7. **Community Action Agency**

- a. Discussion and possible action to accept a distribution check from the Entrust Liquidation Trust in the amount of THREE HUNDRED NINETY-FOUR DOLLARS AND THIRTY-FOUR CENTS (\$394.34) for a Convenience Class Unsecured Claimed; and any other matters incident thereto. The Webb County Community Action Agency Social Services Program currently intends to use these unrestricted funds for the acquisition of needed materials and supplies, and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #2368-1160-521-461000 (Materials & Supplies)]**

8. **Honorable Victor Villarreal, County Court at Law 2 Judge**

- a. Discussion with possible action to authorize the Purchasing Agent to add one (2) cell phone lines, including data service, in accordance with the current approved AT&T FirstNet Plan to the Webb County Court-at-Law II Juvenile Drug Treatment Court (Youth Success Court) pursuant to Sections 271.101 and 272.102, Texas Local Government Code, Cooperative Purchasing program DIR Agreement TELE-CTSA-002 at a monthly rate of \$40.99 per line, plus surcharges and other fees; and subject to the grant annual budgetary appropriation; and authorize the County Judge sign all relevant documents; and any other matter incident thereto. One cell phone line will be for Case Manager and the other for Judicial Communications Specialist. All required documents were sent for review to the Economic Development Department and is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Account #2709-2070-001-441010]**

Issue: Juvenile Drug Treatment Court parent/guardian of participants reach out to our office during non-working business hours, arrest, especially during a crisis, runaway status, and other evolving situations. Our court staff must provide a number to be able to text information relevant to the court program and communicate with other agencies.

Solution: This will provide the JDT Court with a centralized call-in system.

Result: By approving the 2 cell phone devices, it will avoid the use of JDT Court staff's personal phones. Consequently, it will allow a more effective and prompt service to the JDT Court youth's specific needs.

9. **Commissioners Court**

- a. Discussion with possible action to authorize an exception and waive the fee for B&T Management Organization in regards to the rental of the Webb County Fairgrounds roping arena on Friday, October 24th and Saturday, October 25th for their 3rd Annual DPS Troopers Burn and Turn Fundraising Event; and any other matters incident thereto. **[Sponsored by Pct. 2 Commissioner Rosaura "Wawi" Tijerina]**

Issue: B&T Management Organization, the fundraising arm of the Texas DPS Trooper Foundation, is requesting an In-Kind Sponsorship of the fairgrounds roping arena for their annual fundraising event to be held in Webb County on October 24th & 25th.

Solution: Each member of the Commissioners Court is allowed to sponsor one event per fiscal year of a non-profit of their choice. Commissioner Tijerina will sponsor this event being requested.

Result: in-Kind sponsorship of this non-profit event will allow their foundation to raise money that goes directly to the DPS Trooper Foundation Fund.

10. **Honorable Rolando San Miguel, Constable Pct. 4**

- a. Discussion and possible action to ratify and approve the purchase of two (2) APX-8000 Mobile radios including programming and installation for a total amount not to exceed \$17,447.32 from Motorola (Contract No. 17724-HGAC (TX)-RA05-21) for the Webb County Constable Pct. 4 office and in accordance with the Texas Local Government Code Sub-Chapter F. Cooperative Purchasing Program, 271.101, 271.102 (Cooperative Purchasing Program Participation) and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #2468-3170-001-470000 Operation Stone Garden (OPSG) (Capital Outlay)]**

Issue: Grant funding has been reallocated to Webb County for the purpose of purchasing additional

mobile radios to enhance law enforcement communications.

Solution: Consideration to authorize grant funded equipment for law enforcement use. Motorola has a cooperative contract with HGAC, meeting all competitive bidding requirements of the State of Texas.

Result: If approved, proceed with order. The estimated time of delivery is 60 days or less.

- b. Discussion and possible action to approve and ratify the purchase of three (3) body worn camera and video manager EL cloud including programming and installation for a total amount not to exceed \$12,400.00 from Motorola (Contract No. 17724-HGAC (TX)-RA05-21) for the Webb Cty. Con. Pct. 4 office and in accordance with the Texas Local Government Code; Sub-Chapter F. Cooperative Purchasing Program, 271.101,271.102 (Cooperative Purchasing Program Participation) and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #2468-3170-001-460105 Operation Stone Garden (OPSG) (Minor Tools & Apparatus)]**

Issue: Grant funding has been reallocated to Webb County for the purpose of purchasing body-worn camera & video manager EL cloud to enhance law enforcement communications.

Solution: Consideration to authorize grant funded equipment for law enforcement use. Motorola has a cooperative contract with HGAC, meeting all competitive bidding requirements of the State of Texas.

Result: If approved, proceed with order. The estimated time of delivery is 60 days or less.

11. **Honorable Isidro Alaniz, District Attorney**

- a. Discussion and possible action to ratify a credit card charge in the amount of \$12,000.00 for the payment of 13 registrations utilizing the Webb County credit card; and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #2162-2260-001-456205 (Training & Education)]**

Issue: The Children's Advocacy Center of Dallas updated their registration process and no longer accept purchase orders or checks.

Solution: To authorize the use and make an exception to the rule of using the County credit card for only airfare related expenditures.

Result: Registrations will be secured and we will be able to book hotel rooms

- b. Discussion and possible action to accept the purchase of televised football commercial advertisement from Grey Television Group, Inc./Grey Media Group, Inc., in the amount of Forty One Thousand Two Hundred Eighty Five Dollars (\$41,285.00) for KYLX, NGNS, OGNS, KGNS, Football/NCAA games in Laredo by the Webb County District Attorney's Office, for the "Make the Right Call" campaign. The campaign discourages drinking and driving in Webb County. The agreements consist of commercials to commence September, 2025 and run through the end of the football season as follows: KYLX NFL Football Package in the amount of Eleven Thousand Nine Hundred Ten Dollars (\$11,910.00), NGNS Football advertisement package commercial ads at a total cost of Eight Thousand One Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$8,175.00), the OGNS NFL advertisement package at a total cost of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).The KGNS NFL advertisement package at a total cost of Twenty thousand seven hundred Dollars (\$20,700.00).The Webb County District Attorney's Office will be featured in the advertisement and authorizing the Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents, and any other matters thereto. There is no financial impact on the general fund. **[Account #2162-2260-001-457006 (Law Enforcement – Other)]**

- c. Discussion and possible action to enter into a commercial space lease agreement with Peter Tsai., as Lessor and Webb County District Attorney's Office as Lessee, six (6 Mo.) term, from April 10, 2025 thru October 09, 2025 at a monthly rental rate of \$9,500 per month, with a renewal option. The warehouse space has 17,526 sq. ft. located on 9001 San Mateo.; Subject to annual budgetary appropriations, and authorizing the Webb County Judge to execute any and all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #2162-2260-001-457006 (Forfeiture Funds)]**

Issue: The Webb County District Attorney's Office needs space to hold seized evidence.

Solution: Enter into a lease agreement.

Result: The Webb County District Attorney's Office will have enough space to safeguard all evidence.

12. **Drug Court Program**

- a. Discussion and possible action to approve a Non-Financial Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Texas A&M International University (TAMIU) and the Webb County Adult Drug Court and Veterans Treatment Program to designate Counseling Practicum/Internship Sites. The terms of the MOU will be from August 1, 2025–August 31, 2026, and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents; and any other matters incident thereto. **[There is no Fiscal Impact to the General Fund]**

Issue: Students enrolled in the Master of Arts in Counseling Psychology program at Texas A&M International University are required to complete 600 hours of supervised training under Licensed Professional Counselors to fulfill graduation requirements.

Solution: Webb County, through the Adult Drug Court and Veterans Treatment Program, will provide students with the opportunity to complete supervised practicum and internship training. Licensed Professional Counselors will oversee and supervise their work while delivering services to participants of both programs.

Result: This partnership will offer essential counseling services to program participants while enabling graduate students to gain critical hands-on experience toward becoming Licensed Professional Counselors, a need that is significant in our community.

13. **Economic Development**

- a. Discussion and possible action to approve and enter into continued agreement with Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) Fund for Veterans' Assistance Grant Award VCO25-T-001 for use by the Webb County Veterans Service Office Transportation Program in the amount of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars to be distributed over 14 months, for a budget period from July 1, 2025 thru August 31, 2026 and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. No match is required. All required documents were sent to the Economic Development Department for review and were found to be in compliance with the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) policy. **[Requested by Veterans Service Office]**

Issue: On November 27, 2023, the Commissioners Court authorized the submission by the Veterans Service Office of a grant application for Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) Fund for Veterans' Assistance (FVA) in an effort to enhance the services and support currently being provided to Webb County Veterans, Dependents and Surviving Spouses with no means of transportation to and from medical appointments which may not be available without further funding. Authorization from the Commissioners' Court is required in order to accept the award.

Solution: The Commissioners' Court authorizes the acceptance of the state funds to continue to

provide extended services for transportation to medical appointments within the Webb County area and up to 200 miles radius to address the needs of the transportation program participants.

Result: Veterans, Dependents and Surviving Spouses in Webb County will benefit from services that may not be available without these funds.

- b. Discussion and possible action to approve a Signatory Resolution and Order designating the Webb County Judge as the County's Executive Officer and Authorized Representative for all matters related to Webb County's participation in the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program; and further designating the Webb County Auditor as the Authorized Representative and Payment Processor for all financial matters related to the program. All required documents have been submitted for review through the Economic Development Department, and the solicitation is compliant with Webb County's Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures.

Issue: In order to proceed with participation in the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program, Webb County must formally designate an authorized representative for administrative matters and a separate representative for financial matters. The Webb County Judge requires authorization to act as the County's Executive Officer and Authorized Representative. Similarly, the Webb County Auditor must be designated to serve as the Payment Processor and Authorized Representative for all financial matters associated with the program.

Solution: Approve the proposed Signatory Resolution and Order assigning the Webb County Judge and Webb County Auditor to their respective roles as required by the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program.

Result: Upon approval, the Webb County Judge and Webb County Auditor will have full authorization to act on behalf of Webb County in all matters related to the administration and financial management of the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program, ensuring compliance with program requirements and facilitating timely execution of program activities.

- c. Discussion and possible action to approve the submission of a continuation grant application for the Rural Law Enforcement Grant Program, funded under Texas Senate Bill 22, in an amount estimated at \$500,000 to the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts. Funds will be used to support salary and fringe benefits for peace officers and radio dispatchers, as well as costs associated with equipment, minor tools, contractual services, repairs and maintenance, and supplies for the Webb County Sheriff's Office. Further requesting authorization for the Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents associated with this application, and any other matters incident thereto. This grant does not require a cash match and will not impact the general fund. All required documents have been submitted to the Economic Development Department and were reviewed for compliance with the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) policy. **[Requested by Martin Cuellar, Webb County Sheriff; Grant Fund #2716]**

Issue: The Webb County Sheriff's Office, like many rural law enforcement agencies, operates under constrained financial, operational and personnel resources. These limitations present ongoing challenges in addressing complex and evolving criminal justice issues that often stem from multifaceted and deeply rooted societal conditions. **Solution:** By leveraging available federal, state, and local grant resources, the Webb County Sheriff's Office can strengthen its capacity to deliver enhanced law enforcement services. **Result:** Continued grant funding will supplement and improve the Sheriff's Office's operational effectiveness, allowing for greater public safety and service delivery without imposing additional financial demands on the County's general fund.

14. **Fire Marshal**

- a. Discussion and possible action to accept a declaration of public purpose, pursuant to the Texas Constitution, Art. 3 Sec. 52, for the purchase of promotional items to include: drawstring backpacks, notepads, crayons, highlighters, paper, and notebooks. These items will be used to inform, educate, and report information to our constituents on aspects dealing with public safety and education.

Issue: Many families face financial burdens in preparing for back-to-school season. Providing free school supplies helps alleviate this stress, allowing families to allocate their resources to other needs such as food and healthcare.

Solution: Authorization by the Commissioners Court is necessary to purchase school supplies, ensuring students have the essential tools to start the school year.

Result: Access to essential school supplies promotes a sense of belonging and equality among students, ensuring that all children start the school year on the right foot regardless of their financial background.

16. **Planning & Physical Development**

- a. Discussion and possible action to grant Preliminary and Final Plat Approval to a replat of Colonia Cuatro Caminos Plat, being a 300.48-acre residential subdivision, as recorded in Vol. 4, Pg. 13 of the Webb County Plat Records into Cuatro Caminos Industrial Plat, (ID 13017).
- b. Discussion and possible action to issue a "Certificate of Compliance with Plat Requirements" to authorize an electrical and water service connection pursuant to Section 232.029(c)(2), Local Government Code., to an unplatted 0.1595 acre tract, know as Lot 13, Old Milwaukee East Subdivision, same being out of Abst. 296, Porc. 32, as further described in Vol. 5043, Pg. 727 of the Webb County Deed Records (ID 15002).

Issue: Item is a regulatory compliance issue regarding real property development provisions of state law and local regulations with particular emphasis on the Model Subdivision Rules enacted for residential subdivisions. Commissioners Court must certify to certain property conditions before utility service connections may be authorized.

Solution: As reflected in agenda backup, staff has verified compliance matters and recommends the Court's approval of this certificate.

Result: If approved, applicant may connect property to electrical and water utility services. If not approved, utility connection to property is prohibited.

17. Purchasing

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the Purchasing Agent to solicit a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Real Estate Appraisal Services (on an as-needed basis) for a term of three (3) years effective October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2028, or any other performance period term as directed by the Webb County Commissioners Court pursuant to the Professional Services Procurement Act and any other matters incident thereto.

Issue: Real Estate appraisal services are considered professional services under the Texas Government Code §2254 and require a Qualification-Based Selection process prior to award and negotiating related fees. These professional services are frequently requested to secure Fair Market Value appraisal reports or other related services as directed by the Webb County Commissioners Court.

Solution: Consideration to authorize the public solicitation of real estate appraisal services to secure formal submissions of qualification statements for the requested services pursuant to the Professional Services Act.

Result: If approved, the Purchasing Agent will issue a formal request for qualification for the real estate appraisal services to include any other directives authorized by the Governing Body.

18. Honorable Martin Cuellar, Sheriff

- a. Discussion and possible action to approve a Non-Financial Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Texas A&M International University (TAMIU) and Webb County to provide criminal justice and sociology students in The College of Arts and Sciences, and the Department of Social Sciences with internships in the Sheriff's Office to prepare and provide quality education, training, and meaningful experiences. This MOU commences on August 1, 2025 and continues through July 31, 2026 (the "Term"), unless sooner terminated as provided herein, the parties may renew for an additional two (2) one year terms; and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents; and any other matters incident thereto. This agenda item will have no effect on the budget.
- b. Discussion and possible action to authorize a donation of gym equipment (Valued at \$2,000) from Blueline Boxing Gym pursuant to the Texas Local Government Code §81.032, Acceptance of Donations and Bequests (a) commissioners court may accept a donation of labor or services, gift, grant, donation, bequest, or devise of money or other property on behalf of the county; and any other matters incident thereto.

Issue: The Webb County Sheriff's Office Boxing Gym is in need of gym equipment. The donation of gym equipment will provide the community and participants with essential equipment for use in training and fitness.

Solution: Consideration to accept the donation, as per the Texas Local Government Code, of gym

equipment from Blueline Boxing Gym.

Result: Gym equipment will be available for training and promoting overall health and well-being for all members.

- c. Discussion and possible action to authorize the purchase one (1) Motorola P25 Interoperability Repeater Communications System and accessories for Mobile Command Center from Motorola Solutions, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$119,999.92 (Contract: 17724-HGAC (TX) RA05-21) for the Webb County Sheriff's Office in accordance with the Texas Local Government Code, Sub-Chapter F. Solution: Authorize the cooperative contract purchase exceeding \$50,000.00. This Vendor has met the competitive bidding requirements of the State.

Result: Order will be placed after Commissioners Court approval.

- d. Discussion and possible action to ratify the purchase of one (1) 2025 Ford F250, Police Package truck from Silsbee Ford for the amount not to exceed \$64,330.00 and Dana Safety Supply in the amount of \$20,641.33 for installation of equipment. 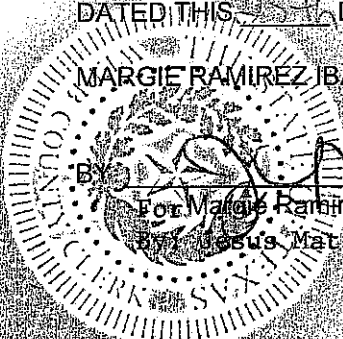

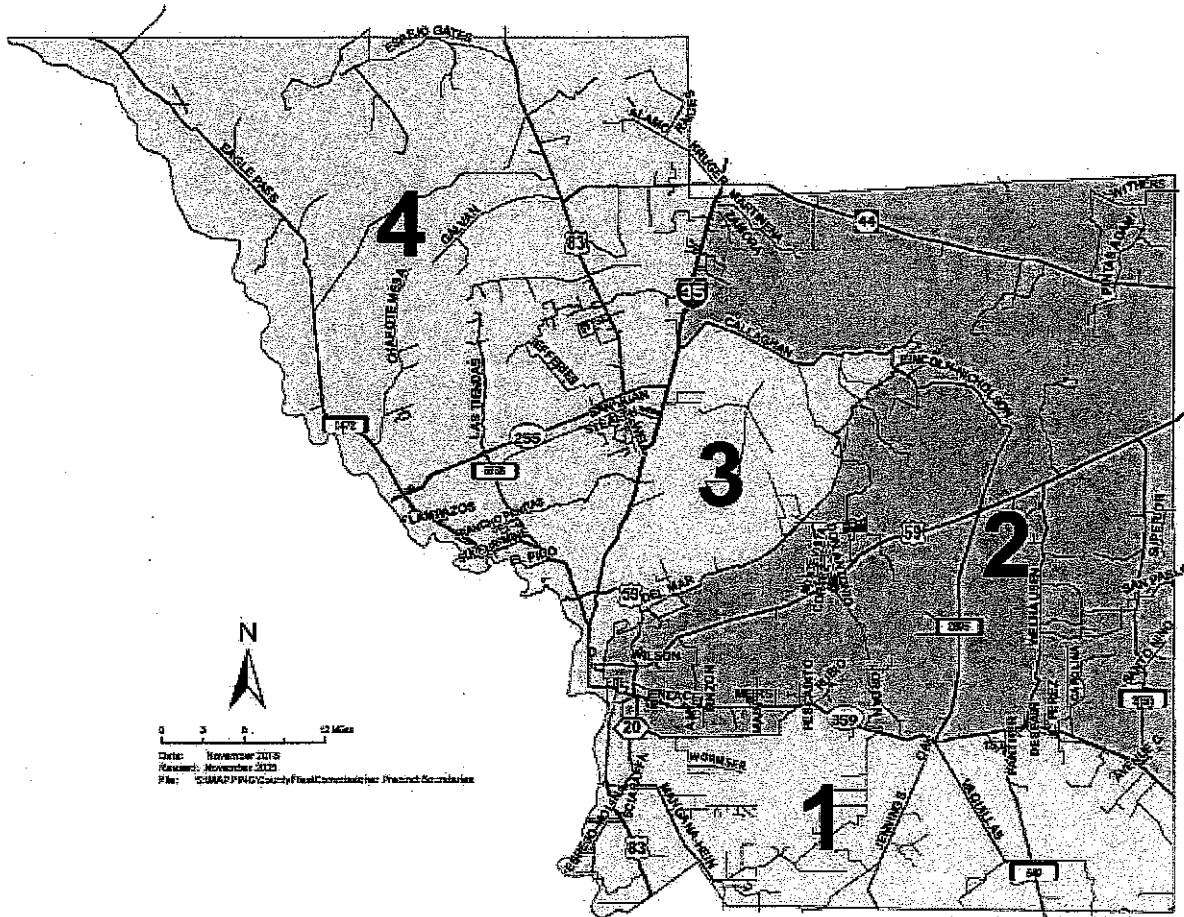
