The UASI Grant Program is administered by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

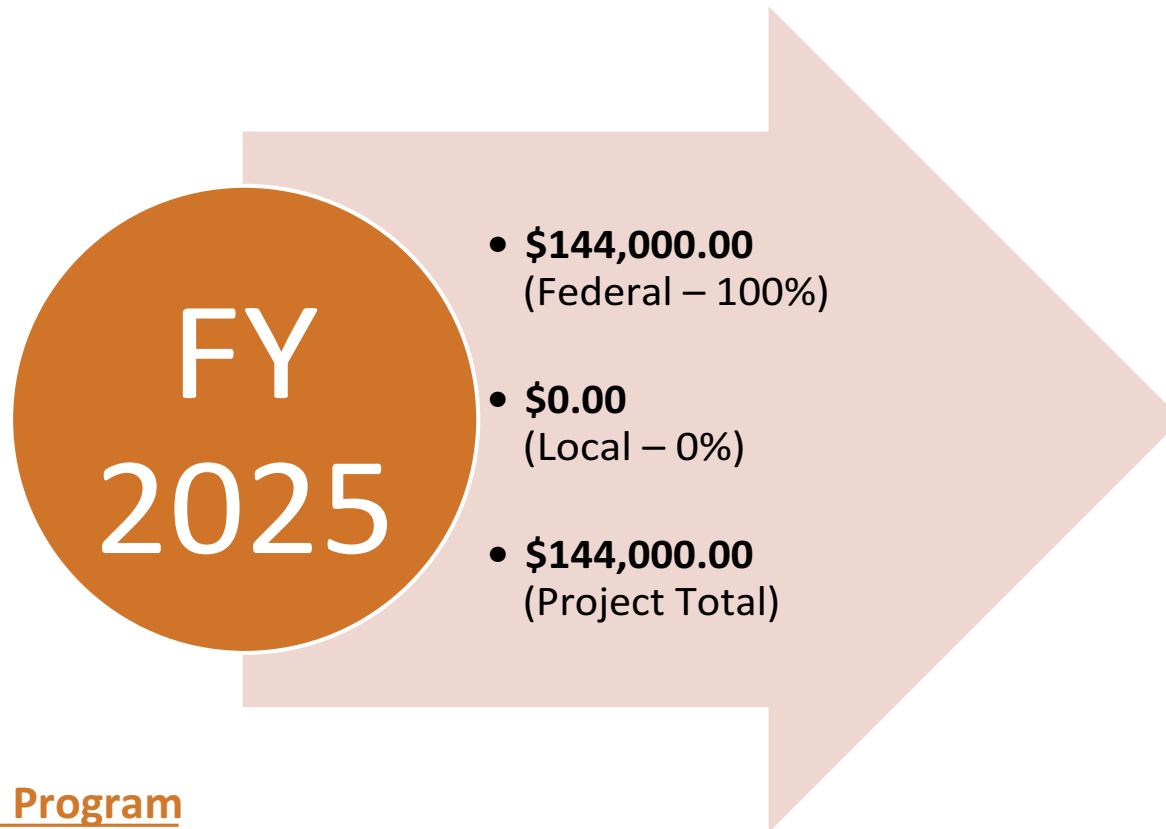
- Managed by the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM), Office of the Governor (OOG), and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Designed to address unique multi-discipline planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of urban areas. This includes investments in areas such as:

- Preventing threatened or actual acts of terrorism, protecting the people of Schertz and its assets against the greatest threats and hazards, mitigating the loss of life and property, responding quickly to save lives, protect property and the environment, meet basic human needs, and recover from acts of terrorism.

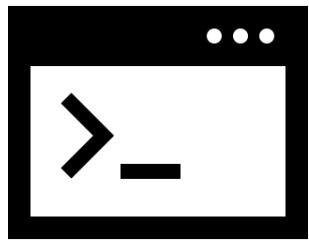
