A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, REQUIRING CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL OF THE DESIGNS AND COLORS OF THE VARIOUS CITY OF SAN LUIS INSIGNIA, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE CITY SEAL, DEPARTMENT LOGOS, BADGES FOR THE POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS; REPEALING CONFLICTING PROVISIONS, AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

WHEREAS, the various insignia of the City of San Luis are vital representations of our City and its Departments; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that any alterations or updates are made with careful consideration and oversight; and

WHEREAS, in the interests of ensuring transparency, accountability, and a collective decision-making approach, the approval process for the city's insignia is best placed with the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona:

Section 1: Definitions as used in this resolution:

"City" means the City of San Luis, Arizona.

"City Insignia" means any emblem representing the City of San Luis, Arizona ("City"), including but not limited to, the City Seal, City flag, City department logos, City badges (including but not limited to the Police badges, the Fire Department badges, or other City Department badges or logos).

"City Seal" means the below design, which may also be called the City Logo, the City Service Mark, the City Symbol, or the City Emblem.



Section 2: The City Council shall have final approval or denial of:

- a. all aspects of City Insignia, including but not limited to their designs and colors;
- b. any and all alterations or updates to City Insignia and
- c. any additional proposed City Insignia.

Section 3: If a conflict arises between the provisions of this resolution and any other ordinance, resolution, order, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are amended, superseded, and replaced, and this Resolution shall govern.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction or controlling legislation, such decision or law shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Resolution.

Section 5: The City officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Resolution.
