#### **PURPOSE:**

#### **ITEM SUMMARY:**

• Dog Park grand opening was a huge success: https://www.wabasha.org/dogpark/.

- Month has been busy looking at financial and budget for next year.
- Wendy attended a webinar on new policies around paid parental leave and paid FMLA. This will include pool employees, ambulance and fire volunteers, will result in a budget impact in 2026.
- Staff met with the League of Minnesota to look at our claims and strategize around best practices for insurance claims.

### • Port Authority

- Submitting \$10,000 grant for Eagles Basin Playground for 2025.
- The Main Street East land survey showed that the right of way would belong to the condos across the street if combined with the City parcel. Will need Port to weigh in on next steps.
- Submitted \$164,000 grant towards demolishing former transfer building site and parking lot. This should off-set TIF. Still waiting until "mid-August" for results on the housing grant. Would re-strategize if that does not move forward.
- Barge Terminal: Lisa and I completed requirements on an anti-discrimination policy and complaint process for the Port Authority for the grant. Environmental assessment work still underway. Expected completion fall.

**DEPARTMENT:** Emergency Management

#### **PURPOSE:**

Discuss the need for Reception Center training/drill/operation hourly increase in incentive pay.

#### **ITEM SUMMARY:**

Reception Center operation, drill, and training hours are all funded by a \$25,000 per year grant to the City of Wabasha. This money is used to cover the cost of operation, materials, and work hours for the program. Due to the inability of being able to achieve a full roster of personnel who volunteer to work with us, we need to raise the level of pay. Wabasha County is raising their pay to \$30 per hour to help keep whom they have and bring in new recruits to fill the roster for each station. This \$1,200 dollar increase has a very minimal affect to the grant budget. All city staff get paid their normal hourly pay. The volunteers consist of WFD, Ambulance, and other members of a government organization that sign up to help and be on our roster.

2 hour hands on course will be paid \$60.

2 hours online training will be paid \$60.

Drill night of 4 hours will be paid \$120.

#### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:**

#### PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Wabasha was held on Tuesday, July 2, 2024, and was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Durand.

Present: Council Member John Friedmeyer; Council Member Dean Meurer; Council Member Brian

Wodele; Council Member Jeff Sulla; Mayor Emily Durand; Council Member Tim Wallerich;

Council Member Eugene Jensen

All present stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

### 1. Pledge of Allegiance

2. **Guest Speaker - Representative Pam Altendorf - Post Session Update**Representative Altendorf summarized legislation that was passed during this past session,

Representative Altendorf summarized legislation that was passed during this past session, including clarification of school resource officers and other reforms. She expressed concerns about the size of the State budget and oversight issues relating to nonprofit organizations. She discussed school funding. She expressed disappointment about the bonding bill discussion process, noting that there was a lack of willingness to compromise. She described her commitment to fund infrastructure projects. She reported that additional funding was allocated toward emergency medical services. She stated that it has been an honor to work with City officials and provided her contact information. When asked whether a special legislative session would be scheduled this summer to discuss flooding events and other pending issues, Representative Altendorf indicated that she had no knowledge of this.

### 3. Public Comments

Mayor Durand reviewed the public comment procedure.

Rob Carrels, 2150 West Grant Boulevard, Wabasha, discussed his family's opposition to the proposed use of property next to their property. He expressed concerns about noise, truck traffic, and property devaluation. He referenced a recent presentation, during which he asked a question that was not addressed.

Kay Kay, 224 Third Street East, Wabasha, expressed appreciation for the emergency declaration and for the community working together during recent flooding events. She also described the work of community nonprofit organizations. Mayor Durand thanked Emergency Management Director Riley Costello and City staff for their hard work.

### 4. Changes or Additions to Agenda

Council Member Sulla requested moving Item 8.1 from the consent agenda to the general business portion of the meeting. There were no other changes or additions to the agenda.

### 5. Mayor's Presentation - Mayor Emily Durand

Mayor Durand further expressed appreciation for the hard work of the community during recent flooding events. She relayed positive comments about programming at the Wabasha Library and athletic field activities. She referenced ongoing projects. Plans for the 4th of July fireworks and parking considerations were discussed.

### 6. Committee Reports and Wabasha Good News

Utilities Commission: There was no update.

Park Board / Street Commission: There was no report.

Port Authority: Council Member Friedmeyer summarized topics of discussion during a recent meeting, including a purchase agreement for property acquisition relating to the barge terminal, survey work of City-owned land to evaluate the potential for future housing development, discussions with Kwik Trip representatives relating to the Highway 60 re-route project, and the work and goals of the CEDA Coordinator. City Administrator Gregerson referenced ongoing discussions with the DNR relating to the barge terminal project in terms of rezoning and future development of the site.

Ambulance Service: Ambulance Director Ryan Marking provided a staffing update, reviewed call statistics, and discussed the RFP process.

Planning Commission: Council Member Wallerich summarized topics of discussion during a recent meeting, including approval of a CUP request for an accessory garage, proposed rezoning, and ordinance revisions.

Public Works Director Tony Johnson provided project updates and discussed parking considerations.

Heritage Preservation Commission: Mayor Durand discussed the work of the HPC, including approval of signage for new businesses and design reviews for building renovation projects.

### 1. Employee Recognitions

Police Chief Joe Stark expressed appreciation for the service of Wabasha Police Department staff. He described the work of Rob Venz, Ben Swanson, and Heidi Johnson and congratulated them on their anniversaries.

#### 1. Administrator's Report

City Administrator Gregerson discussed the environmental assessment report for the former Grandpa's Barn property. She further discussed the barge terminal project, provided grant funding updates, and detailed potential grant opportunities. Administrator Gregerson and Council Member Sulla described networking opportunities during a recent League of Minnesota Cities conference.

### 10. **General Business**

1. Resolutions 31-2024 and 32-2024: 2024 Street Project

City Engineer Brian Malm provided background information and reviewed the approval process for the 2024 street improvement project. He discussed the bidding process and reported that one bid was received from Rochester Sand and Gravel for approximately \$267,500, noting that this was close to the project cost estimate. He reviewed the total project cost of \$329,808.52, noting that this includes engineering and administrative expenses. He referenced the resolutions to declare project costs to be assessed and set a date for the assessment hearing. He detailed the proposed assessments, per City policy, including a 10-year term and a 3.75% interest rate. He discussed the public hearing notification process. He stated that, following the assessment hearing, the Council will be asked to consider taking action to approve the project construction.

Moved by Council Member John Friedmeyer, seconded by Council Member Tim Wallerich to adopt Resolution 31-2024, declaring project costs to be assessed, per the City's assessment policy.

#### 2. 30-2024 Resolution Declaring Emergency

Emergency Management Director Riley Costello provided a flood event update and reviewed predictions provided by the National Weather Service. He referenced damages and detailed plans for reopening roads, camps, and parks. He reviewed the emergency declaration process and discussed State and Federal funding assistance.

Moved by Council Member Tim Wallerich, seconded by Council Member Eugene Jensen to adopt Resolution 30-2024, declaring a 30-day emergency.

### 3. Greenfield Township Ambulance Request

Finance Director Tyler Grabau provided background information and reviewed two potential scenarios for Greenfield Township contributions toward ambulance services. City Administrator Gregerson summarized a recent conversation with the Greenfield Township City Clerk, during which ambulance service funding, township contributions, and property tax impacts were discussed. Council Member Wodele discussed the need for public education. Mayor Durand provided suggestions for taking an active role in this regard. The upcoming election was referenced, and it was suggested to request further discussion with the Greenfield Township Board following the election.

Council Member Sulla requested clarifiation of whether the application is for a loan or a grant. City Engineer Brian Malm provided additional information regarding the grant program.

The City of Wabasha requests your support and co-sponsorship of H.R. 1666 and S. 1673. These pieces of legislation would extend the current temporary increases under the Medicare ambulance fee schedule of 2% urban, 3% rural and 22.6% super rural for another three years. Additionally, the Senate version of the bill would go even further by increasing the add-on payment levels for urban from 2% to 3.4%, for rural from 3% to 4.3% and for super rural from 22.6% to 26.2% to help offset the increased costs of providing ground ambulance services.

The additional three-year extension is critical to keep the add-on payments in place through ambulance data collection and provide time to Congress to then use the data to reform the Medicare ambulance fee schedule.

Our ambulance services in southeast MN are struggling with deficits that continue to grow due to the need for reform of the Medicare ambulance fee schedule. Action must be taken or more of these ambulance services will not be able to continue service. Our entire regional ambulance structure is at risk, which puts all our residents at risk.

Thank you for working with our communities to keep ambulance services financially viable to continue serving our residents.

ITEM TITLE: SERVEPRO WORK - Disinfecting City Playgrounds & Buildings

**DEPARTMENT:** Public Works

#### **PURPOSE:**

#### **ITEM SUMMARY:**

Riley Costello (Emergency Manager) worked with Tony Johnson (Director of Public Works) on obtaining a bid for the work of disinfecting the parks after the floodwaters had receded. After the flood of 2023, we contracted the disinfection work through White's Restoration out of Rochester, MN for the Warming House at the old Athletic Field. We decided to get a bid through Servpro this time based on their specialized experience dealing with flood clean up and FEMA. All disinfection work after the 23 flood was covered through federal assistance and Riley expects the work this year to be covered again after speaking with a representative at the state. Disinfection must take place sooner rather than later due to the bacteria the flood has left behind. That is why, at Tony and Riley's request, the work has already been approved, but we wanted to record the approval in minutes. The attached quote covers the disinfection of the Warming House at the old Athletic Field, Beach Park playground equipment and shelters, Malone Park playground equipment and shelters, and Izaak Walton bathrooms and shelters.







ITEM TITLE: 2024 crack-fill project

**DEPARTMENT:** Public Works

### **PURPOSE:**

Discuss the plan for 2024 crack-filling project.

### **ITEM SUMMARY:**

This crack-sealing project will clean up a few odd sections that were not completed earlier due to budget limitations, and also clean up a couple of bike paths which will need surface sealing, hopefully next year. Our public Works crew has sprayed the weeds and will remove them ahead of the crack-filling so we can save some \$\$. As you can see with price increases our coverage compared to cost is dwindling like everything else. There is a big need to make the case that we need more maintenance money added to our budget. We have chip sealing projects coming hopefully next year that we need to start. All the new streets that were completed in 2013 are overdue, Mill & Overlay projects from 2017 & 2019 are getting overdue, bike paths are overdue, and parking lots need maintenance. On another note, we are investigating another form of surface sealing called micro-surfacing. Roughly the same price but may last longer with a better surface finish than loose rock. There are quite a few cities that use this method. Both surface sealing methods range from \$2.50-\$3.50 per square yard. \$3,400 per block on an average street 340 ft long x 30 ft wide.

### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:**

Street Commission approved and moved for approval to City Council due to the expenditure being over \$5,000.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Fahrner Asphalt sealers have been doing work in Wabasha for 20+ years. Their price has always been competitive, and their quality of work is 2nd to none. They are the same company that does work for Wabasha County, and MNDOT. They work well for us because they are always traveling from Wisconsin to Minnesota across the bridge, and it's convenient for both of us to have them do our street maintenance. We recommend that they complete our work.



### **NOTICE OF LIEN RIGHTS**

### **PURCHASER'S RESPONSIBILITIES**

PURCHASER acknowledges and understands that it shall be responsible for obtaining any and all permits which may be required in connection with the performance of this Proposal/Contract. Where applicable, PURCHASER shall also be responsible for backfilling areas that border along the newly paved surface to eliminate potential cracking. PURCHASER assumes all liability for any damages done to underground utilities and/or structures unless CONTRACTOR has been notified, upon acceptance of this Proposal, as to the specific location and depth of any such buried utilities/structures.

Due to Minnesota winters and expansion and contraction of the ground, some cracking of the pavement may be experienced. There are no express or implied warranties of merchantability, quality, quantity or of fitness for any particular purpose, which extend beyond those specifically set out in this document.

All warranties are void if payment is not made as stipulated.

### **DELINQUENCY CHARGE**

Payment is due and payable upon completion of each stage of the work. If PURCHASER defaults on the payment required, PURCHASER will be liable for all costs of collection, including reasonable attorney's fees, and a delinquency charge on the balance at the maximum rates allowed by law. The Delinquency Charge rate shall be 1.5% per month (18% APR) plus all costs of collection, including reasonable attorney's fees. ### PRODUCT INFORMATION AND MAINTENANCE

Since the asphalt in blacktop needs time to harden and cure, usually 6-12 months, your asphalt pavement will remain soft and pliable during warm weather. During this time, don't park in the same spot every time and do not turn your steering wheel back and forth when your car is not moving. It is not unusual to experience some cracking over the winter due to the contraction and expansion of the ground, especially over culverts, pipes, electric wires, etc. Avoid gasoline and petroleum product spills as they will destroy your pavement. If spills do occur, immediately flush with lots of soapy water. If you decide to seal coat your pavement, wait until the summer following installation. We recommend a good quality coal tar emulsion sealer as they are impervious to gasoline and petroleum product spills.

### **BINDING EFFECT**

This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns.



**DEPARTMENT:** Administration

#### **PURPOSE:**

#### **ITEM SUMMARY:**

In December 2023, City staff discussed with Council the possibility of collaboration between Gundersen St. Elizabeth's (EMPLIFY) and Wabasha Ambulance. The goal was to support the Wabasha Ambulance Service to take more transfers and provide a way to use the skill set of the EMS service providers to support the hospital. There was the possibility to provide a paramedic or EMT in the emergency room and to be paid for the services when the City ambulance EMS staff were not out on calls. The goal was additional revenue for the City of Wabasha. Approve contract to provide these services, the City will be reimbursed for the hourly rate of the staff plus all benefits and will bill monthly, based on time records. Currently, Administrator has budget about \$18,847 in revenues based on 48 hours per month.

# **ACTION REQUIRED:**

Approve contract and authorize staff to carry out obligations in contract.

#### **EMPLOYEE LEASE AGREEMENT**

This Employee Lease Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of July 25, 2024, ("Effective Date") by and between the **City of Wabasha** ("Employing Entity"), and **St. Elizabeth's Hospital of Wabasha**, **Inc. dba St. Elizabeth's Hospital and Clinics** ("Facility").

#### **RECITALS**

- A. Employing Entity and Facility are organizations whose purposes include the advancement of healthcare and emergency medical services.
- B. Employing Entity and Facility are unrelated entities.
- C. In order to meet the needs of its patients, Facility wishes, pursuant to the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement, to obtain the Services of certain Professionals employed by Employing Entity.
- D. Pursuant to the terms and conditions outlined in this Agreement, Employing Entity is willing to provide the Services of certain Professionals to Facility.

#### AGREEMENT

- 1. <u>Professional Services</u>. Employing Entity will provide the Services described in Exhibit A ("Services"). Services will be provided by Professional(s) as further described in Exhibit A.
- Qualifications, Conduct, and Standards Applicable to Professionals. Professionals shall, at all times relevant to this Agreement: (a) be qualified to perform the Services, (b) hold all licenses required to perform the Services, (c) provide the Services in manner that is competent and compliant with all applicable laws, regulations, and standards, and (d) comply with all reasonable rules and requirements of Facility. If at any time Facility, in its sole discretion, determines that a Professional has failed to meet the requirements outlined in this Section, Facility may remove Professional from Facility's premises. In the event that Facility removes a Professional from Facility's premises pursuant to this Section, Facility shall immediately notify Employing Entity. Professionals which have been removed pursuant to this section may not be scheduled or provide Services under this Agreement without advance written consent from Facility.
- 3. <u>Site of Service</u>. Services will be provided on Facility's premises or at such other location as may be agreed upon by the parties from time to time.
- 4. <u>Schedule</u>. The scheduling of Professional(s) providing Services under this Agreement shall be mutually agreed upon by Employing Entity and Facility. The manager of the Facility requesting the Services shall contact the manager of the Employing Entity providing the Services to coordinate scheduling the Services. When requesting to schedule Services, Facility shall provide Employing Entity with as much notice as is reasonably practicable. Parties agree to endeavor to schedule Services thirty (30) days in advance. In the event that Facility provides Employing Entity less than twenty-four (24) hours' notice, Employing Entity may provide Services as able. If the parties are unable to agree on the scheduling and/or amount of Services to be

provided under this Agreement, either party may terminate this Agreement as set forth in the Term and Termination section, below.

- 5. <u>Orientation.</u> Facility will provide orientation to the Facility for Professionals; provided, however, that it is understood that Professionals provided by the Employing Entity will already have the necessary training, education, and professional certification necessary to perform the Services. Facility will provide sufficient education or training to Professionals as required by Facility to maintain licensure and proficiency.
- 6. Record of Services. The actual time spent by Professional(s) performing Services will be tracked by the Professional through the Employing Entity's timekeeping system, which will be recorded by Employing Entity. Such time will be measured in fifteen-minute increments.
- 7. Space, Equipment, Staff Services, and Supplies. Facility shall make available to Professional(s) the space, equipment, staff services, and supplies that are necessary for Professional(s) to perform the Services and to fulfill Employing Entity's obligations under this Agreement. Professional(s) shall not use any Facility space, equipment, staff services, or supplies for any purpose other than as required to provide Services under this Agreement.
- 8. Performance Standards; Quality Indicators. During the term of this Agreement, Professionals shall meet the following performance standards and quality indicators: [a] Professionals shall comply with Facility regulations, maintain confidentiality of patient-related information, abide by Facility policies and procedures, and comply with state and federal requirements, [b] Employing Entity shall ensure that each Professional has undergone a comprehensive screen to determine qualifications and competence as set forth in the attached Exhibit B, Screening Procedures, and [c] Facility reserves the right to require each Professional to complete an orientation.
- 9. Performance Monitoring. During the term of this Agreement, Facility reserves the right to periodically monitor the Professional's activities in order to ensure the Employing Entity's compliance with the terms of the Agreement, including, without limitation, performing [a] direct observation of the services provided, [b] review or audits of documentation and other business records kept by Professionals and/or the Employing Entity upon reasonable notice, [c] collecting and reviewing data that address the efficacy of the services contracted for in this Agreement, [d] periodic review(s) of the accreditation or certification status of the Professionals, and/or [e] review of patient satisfaction surveys.
- 10. <a href="Payment">Payment</a>. Facility shall pay Employing Entity the amounts set forth in Exhibit A for Services provided under this Agreement and recorded as required in the Record of Services Section of this Agreement. Employing Entity shall invoice Facility on a monthly basis for Services provided under this Agreement, and Facility shall pay such invoices within thirty (30) days of receipt. Employing Entity shall include a description of the Services and the number of hours provided.
- 11. <u>Insurance.</u> Each party shall, at its expense, carry liability and professional liability insurance or provide self-insurance covering its acts and omissions under this Agreement, with limits of at least \$1 million per claim and \$3 million aggregate. In addition to and in clarification of the foregoing, Employing Entity shall be solely responsible for liability and professional liability insurance, as well as worker's compensation insurance, for all Professionals providing Services under this Agreement. Moreover, and in further

clarification of the foregoing, Facility shall be solely responsible for liability and professional liability insurance, as well as worker's compensation insurance, for all Facility's employees.

- 12. <u>Compliance</u>. Both parties shall comply with applicable state and federal laws and regulations including but not limited to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and regulations promulgated thereunder, laws and rules governing the provision of health care and payment therefor, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration regulations, and legal standards relating to the interaction of personnel in the workplace.
- 13. <u>Confidentiality.</u> Both parties shall maintain the confidentiality of patient records and medical information, in accordance with applicable state and federal laws, rules and regulations. Neither party nor any of its staff shall disclose to any third party, except where permitted or required by law or where such disclosure is expressly approved in writing by any patient, medical information regarding the other party's patient. All documentation and records relating to any Professional's provision of Services hereunder shall be and remain the sole property of Facility, subject to the patient's rights in such documentation and records.

During the course of providing Services hereunder, the parties may have access to or become acquainted with confidential information relating to each other's business operations. Both parties, on their own behalf and on behalf of their employees and agents, acknowledge the importance to the other party of maintaining the confidentiality of such information and agree never to use or disclose such information except as necessary to carry out its obligations under this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, both parties agree to return to each other all copies of data, records, or other materials, regardless of whether such data, records or other materials are in written, electronic, or other format, which belong to the other party and which contain, embody, or disclose, in whole or in part, any confidential patient information or any general confidential information.

Employing Entity shall not make any disclosure of the any patient's health care records, unless required by law. If Employing Entity believes that it is required to disclose any patient's health care records, the Employing Entity will first notify the Facility and not disclose until the Facility is given an opportunity to prevent any disclosure through judicial proceedings, but in no event prior to three (3) days after the Facility is first informed of the potential disclosure by Employing Entity.

The provisions of this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- 14. <u>Inducement of Referrals.</u> It is not the purpose of this Agreement or the intent of the parties to induce or encourage the referral of patients and there is no requirement under this Agreement or under any other agreement between the parties that either party, or its employees or agents, refer patients to the other party for products or services. No payment made under this Agreement is made in return for the referral of patients, or is made in return for the purchasing, leasing or ordering of any products or services.
- 15. Access to Records. To the extent required by applicable law, Employing Entity agrees that for a period of four (4) years after it has last furnished services under this Agreement, it shall make available, upon written request of the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services (the "Secretary"), or upon request of the Comptroller General of the United States (the "Comptroller"), or any of their duly authorized representatives, this Agreement and any of its books, documents and records that are necessary to certify the nature and extent of the costs for services for which Facility seeks reimbursement. Employing Entity further agrees that if it carries out any of its duties under this Agreement through a subcontract with a value or cost of ten thousand dollars (\$10.000) or more over a twelve-month period with a related organization, such subcontract shall contain a clause requiring the subcontractor, for a period of four (4) years after carrying out such duties, to make available, upon written request of the Secretary or Comptroller, or any of their duly authorized representatives, the subcontract and any of its books, documents, and records that are necessary to verify the nature and extent of the cost of the Services it has provided.
- 16. <a href="Indemnification">Indemnification</a>. The parties are each responsible for their own acts and omissions, and are not liable for the acts or omissions of, or the cost of defending, others. Nothing in this Section shall preclude a finding of liability on the part of either party based on the doctrines of equitable indemnity, comparative negligence, contribution, or other statutory or common law basis for liability. The parties represent that, as of the effective date, neither party has any notice or knowledge of any claims, demands, liabilities, damages, costs, and expenses asserted or threatened by any third party with respect to the matters contemplated in this Agreement.
- 17. <u>Term and Termination</u>. This Agreement shall continue in effect for one (1) year from the effective date, and shall automatically renew for successive one (1) year terms unless sooner terminated as set forth in this Agreement. Either party may terminate this agreement by providing the other party thirty (30) days' prior written notice of such termination. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Employing Entity may, in its sole discretion, choose to stop providing one or more type(s) of Professionals pursuant to this Agreement, provided it gives the other party thirty (30) days advance written notice. Employing Entity and Facility agree to meet at least once annually, upon the request of either party, to review the hourly rates identified in Exhibit A.
- 18. <u>Notices</u>. All notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall made in writing and delivered (a) personally or (b) by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or (c) by a recognized courier service. Notice to a party shall be addressed to the address(es) listed in this Section or at such other address(es) as that a party may designate by like notice from time to time. Notice shall be effective when received if delivered by hand, or on the date shown on the return receipt if by certified mail or courier service.

- 19. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota, without giving effect to any choice or conflict of law rule (whether of the State of Minnesota or any other jurisdiction) that would cause the laws of any jurisdiction other than the State of Wisconsin to apply.
- 20. <u>Venue and Personal Jurisdiction</u>. The parties hereby consent to venue and personal jurisdiction in the Wabasha County Circuit Court. If the Wabasha County Circuit Court cannot adjudicate an action because it lacks subject matter jurisdiction, the parties alternatively consent to venue and personal jurisdiction in the federal district court for the Southeastern District of Minneota.
- 21. <u>No Assignment</u>. Neither party may assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other.
- 22. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same Agreement. In the event that any signature is delivered by facsimile transmission or by email delivery of a ".pdf" format data file, such signature shall create a valid and binding obligation of the party executing (or on whose behalf such signature is executed) with the same force and effect as if such facsimile or ".pdf" signature page were an original thereof.
- 23. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement, including any exhibits, attachments, or addenda which are incorporated by reference herein and attached hereto, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements, representations and understandings of the parties.
- 24. <u>Amendment</u>. No amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.
- 25. <u>Consent to Amendment</u>. The parties agree to amend this Agreement as necessary to comply with any changes in applicable laws and regulations. If a party refuses to enter into such an Amendment, the other party may immediately terminate this Agreement upon

- providing written notice of termination.
- 26. <u>No Waiver</u>. The waiver by either party of a breach of any provision of this Agreement will not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision. All of the rights and remedies provided herein are cumulative and additional to any rights or remedies the parties may have at law.
- 27. <u>Severability</u>. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 28. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and to their permitted successors and assigns.
- 29. Independent Contractor Relationship. The parties to this Agreement are at all times performing as independent contractors. Nothing in this agreement shall constitute or be construed the creation of an employment relationship, partnership or joint venture between or among Employing Entity, Facility, and/or any of their agents or employees, including but not limited to Professional(s). In addition to and in clarification of the foregoing, it is expressly understood that Professionals are not employees of Facility. Professionals shall not be entitled to receive any benefits from Facility, nor shall the Employing Entity or Professionals be entitled to participate in any employee benefit plans now or hereafter offered by Facility. Employing Entity's human resource policies shall apply to the Professionals and Employing Entity shall be responsible for paying compensation as well as all federal, state, and local taxes, fees, and other amounts arising from or relating to the Professionals and the Services provided pursuant to this Agreement, including without limitation: [i] All income taxes, withholding taxes, self-employment taxes, and social security taxes, [ii] All sales and use taxes, if any; [iii] All license fees, permit fees and assessments; and [iv] All contributions and assessments which may be required under any applicable unemployment or worker's compensation laws.
- 30. <u>Claims Notification</u>. Each party shall promptly notify the other in the event it has reason to believe a claim may exist against the other party, or any Professional, related to the services provided under this Agreement. Notification under this section shall be for information purposes only and shall not substitute for any statutory notification and claim procedures, if and as applicable.
- 31. <u>Section Headings</u>. Section headings are provided solely for the convenience of the parties and shall not affect the interpretation of this Agreement.

Certain specialty areas and paraprofessional testing may be replaced with Facility interview or other criteria as directed.

<u>Drug Free Workplace Policy:</u> Any individual providing Services under this Agreement must sign a drug free workplace policy or agree to abide by Facility's Drug Free Workplace policy and be drug tested by Employing Entity according to state guidelines.

<u>Criminal Background Investigation Policy:</u> Any individual providing Services under this Agreement must sign a Criminal Background Investigation policy and be reviewed according to state guidelines.

<u>Mandatory Inservices:</u> A yearly review of Fire & Safety, Infection Control, Hazardous Wastes, and OSHA standards is required of any individual providing Services under this Agreement.

<u>Interviewing:</u> Any individual providing Services under this Agreement must be interviewed by Employing Entity. At this time, information and performance requirements are given to any individual providing Services under this Agreement regarding Employing Entity's policies and procedures, as well as the policies and procedures of Facility.

Health/TB Test: A physician's statement verifying that any individual providing Services under this Agreement has had a satisfactory medical

examination including TB within the past year, or a chest x-ray may be required by Facility. Other specific health requirements are handled on an individual basis, as directed by Facility or state health guidelines. Each Professional must have Hep B vaccine or have a signed declination.

<u>Placement</u> <u>and</u> <u>Orientation:</u> Assignment of individuals is made by Employing Entity in conjunction with Facility, according to the skill and expertise of the individual and the needs of Facility. Emphasis is placed on continuity of service whenever possible. Orientation policies and procedures of Facility are adhered to by Employing Entity. Facility shall provide any individual providing Services under this Agreement with Facility-specific orientation.

**Evaluation:** Facility reserves the right to perform periodic evaluations of any individual providing Services under this Agreement. These evaluations may include direct observation and documentation review.

**Employee Files:** Employing Entity shall keep a complete and current file on each individual providing Services under this Agreement; including application, license and C.P.R. certification, test results, references, physician's statement, medical history, and any continuing education courses completed. An individual's file also contains appropriate documentation relative to the applicant's identity and work authorization as required by United States federal laws and regulations. In response to a regulatory inquiry or human resources issue, Facility may request copies of the relevant portions of the Employing Entity's employee file for the Professional(s) who is (are) the subject of the inquiry or issue.

<u>Continuing Education:</u> Each individual providing Services under this Agreement shall be encouraged by Employing Entity to participate in ongoing educational courses.

**<u>Summary:</u>** Employing Entity shall comply with all recommendations of the ANA, OSHA, and state and federal guidelines.

The properties abutting Market Street, Franklin Avenue and Jefferson Avenue, are the areas proposed to be assessed.

The amount to be specially assessed against your particular lot, piece or parcel of land is Such assessment is proposed to be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 10 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January 2025, and will bear interest at the rate of 3.75 percent per annum beginning January 1, 2025. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

You may at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the entire assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the <u>City Administrator</u>. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 30 days from the adoption of this assessment. You may at any time thereafter, pay to the <u>County Assessor</u> the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year. If you decide not to prepay the assessment before the date given above the rate of interest that will apply is <u>3.75 percent</u> per year. The right to partially prepay the assessment is not available.

The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the city clerk's office. The total amount of the proposed assessment is \$46,997.70. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal to district court may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a written objection signed by the affected property owner is filed with the municipal clerk prior to the assessment hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing. The council may upon such notice consider any objection to the amount of a proposed individual assessment at an adjourned meeting upon such further notice to the affected

property owners as it deems advisable.

Under Minn. Stat. §§ 435.193 to 435.195 and the City Assessment Policy the council may, in its discretion, defer the payment of this special assessment for any homestead property owned by a person 65 years of age or older, one retired by virtue of a permanent and total disability, or a member of the National Guard or other reserves ordered to active military service for whom it would be a hardship to make the payments. When deferment of the special assessment has been granted and is terminated for any reason provided in that law and City Assessment Policy, all amounts accumulated plus applicable interest become due. Any assessed property owner meeting the requirements of this law and City Assessment Policy, may, within 30 days of the confirmation of the assessment, apply to the city clerk for the prescribed form for such deferral of payment of this special assessment on his/her property.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 429.081 by serving notice of the appeal upon the mayor or clerk of the city within 30 days after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the mayor or clerk.





Surrounding Land Use: The Project Site is bounded by the Mississippi River to the north and agricultural land to the east and west. 5<sup>th</sup> Grant Boulevard West (Wabasha County Road 59), which borders the Project Site to the south, provides connection to downtown Wabasha and U.S. Highway 61.

Current Land Use: The two parcels comprised of vacant woodland and appear to have been used for the dumping or storage of scrap metal, construction material, and various vehicle parts. According to historic aerial imagery—which is available for limited years from 1939 to the present—gravel mining occurred on the Project Site,



beginning in earnest in 1949 and continuing into the early 1970s. By 2010, gravel mining had ended, and successional trees have reclaimed the filled gravel pits.

**Project Description/ Rezone for Rezone:** The City of Wabasha, in cooperation with the Wabasha Port Authority, is proposing to construct a commercial port facility ("Wabasha Barge Facility") at Upper Mississippi River mile 760 in Wabasha, Minnesota. The project site is located on tax parcels R27.00004.00 and R27.00005.03 within the City of Wabasha, Wabasha County, Minnesota (Section 30, Township 111N, Range 010W). These parcels are presently privately owned, and the city anticipates purchasing the requisite area to house the facility from a willing seller prior to construction activities.

The 26.8-acre site ("Study Area," "Project Site" and rezone requested area) would house the Wabasha Barge Facility on approximately 8.2 and would facilitate the transfer of materials, including dredge material and other commodities, from river barges to trucks for transport to off-site facilities. The City of Wabasha would own the barge facility site and contract out the port operations and transportation of materials. The city does not currently anticipate expanding the project beyond the proposed 8.2 acres, although that decision will be revisited at a future time if warranted.

**Neighborhood Notification:** All property owners within 350 feet of this property were notified within ten days of the public hearing and published in the paper on Tuesday, May 28, 2024, stating that a public hearing would be held on June 11, 2024, for this conditional use permit request.

### **Rezone Analysis:**

The proposed development of a barge port facility for these two parcels is consistent with the current Wabasha Comprehensive Plan (2016-2035), last amended July 6, 2021. The Comprehensive Plan designates the future land use of the project site as "Industrial" and discusses Wabasha's unique location and opportunity for development of a river port facility that would be used for commercial purposes. Of the 26.8- acre Study Area, approximately 8.2 acres would be used and developed for the proposed project, leaving the remaining area in its current undeveloped state. Prior to the construction of the barge terminal, a Major Traffic Generator CUP (conditional use permit) will be necessary for the expected heavy truck traffic that will be generated by the use.

It is staff's opinion that this property, located adjacent to 5<sup>th</sup> Grant Boulevard (County Road 59) a designated truck route and near Highway 61, and across the street from the major industrial properties within the City of Wabasha makes this land use compatible with the current zoning pattern and uses and conforms to the approved Land Use Plan amended in 2021 as continued industrial land uses.

**Utility and Street Commission Comments:** Pat Mueller, Utility Commission and Tony Johnson, Street Commission have no comments or concerns with this application.

**Emergency Agencies Comments:** Wabasha Fire, Ambulance and Police, have no concerns with the application.

**City Engineering Comments:** Brian Malm has no concerns with the application.

**Lucas Youngsma, MnDNR Comments:** We understand that this rezoning request is in furtherance of Wabasha Port Authority's pursuit of a port facility to facilitate off-load of dredged sand under a section 217 agreement with the USACE. Presuming this is the rationale, DNR has no specific comments on this rezoning, but anticipates continuing to work closely with the City of Wabasha throughout the environmental review and permitting review processes.

Hearings and Neighborhood Notices: Meeting notices were sent to all neighbors withing 350 feet as well as posted in the paper on Tuesday, May 28, 2024. Amending the Ordinance: Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance (text or map) may be initiated by an affected property owner for the purpose of carrying out the policies and goals of the Comprehensive Plan and promoting the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the community." (305.04 Subd. 7). All ordinances must be heard by City Council at least two times (City Charter Section 4.05).

**Public Hearing Comments:** Robert Carrells expressed that he is against the rezone. He did not express a specific reason at that time. Dave Wodele expressed concerns about the CP Rail blocking 5<sup>th</sup> Grant Boulevard for long periods of time causing traffic to be blocked and ultimately backing up and turning around in the cemetery on both their roadway and gravestones. This is something that needs to be resolved before the barge terminal truck hauling is initiated.

**PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION:** The Planning Commission unanimously recommended that the rezone be forwarded to City Council with the following drafted resolution:

Whereas, the 2021 Land Use Plan calls for industrial uses in this area and the requested Industrial zone is compatible with this land use; and

Whereas, 5<sup>th</sup> Grant Boulevard North/ County Road 59 is a designated truck route and the intended barge terminal use would utilize this roadway as their haul route and not disturb any adjacent residential homes within 100 feet of the roadway and;

Whereas, the surrounding existing industrial uses and zoning to south and east are compatible with the requested Industrial zone, and;

Whereas, the request to allow for a barge terminal use for this property is consistent with the goals and policies of the Comprehensive Plan; and

**NOW THEREFORE,** The Planning Commission recommends to the City Council the amendment to Section 305 of City Code, rezoning Parcels R27.00004.00 and R27.00005.03 from R-1 and RC to Industrial.

### § 162.061 USE DEFINITIONS.

Supervised living facility. A facility in which there is provided supervision, lodging, meals and in accordance with provisions of rules of the Department of Human Services and as defined by State

Statue, counseling and developmental habilitative or rehabilitative services to five or more persons who are developmentally disabled, chemically dependent, adult mentally ill, or physically disabled.

The definition of supervised living facility has been slightly altered to more closely follow Minnesota State Statues. Page: 2

Accessory Apartments and Guest Cottage Uses: Accessory Apartments and Guest Cottage should be conditionally allowed in the TDC Zone as we have several properties in the TDC zone where the owners and renter live on the lot so this change would bring these uses into conformity, this is a compatible use within the TDC District, and mixed commercial and residential uses should be allowed in this zoning district.

**Commercial uses in the Industrial Zone:** Commercial retail uses both over and under 1,500 square feet should be an allowed in the Industrial Zone, because we also allow professional office which is a similar scale to retail uses, we have several retail uses within this zone so we would bring these uses into conformity, and commercial retail is a compatible use for the Industrial zone located adjacent to larger roads and typically considered a more intense use.

Day Care: A Group Daycare or professional daycare is a compatible use within the Highway Commercial Zone as most HC zoned parcels are visible from Highway 61 and accessible by an arterial or collector roadway making them easier to locate and use as parents drop off and pick up their children daily, the use fits the intensity typically found in the HC zone, and is compatible with the other allowed and conditional uses within the HC zone. Family Day Care, or in-home daycare with less than ten children are also recommended as a permitted use for the RC, RRLA, and RRGT residential zones as in-home daycare should be an allowed use in all low-density residential neighborhoods. Both of these uses are regulated and licensed by the State of Minnesota.

**Meeting Notification**: A brief summary of these ordinance changes was published in the paper on Tuesday, May 28, 2024, stating that a public hearing would be held on June 11, 2024. No comments for or against were received on these recommended changes.

**Planning Commission Action:** After the public hearing, the Planning Commissioners unanimously recommended that these changes to the USE CHART and USE DEFINITION be forwarded to City Council for their consideration.

The RFP was put on June 5th, 2024. All RFPs were due on July 10th, 2024. We received 5 proposals, and we also had one company that said they were not interested. The Building Task Force reviewed all the proposals. The City received a grant from Compeer Financial in the amount of \$5,000 towards this feasibility study. Per Finance Director Grabau, we have enough funds in the CIP to pay for the RFP in 2024. Ryan Marking contacted references for Brunton and they were all positive.

#### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Building Task Force met and reviewed the 5 proposals and determined that Brunton Architects were best suited for the scope of work that we were looking for.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Approve awarding the RFP to Brunton Architects. Director Marking called and did reference checks on Brunton and feels that they are the best suited for this project.

### **ACTION REQUIRED:**


# WELCOME FIRE STATION & CITY HALL FEASIBILITY STUDY




Our grant cannot be processed without this statement. Staff will not approve costs for this project unless its moving forward.
