## **2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Council Member Esteban C. Rosales led the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **3. INVOCATION**

The invocation was performed by Ms. Elida Valenzuela – Police Chaplain.

Mayor Nieves Riedel extended her sincere appreciation to Ms. Valenzuela for graciously agreeing to deliver the invocation, noting that this responsibility has become an increasingly significant burden.

## **4. CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Mr. James Allen Jr., 1549 E. Babbitt Lane, San Luis, AZ, asked about the purpose of plots of land. Isn't there a perimeter or buffer area that sets the distance between houses and the state prison? He would like to find out how close it is and whether it is being monitored as the building goes up. He also asked when the last environmental study was conducted in the City of San Luis. As they may know, probably one has the highest rate of incidence of children and adults with disabilities, which can be targeted through either pollution, water contamination, or a lot of other things. He asked the Mayor and the City Council to look into conducting a study to determine whether these things are true, so that appropriate steps could be taken to protect the citizens. Lastly, he commented on when someone desires to run for office, he followed the letter of the law. He noted that many people's signs were already out before this Monday, which marked the start of political sign posting. He thinks that if they are going to do things, they need to do them decently and in order and follow the rule of law. If they are not going to follow the rule of law, there should be a price for those who do not.

Ms. Angelica Roldan, Director of Parks & Recreation, announced that the City of San Luis was the only city in the county selected to receive community beautification funding from Arizona Public Service (APS) as part of their 140<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. This investment will allow the Parks & Recreation Department to make important improvements at Joe Orduño Park.

She further noted that the funding will help replace the metal shade structure at F1 Baseball Field and restore the tennis courts. She introduced Ms. Nicole Kulpepper from APS.

Ms. Kulpepper mentioned that they were happy to offer this grant to the Parks & Recreation Department for the beautification project, as they chose to give back in ways that serve the communities that have grown up with them.

Mr. Jose F. Garcia, a Yuma resident, commented that on the 20th of last month, he had to go to see the doctor in San Luis, Mexico, and that he parked in a handicap space on Main Street in San Luis, Arizona. Upon his return, he found a yellow envelope on the windshield of his vehicle, which resulted in a citation for parking in a handicap space, even though he held his handicap placard. He called the court to inquire about the citation and was informed that the fine is \$150.00 and that, if he wanted a payment plan, an additional \$20.00 would be added. He is unsure if it only happens in San Luis or in other places in the United States, where a handicapped person gets a ticket for parking in a handicap space.

Mayor Nieves Riedel asked Mr. Garcia to come to City Hall the following day, as she is interested in meeting with him to discuss this issue, which is very interesting and requires attention.

## **7. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS:**

### **7. A. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the purchase of a new Zoll Cardiac Monitor. (Angel Ramirez, Fire Chief)**

Mr. Angel Ramirez, Fire Chief, stated that he is requesting authorization to purchase a Zoll Cardiac monitor, one of the most expensive pieces of equipment they must use daily. 80% of their calls are EMS calls, and they probably use this equipment on every single call. They do not have a spare cardiac monitor as they are very expensive, and are trying to upstaff another vehicle, as discussed during the budget retreat. This item was budgeted for this fiscal year. Staff would like to use Zoll Cardiac, as they are a sole source company and as allowed through the Procurement Code Section 3.05.020.

### **7. B. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the City of San Luis Business Center Electrical Service and Exhaust Project. (Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works)**

Mr. Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works, explained that this contract adds electrical service and an exhaust system to half the building that lacks power, where the Call Center is located near San Luis Plaza Drive. Approximately half of that building, 20,000 square feet, is used by the city for storage by several departments and is currently a safety issue.

He pointed out that, with this project, there will be lighting, making it more useful for continued storage. The project was advertised, bids were received and Merrill Development was the lowest bidder at \$104,00.00. This project will be completed before the end of the fiscal year.

**7. C. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the approval of Amendment No. 1 to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the City of San Luis and the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) for the US 95 Raised Median Project. (Manuel Hernandez, Assistant Director of Public Works)**

Mr. Manuel Hernandez, Assistant Director of Public Works, stated that Amendment No. 1 to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), approved in February 2024, is for the US Highway 95 raised median project. The amendment revises the project limits from the original segment from County 20 ½ Street to County 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, which was 1.5 miles, to the revised segment from County 21<sup>st</sup> Street to County 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, reducing it to approximately 1.1 miles. The adjustment was necessary because the final design cost estimate exceeded the programmed federal HSIP funding. The total project cost and funding structure remain unchanged, including the city's match. Additionally, all other terms of the original agreement remain the same.

**7. D. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the approval of additional funding for ADOT project administrative fees and right of way and environmental clearances for the Los Alamos Street & 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue Curve Realignment Project (ADOT Project No. T044201D/03D). (Manuel Hernandez, Assistant Director of Public Works)**

Mr. Manuel Hernandez, Assistant Director of Public Works, requested approval of \$37,456.00 in additional funding for the Los Alamos Street and 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue curve realignment project to cover Arizona Department of Transportation's (ADOT) administrative fees, third-party right-of-way services and environmental clearances. This important safety improvement project was originally approved by the Mayor and City Council in 2023 via an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with ADOT. As design progressed, additional right-of-way requirements and environmental coordination have extended the timeline and increased cost beyond the original estimates. ADOT invoiced the city \$37,456.00 to cover the necessary project advancement costs. Per the IGA, the city is responsible for all costs that exceed the initial estimates. The environmental clearance is to be completed by July 2026; the stage 4 submittal is due at the end of July, which is approximately 95% of the design. They expect to complete the entire design by December. The December right-of-way clearances are scheduled for completion by March 2027, at which point ADOT will begin bidding.

**7. E. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the award of a contract to DPE Construction, Inc. for Lakin Drive Subsidence Issue - Road Improvement Construction project. (Tomas Sanchez, City Engineer)**

Mr. Tomas Sanchez, City Engineer, indicated that staff is seeking approval to award the construction contract to DPE Construction for the Lakin Drive subsidence roadway improvement construction project. He provided some background, adding that this project was advertised and two (2) bids were received by local contractors, DPE Construction and Gutierrez Canales Engineering. Bids were evaluated, and after review, DPE Construction was determined to be the lowest responsible bidder, capable of performing the work for \$371,800.00. This will impact two (2) fiscal years, with \$200,000.00 this fiscal year and approximately \$175,000.00 next fiscal year to complete the project. The project's duration will be approximately three (3) months, and the contractor will mobilize as soon as the notice to proceed is given.

**7. F. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding the award of a contract to Kimley Horn and Associates, Inc. for environmental professional services for the 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue Widening Project - Cesar Chavez Boulevard to County 22<sup>nd</sup> Street. (Tomas Sanchez, City Engineer)**

Mr. Tomas Sanchez, City Engineer, explained that the Engineering Department is seeking approval to award a contract to Kimley Horn and Associates for professional environmental services for the 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue widening project from Cesar Chavez Boulevard to County 22<sup>nd</sup> Street. He briefly described the scope of work, noting that these environmental studies are required by the bureau's regulations as part of the right-of-way acquisition process for the 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue road widening project and are not necessary to advance the project through the federal environmental review and right-of-way approval processes. Kimberly Horn will take approximately four (4) months from notice to proceed to complete these studies and submit them to the Bureau of Reclamation. Staff recommended approval of this contract to Kimley Horn in the amount of \$89,500.00.

Questions, answers and discussion ensued amongst the City Council and Mr. Sanchez.

Mr. Sanchez stated that the reason the environmental assessments are needed is due to the entity required to work with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) or the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) when the city wants to obtain the right of way from federal land and to protect the environment, the owls, make sure one will not disturb archaeological sites and protect the flat horn lizard.

**7. G. Discussion and possible action on any and all matters regarding Resolution No. 2398. A Resolution of the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona, a Municipal Corporation of Arizona, authorizing the submission of an application for additional financial assistance from the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund program to support the expansion of the West Wastewater Treatment Plant. (Roula Encinas, Director of Finance)**

Ms. Roula Encinas, Director of Finance, stated that in October 2024, the City Council authorized staff to apply for funding from the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) to expand the west wastewater treatment plant. In December 2025, the city was approved for approximately \$26.2 million through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program. After the project entered the bidding phase, the lowest responsive and responsible bid came in significantly higher than originally estimated at approximately \$41 million. Due to increased construction costs, staff is requesting authorization to apply for approximately \$12 million in additional WIFA funding to help close the remaining funding gap. The remaining \$3 million balance would be funded from the wastewater utility reserve. This project remains a critical infrastructure investment for the city, supporting current and future wastewater capacity, regulatory compliance, and continued community growth. Additionally, the WIFA program continues to offer one of the most cost-effective financing options, with low interest rates and favorable repayment terms.

She mentioned that staff is requesting approval of Resolution No. 2398, which authorizes the submission of an application for additional financial assistance from WIFA. Final loan terms will be brought back to the City Council for approval at a future meeting.

Questions, answers, and discussion followed amongst the City Council, Ms. Encinas, and Mr. Eulogio Vera, Director of Public Works.
