AN ORDER OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA RATIFYING ENTERING INTO THE SETTLEMENT PROPOSALS TO RESOLVE LEGAL CLAIMS AGAINST PURDUE/SACKLER AND EIGHT (8) MANUFACTURERS FOR ALLEGED MISCONDUCT RELATED TO OPIOIDS THROUGH THE INRE: NATIONAL PRESCRIPTION OPIATE LITIGATION; REPEALING CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2019, the City of San Luis opted to join In re: National Prescription Opiate Litigation, Multi-District Litigation Case No. 2804 (ND Ohio); and

WHEREAS, Rubris, the implementation administrator for In re: National Prescription Opiate Litigation, circulated the latest proposed settlements to end litigation against Purdue/Sackler and eight (8) Secondary Manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, the San Luis City Council finds it in the public interest for the city to join these settlements for the financial support toward abating the opioid crisis within the City of San Luis that the settlements afford.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona:

Section 1: The above-recitals, the settlements found at

and the signed releases in the attached Exhibit A are incorporated into this Order by these references as if fully set out here.

Section 2: The attached signed releases are ratified by this Order so that the City of San Luis may join the settlements of Purdue/Sackler and the eight (8) Secondary Manufacturers.

Section 3: If a conflict arises between the provisions of this Order and any other ordinance, resolution, order, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are amended, superseded, and replaced, and this Order shall govern.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Order is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction or controlling legislation, such decision or law shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Order.

Section 5: The City officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Order.
