

**CITY OF SHERIDAN  
RESOLUTION 13-26**

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE PLACEMENT OF CHAIRS, OBJECTS, BARRICADES, AND OTHER ITEMS ALONG PUBLIC SIDEWALKS AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY PRIOR TO THE WYO RODEO PARADE.

WHEREAS, The WYO Rodeo Parade is a longstanding community tradition attracting residents and visitors to the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, members of the public frequently place chairs, benches, coolers, ropes, barricades, and other personal property along sidewalks, curbs, and public rights-of-way in advance of the parade to reserve viewing locations; and

WHEREAS, the premature placement of such items may obstruct pedestrian travel, interfere with public safety operations, create accessibility concerns, and impede street cleaning and parade preparation activities; and

WHEREAS, the governing body desires to establish reasonable regulations to ensure public safety, maintain orderly access to public spaces, and provide fair and equitable parade viewing opportunities.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SHERIDAN, WYOMING:

The City approves Resolution 13-26 as a statement of policy as follows:

1. Placement Restrictions - No person shall place chairs, benches, coolers, signs, or other personal property upon any public sidewalk, curb, street, alley, or public right-of-way along the WYO Rodeo Parade route prior to 5:00 p.m. on the day immediately preceding the parade.

2. Prohibited Obstructions - All items placed along the parade route shall maintain a minimum unobstructed pedestrian pathway of not less than five (5) feet in width and shall comply with all applicable accessibility and fire safety requirements.

3. No Reserved Public Property - Placement of personal property along the parade route shall not constitute ownership, reservation, or exclusive use of any public space.

4. Removal of Unauthorized Items - Any items placed in violation of this Resolution may be removed by authorized personnel without prior notice and placed at a location of their choosing where the owners can pick the items up. The City of Sheridan shall not be responsible for loss of or damage to removed items.

5. Barricades and Structures - No privately owned barricades, fencing, ropes, chains, cables, platforms, tents, or similar structures shall be erected within the public right-of-way without prior written authorization from the City of Sheridan.

6. Public Safety Exception - Authorized public safety personnel, parade officials, and municipal employees may place barricades or traffic control devices as necessary for parade operations and public safety.

7. Enforcement - The provisions of this Resolution may be enforced by law enforcement officers, code enforcement personnel, public works employees, or other authorized officials.

8. Effective Date - This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and shall remain in effect unless amended or repealed by subsequent action of the governing body.
