LSCC proposes that: Williamson County continue to pay for primary care visits at the Medicaid encour allowed for FQHC clinics. In return, LSCC would offer the added value of providing required prescripti medications, up to the allowed maximum of 3 per month per patient, through the newly expanded LSC pharmacies. FQHC clinics may purchase medications at advantageous 340B pricing, passing along the benefit to Williamson County. Patients may purchase medications beyond the 3 covered by WilCo Care advantageous.

Conclusion: These projections demonstrate that an average of 40% savings on prescription drugs ma expected from LSCC patients filling meds at LSCC pharmacies.
