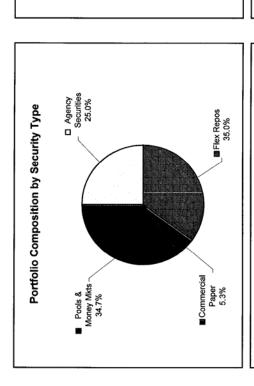

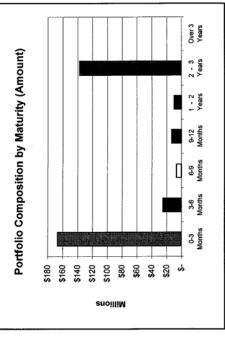

Portfolio Composition by Issuer

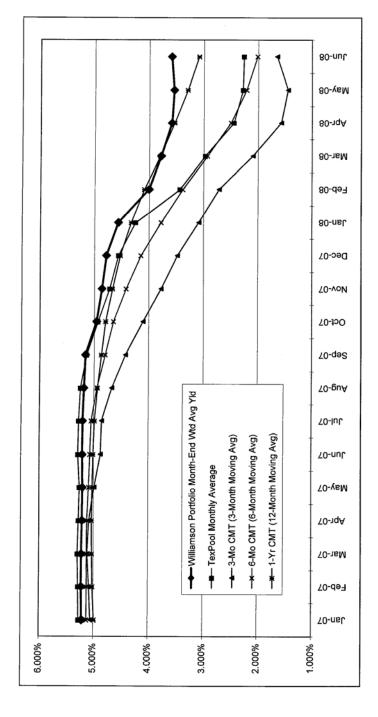

Sheriff Wilson will be honored November 5, 2008, at the Hyatt Regency in Atlanta, Georgia. The nomination categories are representative of outstanding performance of individuals nationwide who have shown exemplary dedication to those suffering from mental illness. The National CIT conference is sponsored by National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), which is well known for their advocacy efforts and collaborations nationwide between law enforcement, mental health professionals, and the mental health community. Sheriff Wilson has been instrumental with his pioneering ideas and support to law enforcement, the public, and the mental health structure in Williamson County by supporting those with mental illness. Sheriff Wilson has accomplished this by providing programs and services to those in crisis and diverting those who require treatment from incarceration to appropriate programs. ## CONTRACT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 1 TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, premises considered, the *County* and the *Engineer* agree that said contract is amended as follows:

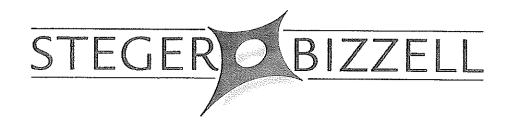
- I. The not-to-exceed fee in Exhibit 1, Section 1, Item 1. I is hereby increased from \$394,345 to \$752,303.
