AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, RELATING TO REQUIRING DOG LICENSES; DECLARING THE DOCUMENT TITLED “THE 2024 RESTATEMENT AND AMENDMENT TO THE SAN LUIS CITY CODE, CHAPTER 6.05” A PUBLIC RECORD AND ADOPTING IT BY REFERENCE; FIXING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; REPEALING CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona:

Section 1-Public Record: Certain documents known as “*The 2024 Restatement and Amendment to the San Luis City Code, Chapter 6.05-Animal Control*,” three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk of San Luis, Arizona, are declared to be a public record, and said copies are ordered to remain on file with the City Clerk.

Section 2-Incorporated by Reference: *The 2024 Restatement and Amendment to the San Luis City Code, Chapter 6.05-Animal Control* is referred to, adopted, incorporated, and made a part of this Ordinance No. 455 as if fully set out in this Ordinance in full.

Section 3-Effective Date: The provisions of *The 2024 Restatement and Amendment to the San Luis City Code, Chapter 6.05-Animal Control*, shall become effective on Friday, October 25, 2024.

Section 4-Penalties: Any person, firm, or corporation to violate or cause the violation of Section 6.05.031 – Dog license requirements – as set forth in *The 2024 Restatement and Amendment to the San Luis City Code, Chapter 6.05-Animal Control* in Section 6.05.990 as adopted by this Ordinance No. 455 shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.. Violations of Section 6.05.031 – Dog license requirements – each separate day, or part thereof, that a violation continues is a separate offense.

Section 5-Repealing Conflicting Provisions: If a conflict arises between the provisions of this Ordinance No. 455 and any other ordinance, or any resolution, order, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are amended, superseded, and replaced, and this Ordinance shall govern.

Section 6-Severability: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance No. 455 is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final

decision of any court of competent jurisdiction or controlling legislation, such decision or law shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance: The City officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Ordinance No. 455.
