a. Public Hearing to consider Aristidis John Pontikas request to rezone from "A" (Single Family Residential) to "A-2" (Patio Home) to construct new homes; being approximately .85 acres; all of Lot 1 and the west 40.00' of Lot 2 in Block 4 of Lakeview Subdivision; located at 36th Avenue North, Texas City, Texas.

This issue came before the Zoning Commission on November 18, 2008. One letter of opposition was received from Mr. Steve Capps regarding property values. The applicant provided his development intent to the Zoning Commission members present. He provided pictures of existing facilities that they have built in the past in order to provide a conceptual illustration of how this project will look. After reviewing all the data presented to the Zoning Commission members present, the members unanimously voted to recommend approval of the request with the stipulation of the Board of Adjustments approving a variance to the 1 Acre minimum for "A-2" (Patio Homes) performance standards. The Board of Adjustments approved the variance request on December 9, 2008.

Mr. Carroll read Mr. Steve Capps' letter of opposition into the record.

To whom it may concern,

I vehemently oppose the petition to rezone my neighbourhood from an "A" (Single Family Residence) to an "A2" (Patio Home) on all of Lot 1 and the West 40" of Lot 2 in Block 4 of Lakeview Subdivision.

The reasoning for this decision is that this type of housing will lower my property value. I will not support this in any way when it will directly affect the market value of my home. The houses will be very small and close together and will not only be an eye sore, but the small value of the houses on the property will lower the value of all of the homes around them.

ANALYSIS

The low, responsible bid meeting all specifications was received from D.L. Elliott Enterprises, Inc., in Sugarland, for the total base bid and Alternate # 1 and # 2 for a total of \$987,671.50. D.L. Elliott Enterprises, Inc. appears to be a responsible firm that is capable of performing the specified work in a satisfactory manner.

It is my recommendation to award the Water Line Replacement Project - Phase 9 to D.L. Elliott Enterprises, Inc, for the total base bid and Add Alternate # 1 and # 2 for a total of \$987,671.50 and that the Mayor is authorized to execute a contract on behalf of the City Commission. I further recommend that the Mayor be authorized to approve change orders, not to exceed 25% of the contract amount, without bringing the matter to before the Commission.





BACKGROUND

On January 23, 2009, five (5) bid packets were mailed to area vendors. A bid tabulation is attached for your review.

Bids opened Tuesday, February 10, 2009 at 2:00 p.m.

A budget amendment of \$465,000.00 was approved by City Commission on January 21, 2009, providing the funds to award roofing projects related to damages incurred by Hurricane Ike.

ANALYSIS

The low responsible bids meeting all specifications were received as follows:

Con-Tex Services, Inc., in Houston Item #1 Doyle Convention Center \$63,910.00 Item #4 Carver Park Community Center \$164,000.00

John A. Walker Roofing, Inc. in La Marque Item #2 Fire Station #2 \$117,700.00 Item #3 Wastewater Treatment Plant \$39,000.00

Grand total price for the projects: \$384,610.00

Both vendors are approved to install Garland Roofing - per project specifications.

It is my recommendation to award the re-roofing projects to Con-Tex Services, Inc., for a total bid of \$227,910.00 and John A. Walker Roofing, Inc., for a total bid of \$156,700.00 and that the Mayor is authorized to execute the contracts on behalf of the City Commission. I further recommend that the Mayor be authorized to approve change orders, not to exceed 25% of the contract amounts, without bringing the matter before the Commission.

ORDINANCE NO. 09-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 40 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF TEXAS CITY, GALVESTON COUNTY, TEXAS, ALSO KNOWN AS THE ZONING ORDINANCE, "A", **FROM DISTRICT** REZONING **SINGLE** RESIDENTIAL TO DISTRICT "E", GENERAL BUSINESS, FOR HARVIN MOORE / AMBURN OAKS TO DEVELOP A RETAIL SERVICE CENTER; ORDERING SAID CHANGES MADE ON THE CITY ZONING MAP: CONTAINING A SAVINGS CLAUSE: PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; DISPENSING WITH THE CHARTER REQUIREMENT FOR READING THIS ORDINANCE ON THREE (3) SEPARATE DAYS; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND ADOPTION AND PUBLICATION BY CAPTION ONLY IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE CITY.

WHEREAS, due and proper notice has been given and public hearing held and all other required action taken to amend the Zoning Ordinance for the City of Texas City, Texas, and it is the considered opinion of the City Commission that said Ordinance be amended and changed as follows for the public welfare, good, economy, and enjoyment;

WHEREAS, this property was previously granted preliminary rezoning approval by both the zoning commission and the city commission; and

WHEREAS, a building permit has been issued for the construction to begin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF TEXAS CITY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That certain property located within the City of Texas City, being Reserve A, Amburn Oaks Subdivision, approximately 9.5 acres out of the S. F. Austin League, located on the corner of Amburn Road and FM 1765, in Texas City, Galveston County, Texas, currently zoned as District "A" (Single Family Residential), is hereby rezoned and classified as District "E" (General Business), to construct a neighborhood retail service center.

SECTION 2: That the City Engineer shall designate said changes from District "A", Single Family Residential, to District "E", General Business, as hereinabove provided on the original zoning map, as amended, and on the duplicate copy thereof kept in the Office of the City Planning Board.

SECTION 3: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed. In the event any section, clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance shall be for any reason adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect, invalidate, or impair the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: That the Charter requirement for reading this Ordinance on three (3) separate days has been dispensed by a majority vote of the City Commission.

SECTION 5: That this Ordinance shall be finally passed upon the date of its introduction and shall become effective from and after its passage and adoption and publication by caption only in the official newspaper of the City.

AN ORDINANCE CORRECTING ORDINANCE NO. 08-52 AND AMENDING THE CITY CODE, CHAPTER 90, "PERSONNEL", SECTION 90-151 "CLASSES OF POSITIONS," BY INCREASING THE NUMBER OF POSITIONS WITHIN THE CLASSIFICATION OF ENGINEER BY ONE; PRESCRIBING THE RESULTING NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN EACH CLASSIFICATION OF THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; DISPENSING WITH THE REQUIREMENT FOR READING THIS ORDINANCE ON THREE (3) SEPARATE DAYS; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND ADOPTION AND PUBLICATION BY CAPTION ONLY IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE CITY.

WHEREAS, section 143.021 of the **Texas Local Government Code** requires the governing body of a municipality to provide for the classification of all fire fighters by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, section 143.021 provides that the governing body must establish the classifications as well as the number of positions within each classification; and

WHEREAS, on December 17, 2008, the City Commission adopted Ordinance No. 08-52 which added the classification of Assistant Fire Chief and provided for the resulting number of firefighters within each classification; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No.08-52 incorrectly stated the number of authorized engineers within said classification as 18, when is should have stated 19 engineers; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Texas City deems it is in the best interest of the City to correct Ordinance No.08-52 and amend Chapter 90, "Personnel", by increasing the number of authorized engineer positions from eighteen (18) to nineteen (19), and to thereby prescribe the resulting number of positions in each classification of the classified service of the Fire Department by ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF TEXAS CITY, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: That Chapter 90, "Personnel" of **The City Code of the City of Texas City** is amended by amending section 90-151 to add one engineer position and to prescribe the number of resulting positions in each classification of the classified service of the Fire Department, which shall read and provide as follows:

"Sec. 90-151. Classes of Positions.

Effective on October 1, 2008, the following classes of positions, and number of positions within each classification, were hereby established in the classified service of the City's Fire Department:

SECTION 2: It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Commission that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are severable.

SECTION 3: That it is further provided that, in the event any section, clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this Ordinance shall be for any reason adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect, invalidate, or impair the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: That the Charter requirement for reading this Ordinance on three (3) separate days has been dispensed by a majority vote of the City Commission.

SECTION 6: That this Ordinance shall be finally passed and adopted on the date of its introduction and shall become effective from and after its passage and adoption and publication by caption only in the official newspaper of the City.
