

Statement of Work

Section 1 – Introduction

This Statement of Work #24-633 (hereinafter known as “SOW”), effective as of the date of last signature below, sets forth the scope of the work to be delivered by Journal Technologies, Inc (hereinafter known as “JTI”) to implement the **NICE Justice EMS Interface** for the Webb County District Attorney (hereinafter known as “Client”), as well as the required deliverables by the Client and NICE Justice (hereinafter known as “Vendor”).

Section 2 – Project Scope and Definition

2.1 Project Scope

The project scope will be to create an interface between **NICE Justice EMS** and the Client’s eProsecutor CMS. This will be a two-way interface. The primary development effort will be executed by the Vendor and will utilize the JTI API to link case files and data between the two systems. JTI will provide the services outlined in Section 2.2.

2.2 Description of Services

JTI will provide the following deliverables:

1. JTI will work with the Client and Vendor to assist in setting up a network connection between the two systems.
2. JTI will provide API Documentation for eProsecutor.
3. JTI will provide access to eProsecutor API by creating an API Service Account with minimum appropriate security access.
4. JTI will provide the required API endpoints with sample file payloads and responses.
5. JTI will create up to 5 custom fields in eProsecutor for NICE data storage.
6. JTI will work with the Client to create links to NICE Justice in the eProsecutor case header.

At completion of these services, there will be a maximum of 3 cycles for testing. Client will test and within 15 workdays report issues that are not in compliance with the requirements.

Section 3 – Project Cost and Billing

3.1 Cost

JTI will bill the Client \$4,000 for the **NICE Justice EMS Interface**, which includes the completion of work defined in Section 2.2. This price is valid if the SOW is signed within 45 days from the date of this SOW.

3.2 Billing

The Client will be invoiced for the full amount for the **NICE Justice EMS Interface** upon acceptance of the deliverables defined in Section 2.2 and shall be paid in accordance with the terms of the Contract.

Section 4 – Assumptions

Implementation of the **NICE Justice EMS Interface** for the Client is per the following assumptions:

1. Provide security protocols/access to Non-Production servers
2. Test in Non-Production environment
3. When approved, provide access to Production server
4. Test in Production environment
5. Provide us with timely feedback.

Section 5 – Project Management

JTI will keep the Client updated on the status of the **NICE Justice EMS Interface** on a regular basis.
