

5.15.990 Penalties for violation.

(A) A person who violates any section of this chapter is responsible for a civil sanction punishable pursuant to the provisions of SLCC [1.05.990](#). Each day a violation continues shall be a separate offense punishable as heretofore described.

(B) A person who uses an area as a taxi stand or a taxi waiting stand; and:

- (1) The City of San Luis has not designated the area as a taxi stand or a taxi waiting stand; and
- (2) The area is publicly owned property; and
- (3) The area is within the area described in SLCC [5.15.020](#), definitions of border area taxi stand and border area taxi waiting stand; and
- (4) Whether or not the person has a border area taxi vehicle permit;

then the person is subject to a civil penalty not less than and not more than \$250.00 for each violation. For continuing violations, each day constitutes a separate offense.

It is not a civil offense for a taxicab to pick up a customer who has either hailed the taxicab or has otherwise requested that the taxicab pick them up, and the location does not violate any traffic, parking or other laws. 8.10.990 Penalty.

Upon conviction for violation of SLCC [8.10.010](#), the sentence to be imposed shall be a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both. (Ord. 15 § 4, passed 2-11-1981. Code 2012 § 91.99(B).)

8.25.100 Penalty.

- (A) A responsible party cited for a violation of any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a civil sanction and shall be fined an amount not more than \$500.00 per day.
- (B) Each day a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.
- (C) The City shall provide for payment by mail of fines imposed under this section.
- (D) The imposition of a penalty under the provisions of this section shall not waive any and all other legal remedies available to the City. (Ord. 422 § 2 (Att.), passed 12-8-2021.)

Upon conviction for violation of SLCC [9.05.010](#), the sentence to be imposed shall be a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both. (Ord. 15 § 4, passed 2-11-1981. Code 2012 § 90.99.)

10.15.990 Penalty.

- (A) *General.* Any person violating any provision of this chapter, for which no other penalty is provided, shall be subject to the civil traffic violation provisions of SLCC [10.05.990](#).
- (B) *Buses, Taxis and Livery.* Any person found guilty of violating any provision of SLCC [10.15.090](#) shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Each time a person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, and/or each day that a violation continues, shall be a separate offense punishable as hereinabove described.
- (C) *Parking Regulations.*
- (1) A person who violates any section of SLCC [10.15.200](#) through [10.15.295](#) is guilty of a civil traffic infraction. Violations of SLCC [10.15.200](#) through [10.15.295](#) for which a civil sanction is imposed shall be treated as a civil offense and hearings and appeals shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure in civil traffic violation cases as set forth in the Rules of Court Procedure for Civil Traffic, Boating, Marijuana, and Parking and Standing Violations.
- (2) Any person violating any of the provisions of SLCC [10.15.200](#) through [10.15.295](#) which are designated as subject to civil sanction or penalty shall be punished by imposition of a civil sanction not to exceed \$500.00, unless another penalty is specified.
- (a) Any person who fails to comply with payment of a civil sanction shall be guilty of violating A.R.S. § [13-2810](#), interference with judicial proceedings. A conviction shall not preclude the imposition of the assessment of a default fee and/or other fees as set forth below.
- (b) In addition to any civil sanction imposed, the Municipal Court shall assess a default fee of not less than \$75.00 for a failure to pay any civil sanction imposed by the court.
- (c) A judge or hearing officer may waive all or part of the default fee if the payment of the fee would cause a financial hardship to the defendant.
- (d) If the court refers any delinquent fines, fees, sanctions, penalties or restitution for collection, any collection or attorney costs are recoverable from the defendant and may be added to any balance due from the defendant to the court.
- (e) The imposition of a penalty does not prevent revocation or suspension of a license, permit or franchise.
- (f) Violations of SLCC [10.15.200](#) through [10.15.295](#) that are continuous with respect to time may be abated by injunctive or other equitable relief. The imposition of a penalty does not prevent injunctive or equitable relief. 10.30.990 Penalty.

(A) Any person in violation of SLCC [10.30.010](#) shall be found guilty of a civil infraction and be required to pay a minimum fine of \$50.00, which cannot be suspended except pursuant to subsection [\(B\)](#) of this section.

(B) The penalty provided in this section for a violation of SLCC [10.30.010](#) may be waived if any offender presents suitable proof that an approved helmet has been purchased or otherwise obtained since the time of the violation and that the minor uses or intends to use a helmet whenever required to do so by this chapter. 5.15.030 General.

- (A) No person shall engage in the public transportation business in public rights-of-way within the City without complying with the requirements of this chapter.
- (B) No taxicab, livery, or bus business or operator of a taxicab, livery, or bus shall operate without the following:
- (1) A City business license;
 - (2) Proper Arizona registration;
 - (3) Insurance as required for taxicabs, liveries, and buses by state law; and
 - (4) It shall be properly registered with the state and, if a bus, the United States Department of Transportation.
- (C) No vehicle shall stop, stand or park on the designated taxi stand other than a taxi possessing a license to conduct business as a taxi in this City.
- (D) No vehicle shall stop, stand or park on the designated bus stand other than a bus possessing authorization from this City, the state and the United States Department of Transportation.
- (E) No vehicle shall stop, stand, or park in or on a designated border area taxi stand or a border area taxi waiting stand other than a vehicle with a valid border area taxi vehicle permit. 5.15.020 Definitions.

Any term included in this chapter which is not defined herein shall be accorded that definition prescribed under other City ordinance(s) and A.R.S. §§ [13-101](#) and [28-101](#) et seq., the latter applying in the case of any inconsistency.

BORDER AREA TAXI STAND. Any taxi stand established on any right-of-way within the City limits of the City of San Luis located within the following area:

- (1) On the west, the western edge of San Luis Plaza Drive;
- (2) On the south, the border between the United States and Mexico;
- (3) On the east, the eastern edge of Sixth Avenue; and
- (4) On the north, the east-west alignment along the northern edge of D Street to the alignment of the western edge of San Luis Plaza Drive.

All taxicabs utilizing a taxi stand shall park with the right-side wheels of the vehicle no more than eight inches from the curb.

BORDER AREA TAXI WAITING STAND. Any taxi waiting stand established on any right-of-way or other public property located within the following area:

- (1) On the west, the western edge of San Luis Plaza Drive;
- (2) On the south, the border between the United States and Mexico;
- (3) On the east, the eastern edge of Sixth Avenue; and
- (4) On the north, the east-west alignment along the northern edge of D Street to the alignment of the western edge of San Luis Plaza Drive.

All taxicabs utilizing a taxi waiting stand shall park with the right-side wheels of the vehicle no more than eight inches from the curb.

BUS. Any motor vehicle designed for carrying more than 11 passengers and used for the transportation of individuals for hire with driver provided and has a set schedule and route; is fully licensed as a transportation business by the City, the state and the United States Department of Transportation.

BUS STAND. Such portions of publicly owned property designated as a bus stand pursuant to SLCC [10.15.090\(B\)](#).

BUSINESS. Engaging in the activity of carrying passengers or individuals for profit.

DETERIORATION. A lowering in quality in the condition or appearance of a vehicle or parts thereof characterized by dents, breaks, cracking, peeling, rusting or any other evidence of physical decay, neglect, excessive use or lack of maintenance.

FILTH. Foul matter, dirt or other matters that are attached to the body of a vehicle or the interior of the vehicle that causes a bad appearance.

HOLIDAY. The following City observed holidays:

- (1) New Year's Day (January 1st);
- (2) Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. (third Monday in January);
- (3) Presidents' Day (third Monday in February);
- (4) Memorial Day (last Monday in May);
- (5) Independence Day (July 4th);
- (6) Labor Day (first Monday in September);
- (7) Columbus Day (second Monday in October);
- (8) Veterans Day (November 11th);
- (9) Thanksgiving Day (fourth Thursday in November); and
- (10) Christmas Day (December 25th).

LIMOUSINE SERVICE. The providing of a motor vehicle designed by its manufacturer and identified by its vehicle registration as a limousine and in which both the limousine and a driver are provided for hire solely by individual agreement and which service is not available for open solicitation on the streets or at a taxicab or bus stand.

NIGHT TIME. The hours between 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

PERSON. Any individual, person, firm, corporation, association, joint venture, partnership or other form of business or combination thereof.

PUBLICLY OWNED PROPERTY. Has the same meaning as defined by SLCC [10.15.060\(D\)](#).

TAXI STAND. Such portions of publicly owned property designated as a taxi stand pursuant to SLCC [10.15.090\(B\)](#).

TAXI WAITING STAND. Such portions of publicly owned property designated as a taxi waiting stand pursuant to SLCC [10.15.090\(B\)](#).

TAXICAB. A taxi or livery as defined by SLCC [10.15.090](#).

UNDOCUMENTED ALIEN OR PERSON. A person who does not have documentation authorizing the person to be physically present in the United States pursuant to the immigration laws thereof.
