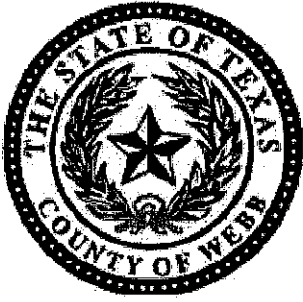

CALL TO ORDER BY THE HONORABLE TANO E. TIJERINA, WEBB COUNTY JUDGE

1. Roll Call by Honorable Margie Ramirez-Ibarra, Webb County Clerk
2. Pledge of Allegiance/Invocation
3. Discussion and possible action for Approval of Bills, Payroll, and Monthly Reports (Auditor, Treasurer, Human Resources/Risk Management; and any other Department reports); and any other matters incident thereto.
4. Public Comment - This section provides the public the opportunity to address the Commissioners Court on any items on the Agenda. Members of the public wishing to participate must complete a Witness Card specifying which agenda item they wish to comment on. Each public member, individually or in a group, will be allowed a total of Three (3) minutes within which to make any/all public comments.

COURT TO DISCUSS AND ACT ON THE FOLLOWING:

CONSENT AGENDA: At most meetings, the Commissioners Court establishes a Consent Agenda. It consists of those Agenda Items which are routine or non-controversial, and which neither a member of the Commissioners court has asked to be pulled for discussion. Once the Commissioners Court has established the Consent Agenda, Agenda Items included on it will be voted upon in one vote, and will not be discussed separately unless requested by the County Judge or Commissioners.

The consent agenda has been created in order to give constituents the opportunity to view any and all pertinent backup information with reference to any item in the agenda. The objective of the consent agenda is for all Webb County constituents to be familiar with everyday county business and to demonstrate the transparency and fairness of this Commissioners Court.

The following Agenda Items are of a routine nature, and the Commissioners Court has received supporting materials for consideration. All of these Agenda Items will be passed with one vote without being discussed separately, unless a member of the Commissioners Court or the public requests that a particular Agenda Item be discussed. If so, that Agenda Item will be pulled from the Consent Agenda and discussed as part of the regular Agenda at the appropriate time. One vote will approve the remaining items on the Consent Agenda.

CONSENT ITEMS

5. Honorable Joe Lopez, 49th District Court Judge

- a. Discussion and possible action to approve amended order that had been previously approved by Commissioners Court on January 27, 2025. Commissioners Court had approved an order regarding the Designation of Court Coordinators Pursuant to Texas Government Code 74.101 and Determination of Compensation Pursuant to Texas Government Code 74.104. It was later identified that an employee, who should have been included in the original order, was inadvertently omitted. The amended order has been prepared to correct this oversight and ensure accurate documentation and implementation.

Issue: Line items need funds to purchase items.

Solution: Approve Line Item Transfer.

Result: Funds will be available to purchase items.

- b. Discussion and possible action to have Commissioners Court receive and file amended FY2025 Special Inventory Tax Fund (2008) budget submitted by the Webb County Tax Assessor-Collector.

Issue: The Tax Assessor-Collector's Special Inventory Tax Fund budget was \$6,000 for FY2025.

Solution: The Tax Assessor-Collector is submitting an amended \$54,118 budget for additional expenditure line items for FY2025.

Result: The Tax Assessor-Collector amended budget will allow the Tax Assessor Collector County to reconcile the bank account and submitted the applicable Journals to the County Auditor according to Texas Local Government Code 111.095 Special Funds and 113.008 Reconciliation of Depository Accounts.

7. **Building Maintenance**

- a. Discussion and possible action to approve the posting and filling of the following Slots, subject to the availability of payroll funds and any applicable Civil Service guidelines, effective August 25, 2025.

Issue: Slot #4072 became vacant July 24 and slot #5055 became vacant August 8, 2025.

Solution: Approval to post and fill slots #4072 and #5055.

Result: This action will allow the Building Maintenance and Parks & Grounds departments to continue to function efficiently and effectively.

8. **Business Office**

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the Budget Officers and Auditors Office to enter and post budget amendments for fiscal year-end transactions necessary to process payment of all invoices dated or services rendered on or before September 30, 2025. Line item transfers are to be determined by the Business Office in coordination with the Auditors Office and presented for ratification.

Issue: Various departments and offices have depleted departmental budgets nonetheless there are invoices pending to be processed that must be paid with FY 2024-2025 funds. Invoices cannot be validated if the accounts are negative.

Solution: In order to timely process and pay invoices, Business Office will identify line items transfers and perform administrative budget amendments as needed to process invoices. A list of invoices pending process due to insufficient funds will be generated and provided to the Budget Officers by the Business Office.

Result: Invoices will be processed and sent to the Auditors for approval.

Honorable Isidro Alaniz, District Attorney

- a. Discussion and possible action to continue paying grant-funded personnel under OOG Grant No. 2466311 Region-2 Border Prosecution Unit Grant (fund 2739), (90) days, until notification about grant continuance award from the Criminal Justice Division by the Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office. All personnel costs will be reimbursed with grant funds. **[Fund 2714; Account #1001-1160-001-463903-025]**

Issue: Current grant funding expires on August 31, 2025. The Border Prosecution Unit (BPU) Program has not received notice of award for the new grant. Unless this item is approved, personnel working under this grant will not be paid after August 31, 2023.

Solution: Grant a payroll extension effective October 1, 2025 for Personnel working under this grant until award notice.

Result: The Webb County District Attorney's Office will continue to employ the grant-funded personnel, and will continue to execute its duties against criminal activity.

- b. Discussion and possible action to continue paying grant-funded personnel under the Office of the Texas Attorney General, OAG Grant No. C-00071, Victims Coordinator and Liaison Grant (VCLG), until notification about grant continuation award. All personnel costs will be reimbursed with grant funds. **[Fund #2714; Account #1001-1160-001-463903-025]**

Issue: Current grant funding expires on August 31, 2025. The Victims Coordinator and Liaison Grant (VCLG) has not received a notice of award for the new grant.

Solution: Grant a payroll extension effective October 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025, for Personnel working under this grant.

Result: Continued funding for the Victim Coordinator and Liaison Grant (VCLG) personnel to assist Victim's of crime as mandated by the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Article 56.04, specifically Crime Victim Liaisons (CVL) in law enforcement agencies.

9. Commissioners Court

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the County Judge to issue a letter of concurrence to the Foreign-Trade Zones Board, U.S. Dept. of Commerce in support of establishing a usage driven FTZ designation (Minor Boundary Modification), City of Laredo Foreign Trade Zone (F.T.Z.) No. 94 for Transmaritime, Inc., located at 14213 Transportation Ave., Laredo, Texas 78045, within Webb County's Taxing Jurisdiction and any matters incident thereto. **[Requested by Transmaritime, Inc./City of Laredo]**
- b. Discussion and possible action to authorize the County Judge to issue a letter of concurrence to the Foreign-Trade Zones Board, U.S. Dept. of Commerce in support of establishing a usage driven FTZ designation (Minor Boundary Modification), City of Laredo Foreign Trade Zone (F.T.Z.) No. 94 for Cargoquin, Inc., located at 11921 Hayter Rd., Laredo, Texas 78045, within Webb County's Taxing Jurisdiction and any matters incident thereto. **[Requested by Caroquin, Inc./City of Laredo]**

- c. Discussion and possible action to accept the donation of one (1) 20' x 8' metal shipping container currently located on Webb County real property under lease to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) pursuant to the Texas Local Government Code section 81.032 (Acceptance of Donation).
[No Impact on the General Fund]

Issue: USDA has informed Webb County that USDA will no longer continue to lease the approximately two (2) acres of real property off the Mines Road. USDA has indicated to County staff that they will abandon the 20-foot container located on the premises and, as per the lease Agreement, the property will then be turned over to Lessor (Webb County).

Solution: Recommendation is to authorize the acceptance of abandoned property as GSA will declare the shipping container as surplus property and transfer owners through the use of the appropriate GSA form.

10. Honorable Victor Villarreal, County Court at Law 2 Judge

- a. Discussion and possible action to adjust pay rates for Webb County Court-at-Law II JDTCourt Program Staff associated with Texas Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division (CJD) DC Specialty Courts Program Grant No. 5091601 and request County Judge to execute all other matters incident thereto. The Fiscal Year 2024-2025 budget includes salary adjustment for the Case Manager slot, and salary adjustment for the Court Juvenile Probation Officer slot. The Case Manager position does not fall under the County's Wage Plan, and are funded 100% by grant funds. However, the Probation Officer position is under the Webb County general fund. The grant was awarded by TX Office of the Governor to Webb County Court-at-Law II effective November 2024. Positions are also subject to annual evaluations by the Department Head, and are entitled to additional increases under the grant. There will be no impact to the General Fund. All required documents were sent for review to the Economic Development Department and the acceptance of the grant award is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Account #2709-2070-001-410000 (Payroll Cost)]**

Issue: These proposed salaries are reflected under the TX OOG grant in Webb County Court-at-Law 2. The awarding of the grant increases the case load within the court as this is an expansion grant.

Solution: The project respectfully requests approval on salary adjustments.

Result: Positions will be fully operational to continue to layout Court day-to-day operations.

- b. Discussion and possible action to approve a 12-month agreement (effective September 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025) between Webb County for the benefit of the Webb County Court-at-Law II Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program and PILLAR in the amount not to exceed Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00). The services will allow the Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program to have access to professional mental health services for participants; as listed and approved on the grant application through TX Office of the Governor, Specialty Courts FY25 and authorize the Webb County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. All required documents were sent for review to the Economic Development Department and the acceptance of the grant award is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Account #2709-2070-001-432001 (Professional Services)]**

Issue: Webb County Court-at-Law II established a Juvenile Drug Treatment Court to service area juvenile drug offenders to community resources including mental health services.

Solution: Effectively service area juveniles through mental health and other resources provided by PILLAR.

Result: Obtaining the services by PILLAR is a key component of grant requirements.

- c. Discussion and possible action to approve a 12-month agreement (effective September 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025) between Webb County for the benefit of the Webb County Court-at-Law II DWI Court Program and Serving Children and Adults in Need (SCAN) in the amount not to exceed Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00). The services will allow the DWI Court Program participants to have access to professional substance abuse and mental health services; as listed and approved on the grant application through TX Office of the Governor Specialty Courts Grant Program FY2025 grant 5091201 and authorize the Webb County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. All required documents were sent for review through Economic Development and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County single point of contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Account #2708-2070-001-432001 (Professional Services)]**

Issue: Webb County Court-at-Law II DWI Court services provide DWI offenders with community resources, including substance abuse and mental health services.

Solution: Effectively service DWI Court participants through substance abuse, mental health and other resources provided by SCAN.

Result: Obtaining the services by SCAN is a key component of grant requirements.

- d. Discussion and possible action to approve a 12-month agreement (effective September 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025) between Webb County for the benefit of the Webb County Court-at-Law II Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program and Communities in Schools of Laredo in the amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00). The services will allow the Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program participants to have access to professional counseling, assistance seeking professional guidance and in school advocates through site coordinators; as listed and approved on the grant application awarded by TX Office of the Governor Specialty Courts Grant Program FY 2025 grant number 5091601 and authorize the Webb County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. All required documents were sent for review through Economic Development and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County single point of contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Account #2709-2070-001-432001]**

Issue: Webb County Court-at-Law II will partner with CIS of Laredo to offer services to participants. Court will receive referrals from CIS to treat juvenile offenders.

Solution: Effectively service area juveniles through CIS improve academics, attendance and behavior in school and other resources provided by CIS while partnering with JDTC.

Result: Obtaining the services by CIS is a key component of grant requirements.

- e. Discussion and possible action to approve a 12-month agreement (effective September 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025) between Webb County for the benefit of the Webb County Court-at-Law II Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program and Westcare in the amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00). The services will allow the Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Program participants to have access to life skills training education, recreation, community involvement, motivational seminars and after school programs through site coordinators; as listed and approved on the grant application awarded by TX Office of the Governor Specialty Courts Grant Program FY 2025 grant number 5091601 and authorize the Webb County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. All required documents were sent for review through Economic Development and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County single point of contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Account #2709-2070-001-432001 (Professional Services)]**

Issue: Webb County Court-at-Law II will partner with Westcare to offer services to participants. Court will receive referrals from Westcare to treat juvenile offenders.

Solution: Effectively service area juveniles through Westcare improve academics, attendance and behavior in school and other resources provided by Westcare while partnering with JDTC.

Result: Obtaining the services by Westcare is a key component of grant requirements

- f. Discussion and possible action to continue paying grant-funded personnel under Webb County Court-at-Law II DWI & Juvenile Drug Courts, TX Office of the Governor Specialty Courts Program, Grant No. 5091201 and 5091601, for up to Ninety (90) days, or until notification about grant continuation award from the TX Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division, Specialty Courts Program FY 2026. All personnel costs will be reimbursed with grant funds.

Issue: Current grant funding expires on August 31, 2025. The DWI and Juvenile Drug Courts Program have not received notice of award for the new grant. Unless this item is approved, personnel working under this said grant will not be paid after August 31, 2025.

Solution: Grant a 90-day payroll extension for personnel working under these two grants.

Result: The Webb County Court-at-Law II DWI & Juvenile Drug Courts Program in Laredo/Webb County will continue to identify and provide services for court participants.

11. **Honorable Raul Reyes, Treasurer**

- a. Discussion and possible action to enter into an agreement for the installation and implementation of hardware which will include 12 months of software services through Flash Parking, Inc., for the Webb County Parking Access and Revenue Control System in an amount of Fifty-Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars before applicable taxes (\$52,500.00) and authorizing the County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. **[Requested by the Honorable Raul Reyes, Webb County Treasurer's Office, Account Number #3872-7230-001-474501 (Tex-Mex Parking Lot Bond Series 2019A – Construction in Progress – Administration)]**

12. **Economic Development**

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the development and submission of a grant application and resolution to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) for the 2026 Community Outdoor Outreach Program for an amount not to exceed \$100,000; and authorizing the County Judge to serve as the County's Executive Officer and Authorized Representative in all matters related to Webb County's participation in the program. There is no match required for this funding opportunity. All required documents were reviewed by the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is in compliance with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures.

Issue: Webb County youth face limited access to resources and opportunities that facilitate participation in diverse outdoor recreational activities and meaningful engagement with Texas varied natural environments. This lack of exposure hinders the development of environmental awareness, physical well-being, and appreciation for natural resources among local youth.

Solution: Webb County Commissioners Court authorizes the development and submission of the grant application and resolution.

Result: Provide underserved youth in Webb County the opportunity to experience Texas natural environments, connecting them to nature, promoting their physical and mental well-being, and cultivating environmental stewardship.

- b. Discussion and possible action to continue paying grant-funded personnel under the Office of the Governor Grant No. 4376703, Operation Lone Star (OLS) Grant Program, for a period of ninety (90) days, pending notification of grant continuation award from the Criminal Justice Division, Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office. All personnel costs will be reimbursed through grant funds.

Issue: The current funding under Grant No. 4376703, Operation Lone Star (OLS) Grant Program, is set to expire on August 31, 2025. As of this date, the Criminal Justice Division, Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office, has not issued a notice of award for the subsequent grant cycle. Without approval of this item, personnel currently funded under this grant will be unpaid starting September 1, 2025.

Solution: Authorize a 90-day payroll extension for OLS grant-funded personnel, effective September 1, 2025, through November 30, 2025, to maintain operational continuity. All personnel costs incurred during this period will be submitted for reimbursement upon grant award.

Result: This action will allow the Operation Lone Star Program in Webb County to maintain personnel critical to its mission of deterring and interdicting criminal activity, and supporting ongoing border security efforts, without interruption.

13. **Fire Suppression & EMS Services**

- a. Discussion and possible action to accept EMS County Assistance, first allocation of lapsed funds provided through the Seven Flags Regional Advisory Council (RAC) Trauma Service Area "T" in the amount of \$10,710.16, to be utilized in the purchase of EMS/materials & supplies, training, travel, personnel cost, membership to professional/technical organizations, public education, vehicle maintenance and equipment for all stations of the Webb County Volunteer Fire Department, and authorizing the County Judge to sign all relevant documents; and any other matter incident thereto. **[Accounts #2929-3140-001-461000; #2929-3140-001-456305 & #2929-3140-001-460105]**

Issue: State funding provided through Seven Flags RAC for EMS needs/operations.

Solution: Accept funds and utilize monies for purchase of supplies, training, travel, personnel cost, membership to professional/technical organizations, public education, vehicle maintenance and equipment.

Result: Properly stocked emergency units ready for response, and well-prepared personnel.

14. **Head Start**

Disclaimer: All Head Start monies are 100% Federal funds

- a. Discussion and possible action to accept, the 2025 - 2026 Refunding grant (Year 2 of a 5-Year Funding Cycle) for the Head Start and Early Head Start program in the amount of \$12,843,244.00 (Federal), with an in-kind match of \$3,210,811.00 (Non-Federal), for a total amount of \$16,054,055.00 to serve 1,218 Head Start and 72 Early Head Start eligible children and their families from September 1, 2025 through August 31, 2026 in Webb County. Acceptance of this grant award includes the approval of Cost of Living adjustments and the filling of new/revised/vacant positions, as documented in the budget and budget justification narrative of the grant application. This action is contingent upon receiving Notice of Award on or before September 1, 2025.
- b. Discussion and possible action to approve the posting and filling of the following Slot:

- c. Discussion and possible action to accept the 2025 - 2026 Refunding grant (Year 2 of a 5-Year Funding Cycle) for the Early Head Start Child Care Partnership grant in the amount of \$995,333.00 (Federal), with an in-kind match of \$248,833.00 (Non-Federal), for a total amount of \$1,244,166.00 to serve 72 eligible children and their families from September 1, 2025 through August 31, 2026 in Webb County. Acceptance of this grant award includes approval of Cost of Living adjustments for all employees and the filling of new/revised/vacant positions, as documented in the budget and budget justification narrative of this grant application. This action is contingent upon receiving Notice of Award on or before September 1, 2025.

15. Planning & Physical Development

- a. Discussion and possible action to issue a "Certificate of Compliance with Plat Requirements" to authorize an electrical service connection pursuant to Section 232.029(c)(1), Local Government Code., to an unplatted lot, being the North 4.42 acres of Tract 28, La Presa Subdivision as further described in Vol. 313, Pgs. 055-057 of the Webb County Deed Records.

Issue: Item is a regulatory compliance issue regarding real property development provisions of state law and local regulations with particular emphasis on the Model Subdivision Rules enacted for residential subdivisions. Commissioners Court must certify to certain property conditions before utility service connections may be authorized.

Solution: As reflected in agenda backup, staff has verified compliance matters and recommends the Court's approval of this certificate.

Result: If approved, applicant may connect property to electrical utility services. If not approved, utility connection to property is prohibited.

16. Public Health Services

- a. Discussion and possible action to enter into a One (1) year (October 1, 2025 - September 30, 2026) service agreement between BIOMEDICAL Waste Solutions, LLC., and the Webb County Public Health Services Department for the purpose of disposing biohazardous waste at a monthly flat rate of One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$120.00), and authorizing the County Judge to sign and execute all relevant documents. **[Account #1001-5040-004-432001 (Professional Services)]**
- b. Discussion and possible action to purchase one (1) 2026 Chevrolet Suburban LT from Silsbee Ford (Tips Cooperative Contract No. 240901) in the amount of \$65,241.00 with an option of a 7-years/125,000 MLS Bumper to Bumper Warranty for \$4,500 for the Webb County Public Health Department pursuant to the Texas Local Government Code; §271.101, & §271.102, Sub-Chapter F. Cooperative Purchasing Program and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #1001-5040-007-470000 (Capital Outlay)]**

Issue: The Public Health Services Department is in need of a vehicle to be used to transport supplies and equipment when attending offsite vaccine clinics and community outreach health events in rural areas.

Solution: The purchase of an SUV will assist the transportation needs of our health programs.

Result: ETA on Delivery is 60-90 Days.

- c. Discussion and possible action to purchase one (1) 2026 Chevrolet Traverse from Silsbee Ford (Tips Cooperative Contract No. 240901) in the amount of \$41,623.00 with an option of a 7-years/ 125,000 MLS Bumper to Bumper Warranty for \$4,500 for the Webb County Public Health Department pursuant to the Texas Local Government Code; §271.101, & §271.102, Sub-Chapter F. Cooperative Purchasing Program and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #1001-5040-001-470000 (Capital Outlay)]**

Issue: One of the Public Health Services Department's existing vehicles will be reassigned to staff at the Bruni Public Health Facility in Bruni, Texas, for use in attending off-site vaccine clinics and community outreach health events in surrounding areas. To maintain transportation capacity for the department's other programs, a new vehicle will be purchased to replace the unit reassigned to Bruni.

Solution: The purchase of a new vehicle will assist the transportation needs of all of our department's health programs.

Results: ETA on Delivery is 45-60 Days

17. **Purchasing**

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the Purchasing Agent to process surplus and/or salvage property in accordance with the Texas Local Government Code, Section 263.152 (Disposition) and to publish notice to the public as per Local Government Code Section 263.153 (Notice) for surplus and/or salvage property being auctioned.

Issue: Excess county property that is either by definition salvage or surplus property because of time, accident, or any other cause such as wear and deterioration, damage, or obsolete that has no value and/or usefulness for the intended purpose and is no longer needed by the department.

Solution: At its June 23, 2025 meeting, the Webb County Commissioners Court awarded Invitation to Bid (ITB) 2025-010 "Webb County Water Plant Basins Sludge Removal and Cleaning Services" to JMJ Diaz, Corp. d/b/a JMS Constructors.

Result: Better efficiency in the provision and quality of water to the residents served by the Water Plant.

27. Discussion and possible action to enter into a Master Agreement with Ardurra Group Inc. to provide Water and Wastewater Consulting Services for Webb County Utilities Department. **[No effect on budget, will be billed for work as needed through approved work authorizations.]**

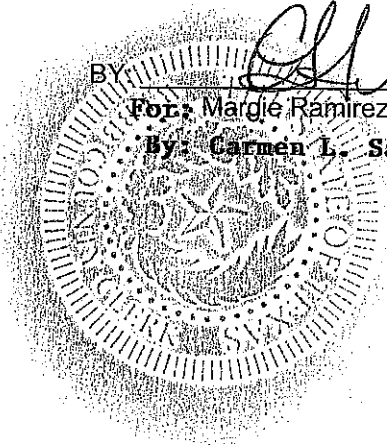

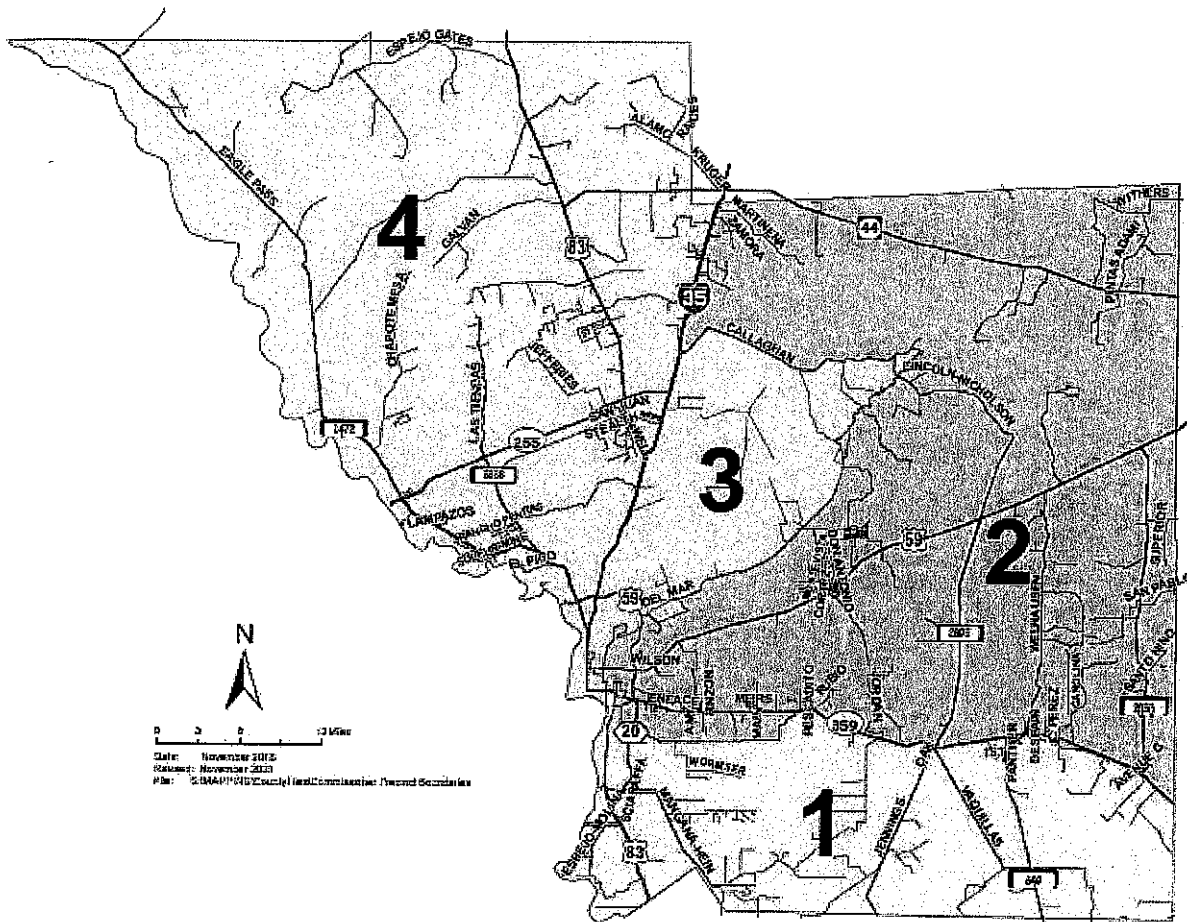
