7. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS:

7. A. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding authorization to approve the purchase of cement and water line installation materials for the East Community Park sidewalk project. (Angelica Roldan, Director of Parks and Recreation)

Ms. Angelica Roldan, Director of Parks & Recreation, mentioned that the Parks Grounds Department is collaborating with the Public Works Department to start the sidewalk project at East Community Park. This project involves constructing sidewalks linking the North, South, and West parking lots, the soccer field, and restrooms, and installing water lines. The Public Works Department has already begun leveling the ground in this area. The staff intends to work directly with BLT Companies for concrete purchases and Yuma Winnelson for the materials needed for the water line installation. The Public Works staff requested quotes for the water line installation materials, but managed to obtain only two (2) of the three (3) needed. They received just one (1) quote for cement, as BLT Companies is a regular vendor known for supplying reliable concrete materials. The concrete project will involve multiple cement purchases from BLT Companies throughout this fiscal year. Considering the concrete fee per cubic yard and taxes, staff recommended keeping the total under \$100,000.00. The quotes for the water line materials are also attached, with Yuma Winnelson providing the lowest quote. Each purchase exceeds the \$45,000.00 limit set by Section 3.05.010(D) of the San Luis Purchasing Code. The Public Works Department will provide labor for both purchases, thereby reducing the city's costs.

Staff is requesting the City Council's approval to buy materials from both BLT Companies and Yuma Winnelson by bypassing formal bidding procedures as allowed under the San Luis Purchasing Code Section 3.05.010(F) due to the urgency in securing formal bids for materials and labor, and to minimize labor costs since Public Works staff will assist the Parks Division as much as possible to make the East Community Park available for residents.

7. B. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding Resolution No. 2393. A Resolution of the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona, establishing rates for parking control devices; establishing a parking control zone; repealing any conflicting provisions; providing for severability. (Nigel Reynoso, Chief of Police)

Mr. Nigel Reynoso, Chief of Police, commented on Mayor Nieves Riedel's remarks about the City of San Luis being the safest city in Arizona by saying that, aside from acknowledging the great work that his staff does, he also recognized the community because it requires a good community that cares and works in partnership with the Police Department.

Chief Reynoso further explained that on August 24, 2022, the City Council officially set rates for parking control devices and parking meters that had been in operation in the city for several years and established a parking control zone with Resolution No. 2230. Since its inception, these rates and parking control zones have not been updated to reflect the city's current needs and costs. Section 10.15.100(B) of the City Code provides that the City Council, by resolution, may establish the rates for parking control devices and parking meters as needed. This resolution increases parking control device rates from \$0.50 to \$1.25 per hour, plus an additional \$0.35 transaction fee, and reestablishes parking control zones to better serve the city's needs. He provided examples from other border and non-border cities regarding their rates, as well as maintenance costs and revenues, for May 2024 to 2026. He added that another change will be the Pay Smarter application on electronic devices or pay with text.

There was some comments, discussion, questions and answers amongst Chief Reynoso and City Council on the misconception that the parking meters are a money maker or a revenue stream rather than enforcement, notification to the community about the changes, having coin paying customer parking meter for those who are not familiar on how to use an app or other options such as a prepaid card, purpose of parking meters, vehicles parked for longer periods of time including overnight parking, parking time per proposed resolution, customer parking to shop locally at the businesses on Main Street, 2-hour enforcement parking, projection of revenues from three (3) to five (5) years.

Mayor Nieves Riedel suggested holding a work session to discuss this matter further.

Ms. Alejandra Peru, Court Administrator, indicated that they are requesting to postpone this item indefinitely due to the 30-day fund transfer requirements that must be administered by the court with the City Council's concurrence. The current presiding judge is scheduled to depart this coming week, leaving the position vacant for a period. Because any fund transfer would not take place 30 days after the ordinance is enacted, they would be in a position where no presiding judge is available to oversee or concur with the expenditures. They want to pause this item until the next appointee is seated and can oversee fund administration.

8. A. Public hearing followed by discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding Variance Case No. 2026-0024 - Villegas Mixed-Use Project. A request by Fernando Villegas, owner, for a variance from the City of San Luis Zoning Ordinance Section 18.35.040 Table No. 7 to reduce the minimum front setback required from 15 ft. to 10 ft. and street side setback from 10 ft. to 5 ft. and to allow parking egress in backward motion into the public right-of-way in a Neighborhood Commercial District (C-1) on property located at 690 N Cesar Chavez Street in San Luis, Arizona. (Jose A. Guzman, Director of Development Services)

A. Staff presentation

Mr. Jose Guzman, Director of Development Services, explained that the applicant is requesting to reduce the required setback and to allow vehicles to exit the site on a backward motion. The question before the City Council is whether the variance meets the statutory and city code requirements. The property is zoned C1, a Neighborhood Commercial District, which allows the proposed use. The proposed use is an office on the first floor and a studio apartment on the second floor. Under the variance process, all required findings must be supported by the information in the record at the time of the public hearing.

He added that based on the information submitted, the request does not meet the required criteria. 70 from 102 lots within the C-1 do not meet the minimum size requirements for that zoning district. There are no special circumstances based on the submitted documentation. Also, staff cannot determine from the information submitted that a variance is necessary to allow reasonable use of the property. The most significant concern is the requested variance to allow the vehicle to exit in reverse. Therefore, the four (4) criteria require that the variance not be materially detrimental to the person's property or the public welfare. Based on the proposed site configuration and staff comments, the design will require the vehicle to back directly into C Street. This will create potential safety concerns due to limited visibility, the location of adjacent structures, and proximity to the intersection. Based on these findings, staff recommended denial of the variance.

B. Open Public Hearing

Mayor Nieves Riedel opened the Public Hearing.

C. Call to the public on this item

Mr. Fernando Villegas, the applicant, stated that according to his own research, he owns the smallest parcel in the City of San Luis. The property is 30 feet wide by 57 feet long at Cesar Chavez Street and C Street. The parcel was recorded in 1966, before Yuma County adopted any zoning regulations. This parcel has long been used as a parking space for a mobile home and a garage at the back of the lot. Years later, the City of San Luis rezoned the downtown area to commercial, and this small residential lot must now comply with commercial standards. Because the property is now commercial, he proposed building the first mixed-use project in San Luis, which will be 22 x 20, the size of a two-car garage, and each floor is required to provide one (1) parking space; therefore, it will have two (2) parking spaces. He wanted to avoid a full variance and requested a minor variance, where he could request a maximum of 20% reduction, as the zoning ordinance allows minor variances to reduce parking requirements and Mr. Guzman has the discretion to waive some parking requirements using the minor variance process. However, it was not possible due to Mr. Guzman's interpretation because of his need to more than one (1) reduction.

Some discussion, comments, questions and answers ensued amongst the City Council, Mr. Guzman, Ms. Jenny Torres, City Manager, and Mr. Villegas.
