

Brushy Creek Regional Wastewater System Brushy Creek Road Closure December 6 and 7, 2009

The Lower Colorado River Authority owns the Brushy Creek Regional Wastewater System, which is located in portions of the Edwards Aquifer. As part of the requirements for being in the recharge zone of the Edwards Aquifer, a wastewater utility must inspect any pipelines located within that recharge zone. To date, a majority of the Brushy Creek Regional interceptor system has been inspected, except for the manholes along Brushy Creek Road. To inspect this section of pipeline, Brushy Creek Road must be closed to all traffic for a short period of time, while the inspections are taking place.

LCRA has worked with the staffs from Williamson County, the City of Cedar Park, and the Williamson County Sherriff's Department to develop a plan for closing Brushy Creek Road, and diverting the traffic as necessary to protect the staff performing the work. Below is a timeline for this project.

Tuesday, December 1, 2009 – Williamson County Commissioners vote to approve the proposed road closure for the following periods of time:

- Sunday, December 6, 2009 from 1 am to 5 am
- Monday, December 7, 2009 from 1 am to 5 am

Wednesday, December 2, 2009 – LCRA and the Brazos River Authority will erect signs to notify all traffic of the upcoming road closures. The flashing signs will be positioned at the following intersections and will remain in place until both road closures are completed.

- Brushy Creek Road and Sam Bass Road
- Brushy Creek Road and Great Oaks Drive
- Brushy Creek Road and Parmer Lane

Wednesday, December 2, 2009 and Saturday, December 5, 2009 – A notice will be posted in the Williamson County Sun, regarding the road closures.

Between December 2nd and December 6th – LCRA staff will make contact with landowners that have a driveway along Brushy Creek Road. Staff will also make contact with Fern Bluff MUD and Brushy Creek MUD of the upcoming road closure.

Sunday, December 6, 2009 – The first road closure will be from Parmer Lane to Great Oaks Drive. From the west, at Parmer Lane, signs will be posted regarding the road closure, and that the road will be closed to all thru traffic. At Walsh Trail Drive, the road will be barricaded to all traffic. From the east, Brushy Creek Road will be barricaded to all traffic at Great Oaks Drive. Motorists will be able to drive north/south on Great Oaks, or turn east onto Brushy Creek Road. Monday, December 7, 2009 – The second road closure will be from Sam Bass Road to Great Oaks Drive. From the east, at Sam Bass Road, signs will be posted regarding the road closure. Just before the bridge on Brushy Creek Raod, the road will be barricaded to all traffic. From the west, Brushy Creek Road will be barricaded to all traffic at Great Oaks Drive. Motorists will be able to drive north/south on Great Oaks, or turn west onto Brushy Creek Road. See attached map – Exhibit B.
