- b. Discussion and possible action to accept a monetary donation in the amount of \$14,325.00 from SE Legacy Development, LLC, in support of the Webb County Community Action Agency's Meals on Wheels Program, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code §81.032 (Acceptance of Donation) with donor recognition requested under the brand name "Talise"; authorizing deposit of funds into Account #2371-5260-521-460105 (Minor Tools & Apparatus); and any other matters incident thereto. The Webb County CAA Meals on Wheels Program currently intends to use these unrestricted funds for the purchase of commercial kitchen cooking equipment.

Issue: The Webb County Community Action Agency (CAA) received a donation for the Meals on Wheels Program.

Solution: With the court's authorization to accept the funds, this donation will provide new cooking equipment for the Webb County CAA's Meals on Wheels Program operations.

Result: The Webb County CAA will be able to utilize these funds to enhance services to meet the growing needs of the local community and its most vulnerable citizens.

Issue: Webb County Court-at-Law II DWI Court services DWI Offenders in Webb County.

Solution: Effectively service area offenders through substance abuse counseling, mental health and other resources provided by the court with SCAN, inc partnership.

Result: Obtaining the services by SCAN, Inc is a key component of grant requirements. Background:

14. Economic Development

- a. Discussion and possible action to accept grant award from Apache Corporation for the FY 2025-2026 Apache Corporation Tree Grant Program Application for the donation of trees for the Larga Vista Community Center/Park, Oilton Park in Precinct 2, and La Presa Community Center/Park, and Webb County Public Health Facility in Precinct 1; and authorizing the County Judge to act as the County's Executive Officer and Authorized Representative in all matters pertaining to the County's participation in the Apache Tree Grant Program. All required documents were sent for review to the Economic Development Department, and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. This grant does not require a cash match.

Issue: Webb County areas have limited greenery.

Solution: To accept the grant award tree donation from the Apache Corporation Tree Grant Program.

Result: To provide trees for the community centers, Webb County facilities, and parks in Precincts 1 and 2.

Solution: A request is being made to fill slot.

Result: The filling will allow the department to run on a full staff if the court grants approval.

- c. Discussion and possible action to authorize the resolution and submission of the "Office of the Governor Public Safety Office, Criminal Justice Divisions Specialty Courts Grant Program, FY 2027 grant application", as developed, written, and submitted by and for the Webb County Adult Drug Court Program in an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) and authorizing the Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents including a Resolution; and any other matters incident thereto. This grant does not require any kind of match; therefore, there is no impact on the general fund. All required documents were sent for review through the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) Procedures. **[Requested by Margarita Garza, Drug Court Director]**

Issue: Webb County Adult Drug Court seeks to renew funding for FY 2027, Year 5 of the Office of the Governor (OOG), and the Criminal Justice Division (CJD) for Specialty Courts Grant. This funding enhances the current services by providing family integrated-based therapy and family-based interventions to qualifying drug court participants.

Solution: Authorize the submission of the OOG for Specialty Courts Program for Fiscal Year 2027, Year 5.

Result: The Webb County Adult Drug Court will remain in compliance with the submission rules and regulations set forth by the funding agency.

- d. Discussion and possible action to authorize the submission of the "Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) Continuation Grant application as developed, written, and submitted by and for the Webb County Adult Drug Court Program in an amount of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) and authorizing the Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents; and any other matters incident thereto. This grant does not require any kind of match; therefore, there is no impact to the general fund. All required documents were sent for review through the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Requested by Margarita Garza, Drug Court Director]**

Issue: SAMHSA awarded a multi-year grant to the Webb County Adult Drug Court Program on 09/30/2023 and the funding agency requires the submission of a non-competing continuation application for subsequent years after year 1 of funding.

Solution: Authorize the submission of Year 4 continuation application for the Drug Court.

Result: Webb County Adult Drug Court Program will remain in compliance with SPOC, and with the submission rules and regulations set forth by the funding agency.

- e. Discussion with possible action to authorize the submission of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) Continuation Grant application as developed, written, and submitted by and for the Webb County Veterans Treatment Court Program to the Substance Abuse Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) in the amount of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) and authorizing the Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents; and any other matters incident thereto. This grant does not require any match; there is no impact to the general fund. All required documents were sent for review through the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC). **[Requested by Margarita Garza, Director]**

Issue: SAMHSA awarded a multi-year grant to the Webb County Veterans Treatment Program on 09/30/2024 and the funding agency requires the submission of a non-competing continuation application for subsequent years after year 1 of funding.

Solution: Authorize the submission of Year 3 continuation application.

Result: If awarded, the Webb County Veterans Treatment Program will remain in compliance with SPOC and with the rules and regulations set forth by the funding agency.

- f. Discussion and possible action to authorize Webb County Court-at-Law II to submit a grant application as developed, written, and submitted by Webb County Court-at-Law II. The grant is through the Governor of the State of Texas, Public Safety Office Criminal Justice Division; Specialty Courts Grant Program, FY2027. The grant would expand The DWI Court Program if awarded with a contractual partnership with AMISTAD Consultation and Evaluation services LLC of San Antonio, Texas for the evaluation services and consulting of the grant. The court would then also partner with SCAN for treatment to court participants. The request is \$250,000.00 for one year. Grant funds shall be utilized to provide outpatient services to area DWI Offenders charged before the county courts-at-law and district courts that qualify for outpatient treatment. Authorizing Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents any other matter incident thereto. This grant does not require a match; and thus, will not have an impact on the general fund. All required documents were sent for review through Economic Development and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County single point of contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Requested by Judge Victor Villarreal, County Court at Law #2]**

Issue: Webb County has seen an influx of DWI Cases filed.

Solution: The grant if awarded would allow to expand services and for the hiring of additional support staff to assist the court with cases.

Result: DWI Court will be able to fully service more participants. The court positions will be fully operational for DWI Court Program.

- g. Discussion and possible action to authorize Webb County Court-at-Law II to submit a grant application as developed, written, and submitted by Webb County Court-at-Law II. The grant is through the Governor of the State of Texas, Public Safety Office Criminal Justice Division; Specialty Courts Grant Program, FY2027. The grant would expand services for the Juvenile Drug Treatment Court if awarded with a contractual partnership with PILLAR which is a non-profit mental health organization and licensed outpatient substance abuse treatment facility. The grant would also contract with AMISTAD Consultation and Evaluation services LLC of San Antonio, Texas for the evaluation services and consulting of the grant. The request is of \$250,000.00 for one year. Grant funds shall be utilized to provide outpatient services to area juveniles charged before the county courts-at-law that qualify for outpatient treatment. Authorizing Webb County Judge to execute all relevant documents any other matter incident thereto. This grant does not require a match; and thus, will not have an impact on the general fund. All required documents were sent for review through Economic Development and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County single point of contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Requested by Judge Victor Villarreal, County Court at Law #2]**

Issue: Webb County Court-at-Law II treats area juvenile offenders through the Juvenile Drug Treatment Court (Youth Success Court).

Solution: The award of this grant would expand services to Juvenile Treatment Court to service juvenile offenders in cases before either County Courts-at-law that would qualify.

Result: Webb County families would greatly benefit from the services offered between Webb County Court-at-Law II and PILLAR.

- h. Discussion and possible action to authorize the acceptance of a grant award for supplemental meal delivery services to elderly and/or disabled homebound residents of Webb County in the amount of THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED FOURTEEN DOLLARS AND NINETY-THREE CENTS (\$36,414.93) from the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) FY 2026 Texans Feeding Texans: Home-Delivered Meals (HDM) Grant Program as prepared, written, and submitted by the CAA grant writer in collaboration with the Meals on Wheel Program Manager and CAA management for Meals on Wheels Program costs, including food costs, small equipment expenses, transportation costs, office supplies, advertising expenses, new serving supplies, and new durable cookware; and designating the Webb County Judge as the authorized official to execute all relevant documents; and any other matters incident thereto. There will be no additional County Match needed. All required documents were sent for review through the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Requested by Guillermo Walls, CAA Director; GF#2370]**

Issue: There is a need for additional services/expanded capacity to serve more impoverished elderly and/or disabled residents of Webb County through the Meals on Wheels Program.

Solution: Supplemental grant award will allow expanded capacity for additional home deliveries of hot, nutritious meals to elderly and/or disabled residents of Webb County, Texas.

Result: With this grant award, CAA's Meals on Wheels Program will be able to provide additional services.

- i. Discussion and possible action to approve a budget increase request to the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) Fund for Veterans' Assistance Grant Award VCO25-T-001 for use by the Webb County Veterans Service Office Transportation Program in the amount of Seventy Thousand (\$70,000.00) Dollars to be distributed in the remaining grant year 2025-2026. This action will have no impact on the General Fund. No match is required from Webb County. **[Requested by David Garza, Veterans Service Office]**

Issue: On May 15, 2025, the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) authorized and awarded the Webb County Veterans Service Office \$100,000 to operate the Veterans Transportation Assistance Program (VTAP) for the grant period July 1, 2025 through August 31, 2026. Demand for transportation services has increased, and TVC extended the duration of its grants by an additional two months. As a result, current funding is projected to be substantially depleted by April 2026, placing the program's ability to sustain uninterrupted transportation services at risk for the remainder of the grant period.

Solution: Authorize submission of a budget increase request to the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC), Fund for Veterans' Assistance Grant Award VCO25-T-001, in the amount of \$70,000.00 to support the Webb County Veterans Service Office Transportation Program for the remainder of the 2025-2026 grant year.

Result: Approval will sustain VTAP services at the current level of demand and prevent service reductions for eligible Webb County Veterans, dependents, and surviving spouses by ensuring uninterrupted, no-cost transportation within a 200-mile radius to VA hospitals, specialty clinics, and

other essential medical facilities—including regional centers in San Antonio, Corpus Christi, Harlingen, and McAllen—and by continuing transportation support for basic needs (pharmacies, grocery stores, food pantries, and food delivery when needed). Funding will preserve continuity of care and access to essential services for Webb County Veterans and their dependents.

- j. Discussion and possible action to approve the submission of a Violence Against Women Justice and Training Program (VAWA) grant application to the Office of Governor (OOG) in the amount up to \$10,000 for training and supplies for investigators and patrol officers working at the Webb County Sheriff's Office serving victims of violent crimes against women and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents; including the resolution, and any other matters incident thereto. This grant requires a Thirty (30%) percent cash match, or a \$3,000 cash match, which will be met by Webb County Sheriff's Office state forfeiture funds. Thus, this grant will have no impact on the general fund. All required documents were sent to the Economic Development Department and were found in compliance with the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) policy. **[Requested by Martin Cuellar, Sheriff; Grant Fund #2605; Cash Match Account #2151-9080-001-485005 (Transfer out from State Forfeiture Funds)]**

Issue: Violence against women is a critical issue globally, encompassing physical, sexual, emotional, and economic abuse. It includes domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, and exploitation. Rooted in gender inequality and harmful cultural norms, it often goes unreported due to fear or lack of support. Effective solutions require stronger laws, education on gender equality, and better resources for victims to help prevent and address these crimes.

Solution: Grant application to improve the tools, techniques, and training for investigators handling cases of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking. This includes those who respond to calls for assistance, conducting victim interviews, completing incident reports, offering victim referrals to service providers, initiating arrests of perpetrators, preparing cases for prosecution, and preparing testimony and evidence for trial.

Result: Improved law enforcement services, including advanced investigative techniques, to address emerging criminal trends like cyberstalking, and enhance the effectiveness of law enforcement responses to the needs of victims of violent crime.

- k. Discussion and possible action to approve the submission of an Active Attack Response Equipment Grant Program application in the amount of \$73,697 for the purchase of breaching tools and bullet-resistant shields for peace officers of the Webb County Sheriff's Office, and authorizing the County Judge to execute all necessary documents related thereto and authorizing the County Judge to act as the County's Executive Officer and Authorized Signatory regarding all matters related to the County's involvement in the Active Attack Response Grant Program. It should be noted that this program does require a county in-kind match. All necessary documentation has been submitted to the Economic Development Department, and the solicitation aligns with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) policies and procedures.

Issue: Active shooter and critical incident responses require specialized equipment to ensure officer safety and the rapid neutralization of threats. Limited availability of protective equipment, such as ballistic shields and breaching tools, may hinder law enforcement's ability to effectively respond to active threats and protect both officers and the public.

Solution: Submit a grant application to obtain funding for breaching tools and NIJ-compliant ballistic shields for frontline peace officers directly employed by the Webb County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office will ensure compliance with all program-specific requirements, including maintaining an Active Shooter (Critical Incidents In-Progress) policy and ensuring officers receive required ALERRT training.

Result: Enhanced officer safety and improved operational readiness during active shooter and violent incident responses, enabling law enforcement to quickly stop the threat, provide rapid

casualty evacuation, and protect the community.

- I. Discussion and possible action to approve the submission of a FY2027 Project Safe Neighborhoods Program Grant Submission application to the Office of the Governor (OOG) in the amount up to \$150,000 for the purchase of License Plate Recognition (LPR) camera equipment and related system components to support projects designed to support violent crime and firearms-related initiatives for the Webb County Sheriff's Office and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents; including the resolution, and any other matters incident thereto. This grant requires no cash match. This grant will have no impact on the general fund. All required documents were submitted to the Economic Development Department and were found to be in compliance with the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) policy.

Issue: Violent crime and firearms-related offenses continue to pose significant public safety challenges, requiring law enforcement agencies to utilize advanced technology to enhance crime prevention and investigative capabilities. The Webb County Sheriff's Office must adapt to increasingly mobile and organized criminal activity, where timely identification of suspect vehicles is critical to solving crimes, preventing repeat offenses, and supporting officer safety. Limited access to modern surveillance and data-driven tools can hinder effective responses to violent crime incidents.

Solution: Approval of the FY2027 Project Safe Neighborhoods Program grant application will provide funding for the acquisition of License Plate Recognition (LPR) camera equipment and related system components for the Webb County Sheriff's Office. The LPR technology will support violent crime and firearms-related initiatives by enhancing real-time vehicle identification, strengthening investigative efforts, and improving intelligence-sharing capabilities. This grant requires no cash match and will be implemented without impact to the County's General Fund.

Result: Grant-funded LPR equipment will improve the Sheriff's Office's ability to deter, detect, and investigate violent crime and firearms-related offenses. The anticipated outcome includes faster identification of suspect vehicles, increased case clearance rates, improved coordination among law enforcement units, and enhanced public safety for the community. These improvements will be achieved through grant funding with no financial impact to the County's General Fund.

- m. Discussion and possible action to approve the submission of a FY2027 Criminal Justice Program grant application to the Office of the Governor (OOG) in the amount of up to \$45,000.00 for overtime and applicable fringe benefits for member of the Mental Health Unit to provide mental health services, including commitments executions of court orders, and transport to mental health facilities for the Webb County Sheriff's Office and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents; including the resolution, and any other matters incident thereto. Authorized Signatory regarding all matters related to the County's involvement in the Criminal Justice Grant Program. This grant requires no cash match. This grant will have no impact on the general fund. All required documents were submitted to the Economic Development Department and were found to be in compliance with the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) policy.

Issue: The demand for mental health-related law enforcement services continues to increase, requiring specialized response from trained personnel. Deputies assigned to the Mental Health Unit are frequently called upon to conduct emergency mental health commitments, execute court-ordered mental health warrants, and transport individuals to appropriate treatment facilities. These responsibilities often require overtime to ensure timely, lawful, and safe responses. Without dedicated funding, these essential services can strain staffing resources and limit the Sheriff's Office's ability to effectively address mental health crises in the community.

Solution: Approval of the Criminal Justice Program grant application will provide funding for overtime and applicable fringe benefits for members of the Webb County Sheriff's Office Mental Health Unit. Grant-funded overtime will allow deputies to continue providing critical mental health services, including emergency commitments, execution of court orders, and transportation to mental health facilities, without impacting the County's General Fund. This funding supports a specialized,

professional response to mental health incidents while maintaining compliance with state and local mandates.

Result: Grant funding will enhance the Sheriff's Office's capacity to respond effectively and efficiently to mental health-related incidents, ensuring individuals in crisis receive timely access to appropriate care. The anticipated result includes improved public safety, reduced strain on patrol resources, and better outcomes for individuals experiencing mental health emergencies, all achieved with no required cash match and no financial impact to the County's General Fund.

Result: Recommend approval for the lease program which includes maintenance for emergency response units.

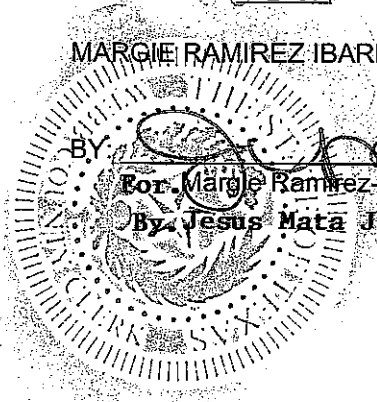

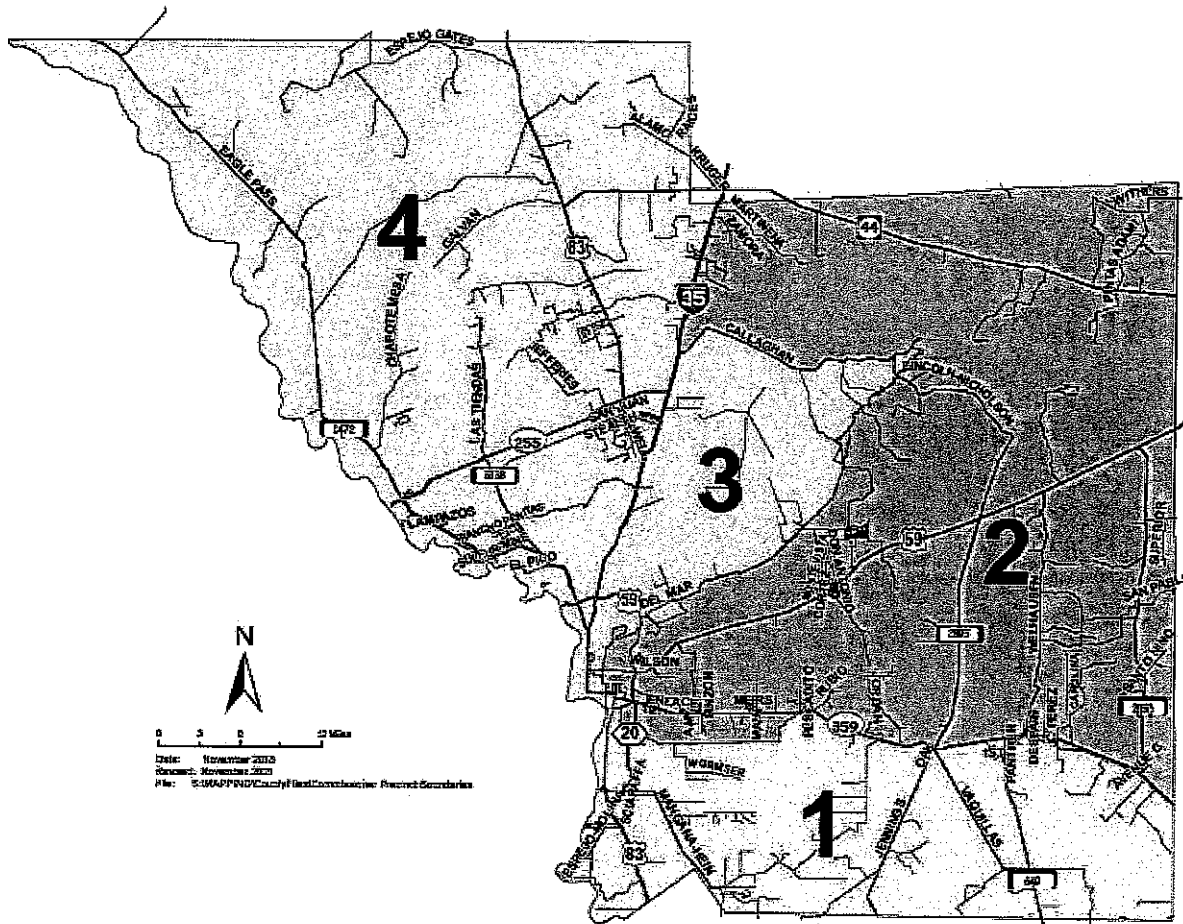
