD Bank) and received \$95,000.00. Requests for proposals were requested and three (3) proposals were received from different companies from Chandler, Arizona; Houston, Texas and South Africa. The proposals were reviewed and evaluated by the evaluation committee and are recommending one of the consultants but the amount of the funds provided are not sufficient and provided NAD Bank with potential options. The first option is to increase

the amount requested to them, they presented it to the board and granted \$161,050.00 to be able to hire a consultant to develop a feasibility study for the natural gas project. A requirement of the technical assistance grant is that the city match 10%, which is \$17,894.00. Ms. Torres asked the City Council to authorize an increase in the financial budget to accept the grant fund and increase the expenditures to spend and the second request is to approve the contingency funds to commit the necessary match.

Mayor Gerardo Sanchez thanked Ms. Torres and NAD Bank as they are a great resource. This is not the first time that NAD Bank has helped the city as they have helped the city with other grants in the past.

6.C. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the approval of request of Council's Contingency fund to cover costs of the City of San Luis Census 2020 Campaign. (Jose A. Guzman, Director of Planning and Zoning, and Francia Alonso, PIO/Assistant to Council)

Mr. Tadeo De La Hoya, City Manager, explained that the 2020 Census will occur on April 1, 2020. The Census is a mandate of the United States Constitution to complete a count every ten (10) years of everyone residing in the United States. This includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, citizens, and non-citizens. The population totals from the 2020 Census will determine the number of seats each state has in the House of Representatives; it will be used to redraw state legislative districts; and it will determine funding for programs, projects and state shared revenues. In addition to being part of the Yuma County Complete Count Committee, the city wants to do an aggressive campaign on promoting the importance of the census and making sure all residents of the City of San Luis are counted. However, it was found out that the census bureau was not accurately funded, therefore for this reason, the city wants to make sure that all the residents of San Luis get informed and invited to participate in the early stage of the Census. The City of San Luis Planning and Zoning Department is seeking approval from the Mayor and City Council to transfer \$25,000.00 from City Council Contingency to cover the expenses for the promotional campaign of the Census 2020 for the City of San Luis.

Mayor Gerardo Sanchez added that the Constitution of the United States mandates that the citizens be counted every ten (10) years but does not say the amount to spend on the census. In conjunction with the Census Bureaus, the City of San Luis is trying to make sure that there is an accurate count for the City of San Luis. The City of San Luis is the second-largest community with PO boxes in the entire nation, it becomes an issue because it is based on one's physical address and not PO box. Many things are based on statistical information such as programs needed in the community, businesses wanting to invest in the city, fire and police stations, reduced lunches for the kids, etc... He added that \$25,000.00 is a good investment to make sure the city gets represented. Eventually, there will be a time when the City of San Luis will have their own representative in Congress and the way to get close to this is if the city gets counted correctly. Once the City of San Luis reaches 50,000 in population it will qualify for higher grants, higher assistance and a couple more millions funding for streets. It will be a strong campaign so let's make all residents get counted as we don't want the city's residents to be counted in California.

Vice Mayor Maria Cecilia Cruz added that being part of the census committee is helping promote the importance of being counted as south county always gets under served.

6.D. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the City of San Luis accepting slurry seal application services from American Pavement Preservation for application of Type 2 and Type 3 slurry seal as part of the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Pavement Preservation Project. (Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works)

Mr. Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works, stated in continuance of the Pavement Preservation Program, staff recommends that the city accepts services offered by American Pavement Preservation, for a total amount not to exceed \$220,000.00. The City would piggyback on a contract that the City of Yuma has in place with American Pavement Preservation, Slurry Seal Service.

Mayor Gerardo Sanchez asked how much slurry seal has been performed on the city's streets.

Mr. Vera stated that approximately 90-95% of the streets have been slurred, the ones that have not either are not good candidates for slurry because they need total replacement which there are eight (8) streets left and some of the other ones are the major material type roads that are getting crack sealing. The entire city has been covered with slurry once.

Vice Mayor Maria Cecilia Cruz commented that last year's budget was \$350,000.00 and this year he is only requesting \$220,000.00.

Mr. Vera replied it is because they are trying to get other projects completed and they use the funds from HURF, another important thing with pavement preservation is that the first three(3) years they were doing a lot of crack sealing therefore it would be less funds needed for the slurry.

6.E. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding a contract with James Davey and Associates, Inc. associated with design services for County 24th Street - Avenue H (10th Ave) to Avenue F1/2. (Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works)

Mr. Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works, explained this item is for the design for County 24th Street connecting east San Luis with the west side of the city, continuing to F ½ to 10th Avenue or Avenue H then north to connect to the paved area next to Urtuzuastegui Street. Once this road is paved it will create another connection between the two parts of the city which will significantly decrease the congestion on 10th Avenue and Cesar Chavez Boulevard. Mr. James Davey is one of the consultants that we have on the on-call list; for this project there is land under the Bureau of Reclamation and some under Bureau of Land Management and the process can take up to two (2) years.

Mayor Gerardo Sanchez thanked Mr. Vera and added that the city needs to be ready in the event the grant is approved to do the planning.
