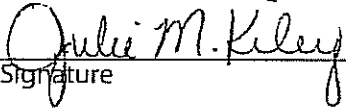

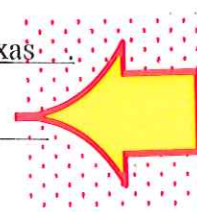

Proposals were received for Workers' Compensation Insurance and the current vendor, Texas Political Subdivisions (TPS), submitted the best proposal. The current premium is \$891,914 annually. TPS proposed a new premium of \$636,308 annually. A 29% reduction which is \$255,606 less per year.

TPS also proposed a 3 year rate guarantee, however, the discounts applied for our group's actual experience may vary. Then, upon renewal, Williamson County is also eligible to receive a \$17K dividend.

The current carrier, Texas Political Subdivisions, is recommended for award of this contract effective 10/1/09.

**Agreement for Services Provided for FY 2009-2010
Williamson County Wellness Program
by the
Williamson County & Cities Health District**

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into effective this 1st day of October, 2009, by and between Williamson County, sponsored by the Williamson County Human Resources Department, (hereinafter CLIENT) and The Williamson County & Cities Health District (hereinafter PROVIDER).

WHEREAS, PROVIDER has expertise in the area of services required by CLIENT and is willing to provide such services to CLIENT under the following terms and conditions:

1. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

PROVIDER shall provide CLIENT with the following services for the benefit of CLIENT'S employees (PARTICIPANTS):

"Beat the Pack" is a tobacco cessation program designed for the worksite. The program offers a step by step guide to help individuals quit smoking. It contains all the information needed to promote and instruct the program.

PROVIDER will offer a total of 3 series with 7 sessions each throughout the year. Three of the sessions will be provided by the Williamson County Employee Assistance Program. For the sessions to be effective a limit of 10-12 PARTICIPANTS will be allowed for each class. PROVIDER will follow up every week to remind PARTICIPANTS of next class and to check on their progress of quitting smoking.

After completion of the program and with permission from the PARTICIPANTS, PROVIDER staff will follow up with individuals every three months for up to one year from the time they began the program to track progress.

2. FEES

- A. CLIENT shall pay PROVIDER a fee of \$2,272 per month for a maximum of \$27,264 per year.
- B. CLIENT shall pay PROVIDER for services submitted by the 10th of the month following the month for which services are being billed.

3. TERM

- A. The Wellness Services under this agreement shall become effective on October 1, 2009, and the obligations hereunder shall continue unless sooner terminated pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, until September 30, 2010.
- B. Contract renewal shall be negotiated at least 30 days prior to the expiration of the effective date of this agreement. Renewal is contingent upon review and approval by the Benefits Committee

4. TERMINATION

- A. Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without good cause at any time by giving the other party at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of such termination. In the event of such termination for convenience, it is understood and agreed that only the amounts due to PROVIDER for services provided to and including the date of termination, will be due and payable. No penalty will be assessed for either party's termination of this Agreement for convenience.
- B. In addition, if PROVIDER shall fail to provide reasonably faithful service with due attention to any service required hereunder, CLIENT may, at its discretion and without prejudice to any legal rights or remedy, immediately terminate this Agreement or the services furnished hereunder.

5. MISCELLANEOUS

CLIENT shall have the right to control or direct the details, manner and means by which PROVIDER accomplishes the results of the services performed hereunder.

- A. All activities and services provided by PROVIDER shall be coordinated through the Williamson County Human Resources Department with final approval from CLIENT prior to implementation and completion by PROVIDER.
- B. Reporting, analysis and evaluation of data shall be submitted to CLIENT by PROVIDER with recommendations for further action.
- C. PROVIDER shall submit annual reporting of results to CLIENT with suggestions and proposal for future programs and services.
- D. All programs and services by PROVIDER to be made available to PARTICIPANTS at all locations to ensure non-discriminatory practices in the Williamson County Wellness Program.
- E. Each party to this Agreement, in the performance of this Agreement, shall act in an individual capacity and not as agents, employees, partners, joint ventures or associates of one another. The employees or agents of one party shall not be deemed or construed to be the employees or agents of the other party for any purposes whatsoever.
- F. PROVIDER agrees that CLIENT or its duly authorized representatives shall, until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment under this Agreement, have access to and the right to examine and photocopy any and all books, documents, papers and records of PROVIDER which are directly pertinent to the services to be performed under this Agreement for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions. PROVIDER agrees that CLIENT shall have access during normal working hours to all necessary PROVIDER facilities and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space in order to conduct audits in compliance with the provisions of this section. CLIENT shall give PROVIDER reasonable advance notice of intended audits.
- G. CLIENT believes it has sufficient funds currently available and authorized for expenditure to finance the costs of this Agreement. PROVIDER understands and agrees that the CLIENT's payment of amounts under this Agreement is contingent on the CLIENT receiving appropriations or other expenditure authority sufficient to allow the CLIENT, in the exercise of reasonable administrative discretion, to continue to make payments under this Agreement.
- H. This Agreement is the entire agreement of the parties with respect to Wellness Services and supersedes any oral or written proposals or agreements made before and contemporaneous to this Agreement. Any change(s) to this contract shall be in writing in the form of an amendment mutually agreed upon and duly executed by representatives of both CLIENT and PROVIDER. Changes will be implemented within 30 days upon receipt of an executed amendment.

Background

The COPS funded Interoperable Communications Technology Program grant was a \$6,000,000 federal grant with a \$2,000,000 match, of which Williamson County appropriated \$1,850,000 for the purchase of Williamson County radio system infrastructure and the City of Austin appropriated \$150,000 to upgrade the Austin/Travis County Regional Radio System operating software. This grant provided a multi-jurisdictional interoperable radio communication system that allows for seamless radio coverage across the two counties. As shown on Exhibit "A", the City of Austin will retain \$600,000 for the Austin Regional Radio Upgrades. The remainder equipment totaling \$7,390,000 will belong to Williamson County. A Radio Equipment Transfer of Title between Williamson County and the City of Georgetown for the IP consoles also listed on Exhibit "A" is presented on this week's agenda. The Radio Equipment Transfer of Titles between Williamson County and the cities of Round Rock & Cedar Park will be presented for approval in the near future for the IP Consoles listed on Exhibit "A". 1. Grant Award On September 2, 2005, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) awarded a COPS Interoperable Communications Technology Program Grant #2005INWX0020 in the amount of \$6,000,000, subject to a \$2,000,000 local grant match requirement, to the City of Austin. This grant award was for the implementation of a public safety voice radio system in Williamson County ("Project"). The City of Austin and Williamson County provided funds to satisfy the local grant match.
2. Interlocal Agreement On April 27, 2006, the City of Austin and Williamson County, an Official Partner to the Grant Award, entered into a Public Safety Voice Radio Communications System Implementation Interlocal Agreement. The parties agreed that upon completion of the Project and the City of Austin's final acceptance, title to the COPS funded radio equipment installed on the Williamson County Radio System shall be transferred to Williamson County. The equipment is listed in Exhibit "A" (Radio Equipment List) attached to this Transfer of Title and incorporated by reference.
3. City of Austin Acceptance The Project was completed on February 1, 2008, and on June 26, 2008, the City approved final acceptance of the Project as evidenced by the Acceptance Document attached as Exhibit "B" to this Transfer of Title and incorporated by reference.

Therefore, the City of Austin transfers title to the COPS funded radio equipment installed on the Williamson County Radio System that is described on Exhibit "A" (Radio Equipment List) to Williamson County. In consideration of the transfer, Williamson County agrees not to sell or otherwise transfer the radio equipment described in Exhibit "A" except to the extent permitted by federal law.

Radio Equipment Transfer of Title

1. Grant Award On September 2, 2005, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) awarded a COPS Interoperable Communications Technology Program Grant #2005INWX0020 in the amount of \$6,000,000, subject to a \$2,000,000 local grant match requirement, to the City of Austin. This grant award was for the implementation of a public safety voice radio system in Williamson County ("Project"). The City of Austin and Williamson County ("County") provided funds to satisfy the local grant match.
2. The City of Austin and Williamson County, an Official Partner to the Grant Award, entered into a Public Safety Voice Radio Communications System Implementation Interlocal Agreement. The parties agreed that upon completion of the Project and the City of Austin's final acceptance, title to the COPS funded radio equipment installed on the Regional Communications System shall be transferred to Williamson County.
3. The Project is complete, and the County has accepted transfer of the equipment from the City of Austin.

Therefore, the County transfers title to the COPS funded radio equipment installed on the Regional Communications System that is described on Exhibit "A" (Radio Equipment List) to the City of Georgetown, Texas. In consideration of the transfer, the City of Georgetown agrees not to sell or otherwise transfer the radio equipment described in Exhibit "A" except to the extent permitted by federal law.

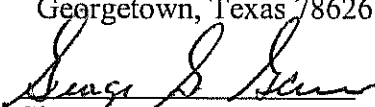

Discuss and take appropriate action on renewal of interlocal agreement with Bluebonnet Trails MHMR for crisis services.

Background

This is a continuation of the agreement with Bluebonnet Trails to provide crisis services as required in the \$82 million Crisis Redesign Initiative for the 2008/2009 biennium. The State of Texas through the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) mandates services, including a crisis hotline and a mobile crisis outreach team. To avoid duplication of services, Bluebonnet Trails has contracted to use the existing County Mobile Outreach Team (MOT) for crisis services. In the agreement Bluebonnet will reimburse the County for the following items: Salaries - \$62,656; Radio - \$250/year; Uniforms - \$240/year; Phone/pager - \$1,000/year; Training - \$828/year; and Printed Materials - \$60/year. In addition, Bluebonnet will pay a fee for assessment and follow-up services at set rates, with the total agreement not to exceed \$124,000/year.

WILLIAMSON COUNTY CRISIS SERVICES INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (Agreement) for crisis funding from the State of Texas is made and entered into effective this _____, by the between WILLIAMSON COUNTY (County) and BLUEBONNET TRAILS COMMUNITY MHMR CENTER (Bluebonnet) which are political subdivisions of the State of Texas ("the Parties").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Texas Government Code, Chapter 791, the Interlocal Cooperation Act provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with each other for the performance of governmental functions and for the joint use of facilities or services for the promotion and protection of the health and welfare of the inhabitants of this State and the mutual benefit of the Parties; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Texas has contracted with Local Mental Health Authorities to ensure provision of emergency mental health services throughout the 254 counties in Texas; and,

WHEREAS, Bluebonnet is the Local Mental Health Authority for Williamson County and is the provider of mental health services for the citizens of Williamson County; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Texas through the actions of the Texas Legislature has supported the Crisis Redesign Initiative and has allocated \$82 million for additional crisis services for the FY 2008-2009 biennium.

WHEREAS, the State of Texas through the Department of State Health Services is mandating that the funding be used for the development of hotline services and mobile crisis outreach teams; and,

WHEREAS, the County has been working in partnership with Bluebonnet to provide mental health services for the citizens of Williamson County and, Bluebonnet has been an active member of the Williamson County Mental Health Committee and participated in the development and implementation of mental health programs such as the Mobile Outreach Team in 2004; and

WHEREAS, the above-mentioned meetings have resulted in agreement on certain areas of common concern, including the desire to avoid duplication of mental health services through the expansion of the existing County Mobile Outreach Team; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the Parties agree as follow:

1. MISSION OF THE EXPANDED MOBILE CRISIS OUTREACH TEAM

The Mission of the Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT) is to link non-violent persons in crises with mental health, social service, or medical providers in order to prevent escalation or interaction with law enforcement and other first responders.

2. **TERM OF CONTRACT**

The term of this Agreement shall begin on September 1, 2008 and continue until the end of the Texas Legislature's 2008-2009 biennium on August 31st, 2009, unless Section 7 (Duration) or Section 8 (Termination) is exercised.

3. **ADDITIONAL MOBILE OUTREACH TEAM MEMBER**

Williamson County will hire an additional full-time salaried Masters Level Counselor that has a Licensed Professional of the Healing Arts (LPHA) or a Registered Nurse (RN) with psychiatric experience to serve on the Williamson County Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT). The additional MCOT member shall remain under the control and supervision of the County at all times and shall remain a County employee, entitled to the same benefits and subject to the same restrictions as any other MCOT member.

4. **RESPONSIBILITIES OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY**

The responsibilities of Williamson County are outlined in Attachment A, made a part of this Agreement.

5. **RESPONSIBILITIES OF BLUEBONNET**

The responsibilities of Bluebonnet are outlined in Attachment B, made a part of this Agreement.

6. **ACCOUNTING**

Williamson County will provide supporting documentation for all expenses related to this Agreement to Bluebonnet. Williamson County is responsible for adherence to all financial and reporting obligations for which the entity is responsible.

Bluebonnet will manage the Crisis Services Redesign funds including timely payment for services as indicated by this Agreement. Bluebonnet is responsible for adherence to all financial and service data reports to the State as well as all other financial and reporting obligations for which the entity is responsible.

7. **DURATION**

THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE EFFECTIVE: While State crisis money is available, or until the agreement is terminated by either party.

8. **TERMINATION**

RIGHT TO WITHDRAW: A Party to this Agreement has the right to withdraw from the Agreement by providing written notice which must be received by the other Party no less than ninety (90) days prior to the termination of the Agreement, after satisfying any liabilities of the withdrawing Party as stated herein.

SEPARATE EQUIPMENT: The terminating Party may remove any and all of its own separate equipment, unless the removal of the equipment will render the MCOT inoperable. In such case, the Party may not remove the equipment, but shall be reimbursed the fair market value of said equipment, as determined by an appraiser chosen by the Parties.

9. **MISCELLANEOUS**

SEVERABILITY. The Parties agree that in the event any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be in contradiction of any laws of the State of Texas, the Parties will immediately rectify the offending portions of this Agreement. The remainder of the Agreement shall be in full force and effect.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties hereto, and supersedes all their oral and written negotiations, agreements and understandings of every kind. The Parties understand, agree, and declare that no promise, warranty, statement, or representation of any kind whatsoever, which is not expressly stated in this Agreement, has been made by any Party hereto or its officer, employees, or other agents to induce execution of this Agreement.

CONFIDENTIALITY OF INFORMATION. Williamson County and Bluebonnet will maintain the confidentiality of information received pursuant to the performance of this Agreement, including medical records, and information, which discloses information about the identity of any person served, in accordance with applicable federal and state law.

BUSINESS ASSOCIATE PROVISIONS. If Williamson County receives any individually identifiable health information ("Protected Health Information" or "PHI"), from Center or Bluebonnet agents, authorized personnel, employees, representatives and/or staff members of Bluebonnet, or creates or receives any PHI on behalf of Bluebonnet, Contractor shall maintain the security and confidentiality of such PHI as required of Bluebonnet by applicable laws and regulations, including the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and the regulations promulgated thereunder. Without limiting the foregoing:

- **Use of PHI.** Williamson County shall not use PHI otherwise than as expressly permitted by this agreement, or as required by law. However, Williamson County may use PHI for purposes of managing its internal business processes relating to its functions under this agreement.

- **Disclosure of PHI.** Williamson County shall not disclose PHI to any other person (other than members of Williamson County's MCOT workforce), except as approved by Bluebonnet in writing. Any such disclosure shall be made only upon written agreement of the between Williamson County and Bluebonnet, stating that Williamson County is bound by

the provisions of this section. Williamson County shall not disclose PHI to any member of its workforce unless Williamson County has advised such person of Williamson County's obligations under this section, and of the consequences for such person and for Williamson County violating them. Williamson County shall take appropriate disciplinary action against any member of its workforce who uses or discloses PHI in contravention of its agreement.

- Safeguards. Williamson County shall use appropriate safeguards to prevent use or disclosure of PHI otherwise than permitted by this agreement. Williamson County shall provide Bluebonnet with such information concerning such safeguards as Bluebonnet may from time to time request, and shall, upon reasonable request, give Bluebonnet access for inspection and copying to Williamson County's facilities used for the maintenance or processing of PHI, and to its books, records, practices, policies and procedures concerning the use and disclosure of PHI, for the purpose of determining Williamson County's compliance with this agreement.

- Accounting/Reporting of Disclosures. Williamson County shall maintain a record of all disclosures of PHI made otherwise than the purposes of this agreement, including the date of the disclosure, the name and, if known, the address of the recipient of the PHI, a brief description of the PHI disclosed, and the purpose of the disclosure. Williamson County shall make such record available to Bluebonnet on request. Williamson County shall report to Bluebonnet any unauthorized use or disclosure of PHI by Williamson County or its workforce, and the remedial action taken or purposed to be taken with respect to such use or disclosure.

- Disclosure to U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. If Bluebonnet is required by law to obtain the following undertaking from Williamson County, Williamson County shall make its internal practices, books, and records relating to the use and disclosure of health information received from Bluebonnet (or created or received by Williamson County on behalf of Bluebonnet) available to the Subscriber and to the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, for the purposes of determining the Covered Entity's compliance with HIPAA.

- Amendment. Upon the enactment of any law or regulation affecting the use or disclosure of PHI, or the publication of any decision of a court of the United States or of this state relating to any such law, or the publication of any interpretive policy or opinion of any governmental agency charged with the enforcement of any such law or regulation, Bluebonnet may, by written notice to Williamson County, amend this agreement in such manner as Bluebonnet determines necessary to comply with such law or regulation. If Williamson County disagrees with any such amendment, it shall so notify Bluebonnet in writing within thirty (30) days of Bluebonnet notice. If the parties are unable to agree on an amendment within thirty (30) days thereafter, either of them may terminate this agreement on written notice to the other.

- Breach. If Williamson County breaches its obligations under this section, Bluebonnet may, at its option, exercise any of its rights of access and inspection under the above paragraph in this section regarding "Safeguards"; require Williamson County to submit to a plan of monitoring and reporting, as Bluebonnet may determine necessary to maintain compliance with this agreement, and such a plan shall become part of this agreement;

terminate this agreement, with or without an opportunity to cure the breach. When appropriate, notification to the applicable licensure board will be made by Bluebonnet.

- Procedure upon Termination. Upon termination of this agreement Williamson County shall return or destroy all PHI that it maintains in any form, and shall retain no copies of such information or, if the parties agree that return or destruction is not feasible, it shall continue to extend the protections of this agreement to such information, and limit further use of the information to those purposes that make the return or destruction of the information infeasible.

AUTHORIZATION OF SERVICES. Authorization for crisis follow up services subsequent to the crisis screening is required before Williamson County may submit a claim for payment. Consideration of authorization will be driven by the assessment scores and Crisis Plan documented on the Screening Assessment and Recommendation for Treatment form completed by the MCOT members. All authorizations for the provision of crisis follow up services will be made by Bluebonnet or its designee. Williamson County will request payment under this Agreement for only the type and amount or duration of services authorized in that manner.

REPORTING OF UNUSUAL INCIDENTS. Williamson County will report any emergencies, injuries or unusual incidents involving a Covered Individual to the Director of Mental Health or Mental Retardation Services during business hours or to the Administrative OD.

INSPECTIONS. Pursuant to Texas Health and Safety Code Section 534.061, Williamson County authorizes Bluebonnet and HHSC or their designees, including independent financial auditors, to have, within reasonable notice, unrestricted access to all Covered Client records, data and services associated with this Agreement, and to copy such records, data and information at no cost to the Bluebonnet, HHSC or their designees as necessary to enable Bluebonnet to audit, monitor, and review all financial and programmatic activities and services associated with this Agreement.

CERTIFICATION, LICENSURE, ACCREDITATION AND PRIVILEGES. Williamson County represents and warrants that certifications, licenses, accreditations and privileges for Williamson County employees are in good standing with the appropriate professional agency or agencies, are without restrictions and will maintain them during the term of this Agreement. Evidence of such certifications, accreditations, licensure and privileges will be submitted to Bluebonnet through the Bluebonnet credentialing process.

INSURANCE. Each Party will be responsible for insuring or self-insuring its own officers and employees.

SUBCONTRACTING. Williamson County will notify Bluebonnet of intent to subcontract services. Bluebonnet retains the right to screen and approve or disapprove Williamson County's choice of subcontractor.

REPRESENTATIONS. Williamson County represents that:

- Williamson County is not held in abeyance or barred from the award of a federal or state contract;
- Williamson County employee licenses have not been restricted, revoked or suspended and, to the Williamson County's knowledge, are not the subject of any investigation or proceeding;
- The execution and performance of this Agreement by Williamson County will not conflict with or create a default under any agreement, contract, instrument, order or judgment to which Williamson County is a party or is otherwise subject to; and
- Williamson County and its employees and volunteers are duly qualified and competent to perform services to be provided under this Agreement.

SOLICITATIONS. Williamson County is prohibited from:

- offering any gift with a value in excess of ten (10) dollars to potential consumers; and
- soliciting potential consumers through direct-mail or by telephone.

REPORTS OF ABUSE AND NEGLECT. Williamson County will report any allegations of abuse or neglect or exploitation of an individual to **(800) 647-7418** in accordance with applicable law, including rules of HHSC, the Department of Family and Protective Services, and the Department of State Health Services.

AIDS/HIV WORKPLACE GUIDELINES. Williamson County will adopt and implement AIDS/HIV workplace guidelines similar to those adopted by HHSC and AIDS/HIV confidentiality guidelines consistent with state and federal law.

CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION. Williamson County shall provide evidence of criminal history record information on the Williamson County's applicants, employees, volunteers and subcontractors, and all persons who would be placed in direct contact with consumers, pursuant to the Texas Health and Safety Code, Section 533.007 and Chapter 250; the Texas Government Code, Section 411.115; and 25 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 414, Subchapter K. If an applicant, employee, volunteer or subcontractor of the Williamson County has a criminal history relevant to his or her employment as described in 25 TAC, Chapter 414, Subchapter K, then the Williamson County will take appropriate action with respect to the applicant, employee, volunteer, or subcontractor including terminating or removing the employee, volunteer, or subcontractor from direct contract with consumers served by the Williamson County. For the purpose of this Agreement, a crime relevant to a person's employment and/or duties shall be defined as any sexual offense, drug-related offense, homicide, theft, assault, battery, or any other crime involving personal injury or threat to another person.

CHOICE OF LAW. This Agreement shall be performable in Williamson County, Texas.

AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be amended if agreed upon by the Parties, and approved by the governing body of each Party. The Parties agree to review this Agreement at least annually and before each annual budget period.

ASSIGNMENT. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the rights and duties of the Parties may not be assigned or delegated without the written consent of all Parties to this Agreement. Any attempt to assign or delegate such rights or duties shall be consistent with the terms of any contracts, resolutions, indemnities, and other obligations of this Agreement. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the successors and assigns of the Parties. All other existing arrangements between Williamson County and Bluebonnet will be honored under this Agreement.

NO PERSONAL BENEFIT. No Party intends to benefit any person who is not named as a Party to this Agreement, to assume any special duty to supervise the operations of another Party, to provide for the safety of any specific person or to assume any other duty other than that imposed by general law.

NOTICE. Any notice given hereunder shall be in writing, and may be affected by personal delivery, or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, at the address of the respective Parties indicated below:

Address for notice may be changed at anytime by delivering written notice of change to the other Party in accordance with the notice requirements of this section.

PARAGRAPH HEADINGS. The various paragraph headings are inserted for convenience of reference only, and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement or any section thereof.

ATTORNEY FEES. In any lawsuit concerning this Agreement, the prevailing Party, shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees from the nonprevailing Party, plus all out-of-pocket expenses such as deposition costs, telephone calls, travel expenses, expert witness fees, court costs, and other reasonable expenses.

GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY. The Parties do not waive, modify, or alter to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity. Each Party shall be responsible for its own employees and the acts of its own employees.

COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS. The Parties hereby agree to comply with all applicable ordinances, laws, rules, regulations and lawful orders of any public authority with jurisdiction.

RESOLUTION

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A RESOLUTION ADOPTING GUIDELINES AND CRITERIA GOVERNING REINVESTMENT ZONES AND TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENTS WITHIN WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS.

WHEREAS, the County of Williamson must compete with other counties across the State and across the Nation currently offering tax abatements and other incentives to attract new industry or to keep existing industry; and

WHEREAS, new jobs and industries will benefit the local economy, strengthen the real estate market, and generate future tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 312.002 and 312.401 of the Texas Property Tax code, V.A.T.S., the County may not designate an area as a reinvestment zone and may not enter into an abatement agreement unless the Commissioner's Court has established guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement agreements, Now Therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS

That the following guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement agreements within Williamson County are hereby adopted.

SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION FO ABATEMENT

- A. Economic Qualifications: In order for the owner of property within a reinvestment zone to be eligible to receive a tax abatement, the owner must show that the planned project will:
1. be a major investment on the zone that will substantially increase the appraised value of property within the zone; and
 2. contribute to the retention or expansion of primary and secondary employment within the County.
 3. provide for affordable health insurance for individuals employed by project.
- B. Creation of New Value: An abatement may be granted for lonely the increased taxable value of the eligible property, property improvements, or business personal property made subsequent to and listed in an abatement agreement between the County and the property owner and lessee (if required), subject to such limitations as the County may require.

- C. Agricultural Exemptions Denied: No tax abatement shall be granted for any property unless and until full market value taxes have been paid for the five years prior to the execution of a tax abatement agreement.
- D. Industrial Districts: No tax abatement shall be granted for any property included in an Industrial District.

E. Tax Increment Financing Districts: No tax abatement shall be granted for any property included in a Tax Increment Financing District.

F. Eligible Property: Tax abatement agreements may exempt from taxation all or part of the increase in the value of the property over its value in the year in which the agreement is executed.

G. Owned/Leased Facilities: If a leased facility is granted abatement, the tax abatement agreement shall be signed by both the lessor and the lessee.

H. Value and Term of Abatement: Abatement shall be granted effective on a mutually agreed upon date. The percentage of the increase abated shall be determined in each tax abatement agreement; however, no tax abatement agreement shall exceed ten (10) years.

SECTION II PUBLIC HEARING AND APPROVAL

- A. Prior to entering into any tax abatement agreement, the County may, at its sole option, hold a public hearing at which interested persons shall be entitled to speak for or against the approval of the tax abatement agreement.
- B. Before approving any tax abatement agreement, the County must find that the terms of the proposed agreement meet these guidelines and criteria and that:
1. there will be no substantial adverse affect on the provision of county services or in its tax base; and
 2. the planned use of the property will not constitute a hazard to public safety, health, or welfare.

SECTION III AGREEMENT

In addition to the specific requirements of Sections 312.205 and 312.402 of the Property Tax Code, the tax abatement agreement shall include but not be limited to the following:

1. the amount of increase to be abated and the current taxable value of the property;
2. a percent of increase to be abated each year, designated by specific year;
3. a commencement and expiration date of abatement;
4. a proposed use of improvement, nature of construction, time schedule, map, and property description; and
5. the number of jobs involved per year for the life of the tax abatement

SECTION IV ASSIGNMENT

Tax abatement agreements may be assigned to a new owner or lessee of the improvements with the written approval of the County, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any assignment shall provide that the assignee shall irrevocably and unconditionally assume all duties and obligations of the assignor as set out in the agreement. No assignment shall be approved if the assignor or assignee is indebted to the County for ad valorem taxes or other obligations.

SECTION V AMENDMENTS TO GUIDELINES

This Resolution can be amended and added to upon action of the Commissioner's Court, and is effective upon the date of its adoption and will remain in force ~~until amended by the Commissioner's Court.~~

These guidelines and criteria are mutually exclusive of existing Industrial District agreements.

Chief Elliott,

The Commissary Services went out to bid for the 2009-2010 fiscal year. This year we received only three proposals and they were from Aramark, Five Star Correctional Services and Keefe Commissary Network.

First of all, the commission offered breaks down as follows, depending on options/requirements:

Aramark: 40.3% on adjusted gross sales; 42.6% on adjusted gross sales and implementation of iCare and TouchPay solutions (Kiosk); 42.6% on adjusted gross sales and implementation of iCare, Go-Cart and TouchPay.

Five Star Correctional Services: 34% on adjusted gross sales including the lobby Kiosk.

Keefe Commissary Network: 40.5% on adjusted gross sales; 41% on adjusted gross sales with the Kiosk; 41.5% on adjusted gross sales with inmate population of 1,000 inmates.

At the basic commission level, Keefe Commissary Network offers a higher percentage rate than the other two vendors. Aramark offers the ability to earn commission rates at a higher level, but those levels are contingent on the implementation of several programs we do not wish to participate in. Some of these programs force a limitation of facility control and create inmate account security issues.

In conducting a random sampling of items offered for purchase by the inmate, Keefe had lowest pricing, Aramark was second and Five Star was highest. The lower pricing with Keefe would allow the inmate the ability to purchase items at a lower cost, thereby giving the inmate the opportunity to purchase additional items.

Keefe has steadily maintained open communication with our staff and administration. Keefe has been able to provide all reporting documentation necessary and provides technical support 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Because Keefe writes their own software using Crystal Reports, they can and have been able to meet any reporting requirements we have needed. Their in-house employee is courteous and does a great job dealing with our staff and inmates.

Keefe has an excellent customer service record. They can provide the Kiosk we preferred at no additional charge to the County, will provide on-site training and has technological capabilities available to this facility we can possibly implement in the future at no additional cost as well. It is our recommendation that Keefe Commissary Network be awarded the Commissary Proposal for the 2009-2010 fiscal year.
