

- C. If the Town Judge is satisfied that the offense complained of has been committed by the person charged, he shall issue a summons or a warrant of arrest. Before issuing a summons or warrant of arrest on a complaint, the Town Judge may subpoena and examine witnesses as to the truth of the complaint.

ARTICLE 6-4 FORMATION AND SUMMONING OF JURIES; JURORS' PAY

- A. The formation and summoning of juries in the Town Courts shall be one in the same manner as provided for by law in Courts of Record.
- B. Selection of potential jurors shall be made from the master jury list furnished by the County Recorder pursuant to Section 21-311, Arizona Revised Statutes.
- C. Only persons who reside within the Town's limits are eligible for jury service in the Town Court.
- D. Each juror shall be paid \$12.00 by the Town for each days' attendance upon the Town Court and reimbursed for mileage pursuant to Section 21-221, Arizona Revised Statutes.



ARTICLE 6-5 JUDGES PRO TEMPORE

- A. The Council may appoint Judges Pro Tempore on a temporary full-time or part-time basis.
- B. The selection and appointment of Judges Pro Tempore shall be upon the recommendation of the Town Judge.

Section 6-6-1 Establishment of Home Detention Program

- A. A Home Detention Program is hereby established in the Town Court for persons who are sentenced to jail confinement, including those persons sentenced under A.R.S. §28-1381 or §28-1382. If a person is sentenced to jail confinement by the Town Court, the Court may substitute Home Detention for a portion of the jail term as provided in this Article.
- B. The presiding Judge shall develop and implement a Home Detention Program that complies with the requirements of State law.
