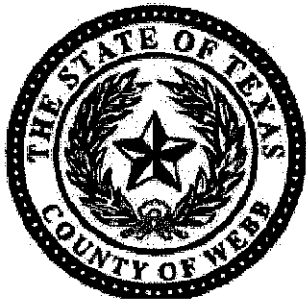

Members of the public wishing to participate must complete a Witness Card specifying which agenda item they wish to comment on. Each public member, individually or in a group, will be allowed a total of Three (3) minutes within which to make any/all public comments.

COURT TO DISCUSS AND ACT ON THE FOLLOWING:

CONSENT AGENDA: At most meetings, the Commissioners Court establishes a Consent Agenda. It consists of those Agenda Items which are routine or non-controversial, and which neither a member of the Commissioners court has asked to be pulled for discussion. Once the Commissioners Court has established the Consent Agenda, Agenda Items included on it will be voted upon in one vote, and will not be discussed separately unless requested by the County Judge or Commissioners.

The consent agenda has been created in order to give constituents the opportunity to view any and all pertinent backup information with reference to any item in the agenda. The objective of the consent agenda is for all Webb County constituents to be familiar with everyday county business and to demonstrate the transparency and fairness of this Commissioners Court.

- a. 6. Community Action Agency

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the Webb County Community Action Agency (CAA) to enter into a vendor agreement with the Retail Energy provider (listed below) for the continued implementation of the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) and the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program (CEAP). These vendor agreements are a Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) requirement for the implementation of the programs, authorizing the County Judge to sign all relevant documents; and, any other matters incident thereto. These vendor

agreements are a requirement by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) for the implementation of these social programs. This agreement shall be effective starting on January 1, 2026, and for a period not to exceed two years from that effective date. **[Account #2362-5360-521 (Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program)]**

Retail Energy Provider:

Issue: These vendor agreements are a Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) requirement.

Solution: The Webb County CAA will enter into a two-year vendor agreement with the Retail Energy Provider for the implementation of the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) and the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program (CEAP).

Result: The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) will provide funding to be utilized for payment of home energy expenses for qualifying low-income citizens of Webb County.

- b. Discussion and possible action to approve the following donation checks received for the Webb County Community Action Agency First Annual Meals on Wheels Golf Tournament. These funds will be utilized to help cover tournament-related costs and the purchase of bulk food for the Meals on Wheels Programs.

Issue: The Webb County Community Action Agency Meals on Wheels Program has received these funds as sponsorship opportunities associated with the First Annual Meals on Wheels Golf Tournament.

Solution: The Webb County Community Action Agency Meals on Wheels Program will utilize these funds to cover tournament-related costs and the purchase of bulk food to continue providing hot, nutritious meals to the elderly in our community.

Result: Approval of this item will allow the Meals on Wheels Program to continue providing over 550 hot, nutritious meals per day to the elderly residents of Webb County.

- c. Discussion and possible action to approve the posting and filling of the following Slot to be funded with Grant funds, subject to the availability of payroll funds and any applicable Civil Service guidelines, effective February 23, 2026:

Issue: The employee in this position was promoted.

Solution: Advertise and hire a replacement who can assist with the delivery of healthy hot meals to the elderly.

Result: We will be able to continue servicing the elderly with hot healthy meals under the Meals on Wheels and Elderly Nutrition Program.

7. **Honorable Isidro Alaniz, District Attorney**

- a. Discussion and possible action to approve a Cooperative Agreement between Webb County District Attorney's office and Laredo Police Department concerning the joint efforts between officers and prosecutor who will work closely with the LPD ATTF unit, The grant runs from March 18, 2025 to March 17, 2026..The Laredo Police Department will reimburse Webb County for payroll expenses including salary and fringe benefits in an amount not to exceed \$154,968. There is no cash match required for this grant.

Issue: There is evidence that an increasing amount of auto theft exists in Laredo, Texas area and that such illegal activity has a substantial and detrimental effect on the welfare of the people of Texas.

Solution: Disrupt the illicit auto theft in Laredo by immobilizing targeted violators and auto theft organizations.

Result: There is evidence that auto theft exists in Laredo, and surrounding areas and that such illegal activity has a substantial and detrimental effect on the welfare of the community. The D.A.'s Office prosecutor will collaborate between state and local law enforcement agencies by providing legal expertise and lead by task force participants. The objective is to disrupt the illicit drug traffic in Laredo and surrounding areas by immobilizing targeted violators and trafficking organizations; therefore, minimizing the harmful effects of Auto theft, illegal drugs, and organized crime.

- b. Discussion and possible action to accept the award and enter into an agreement with the Texas Comptroller and accept the award in the amount of \$275,000 through the Rural Prosecutor's Office Salary Assistance Grant. All required documents were sent for review through the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. This grant does not require a cash match. There will be no impact on the County's General Fund.[Fund #2717]

Issue: District Attorney's Offices all over Texas are having a hard time retaining and hiring employees due to the competitive salaries in the private sector and other government agencies.

Solution: Use the amount awarded to pay higher salaries and be able to retain employees

Result: This will allow the District Attorney's Office to retain and recruit talented employees

- c. Discussion and possible action to approve an agreement between the Webb County District Attorney's Office and the United States Marshals Services for reimbursement of employee overtime incurred from joint law enforcement operations project JLEOTFOT, for the performance period of October 17, 2025, through September 30, 2026, in the amount of Twenty-One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$21,500.00). District Attorney Forfeiture funds will be utilized to cover the applicable fringe benefits associated with this project's employee(s) overtime, therefore there will be no impact to the General Fund; and authorizing the Webb County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto. [Account #2580-2260-001-413000 (US Marshals - DA)]

Issue: Collaboration between Federal, State and local law enforcement agencies is necessary to pursue and dismantle organized crime organizations along the Texas border and within our community.

Solution: Accept Federal assistance to continue local participation in USMS investigations, strategic initiatives and prosecution of organized crime.

Result: Disruption of organized criminal activity in Webb County and along the Texas border.

8. **Economic Development**

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the submission of a grant application for a FY 2026 Community Challenge Grant in the amount estimated at FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$15,000.00) as prepared, written, and submitted by the CAA grant writer in collaboration with CAA management and submitted to the AARP Livable Communities Grant Program for equipment, minor tools/apparatus, materials, and supplies for Meals on Wheels and Emergency Preparedness and designating the Webb County Judge as the authorized official to execute all relevant documents; and any other matters incident thereto. This grant requires no match; and, thus will have no impact to the general fund. All required documents were sent for review through the Economic Development Department and the solicitation is compliant with the Webb County Single Point of Contact (SPOC) procedures. **[Requested by Guillermo Walls, CAA Director]**

Issue: There is often a need for additional services/expanded capacity to serve the residents of Webb County, including for emergency preparedness endeavors.

Solution: Proposed supplemental grant application will allow expanded capacity for the Community Action Agency to better serve the low-to-moderate income older residents of Webb County, Texas.

Result: Community Action Agency (CAA) will be able to provide additional services for these older residents.

- b. Discussion and possible action to ratify the submission of the Operation Stone Garden (OPSG) FY 2025 grant application and the accompanying resolution; to authorize the Economic Development Department to prepare and submit the FY 2025 OPSG grant application to the Office of the Governor in an amount not to exceed TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED NINE DOLLARS AND TWENTY CENTS (\$2,215,609.20) for overtime, associated fringe benefits, equipment, supplies, fuel, helicopter maintenance and fuel, vehicle and tire maintenance, data services, Management and Administration (M&A), and maintenance of OPSG-acquired assets for local law enforcement agencies; and to approve and ratify a resolution authorizing the County Judge to serve as the County's Executive Officer and Authorized Representative for all matters related to the County's participation. This grant does not require a county cash or in-kind match.

Issue: Complex and dynamic law enforcement challenges exist in the Southwest border area of the United States, including Laredo/Webb County. For example, transnational criminals seek to exploit existing law enforcement jurisdictional boundaries by conducting their illegal enterprises across traditional jurisdictional divisions.

Solution: Grant application: (1) to ensure first responders are equipped with enhanced tools/equipment/resources needed to confront well-funded criminal organizations and (2) for the coordination of law enforcement efforts between various local and federal law enforcement agencies.

Result: Enhanced capabilities of local law enforcement responders; further coordination of response across local and federal jurisdictions.

- c. Discussion and possible action to approve Contract Amendment #6 with the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) for a contract extension (Contract No. 70800001013) until April 30, 2026 on the Webb County Southern Health Facility Project, contingent on TDCHA Approval and authorizing the County Judge to sign all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto.

Issue: Delays on construction will cause project completion to fall outside TDCHA contract period.

Solution: Approve contract extension with TDHCA that will provide ample time to finish construction.

Result: Project completion will occur within TDHCA contract performance period.

- d. Discussion and possible action to approve Change Order #7 with AOC Calton, Ltd. d/b/a Summit Building & Design for an increase of 40 days for a final date of March 31, 2026, to allow completion of construction on the Webb County Southern Health Facility Project, contingent on approval from state funding agency and authorizing the County Judge to execute all relevant documents and any other matters incident thereto.

Issue: The contract with Summit Building & Design is due to expire on February 19, 2026 and construction is still ongoing.

Solution: Approve Change Order #7 in order to Summit Building & Design to have additional days to complete construction.

Result: Additional days will allow for project completion within an approved contract timeline.

9. **Head Start**

10. **Medical Examiner**

- a. Discussion and possible action to ratify the authorization to use the Webb County credit card for hotel reservations for visiting Medical Examiner Dr. Adel Shaker in an amount not to exceed \$1,916.14; and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #1001-3100-001-432001 (Professional Services Account)]**

Issue: The Webb County Medical Examiner will be visited by a forensic doctor that will cover for Dr. Corinne E. Stern.

Solution: Consideration to ratify the authorization to use the Webb County credit card for hotel-related expenditures for visiting Medical Examiner doctor.

Result: Ratification approval on use of County Credit Card for Medical Examiner's Office use.

11. **Planning & Physical Development**

- a. Discussion and possible action to grant a waiver from the ground water study requirements under Section 232.0032, Texas Local Government Code (TLGC), for all subdivision plat applications subject to Section 232, Subchapter A, TLGC (non-residential subdivisions in border counties) and located in the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer as authorized by Section 232.0032(a-1), TLGC and any other matters incident thereto.

Issue: Section 232.0032 of the TLGC requires subdivision plat applications subject to Section 232, Subchapter A, TLGC to submit an extensive groundwater study where no organized water services are available. The groundwater study requirement does not mandate that the developer provide water services, just demonstrate that it is available. The groundwater study adds an additional unnecessary burden to commercial developers in border counties that already have strict water and wastewater regulations under the Model Rules and 232, Subchapter B, TLGC for residential subdivisions.

Solution: Section 232.0032(a-1) allows counties to grant a waiver from groundwater study requirements if there is evidence that there is sufficient groundwater available, will continue to be available and the proposed subdivision is located in the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer. The County has evidence through recent groundwater studies that there is sufficient groundwater and will continue to be available in the area of the aforementioned aquifer.

Result: Granting a waiver from the groundwater study requirement will keep commercial development costs down and simplify the plat application process for non-residential plats in the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer.

- b. Discussion and possible action to approve the posting and filling of the following Slot, subject to the availability of payroll funds and any applicable Civil Service guidelines, effective February 23, 2026:

Issue: Request to post and fill slot 1746 which is currently vacant.

Solution: Approval to post and fill slot 1746.

Result: Filling of the slot will allow the Planning Department to provide public services efficiently and effectively.

12. **Purchasing**

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize the Purchasing Agent to advertise a Request for Proposals for the procurement of employee health benefits such as health, dental, vision, prescription drug, stop loss, third-party administration and other related health benefits pursuant to the Professional Services Procurement Act and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account Numbers 6100-1090-001-432056 (Administration Fees), #6100-1090-001-4325056-025 (Aetna Stop-Loss), #6100-1090-001-432056-030 (Administration Fees Dental), #6100-1090-001-452015-005 (Plan Premiums Vision Aetna), & #6100-1090-001-432057 (Cafeteria Administration)]**

Issue: Commissioners Court recently approved a consulting agreement with Gallagher Benefit Services, Inc.; The effective date of agreement is February 1, 2026.

Solution: Part of Gallagher's scope of services is to assist with the development of all phases of the RFP specifications, which include providing expert responses to offerors questions submitted to the Webb County Purchasing Agent during the procurement of these health benefits, and to assist with the negotiation of favorable renewals for employee group benefits and services such health, dental, vision, prescription drug and stop-loss and third-party administration.

Result: If approved, the Purchasing Agent will coordinate with the Risk Management Director and Consultant to begin the process of developing an RFP package for the employee health benefit services.

13. **Honorable Martin Cuellar, Sheriff**

- a. Discussion and possible action to authorize an exception to Webb County Personnel policy and approve the transfer of employee earned accruals from slot #4058, currently under the SB22 grant, to Webb County slot #455; and any other matters incident thereto.

Issue: The CBA officer in the grant slot has accrued leave and is transferring from the grant funded slot to a Webb County slot.

Solution: Allow the one-time transfer of accruals for CBA member from Grant SB22 slot #4058 to Webb County slot #455.

Result: Webb County will not payout accruals and will allow the employee to use earned accruals.

14. Discussion and possible action to continue paying grant funded personnel under the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) Task Force Agreement, DEA Narcotics Task Force for Ninety (90) days, until notification about grant continuation award from the U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration. **[Fund #2592]**

Issue: HIDTA is a multi-agency task force that continues to gather intelligence and disrupts the illicit flow of narcotics and money laundering activities along the South Texas Border region. South Texas HITDA is an alliance of over 57 federal, state and local law enforcement agencies working together to combat drug trafficking and related crimes. Historically the Grantor has always submitted award letters to local law enforcement agencies between the months of February and March; Nonetheless, the grants are retroactive to January 1st of each calendar year.

Solution: For the Webb County District Attorney's Office to continue supporting HIDTA by employing grant funded investigators and continue corroborating with other law enforcement agencies to push forward the mission and goals of the South Texas HIDTA task force.

Result: The Webb County District Attorney's Office will continue to employ HIDTA funded investigators who will actively participate and help the task force fight against the continued flow of illicit drugs and related crime within the South Texas region.

16. Discussion and possible action to authorize and make an exception for a one-time annual credit card charge not to exceed Two Thousand Two Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$2,280.00) for an annual renewal subscription for Monday.com Work Management Pro Platform for the Webb County Community Action Agency Department utilizing the Webb County credit card typically designated only for airfare related expenditures; and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #2043-1160-521-461000 (Materials & Supplies)]**

Issue: The Webb County Community Action Agency is renewing a needed subscription to a work management platform to continue efficient operations within the department. The platform accepts purchase orders at a minimum threshold cost of \$5,280.00. With a purchase order at that price, Webb County CAA would have to spend THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00) greater than if the county would pay using a credit card for the \$2,280.00 subscription rate.

Solution: Consideration to authorize the use and make an exception to the rule regarding the County Credit Card for this purchase.

Result: If authorized, the order will be processed using the credit card. This work management platform will continue assisting in the overall operational efficiency of the department.

17. Discussion and possible action to authorize the Purchasing Agent to solicit competitive bids for the removal and installation of new Fifty (50) Mailboxes along SH 359 at Veterans Blvd., pursuant to the Local Government Code; Sub-Chapter C. Competitive Bidding in General and any other matters incident thereto. **[Co-Sponsored by Rosaura "Wawi" Tijerina, Commissioner Pct. 2; Account #2007-7150-001-470000 (Capital Outlay)]**

Issue: Currently, residential mailboxes along the subject area location, are located along the shoulder/roadside of SH359. The existing placement of these residential mailboxes pose a safety concern due to the proximity of the mailboxes to the road.

Solution: Consideration to authorize the Purchasing Agent to publicly advertise and secure competitive formal bids for the subject project. Securing a competitive bid from a qualified contractor will provide an opportunity to remove existing mailboxes and install new ones in a more secure spot, in accordance with state and local traffic rules & regulations.

Result: If approved, the Purchasing Agent will secure the specifications, drawings and/or any other related construction document items from the County Engineering Department in order to proceed with the public bid. These actions will provide a safer roadway, protect property but most importantly, protect the residents of Webb County.

Issue: On January 12, 2026, item 16g., the Webb County Commissioners Court authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue a Request for Qualifications for a Federal Legislative Consultant. The selected consultant(s) will serve as, but not limited to, the County's representative and advisor on

federal legislative and administrative matters affecting County operations, infrastructure, public safety, economic development, healthcare, emergency management, and border-related initiatives at the federal legislative level.

Solution: Consideration to authorize the selection of the highest-ranking consultant as recommended by the evaluation committee and the Webb County Purchasing Agent.

Result: If approved, General Counsel and any other designated County official(s) as directed by Webb County Commissioners Court will negotiate the terms, conditions and related fees for the awarded services and return to Commissioners Court for final approval of the Consulting Services agreement for execution.

19. Discussion and possible action to reject all proposals for (RFP) 2026-002 "Webb County Inmate Telephone Services" and any other matters incident thereto.

20. Discussion and possible action to authorize the purchase of office furniture for the Constable Pct. 2 Office to include delivery, assembly and setup in an amount not to exceed \$44,838.19 from G&S Office Designs (OMNIA Contract No. R240108 & TIPS Contract No. 2303011) pursuant to Section 271.101 and 271.102 of the Texas Local Government Code, Cooperative Purchasing Program; and to further authorize the transfer of funds from the general operating reserve Account #1001-1130-001-431007-010 to Constable Pct. 2 material and supplies Account #1001-3180-001-461000; and any other matters incident thereto. **[Account #1001-3180-001-461000 (General Fund-Constable Pct 2 - Administration-Materials & Supplies)]**

Issue: Current furniture is worn out and needs replacement. Some furniture has water damage from a previous water leak.

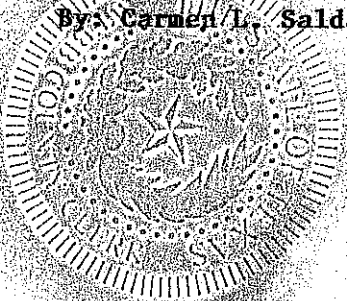

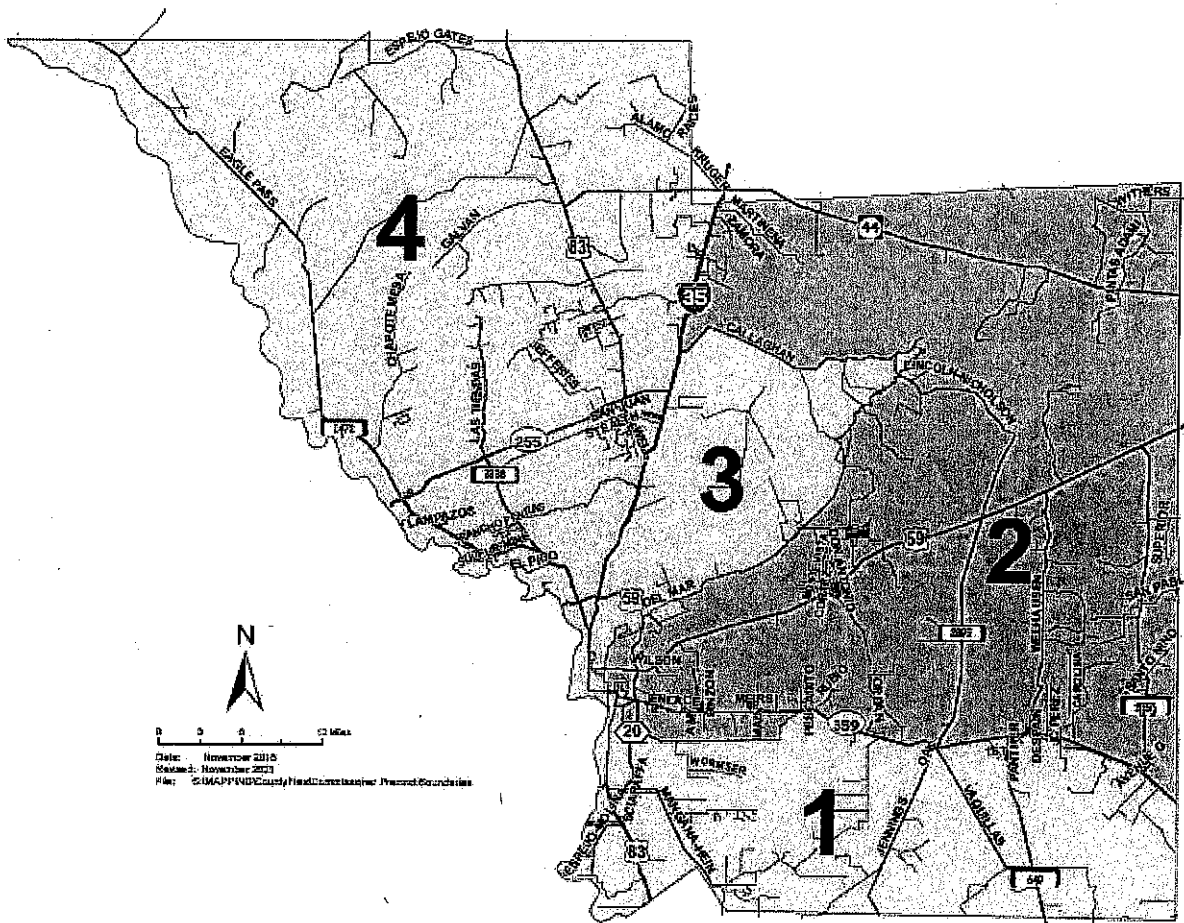
