To the Williamson County Commissioners Court;

I am submitting a request to transfer \$1000 from line item 4100(Professional Services) and \$1000 from 3110 (Other supplies) to line item 4510 (Facility Repair and Maintenance). The \$2000 transfer will pay for 220 wiring for the Taylor Fire Station 1 to allow the housing of the trailer stored outside their Fire Station today.

Last year (March 25) we had significant Hail damage done to the Haz Mat trailer and truck that was stored over at Jollyville Station 1 (off Anderson Mill Road).

After this storm Commissioner Birkman had discussed the possibility of phasing in carports or awnings for our trailers. At that time the Chief of Taylor Fire (Bruce Watson) started looking for awning proposals which were coming in at \$30,000 or more. Chief Watson has since resigned from Taylor Fire and Chief Pat Ekiss has taken the job. Upon Chief Ekiss arrival one of the first comments he made was that we have to get that trailer out of the sun and into some type of protection.

Chief Ekiss and I met to discuss alternatives in which I explained that Chief Watson and I had been looking at awnings but with this economy it was going to be difficult to raise \$30,000 for the awning. He informed me that he believed he could move some of his equipment around and if I was OK with disconnecting the truck from the trailer they could move the truck and trailer inside their station (just not hooked together). In order to accomplish this we must run 220 electrical so that the trailer may stay plugged in with the AC units running. Chief Ekiss has obtained quotes that range from \$1500 to \$1900 for this work to be done. If you approve this transfer then I will work with Chief Ekiss to have the electrical work completed.

Dear Judge Gattis:

1. This letter agreement authorizes Williamson County to use the Emergency Notification System provided by the Capital Area Council of Governments ("CAPCOG"), under the terms and conditions set out below, for the period beginning October 1, 2010 and ending, unless sooner terminated under paragraph 9 or 11, September 30, 2011.

Use of Emergency Notification System

2. Williamson County agrees to use the Emergency Notification System solely in accordance with the current version of the CAPCOG Emergency Notification System (ENS) Policies and Procedures. The current version is part of this agreement and is available on CAPCOG's website, www.capcog.org/divisions/homeland-security/ens/docs/.

Cost and Payment Terms

3. Upon execution of this letter agreement, CAPCOG will invoice Williamson County \$2141.00 to cover all or some part of the operating expenses associated with use of the Emergency Notification System for the agreement period. Williamson County agrees to pay the invoice in full within 90 calendar days of its receipt, but solely from current revenues available to Williamson County. Access to the Emergency Notification System will be granted when: (1) CAPCOG receives payment in full of the invoice; and (2) Williamson County has provided CAPCOG with a list of its Authorizing Individuals and Certified Users as required by the CAPCOG Emergency Notification System (ENS) Policies and Procedures.

Public Information Act Request

4. If Williamson County receives a request under the Texas Public Information Act for disclosure of any of the 9-1-1 database information, Williamson County agrees not to disclose the information prior to notification of CAPCOG's Emergency Communications Department in writing within two business days of the receipt of the request so that CAPCOG may advise Williamson County regarding the request.

Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity

- 5. Paragraph 6 summarizes the nondiscrimination and equal opportunity requirements applicable to performance of this agreement that are set out in detail in title 6, parts 15, 17, and 21, Code of Federal Regulations. Williamson County and CAPCOG agree to comply with the detailed requirements.
- 6. Williamson County and CAPCOG shall not exclude anyone from participating under this agreement, deny anyone benefits under this agreement, or otherwise unlawfully discriminate against anyone in carrying out this agreement because of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, handicap, veteran status, or national origin.

Applicable Law

- 7. In carrying out this agreement, Williamson County agrees to comply with all applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Texas Uniform Grant and Contract Management Act, chapter 783 of the Government Code, and the *Uniform Grant Management Standards* implementing the Act.
- 8. Williamson County agrees to comply with its own written rules defining, regulating, and prohibiting conflict of interest in carrying out this agreement.

Early Termination of Agreement

9. Williamson County acknowledges that CAPCOG's sole source of revenue for operating and maintaining the Emergency Notification System are grant funds it receives from the State Administrative Agency, Texas Department of Public Safety, and contractual funds provided by participating organizations. Accordingly, Williamson County agrees that CAPCOG may terminate this agreement if it learns that funds to operate and maintain the Emergency Notification System are no longer available.

- 10. CAPCOG terminates this agreement for unavailability of funds by giving Williamson County notice of the termination, as soon as it learns of the funding unavailability, and specifying the termination date. The agreement terminates on the specified termination date.
- 11. If Williamson County or CAPCOG breaches a material provision of this agreement, the other may notify the breaching party describing the breach and demanding corrective action. The breaching party has five business days from its receipt of the notice to correct the breach, or to begin and continue with reasonable diligence and in good faith to correct the breach. If the breach cannot be corrected within a reasonable time, despite the breaching party's reasonable diligence and good faith effort to do so, the parties may agree to terminate the agreement.
- 12. If Williamson County violates a provision of the CAPCOG's Emergency Notification System (ENS) Policies and Procedures, CAPCOG in its sole discretion, after notifying Williamson County of the alleged violation in accordance with paragraph 11, may terminate Williamson County's user account while Williamson County is attempting to correct the violation. If Williamson County corrects the violation under paragraph 11, and the Emergency Notification System was not damaged by the violation, CAPCOG agrees to restore Williamson County's user account.
- 13. Termination for breach does not waive either party's claim for damages resulting from the breach.

Notice to Parties

- 14. Notice to be effective under this agreement must be in writing and received by the party against whom it is to operate. Notice is received by a party: (I) when it is delivered to the party personally; (2) on the date shown on the return receipt if mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the party's address specified in paragraph 15 and signed on behalf of the party; or (3) three business days after its deposit in the United States mail, with first-class postage affixed, addressed to the party's address specified in paragraph 15.
- 15. CAPCOG's address is 6800 Burleson Road, Building 310, Suite 165, Austin, TX 78744, Attention: Executive Director. Williamson County's address is 710 South Main, Suite 101, Georgetown, Texas 78626, Attention: The Honorable Dan Gattis, Sr..
- 16. A party may change its address by providing notice of the change in accordance with paragraph 14.

Miscellaneous

- 17. Each individual signing this agreement on behalf of a party warrants that he or she is legally authorized to do so and that the party is legally authorized to perform the obligations under this agreement.
- 18. This agreement states the entire agreement of the parties, and an amendment to it is not effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.

Notice is received by a party: (I) when it is delivered to the party personally; (2) on the date shown on the return receipt if mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the party's address specified in paragraph 15 and signed on behalf of the party; or (3) three business days after its deposit in the United States mail, with first-class postage affixed, addressed to the party's address specified in paragraph 15.
- 15. CAPCOG's address is 6800 Burleson Road, Building 310, Suite 165, Austin, TX 78744, Attention: Executive Director. Williamson County's address is 710 South Main, Suite 101, Georgetown, Texas 78626, Attention: The Honorable Dan Gattis, Sr..
- 16. A party may change its address by providing notice of the change in accordance with paragraph 14.

Miscellaneous

- 17. Each individual signing this agreement on behalf of a party warrants that he or she is legally authorized to do so and that the party is legally authorized to perform the obligations under this agreement.
- 18. This agreement states the entire agreement of the parties, and an amendment to it is not effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.

Capital Area Council of Governments EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM (ENS) Policies & Procedures

Version 2.3 - Effective: May 12, 2010

Sec. 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. The CAPCOG Emergency Notification System (ENS) was implemented using Homeland Security Grant Program funds for use in the 10-county area covered by the Capital Area Council of Governments (Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson counties).
- 1.2. The ENS consists of two web-based applications, Communicator NXT® and GeoCast Web®. Communicator NXT® makes notifications from a contact list maintained by participating jurisdictions. GeoCast Web® makes notifications from a map-based interface that retrieves telephone numbers from the telephone number database that is used by the region's 9-1-1 services. In addition, GeoCast Web® has the capability of notifying individuals via cellular telephones that they have registered on the system. Due to differences in the sources of the data used as the basis for making the notifications, the usage of Communicator NXT® and GeoCast Web® are governed by different policies.
- 1.3. The system has access to 69 outgoing telephone lines that may be used simultaneously. This system can effectively notify up to four thousand persons in a one-hour period. (This number depends upon the length of the message and other variables. It should be used only as an estimate when deciding if ENS use is appropriate for the situation.) Users also have access to an additional 400+ telephone lines that may be used when a larger number of persons must be notified in a short period of time. Additional costs may be incurred for use of this capability.

Sec. 2. PURPOSE

- To outline tasks necessary for efficient and effective operations, and to assign responsibility for completion of such tasks.
- 2.2. To provide rules for uniform use of the ENS.
- To provide information for continued quality assurance within the CAPCOG region.
- 2.4. To ensure adequate accounting of ENS activity.

Sec. 3. DEFINITIONS

- 3.1. "Communicator NXT®" is a database-driven application developed by Dialogic Communications Corporation, now Plant CML, and operated under a license granted by the company. This system delivers messages via telephone, e-mail and pager to individuals that are entered into its database by personnel from jurisdictions participating in the CAPCOG ENS.
- 3.2. "GeoCast Web®" is a geographic information system (GIS)-based application developed by Dialogic Communications Corporation, now Plant CML, and operated under a license granted by the company. This system delivers messages via telephone to individuals with telephone numbers listed in the database that has been compiled for use by the region's 9-1-1 services and to cellular telephones that have been self-registered via CAPCOG's proprietary application.
- 3.3. "Authorizing Individual" means: (1) a CAPCOG county judge, county sheriff, and/or county emergency management coordinator; city mayor or city manager; police chief or fire chief of a jurisdiction with managing control of a Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP); or (2) the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) Emergency Management Coordinator; or (3) an individual designated in writing by an Authorizing Individual identified in clause (1). The Authorizing Individual has the authority to direct a Certified User to activate the ENS.
- 3.4. "Certified User" means an individual who has been designated by an Authorizing Individual as someone who has permission to activate the ENS and has satisfactorily completed the training curriculum prescribed by CAPCOG for accessing and activating the ENS. Note: an Authorizing Individual may chose to become a Certified User.

Sec. 4. POLICY

- 4.1. Acceptable uses of the CAPCOG ENS
 - 4.1.1. The CAPCOG ENS has been funded by the United States Department of Homeland Security through the Homeland Security Grant Program. Therefore, its use is limited to homeland security-related activities. Federal and state laws extend this usage to all types of emergencies, both man-made and natural.
 - 4.1.2. The GeoCast Web[®] application derives its contact list from the database that has been compiled for use by the region's 9-1-1 services. State law limits the use of this data to, "warning or alerting citizens regarding information in an emergency situation where property or human life is in jeopardy."

- 4.1.2.1.CAPCOG interprets this restriction to include any situation in which persons notified need to act in a timely manner to prevent property damage, bodily injury or loss of human life. This includes, but is not limited to, severe weather warnings, "boil water" notices, shelter-in-place advisories and evacuation recommendations or orders.
- 4.1.2.2. ENS testing and use during emergency preparedness training and exercises are acceptable uses.
- 4.1.2.3. Informational messages intended to advise the public of potential hazards but not requiring action on the part of those notified (e.g., severe weather watches) are not acceptable uses of the system.
- 4.1.3. The Communicator NXT® application derives its contact list from a database developed and maintained by participating jurisdictions. Since it does not use the 9-1-1 database, the restrictions associated with use of that database do not apply.
 - 4.1.3.1. Acceptable uses of this application include, but are not limited to, notifications of staff members of participating jurisdictions of emergency events, changes in work schedules of participating jurisdictions resulting from inclement weather, activation of emergency response teams, information notices about imminent hazards and activation of Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs).
 - 4.1.3.2. ENS testing and use during emergency preparedness training and exercises are acceptable uses.
 - 4.1.3.3. Notifying personnel or the public of meetings, hearings, training activities or similar activities is not an acceptable use.

4.2. Participating jurisdictions:

- 4.2.1. GeoCast Web®—Due to the restrictions on the use of the 9-1-1 database, only jurisdictions with managing control of a Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) are eligible to use this application.
 - 4.2.1.1. PSAP personnel may be trained as Certified Users and may be granted access to the jurisdiction's login credentials in order to activate the system.
 - 4.2.1.2. Employees and officials of additional departments of eligible jurisdictions, including emergency management coordinators, public health personnel and emergency response personnel may be granted login credentials in order to activate the system. The

jurisdiction's ENS Point-of-Contact (POC), chief elected official (mayor or county judge) or emergency management coordinator shall make a written request to CAPCOG for additional login credentials for additional departments.

- 4.2.2. Communicator NXT®—Use of this application is available to:
 - 4.2.2.1. Any jurisdiction eligible to use GeoCast Web®;
 - 4.2.2.2. Other organizations that actively participate in the emergency management and emergency response activities of CAPCOGmember jurisdictions, including, but not limited to, emergency services districts, school districts and hospitals. These organizations must be:
 - 4.2.2.2.1. Endorsed in writing by the chief elected official (mayor or county judge) or emergency management coordinator of the respective jurisdiction; and
 - 4.2.2.2. Participate in the funding of the ongoing costs of maintaining the system.
 - 4.2.2.3. Each participating organization will be issued its own login credentials.
- 4.3. Each jurisdiction with managing control of a Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) shall:
 - 4.3.1. Designate a single point of contact (POC) for CAPCOG for the purpose of administering the ENS, and notify CAPCOG immediately when the designated POC is no longer valid. It is recommended that this person be PSAP personnel and be a Certified User.
 - 4.3.2. Maintain an up-to-date roster of all Authorizing Individuals and send a copy of the updated roster to CAPCOG whenever a change occurs.
 - 4.3.3. Maintain an up-to-date roster of all Certified Users, send a copy of the roster to CAPCOG, and notify CAPCOG immediately when there is a change in Certified Users.
 - 4.3.4. Protect and limit the use of the assigned user name and password which grants access to the ENS programs. In the event a Certified User is no longer authorized to access and activate the ENS, the ENS program password shall be changed by CAPCOG personnel.

4.3.5. Ensure that Certified Users (1) are available or on-call during each shift and (2) complete an annual training refresher course.

4.4. Each Authorizing Individual shall:

- 4.4.1. Ensure that access to and activation of the ENS programs is limited to Certified Users.
- 4.4.2. Protect and limit the use to certified users of the assigned user name and password which grants access to the ENS programs.
- 4.4.3. Protect the confidentiality of addressing databases and of information furnished by 9-1-1 database providers, and notify CAPCOG's Director of Emergency Communications (see Exhibit 7.1) in writing within two business days of the receipt of a request for addressing databases or information made under the Texas Public Information Act so that CAPCOG may advise the authorizing individual regarding the request.

4.5. Each Certified User shall:

- 4.5.1. Protect the confidentiality of 9-1-1 addressing databases and of information furnished by 9-1-1 database providers.
- 4.5.2. Comply with naming conventions set forth by CAPCOG.
- 4.5.3. Sign and date the Nondisclosure Agreement (Exhibit 7.3) and submit it to a CAPCOG staff member named in Exhibit 7.1. This form is available on-line at http://www.capcog.org/Programs/Homeland Security/ens/default.asp.

4.6. CAPCOG shall:

- 4.6.1. Verify the accuracy of Authorizing Individual and Certified User rosters with the ENS POC at least quarterly.
- 4.6.2. Provide updated login credentials to each jurisdiction's POC when these credentials are changed. To preserve security, these credentials will be provided either in person or via telephone. They will not be provided in written form.
- 4.6.3. Conduct routine maintenance and service operations on the system. ENS POCs will be notified prior to these operations which may cause system use to be limited or leave the system temporarily unavailable.
- 4.6.4. Provide training, including course materials, for all Certified Users. This may be accomplished by conducting a Train-the-Trainer course for all or some of the jurisdictions.

- 4.6.5. Provide technical and procedural guidance for ENS use and administration.
- 4.6.6. Provide a contact list for CAPCOG Staff (Exhibit 7.1).

Sec. 5. PROTOCOLS

- 5.1. In order to facilitate the use of the ENS applications by multiple jurisdictions, the following protocols shall be followed:
 - 5.1.1. Contacts shall be assigned a numerical User ID from the range of numbers provided by CAPCOG.
 - 5.1.2. Scenarios shall be assigned a numerical Scenario ID from the range of numbers provided by CAPCOG.
 - 5.1.3. Scenarios, Messages, Groups, and Custom Field information shall be preceded by the name of the jurisdiction.

5.2. Each PSAP shall:

- 5.2.1. Utilize the procedures outlined in the *ENS Guidelines and Activation Form* (Exhibit 7.2) for all ENS activations using the GeoCast Web[®] application. Use of this form is not required but is recommended for test activations.
- 5.2.2. Test at least once a month the Communicator! NXT® application for proper operation and user familiarity. The test should include a minimum of one defined group. CAPCOG administrators will have access to activation reports on all testing and activations.
- 5.2.3. Test at least once a month the GeoCast Web[®] application for proper operation and user familiarity. The test should include a minimum of 10 but not more than 25 data points. In order to ensure adequate performance within the county, varying data points should be utilized each month.
- 5.2.4. CAPCOG administrators will have access to activation reports on all testing and activations.

Sec. 6. FUNDING

- 6.1. As long as Homeland Security Grant Program funds are available for this purpose, CAPCOG will attempt to fund the following costs from those funds:
 - 6.1.1. CAPCOG personnel costs associated with operation and maintenance of the system;

- 6.1.2. Maintenance costs for system hardware and software; and
- 6.1.3. Costs of system enhancements.
- 6.2. Other costs, including monthly recurring costs for telephone service, will be allocated to participating jurisdictions and organizations according to a schedule approved by the CAPCOG Executive Committee and furnished to the jurisdictions.
- 6.3. Additional costs incurred by a participating jurisdiction for use of the "DCC Mass Call" option to contact large numbers of persons will be the responsibility of the jurisdiction authorizing the activation.
- 6.4. Jurisdictions and organizations participating in the system shall execute a letter agreement allocating costs with CAPCOG.
 - 6.4.1. These agreements will cover a one-year period beginning on October 1 of each even-numbered year and will be automatically renewed unless cancelled in writing by the jurisdiction or CAPCOG.
 - 6.4.2. These agreements will allocate the costs to the jurisdictions participating in the system.
- 6.5. CAPCOG will send an invoice describing the costs to each participating jurisdiction in October of each year.

Exhibit 7.2

ENS Activation Guidelines and Checklist for Certified Users

- 1. The Emergency Notification System (ENS) is designed to notify relatively small numbers of citizens (hundreds to low thousands) in the case of an emergency which directly affects that population. Examples of such would be flooding, a sniper event, an Alzheimer's patient lost in the area, hazardous materials incident, and similar life threatening events.
- 2. For emergencies which affect larger segments of the population (the entire city, the county, or more than 3,500 households or so) TV and radio are more effective and would be more expedient. The ENS would take far too long to notify that many people and was not designed to do so.
- 3. If a jurisdiction desires to notify a larger number of persons, it may use the "DCC Mass Call" option on the "Available Hosts" screen of the GeoCast Web® application. This allows 400+ calls to be made simultaneously. NOTE: Additional charges for telephone calls using this system may be incurred. Such charges are the responsibility of the jurisdiction authorizing the notification. Approval of these charges must be approved according to local policies.
- 4. The nature of this system and the sensitivity of the database that it uses dictate that only authorizing individuals, as defined in Sec. 3.3 of these procedures, are authorized to initiate use of the system. These officials may be the County Judge, City Mayor, City Manager, Police Chief, Emergency Management Coordinator, and other designated city or county officials.
- 5. The PSAP maintains a list of Authorizing Individuals in the Certified User's jurisdiction that are authorized to initiate an ENS activation. These are the only people in your area who can do so! If the caller is not listed, let them know you cannot perform this operation because they are not authorized to initiate it. Contact the PSAP supervisor or follow pre-determined PSAP protocol to determine how to proceed. You may only initiate the activation process if you are ultimately contacted directly by someone who is on the list of Authorizing Individuals.
- 6. Calls received that are requesting activation of the ENS must be taken by or transferred to an ENS Certified User. The Certified User will use the ENS Activation Form that follows to guide them through the activation process.
- 7. In order to protect and properly notify the citizens in harm's way, an accurate message must be recorded by the Certified User. Keep in mind that the message sent to the citizens might be the only information they receive about the emergency and they will act accordingly. The Certified User will not modify the message at all because even small edits can change meaning and have a potential big impact. It is important for the emergency message to be clear and concise. Thirty seconds is the recommended target length for emergency messages.
- 8. In order to notify the citizens in harm's way immediately, accurate location information must be recorded. Get as much detail as possible. This could be in the form of a map book page grid, a major intersection, a landmark, or preferably a faxed copy of a map with drawn-in detail. Keep in mind, even if an intersection is given, you must also explain approximately how far beyond that intersection (what radius) is to be notified.
- 9. The Certified User will verify success of the activation by using the ENS tool to generate a "post-activation" summary report. They may also request a comprehensive summary report from a

CAPCOG Homeland Security Division staff member listed in Exhibit 7.1 during normal business hours.

10. If the regional installation of GeoCast Web[®] is inoperable, system users can access to the on-line Backup Hosting Center at the URL provided to each certified user. This URL can be found at: http://www.capcog.org/Programs/Homeland_Security/ens/default.asp. Access to the backup installation of the Communicator NXT® application is only available through CAPCOG personnel.

REAL ESTATE CONTRACT SH 195 Right of Way

State of Texas County of Williamson

THIS REAL ESTATE CONTRACT ("Contract") is made by and between P.L. LLOYD a/k/a PHILLIP LYNN LLOYD, (referred to in this Contract as "Seller", whether one or more) and the COUNTY OF WILLIAMSON (referred to in this Contract as "Purchaser"), upon the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract.

ARTICLE I PURCHASE AND SALE

By this Contract, Seller sells and agrees to convey, and Purchaser purchases and agrees to pay for, the tract(s) of land described as follows:

All of that certain 4.130 acre tract of land, more or less, situated in the W. Roberts Survey, Abstract No. 524 in Williamson County, Texas, being more fully described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein (Parcel 120); and

Waterline easement and electric easement interests in and across all of that certain 0.237 acre tract of land, more or less, situated in the W. Roberts Survey, Abstract No. 524 in Williamson County, Texas, being more fully described by metes and bounds and shown on the sketch in Exhibit "B", attached hereto and incorporated herein (Parcel 120E); and

Temporary construction easement interest for installation of waterline facilities in and across all of that certain 0.237 acre tract of land, more or less, situated in the W. Roberts Survey, Abstract No. 524 in Williamson County, Texas, being more fully described as shown on the sketch which accompanies the field notes in Exhibit "B", attached hereto and incorporated herein.

together with all and singular the rights and appurtenances pertaining to the property, including any right, title and interest of Seller in and to adjacent streets, alleys or rights-of-way (all of such real property, rights, and appurtenances being referred to in this Contract as the "Property"), and any improvements and fixtures situated on and attached to the Property described in Exhibits "A", for the consideration and upon and subject to the terms, provisions, and conditions set forth below.

ARTICLE II PURCHASE PRICE

Purchase Price

- 2.01. The purchase price for the Property described in Exhibit "A" and for the acquisition of any improvements on the Property or for the relocation of any fencing to the new boundary of the Property or for any damages to the remaining property of Seller shall be the sum of SIX HUNDRED THIRTY FOUR THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY and 00/100 Dollars (\$634,250.00).
- 2.01.1 The purchase price for the easement interests in the Property described in Exhibit "B" shall be the sum of THIRTY FOUR THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FOURTEEN and 00/100 Dollars (\$34,314.00).

Special Provisions

2.02. As an obligation which shall survive the closing of this transaction, Seller agrees that within 60 days after the closing of this transaction it shall complete the construction of any fencing along the new right of way line which is necessary to contain any livestock or other animals within the remaining property of Seller and prevent them from entering the purchased Property. Seller further agrees to restore any existing access gates or other entry points currently used by any utility company having an easement interest in the property of Seller.

Payment of Purchase Price

2.02. The Purchase Price shall be payable in cash at the closing.

ARTICLE III PURCHASER'S OBLIGATIONS

Conditions to Purchaser's Obligations

3.01. The obligations of Purchaser hereunder to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby are subject to the satisfaction of each of the following conditions (any of which may be waived in whole or in part by Purchaser at or prior to the closing.)

Miscellaneous Conditions

3.02. Seller shall have performed, observed, and complied with all of the covenants, agreements, and conditions required by this Contract to be performed, observed, and complied with by Seller prior to or as of the closing.

ARTICLE IV REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES OF SELLER

Seller hereby represents and warrants to Purchaser as follows, which representations and warranties shall be deemed made by Seller to Purchaser also as of the closing date, to the best of Seller's knowledge:

- (1) There are no parties in possession of any portion of the Property as lessees, tenants at sufferance, or trespassers, other than previously disclosed to Purchaser;
- (2) Seller has complied with all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, statutes, rules and restrictions relating to the Property, or any part thereof;

The Property herein is being conveyed to Purchaser under threat of condemnation.

ARTICLE V CLOSING

Closing Date

5.01. The closing shall be held at the office of Texas American Title Company on or before August 15, 2010, or at such time, date, and place as Seller and Purchaser may agree upon, or within 10 days after the completion of any title curative matters if necessary for items as shown on the Title Commitment or in the contract (which date is herein referred to as the "closing date").

Seller's Obligations at Closing

5.02. At the closing Seller shall:

- (1) Deliver to the State of Texas a duly executed and acknowledged Special Warranty Deed conveying good and indefeasible title in fee simple to all of the Property described in Exhibit "A", deliver to Chisholm Trail Special Utility District a duly executed and acknowledged Waterline Easement conveying such interest in and to the property described in Exhibit "B", and deliver to Pedernales Electric Cooperative a duly executed and acknowledged Electric Easement conveying such interest in and to the property described in Exhibit "B", all free and clear of any and all liens and restrictions, except for the following:
 - (a) General real estate taxes for the year of closing and subsequent years not yet due and payable;
 - (b) Any exceptions approved by Purchaser pursuant to Article III hereof; and

(c) Any exceptions approved by Purchaser in writing.

The deed shall be in the form as shown in Exhibit "C" attached hereto. The waterline easement shall be in the form as shown in Exhibit "D" attached hereto. The electric easement shall be in the form as shown in Exhibit "E" attached hereto.

- (2) Deliver to Purchaser a Texas Owner's Title Policy at Purchaser's sole expense, issued by Title Company, in Grantee's favor in the full amount of the purchase price, insuring Grantee's fee simple title and/or easement interests to the Property subject only to those title exceptions listed herein, such other exceptions as may be approved in writing by Purchaser, and the standard printed exceptions contained in the usual form of Texas Owner's Title Policy, provided, however:
 - (a) The boundary and survey exceptions shall be deleted;
 - (b) The exception as to restrictive covenants shall be endorsed "None of Record", if applicable; and
 - (c) The exception as to the lien for taxes shall be limited to the year of closing and shall be endorsed "Not Yet Due and Payable."
 - (3) Deliver to Purchaser possession of the Property if not previously done.

Purchaser's Obligations at Closing

- 5.03. At the Closing, Purchaser shall:
 - (a) Pay the cash portion of the purchase price.

Prorations

5.04. General real estate taxes for the then current year relating to the Property shall be prorated as of the closing date and shall be adjusted in cash at the closing. If the closing shall occur before the tax rate is fixed for the then current year, the apportionment of taxes shall be upon the basis of the tax rate for the next preceding year applied to the latest assessed valuation. Agricultural roll-back taxes, if any, shall be paid by Purchaser.

Closing Costs

- 5.05. All costs and expenses of closing in consummating the sale and purchase of the Property shall be borne and paid as follows:
 - (1) Owner's Title Policy and survey to be paid by Purchaser.

- (2) Deed, tax certificates, and title curative matters, if any, paid by Purchaser.
- (3) All other closing costs shall be paid by Purchaser.
- (4) Attorney's fees paid by each respectively.

ARTICLE VI BREACH BY SELLER

In the event Seller shall fail to fully and timely perform any of its obligations hereunder or shall fail to consummate the sale of the Property for any reason, except Purchaser's default, Purchaser may: (1) enforce specific performance of this Contract; or (2) request that the Escrow Deposit, if any, shall be forthwith returned by the title company to Purchaser.

ARTICLE VII BREACH BY PURCHASER

In the event Purchaser should fail to consummate the purchase of the Property, the conditions to Purchaser's obligations set forth in Article III having been satisfied and Purchaser being in default and Seller not being in default hereunder, Seller shall have the right to receive the Escrow Deposit, if any, from the title company, the sum being agreed on as liquidated damages for the failure of Purchaser to perform the duties, liabilities, and obligations imposed upon it by the terms and provisions of this Contract, and Seller agrees to accept and take this cash payment as its total damages and relief and as Seller's sole remedy hereunder in such event. If no Escrow Deposit has been made then Seller shall receive the amount of \$500 as liquidated damages for any failure by Purchaser.

ARTICLE VIII MISCELLANEOUS

Notice

8.01. Any notice required or permitted to be delivered hereunder shall be deemed received when sent by United States mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to Selier or Purchaser, as the case may be, at the address set forth opposite the signature of the party.

Texas Law to Apply

8.02. This Contract shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Williamson County, Texas.

Parties Bound

8.03. This Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns where permitted by this Contract.

Legal Construction

8.04. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, this invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Contract shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

Prior Agreements Superseded

8.05. This Contract constitutes the sole and only agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting the within subject matter.

Time of Essence

8.06. Time is of the essence in this Contract.

Gender







Consider approving agreement with TMF Health Quality Institute for retrospective medical record review services for the county indigent health care program.

Background

TMF Health Quality Institute is a private non-profit organization of licensed physicians. Its purpose is to promote, develop, define and encourage the delivery of high quality medical care and health services to the people of Texas and the general public, while promoting efficient, cost-effective medical care. TMF has been the Medicare quality improvement organization for Texas, reviewing the medical necessity and quality of care provided to Medicare beneficiaries since 1984.

TMF has been requested to conduct an independent, third party review of selected records of WilCo Care patients treated in Williamson County hospitals during the first half of the current fiscal year. TMF's work relates to evaluating and reporting on quality of care using established medical practice standards and guidelines to perform the assessment. TMS currently works with two indigent health care programs in Texas providing retrospective record review and consultative services that have enabled the organizations to utilize the resulting data and reports to improve the quality of care and reduce costs.

In the current year budget, \$47,000 was budgeted for this review of a sampling of records from all Williamson County hospitals. The scope of work proposed is projected to cost no more than \$35,000.

Objective: To determine if the proposed agreement with TMF Health Quality Institute contains the essential contract elements and clauses to reduce the risk of non-compliance to an acceptable level. **Contract Name**: Review Services Agreement

Contracting Department: Community Health Education & Social Services Division

Results: 11 (78.57%) of the 14 applicable contract clauses are reflected in the contract. The 3 missing clauses are not considered significant to this contract and their omission does not increase the risk of non-compliance to the County.

Action: Return the contract to Bride Roberts with a copy of this checklist and a recommendation to proceed with placing this contract on the Commissioners Court agenda.

Conclusion: The risk of non-compliance to the County associated with this contract is **low** and approval is recommended.

Note: The authority to enter into this agreement is the result of the County approving on March 16, 2010, agenda item 23, a purchasing cooperative inter-local agreement with Montgomery County Hospital District.

Review Services Agreement

Section 1. Parties

- 1.1. This Review Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into this 15th day of July 2010 (the "Effective Date"), by and between TMF Health Quality Institute ("TMF"), a Texas nonprofit corporation, located at Bridgepoint I, Suite 300, 5918 West Courtyard Drive, Austin, Texas 78730-5036, and Williamson County, located at 710 Main Street, County Courthouse, Georgetown, TX 78626-5703.
- 1.2. In accordance with Section 1154(a)(11) of the Social Security Act, TMF's Medicare peer review contract with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, requires that TMF shall make available its facilities and resources for contract with public and private entities paying for health care in its area for review of services reimbursed by such entities, as is feasible and appropriate.
- 1.3. In accordance with section 1.2. above, TMF is a private utilization review agent certified by the Texas Department of Insurance under Article 21.58A of the Texas Insurance Code, and a private independent review organization certified by the Texas Department of Insurance under Article 21.58C of the Texas Insurance Code.

Section 2. Review Services.

- 2.1. <u>Type of Review Services</u>. During the term of this Agreement, and subject to the terms and conditions stated in this Agreement, TMF will provide the review services identified in sections 2.1.1. and 2.1.2. of this Agreement on cases submitted by Williamson County for review. Williamson County may initiate a review request by submitting to TMF all necessary medical record and claim information necessary to render a review decision.
 - 2.1.1. Retrospective Review of Medical Records. At the request of Williamson County and upon TMF's receipt of all appropriate medical record documentation, TMF will retrospectively review non-Medicare medical records to address any questions or areas of concern Williamson County may have related to the medical necessity, coding, quality and appropriateness of preventive care and chronic disease management provided in the clinic setting as compared to established national medical practice guidelines. TMF will also perform chart to charge audits of emergency room visits to validate charges against documentation in the medical record. Unless specified by Williamson County, TMF reserves the privilege to assign a physician specialty appropriate to the case in question. Review determinations on all records

submitted will be based on the available information submitted by Williamson County or contracted providers. TMF does not assume responsibility for incomplete records.

- 2.1.2. Reconsideration of
 Retrospective Review Decisions. At the request of
 Williamson County, TMF will perform
 reconsideration review of cases retrospectively
 reviewed by TMF under this Agreement.
 Williamson County must provide TMF with
 additional information for a case to be considered
 eligible for reconsideration review.
- 2.1.3. Without its express prior written consent, TMF will not provide review services for use in the suspension or termination of a physician's facility or hospital privileges. If Williamson County wishes to engage TMF to provide review services for use in suspension or termination of a physician's facility or hospital privileges and TMF, at it sole discretion, is willing to conduct such review, TMF and Williamson County will enter into a separate agreement concerning such reviews.

2.2. <u>Assignment of Personnel</u>.

- 2.2.1. TMF will utilize registered nurses (RNs) trained in utilization and quality review and coding guidelines for screening and review of the information provided to determine the correct ICD-9-CM codes and DRG for the diagnoses and procedures performed. Cases which require a review decision regarding medical necessity or quality of care provided will be referred to a physician reviewer.
- 2.2.2. Physician review will be performed by doctors of medicine (MDs), doctors of osteopathy (DOs), podiatric medicine (DPMs), or dentistry (DDSs) who meet the requirements established by the TMF Board of Trustees for physician reviewers, including training in utilization and quality review. TMF will assign a physician consultant or reviewer to each case which TMF determines is of a specialty appropriate to perform a peer review.
- 2.3. <u>Review Report</u>. Upon completion of retrospective review, TMF will provide written or FAX notification to the Executive Director of Williamson County of the review results. TMF's review reports will be provided within the timeframes outlined in section 2.4 and a report of findings and recommendations will be completed by September 30, 2010.
- 2.4. <u>Time</u>. TMF will complete each requested review within the following time frame after TMF's receipt of the review request and complete substantiating information from Williamson County.

- 2.4.1. <u>Retrospective Review/</u>
 <u>Reconsideration Review of Retrospective</u>
 <u>Review Decisions</u>. Review results will be provided to WILLIAMSON COUNTY on or before September 30, 2010.
- 2.5. <u>Discontinuation of Review</u>. At the request of Williamson County TMF will discontinue any review which has been initiated.
- Litigation Support to Williamson County. Upon receipt of a written request from Williamson County, TMF will provide support to Williamson County for appeals or litigation for cases for which TMF has provided a retrospective, or reconsideration review decision. TMF's support will be limited to verification of TMF's retrospective, or reconsideration review decision, rereview of the case in question by a physician to assure accuracy of TMF's first advisory determination, and/or depositions or testimony regarding TMF's advisory review decision, processes, procedures, and contractual responsibilities. TMF will provide the medical record documentation, administrative or review staff and/or professional medical advisory consultation as TMF determines is appropriate.
 - 2.6.1. Williamson County will submit a written request to TMF fully identifying the case and specifying the type of support required. Williamson County's written request will also identify any additional parties which may contact TMF, such as attorneys requiring the identification of the physician reviewer or expert witnesses for depositions/testimony.
 - 2.6.2. If release of a physician reviewer's name is required by an attorney, TMF will be notified no fewer than sixty (60) days prior to the potential date of deposition or testimony.
 - 2.6.3. Williamson County may refer attorneys to TMF's legal counsel when a specific case is in litigation:

- 2.6.4. Reimbursement of TMF physician reviewers for depositions or testimony will be negotiated through TMF's legal counsel on a case-by-case basis. Such reimbursement will be made by the requesting attorney directly to TMF. Deposition or testimony required of TMF staff will be negotiated through TMF on a case-by-case basis.
- 2.7 <u>Conflicts Mitigation</u>. TMF strives to maintain impartiality in all of its review services.

However, should an issue concerning impartiality arise, TMF maintains a Conflicts Mitigation Plan and Policy to address these concerns. Copies of TMF's Conflicts Mitigation Plan and Policy may be obtained by written request addressed to the contact for contract or financial matters listed in Section 7.4.1. of this Agreement.

Section 3. Fees; Invoice; Payment; Late Payment; Suspension of Review Services.

- 3.1. Fees. Each inpatient case reviewed is considered a separate review and subject to assessment of fees set forth in the attached Fee Schedule. Emergency Department review/consulting fees for the chart to charge audit and consulting services are in accordance with the fee schedule. Total fees for review/consulting services will not exceed \$35,000 for work completed and billed by September 30, 2010.
- 3.2. <u>Invoice</u>. TMF will provide WILLIAMSON COUNTY with a monthly invoice for all review services completed during the previous month.
 - 3.2.1. During the term of this Agreement, including any renewal terms, and for ninety (90) calendar days following termination of this Agreement, TMF will provide access to its records that support invoices for audit and inspection by Williamson County within five (5) working days of TMF's receipt of written notice.
- Payment. Williamson County will pay TMF at its office in Austin, Texas, on a monthly basis for the services provided during the previous month pursuant to Section 3.1 of this Agreement and upon receipt of invoice from TMF. Williamson County's payment for services shall be governed by Chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code. Invoices shall be paid by Williamson County within thirty (30) days from the date of the Williamson County Auditor's receipt of an invoice. Interest charges for any late payments shall be paid by Williamson County in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 2251.025. More specifically, the rate of interest that shall accrue on a late payment is the rate in effect on September 1 of Williamson County's fiscal year in which the payment becomes due. The said rate in effect on September 1 shall be equal to the sum of one percent (1%); and (2) the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first day of July of the preceding fiscal year that does not fall on a Saturday or Sunday. In the event that a discrepancy arises in relation to an invoice, such as an incorrect amount on an invoice or a lack of documentation that is required to be attached to an invoice to evidence the amount claimed to be due, Williamson County shall notify TMF of the discrepancy. Following Williamson County's notification of any discrepancy as to an invoice, TMF must resolve the discrepancy and resubmit a corrected or revised invoice, which includes all required support documentation, to the Williamson County Auditor. Williamson County shall pay the invoice within thirty (30) days from the date of the Williamson County Auditor's receipt of the corrected or revised invoice. Williamson County's payment of an invoice that contains a discrepancy shall not be considered late, nor shall any interest begin to accrue until the thirty-first (31st) day following the Williamson County Auditor's receipt of the corrected or revised invoice.

- 3.4. Late Payment. See 3.3 above.
- 3.5. <u>Suspension of Review Services</u>. When payment has not been received by TMF within sixty (60) calendar days from the invoice date, TMF will inform Williamson County of the suspension of review services. Review services will resume when all outstanding balances and interest are fully paid by Williamson County.

Section 4. Confidentiality.

- 4.1. Without consent of Williamson County, TMF will not disclose to any person or entity not a party to this Agreement any information provided to, acquired by, or prepared by TMF or provided to Williamson County. TMF agrees to execute a business associates agreement with Williamson County and such other agreements and documents necessary for Williamson County to comply with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
- 4.2. Williamson County will maintain the confidentiality of all data and information acquired or produced by TMF, in accordance with applicable state and Federal laws.
- 4.3. TMF will generally maintain the information submitted by Williamson County to TMF and the reports provided by TMF to Williamson County in confidence, except as necessary to perform the utilization review services set forth in this Agreement. Williamson County acknowledges and agrees, however, that certain federal and state authorities and agencies may require access to TMF's facilities to audit the performance of the services offered by TMF pursuant to this Agreement and other agreements, and that TMF shall cooperate with respect to all such governmental audits, including permitting access to and disclosure of reports. Williamson County further agrees that TMF's obligation under this Section 4.1. is limited to compliance with the same methods and procedures that TMF uses to protect its own confidential information from disclosure.

Section 5. Indemnification.

To the extent allowed by law, 5.1. Williamson County shall, at its sole expense, defend, indemnify, and hold TMF and its officers, directors, agents, reviewers and employees harmless from and against all liability and costs (including judgments, attorneys' fees and court costs) that may result from any claim or suit asserted or brought against TMF by a third party, except for TMF's negligence or reckless conduct, in connection with (a) the receipt, use or dissemination by TMF of the information provided by Williamson County to render the review services hereunder, (b) the receipt, use or dissemination by Williamson County of the information provided by TMF to Williamson County or (c) the assessment of and actions taken by Williamson County based upon the information furnished by TMF to Williamson

County. If any third party asserts a claim against TMF with respect to any matter, with the exception of TMF's negligence or reckless conduct, which may give rise to a claim for indemnification (an "indemnifiable claim") by TMF against Williamson County under this Agreement, then TMF shall notify Williamson County promptly. In the event of an indemnifiable claim made by a third party against TMF, Williamson County shall select counsel to defend the claim, which counsel shall be reasonably satisfactory to TMF, and all costs of such counsel shall be borne by Williamson County.

- 5.2. TMF shall, at it sole expense, defend, indemnify, and hold Williamson County, and its officers, directors, agents, and employees, harmless from and against all liability and costs (including judgments, attorneys' fees, and court costs) that may result from any act or omission on the part of TMF or any of its employees or agents which resulted in:
 - i) any loss from any fraudulent or dishonest act on the part of any TMF employee;
 - ii) any loss of or damage to Williamson County's property or premises caused by the negligence or willful act of any TMF employee; or
 - iii) any negligent or reckless conduct by TMF, its agents and/or employees that forms the basis of a claim against Williamson County.

If any third party asserts a claim against Williamson County with respect to any matter, with the exception of Williamson County's negligence or reckless conduct, which may give rise to a claim for indemnification (an "indemnifiable claim") by Williamson County against TMF under this Agreement, then Williamson County shall notify TMF promptly. In the event of an indemnifiable claim made by a third party against Williamson County, TMF shall select counsel to defend the claim, which counsel shall be reasonably satisfactory to Williamson County, and all costs of such counsel shall be borne by TMF.

- 5.3. TMF warrants that it has and shall maintain insurance contracts for its employees providing comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance coverage. If any third party asserts a claim against Williamson County with respect to any other matter which gives rise to an indemnifiable claim by Williamson County against TMF under this Agreement, then Williamson County shall notify TMF thereof promptly.
- 5.4. Williamson County is a political subdivision of the State of Texas. Since claims against the county are subject to the liability and damage limitations of the Texas Tort Claims Act, Williamson County has chosen to self-insure rather than to obtain insurance coverage for its residual liability. The full faith and credit of Williamson County, therefore, stands behind any lawful claims against it, its officials, employees, or agents. If any third party asserts a claim against TMF with respect to any other matter which gives rise to an indemnifiable claim by TMF against Williamson County under this Agreement, then TMF shall notify Williamson County thereof promptly.

Section 6. Term; Termination; Dispute Resolution.

- 6.1. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date of this Agreement and will expire on September 30, 2010.
- 6.2. Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time with or without cause by giving at least thirty (30) calendar days prior written notice properly addressed to the individual whose signature is set forth below and at the address identified in Section 1.1. of this Agreement, or such more recent address of which the sending party has received written notice. During the time between receipt of the written termination notice and the effective date of such termination, TMF shall continue to provide utilization review services and Williamson County will pay TMF for all services rendered during the term of this Agreement.
- Dispute Resolution Prior to Suit. Each party agrees that unless otherwise required in order to comply with deadlines under applicable law, it will not file an action or institute legal proceedings with respect to any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of, relating to, or in connection with this Agreement until a mediation process has been attempted. TMF and Williamson County shall attempt to settle any claim or controversy arising out of this Agreement through consultation and negotiation in the spirit of mutual friendship and cooperation. If such attempts fail, then the dispute shall first be submitted to a mutually-acceptable neutral advisor for mediation. Neither of the parties may unreasonably withhold acceptance of such an advisor, and his or her selection will be made within thirty (30) days after notice by the other party demanding such mediation. The cost of such mediation or any other alternate dispute resolution agreed upon by both parties shall be shared equally by TMF and Williamson County. Any dispute which cannot be so resolved between the parties within ninety (90) days of the date of the initial demand by either party for such mediation shall be determined by the courts. The use of such a procedure shall not be construed to affect adversely the rights of either party under the doctrines of laches, waiver or estoppel. Nothing shall prevent either party from resorting to judicial proceedings if (a) good faith efforts to resolve a dispute under this procedure have been unsuccessful, or (b) interim resort to a court is necessary to prevent serious or irreparable injury to a party or to others.

Section 7. Miscellaneous.

- 7.1. <u>Procedures</u>. Williamson County and TMF shall establish compatible procedures to implement and administer this Agreement.
- 7.2. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Either party shall be excused from delays or failures in performance of their obligations under this Agreement resulting from causes beyond their reasonable control, whether or not foreseeable; provided that in order to be excused, such party must notify the other party of the delay or

failure and its cause at the time it arises and must act diligently to remedy the cause and restore performance.

- 7.3. Independent Contractor. In performing the utilization/quality review services under this Agreement, TMF is acting as an independent contractor, and in no way are the parties to be construed as partners, joint venturers, or agents of one another in any respect under this Agreement. TMF does not undertake by this Agreement to perform any obligation of Williamson County.
- 7.4. <u>Contact Persons</u>. Each party will identify and update in writing the person(s) responsible for administration of the terms of this contract for the purposes of, but not limited to, liaison activity, program performance, administrative matters, and additional negotiations.

- 7.5. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended, by mutual consent, expressed in writing, of the parties hereto or their successors.
- GOVERNING LAW; LIMITATIONS; VENUE. THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, EXCLUDING ANY RULE OR PRINCIPLE THAT WOULD REFER TO AND APPLY THE SUBSTANTIVE LAW OF ANOTHER STATE OR JURISDICTION. TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED BY APPLICABLE LAW, ANY CLAIMS OR CAUSES OF ACTION ARISING OUT OF, RELATING TO, OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT OR THE UTILIZATION REVIEW SERVICES OFFERED HEREUNDER MUST BE INSTITUTED WITHIN THE TIME ALLOWED BY THE STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR SUCH CLAIM. FURTHER. EACH PARTY TO THIS AGREEMENT HEREBY AGREES AND ACKNOWLEDGES THAT VENUE AND JURISDICTION OF ANY SUIT, RIGHT, OR CAUSE OF ACTION ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT SHALL LIE **EXCLUSIVELY IN EITHER THE STATE COURTS** OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS OR IN THE AUSTIN DIVISION OF THE WESTERN FEDERAL DISTRICT OF TEXAS, AND THE PARTIES HERETO EXPRESSLY CONSENT AND SUBMIT TO SUCH JURISDICTION.
- 7.7. <u>Freedom of Action</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall restrict or prevent TMF from providing utilization review services to any other private or public entity.
- 7.8. Notices. All notices which shall be given by either party under the terms of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be hand delivered, sent by facsimile transmission, or sent by certified mail (return receipt requested), addressed to the party at the address set forth at the beginning of this Agreement or at such other address as may be designated by a party in writing. All such notices which are hand delivered or sent via facsimile shall be deemed given upon receipt, and all notices sent via certified mail shall be deemed given five days after mailing.
- 7.9. No Conflicting Terms. If there is any conflict between this Agreement and any purchase order, written request, or other document submitted by Williamson County to TMF requesting utilization review services, this Agreement shall govern whether such purchase order, written request or other document is submitted prior to or subsequent to the Effective Date of this Agreement, or is signed or acknowledged by any director, officer, employee, representative or agent of TMF. It is acknowledged that this Agreement between TMF and Williamson County is developed outside of TMF's QIO contract with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. In the event that Williamson County believes that this Agreement was forced or coerced, the Government Contracting Officer and/or Project Officer may be contacted directly by Williamson County. The Contracting Officer is Naomi Haney-Ceresa and she

can be reached at 410-786-1607. The Project Officer is Patty Rawlings and she can be reached at 214-767-4423.

TMF shall not undertake or perform any services under this Agreement requiring TMF to conduct review of any cases concerning Medicare beneficiaries residing in the state of Texas, or any other matter which would or could constitute a conflict of interest with TMF's obligations under its QIO contract with CMS, including any review involving the Emergency Medical Treatment and Labor Act (EMTALA), the Benefits, Improvements and Protection Act of 2000 (BIPA), or any review of a Medicare+Choice Organization's decision to terminate Medicare coverage of services.

- 7.10 Attorney's Fees. If either party takes action (by itself or through its representatives) to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement, including collection of amounts due hereunder, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party, in addition to all sums to which it is entitled or any other relief, at law or in equity, reasonable and necessary attorney's fees and any court costs.
- 7.11. <u>Consideration</u>. The parties agree that they enter into this Agreement for and in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which they hereby acknowledge.
- 7.12. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in two counterparts, each of which taken together shall constitute one single Agreement between the parties.
- 7.13. If any rule, regulation, directive, or guidance issues by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services or any provision contained in TMF's QIO contract requires approval of this Agreement by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services before it becomes effective, this Agreement shall not be effective until such approval has been obtained. TMF shall make reasonable efforts to obtain such approval if required.

ALS EDUCATION AFFILIATION AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL PRECEPTOR PROGRAM BETWEEN

WILLIAMSON COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AND EMTS ACADEMY AND ST. DAVID'S ROUND ROCK MEDICAL CENTER PARAMEDIC PROGRAM CONSORTIUM

This Agreement is between Williamson County Emergency Medical Services, acting by and through Williamson County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY") and EMTS Academy and St. David's Round Rock Medical Center Paramedic Program Consortium (hereinafter referred to as "ACADEMY").

RECITALS:

ACADEMY provides courses of study in emergency medical services to students enrolled in its paramedic program of study.

ACADEMY desires program components that will provide to the students clinical experience as part of their educational instruction.

COUNTY, through its Emergency Medical Services Department, has facilities that can provide a clinical setting for educational instruction and is willing to make available the use of its facilities to ACADEMY for its Paramedic program of study.

COUNTY and ACADEMY desire to enter into this Educational Affiliation Agreement in accordance with the terms stated below:

TERMS:

RESPONSIBILITIES OF ACADEMY

- 1. ACADEMY shall be responsible for the selection of students and their supervised instruction and grading. Students shall have satisfactorily completed curriculum prerequisites for participation in the internships or rotations.
- 2. ACADEMY'S instructors shall possess current and appropriate professional credentials or certifications and ACADEMY shall be responsible for the coordination and implementation of the program of study.
- 3. Services rendered by ACADEMY instructors and students shall be without charge to COUNTY. ACADEMY instructors and students shall not be responsible for the quality of patient or client care.
- 4. Neither ACADEMY instructors nor students shall be deemed to be COUNTY employees, nor shall they be entitled to any COUNTY benefits, compensation or workers compensation benefits.
- 5. ACADEMY shall annually provide COUNTY with anticipated enrollments for courses intending to provide clinical internships or experience through this Agreement. The number of students and the schedule of use of COUNTY's facilities shall be subject to annual, mutual approval.
- 6. ACADEMY shall provide COUNTY with a list of students authorized to participate in the clinical instruction facilitated under this Agreement. ACADEMY shall promptly inform COUNTY in writing of any student withdrawing from the course or otherwise unqualified to continue the internship or clinical experience made

available under this Agreement.

- 7. ACADEMY shall require all instructors and students to abide by all applicable policies, regulations and laws governing the facility or its work environment. ACADEMY shall withdraw authorization for participation under this Agreement for any instructor or student found to have committed a violation of applicable policies, regulations or laws, or determined by COUNTY to be unqualified to continue in the program.
- 8. During the term of this Agreement, ACADEMY shall maintain a professional liability insurance policy with a limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate that covers the activities of ACADEMY'S students, employees and faculty under this Agreement. ACADEMY shall ensure that each current student, employee and faculty member is individually insured under such policy in the above-stated amounts, and shall provide COUNTY with a proof of such insurance coverage each year, and at other times upon request. ACADEMY agrees to require each student to be covered by or to carry accident insurance for injury while enrolled in the program, and to ensure that each employee or faculty member is covered by worker's compensation insurance while participating in the program. No student or faculty member shall be permitted to participate in the program until such insurance coverage has been verified to the satisfaction of COUNTY. The above described insurance policy shall name COUNTY as an additional insured.
- 9. ACADEMY agrees to secure a release of liability form from each student and faculty member who will participate in the program. Such form shall be as set forth in Attachment "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY

- 10. COUNTY shall, on a space available basis, allow the use of designated facilities to provide a clinical education to participating students. COUNTY agrees to provide evaluations for student course-work done on forms provided by ACADEMY.
- 11. COUNTY shall provide an orientation session to inform students and ACADEMY staff about the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the facilities.
- 12. COUNTY agrees to provide, on a space-available basis, the use of conference rooms, classrooms, lounges and lockers to the instructors and the students.
- 13. COUNTY shall notify ACADEMY of any change of any accreditation or status concerning a facility and affecting internship or course requirements for clinical experience at an ACADEMY credited facility. Representatives of an ACADEMY crediting agency for ACADEMY shall be permitted to conduct inspections for purposes relating to ACADEMY'S accreditation.
- 14. COUNTY shall cooperate with ACADEMY in matters relating to academic performance and student conduct relating to course work performed under this Agreement.
- 15. Unless prohibited or restricted by law, COUNTY shall timely notify an instructor or student of any instance in which a facility employee has been exposed to blood-borne or airborne pathogens and the student or instructor may have been exposed in the same instance. Notification shall be provided in a time frame sufficient to allow the student or faculty member to seek appropriate treatment for potential exposure.
- 16. COUNTY shall obtain and maintain all licenses required for its participating facilities and shall assure that COUNTY personnel are appropriately licensed.
- 17. In the event emergency care is required for an ACADEMY student or faculty member, it shall be provided in the same manner that emergency care is provided to COUNTY employees and the general public. Emergency care provided by COUNTY shall be at the expense of the student or faculty member.

MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 18. The Parties agree to designate a liaison for each program to do the following:
 - A. Meet annually, or more often as needed, to schedule use of the facilities;
 - B. Meet on a per semester basis to set the number of students allowed to participate;
 - C. Design and approve curriculum assignments as they affect the operation of the facility and as affected by ACADEMY crediting standards;
 - D. Meet to review protocols, policies and rules and regulations concerning the operation of the facility and its use under this Agreement;
 - E. Meet annually to evaluate changes or amendments to this Agreement or the performance of the Agreement.
- 19. In the event any claim or demand is made on one of the Parties for actions relating or authorized by this Agreement, the other party shall be notified of such claim or demand in writing within five business (Monday-Friday) days. COUNTY shall not be liable for any claims, damages or attorneys fees arising from the negligent acts or omissions of ACADEMY, its employees, agents or students under this Agreement. ACADEMY shall not be liable for any claims, damages or attorneys fees arising from the negligent acts or omissions of COUNTY or its employees under this Agreement.

ACADEMY WILL DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS COUNTY, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, VOLUNTEERS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES, FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS FOR LOSS AND DAMAGE TO PROPERTY OR INJURY OR DEATH TO PERSONS, INCLUDING COSTS, EXPENSES AND REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES, ARISING FROM THE ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF ACADEMY, ITS FACULTY OR STUDENTS. ACADEMY SHALL BE LIABLE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS PARAGRAPH FOR SUCH OBLIGATION, COSTS OR EXPENSES ONLY TO THE EXTENT THAT SUCH ACT OR OMISSION IS CAUSED BY THE FACULTY OR STUDENTS OF ACADEMY.

ADDITIONAL TERMS

- 21. Compensation benefits for this Agreement shall include \$35 total for each EMT-Intermediate student ride-out and \$50 total for EMT-Paramedic student ride-out to be paid by ACADEMY to the COUNTY. Compensation shall be paid to COUNTY within thirty (30) days from the date of the COUNTY'S invoice for payment.
- 22. ACADEMY acknowledges that COUNTY is a hybrid entity under the privacy regulations of the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA Privacy Rule"). COUNTY has designated its Emergency Medical Services Department as a health care component, as defined in HIPAA, and the Department is therefore required to comply with the HIPAA Privacy Rule. This compliance includes obtaining

written contractual assurances from ACADEMY that ACADEMY, its employees and agents will protect all individually identifiable health information they may access or use under this Agreement in accordance with the terms of the HIPAA Business Associate Agreement, which is hereby attached to and made a part of this Agreement, for all purposes, as Attachment "B".

- 23. The parties agree that COUNTY shall at all times maintain the right to terminate a student's participation in the program if COUNTY, in its sole discretion, determines that the student's continued participation would be disruptive to the program or the operations of the facility, or would pose a danger.
- 24. ACADEMY instructors and students shall maintain confidential all records and information concerning patients treated or attended to in COUNTY's facilities. Each ACADEMY instructor and student involved in medical or EMS programs shall be required to sign a confidentiality agreement regarding records and information about patients treated or attended by COUNTY employees.
- 25. Failure of either party to exercise any right or privilege granted by this Agreement shall not operate to waive such right or privilege in the event of subsequent defaults or assertions of right. Neither party waives nor shall be deemed to have waived any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it against claims arising under the performance of this Agreement.
- 26. The provisions of this Agreement shall be severable in the event any provision is declared invalid, illegal or unenforceable.
- 27. Either party <u>may terminate this Agreement without cause</u> upon 90 days written notice to the other party. In addition, COUNTY shall have the right to terminate the Agreement immediately in the event the facility becomes inoperable for any reason or COUNTY no longer controls a program.
- 28. Either Party may terminate this Agreement if the other breaches the Agreement and fails to cure such breach within 15 days of receiving notice of breach. If more than 15 days are required to cure the breach, the Parties may agree to an extension of the cure period in writing.
- 29. This agreement is effective when all parties have executed it. The term of the Agreement is from June 1, 2010 through December 31, 2013 unless this Agreement is otherwise terminated pursuant to the termination provision contained in Article 27 of this Agreement. All services shall be completed during this term. This Agreement may be reviewed annually by agreement of both parties via written instrument and subject to required approvals. There is no right or expectation of renewal and any renewal will be determined at the discretion of both Parties.
- 30. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to confer third party rights or to constitute a waiver of any governmental immunity of the parties.
- 31. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and any prior or contemporaneous agreements, written or oral, are hereby superseded and of no further effect.
- 32. The laws of the State of Texas shall govern the validity, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement, and venue for any dispute or cause of action shall be in Williamson County, Texas.
- 33. The Parties will comply with applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations in the performance of this Agreement.
- 34. The performance of this Agreement shall be undertaken in a manner that does not discriminate against any person on a basis prohibited by law, including but not limited to race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, veteran status or disability.

35. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, a COUNTY department may suspend participation in this Agreement due to space needs, staff training needs, <u>budgetary issues</u> or other urgent considerations. In the event of suspension, COUNTY shall give ACADEMY written notification stating the date of suspension and the date on which participation is anticipated to resume.

BUSINESS ASSOCIATE AGREEMENT UNDER HEALTH INFORMATION PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 1996 (HIPAA)

This is an AGREEMENT between the parties shown below.

1.10. Parties:

- 1.11. Williamson County EMS (hereinafter called "Provider")
- 1.12. The individual or entity set forth in the signature block below (hereinafter called "Associate")

1.20. Purpose of Agreement:

To insure compliance with the privacy provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"), Public Law 104-191, Subtitle F-Administrative Simplification, Sections 261, *et seq*, as amended.

1.30. Declarations:

Both Provider and Associate wish to insure that the provisions of HIPAA and other laws and regulations pertaining to privacy of a patient's protected health information, (hereinafter called "PHI") as defined by HIPAA, are fully complied with.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby AGREED by and between the Parties hereto as follows:

2.10. Agreements by Associate. Associate agrees that it will:

- 2.10.1.1. Require that all its agents, servants, employees, and subcontractors, and their agents, servants, and employees comply fully with the provisions of HIPAA and all other applicable laws governing the use of disclosure of PHI.
- 2.12. Implement and maintain appropriate and adequate administrative, physical, and electronic, safeguards to insure that all uses or disclosures of PHI will be in compliance with HIPAA or other applicable laws.
- 2.13. Use and disclosure PHI only as permitted by HIPAA and by this agreement, but no provision of this agreement shall operate to authorize any use or disclosure of PHI which would violate the provisions of HIPAA or any other applicable federal or state rule or regulation. Permitted uses shall include review of documents either in written or electronic data format, relating to a patient.
- 2.14. Grant access to any and all PHI in its possession or under its control to Provider on request.
- 2.15. Grant access to the individual, whose PHI is in its possession or under its control to the individual according to the provisions of HIPAA.
- 2.16. Abide by restrictions on use of PHI, which are agreed to by Provider at the request of the individual, and notify its employees, servants, agents, subcontractors of such restrictions in timely fashion.
- 2.17. Amend an individual's PHI when advised by Provider to do so pursuant to a request by the individual, or in the event that Provider sees fit to amend such information.
- 2.18. Immediately advise Provider of any instances of use of disclosure of PHI which are not in compliance with HIPAA, with other state or federal laws or regulations as soon as it becomes aware of such instances, and take immediate steps to mitigate any damages arising from such instances of non-compliance.
- 2.191 Maintain records of all uses and disclosures made of PHI and render an accounting of such uses and disclosures upon request of Provider or the individual as provided by HIPAA.
- 2.20. At the termination of this agreement, return to Provider or destroy all PHI in its possession or under its control which it has received from Provider, together with any amendments, copies, variations of it, whether written or preserved in another form.
- 2.21. Provide to the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services of the United States of America all documents and records relating to the use and disclosure of PHI if requested by the said Secretary.

- 2.22. Require that all members or its workforce and its subcontractors who deal with PHI furnished to Associate by Provider execute confidentiality agreements guaranteeing compliance with HIPAA and other applicable laws.
- 2.23. Provide for sanctions against members of its workforce for violation of HIPAA regulations, enforce such sanctions, and furnish Provider with evidence of the application of such sanctions, except that such evidence shall not identify any employee so sanctioned. Associate shall also, in its agreements with subcontractors, provide for the same sanctions that are required by this subparagraph.

3.10. Agreements by Provider. Provider agrees as follows:

3.11. To provide Associate with notice of restrictions, amendments, requests for confidential communications, and requests for access or copying relating to an individual's PHI.

4.10. General Provisions.

- 4.11. <u>Captions.</u> Captions to sections or paragraphs to this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not change the meaning of any part hereof.
 - 4.12. <u>Severability.</u> If any part of this Agreement shall be determined to be invalid, unenforceable, or illegal, all other parts of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
 - 4.13. <u>Complete Agreement.</u> This Agreement forms the sole and complete Agreement and understanding between Williamson County EMS and DM Medical Billings and cannot be amended except in writing duly signed and executed by both parties.
 - 4.14 <u>Authority of Parties.</u> The person or persons executing this Agreement hereby represent and guarantee that they are authorized to do so on behalf of themselves and the entities that they represent, that all necessary internal procedures, due diligence, and process required to legally bind and enter into such an Agreement have been satisfied, and that the Agreement will be executed according to all its provisions.

BLS EDUCATION AFFILIATION AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL PRECEPTOR PROGRAM BETWEEN

WILLIAMSON COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TRAINING AND SERVICES (EMTS)

This Agreement is between Williamson County Emergency Medical Services, acting by and through Williamson County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY") and Dalma, LLC d/b/a Emergency Management Training and Services hereinafter referred to as "ACADEMY").

RECITALS:

ACADEMY provides courses of study in emergency medical services to students enrolled in its Emergency Medical Technician-Basic program of study.

ACADEMY desires program components that will provide to the students clinical experience as part of their educational instruction.

COUNTY, through its Emergency Medical Services Department, has facilities that can provide a clinical setting for educational instruction and is willing to make available the use of its facilities to ACADEMY for its Emergency Medical Technician program of study.

COUNTY and ACADEMY desire to enter into this Educational Affiliation Agreement in accordance with the terms stated below:

TERMS:

RESPONSIBILITIES OF ACADEMY

- 1. ACADEMY shall be responsible for the selection of students and their supervised instruction and grading. Students shall have satisfactorily completed curriculum prerequisites for participation in the internships or rotations.
- 2. ACADEMY'S instructors shall possess current and appropriate professional credentials or certifications and ACADEMY shall be responsible for the coordination and implementation of the program of study.
- 3. Services rendered by ACADEMY instructors and students shall be without charge to COUNTY. ACADEMY instructors and students shall not be responsible for the quality of patient or client care.
- 4. Neither ACADEMY instructors nor students shall be deemed to be COUNTY employees, nor shall they be entitled to any COUNTY benefits, compensation or workers compensation benefits.
- 5. ACADEMY shall annually provide COUNTY with anticipated enrollments for courses intending to provide clinical internships or experience through this Agreement. The number of students and the schedule of use of COUNTY's facilities shall be subject to annual, mutual approval.
- 6. ACADEMY shall provide COUNTY with a list of students authorized to participate in the clinical instruction facilitated under this Agreement. ACADEMY shall promptly inform COUNTY in writing of any student withdrawing from the course or otherwise unqualified to continue the internship or clinical experience made available under this Agreement.

- 7. ACADEMY shall require all instructors and students to abide by all applicable policies, regulations and laws governing the facility or its work environment. ACADEMY shall withdraw authorization for participation under this Agreement for any instructor or student found to have committed a violation of applicable policies, regulations or laws, or determined by COUNTY to be unqualified to continue in the program.
- 8. During the term of this Agreement, ACADEMY shall maintain a professional liability insurance policy with a limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate that covers the activities of ACADEMY'S students, employees and faculty under this Agreement. ACADEMY shall ensure that each current student, employee and faculty member is individually insured under such policy in the above-stated amounts, and shall provide COUNTY with a proof of such insurance coverage each year, and at other times upon request. ACADEMY agrees to require each student to be covered by or to carry accident insurance for injury while enrolled in the program, and to ensure that each employee or faculty member is covered by worker's compensation insurance while participating in the program. No student or faculty member shall be permitted to participate in the program until such insurance coverage has been verified to the satisfaction of COUNTY. The above described insurance policy shall name COUNTY as an additional insured.
- 9. ACADEMY agrees to secure a release of liability form from each student and faculty member who will participate in the program. Such form shall be as set forth in Attachment "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY

- 10. COUNTY shall, on a space available basis, allow the use of designated facilities to provide a clinical education to participating students. COUNTY agrees to provide evaluations for student course-work done on forms provided by ACADEMY.
- 11. COUNTY shall provide an orientation session to inform students and ACADEMY staff about the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the facilities.
- 12. COUNTY agrees to provide, on a space-available basis, the use of conference rooms, classrooms, lounges and lockers to the instructors and the students.
- 13. COUNTY shall notify ACADEMY of any change of any accreditation or status concerning a facility and affecting internship or course requirements for clinical experience at an ACADEMY credited facility. Representatives of an ACADEMY crediting agency for ACADEMY shall be permitted to conduct inspections for purposes relating to ACADEMY'S accreditation.
- 14. COUNTY shall cooperate with ACADEMY in matters relating to academic performance and student conduct relating to course work performed under this Agreement.
- 15. Unless prohibited or restricted by law, COUNTY shall timely notify an instructor or student of any instance in which a facility employee has been exposed to blood-borne or airborne pathogens and the student or instructor may have been exposed in the same instance. Notification shall be provided in a time frame sufficient to allow the student or faculty member to seek appropriate treatment for potential exposure.
- 16. COUNTY shall obtain and maintain all licenses required for its participating facilities and shall assure that COUNTY personnel are appropriately licensed.
- 17. In the event emergency care is required for an ACADEMY student or faculty member, it shall be provided in the same manner that emergency care is provided to COUNTY employees and the general public. Emergency care provided by COUNTY shall be at the expense of the student or faculty member.

MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 18. The Parties agree to designate a liaison for each program to do the following:
 - A. Meet annually, or more often as needed, to schedule use of the facilities;
 - B. Meet on a per semester basis to set the number of students allowed to participate;
 - C. Design and approve curriculum assignments as they affect the operation of the facility and as affected by ACADEMY crediting standards;
 - D. Meet to review protocols, policies and rules and regulations concerning the operation of the facility and its use under this Agreement;
 - E. Meet annually to evaluate changes or amendments to this Agreement or the performance of the Agreement.
- 19. In the event any claim or demand is made on one of the Parties for actions relating or authorized by this Agreement, the other party shall be notified of such claim or demand in writing within five business (Monday-Friday) days. COUNTY shall not be liable for any claims, damages or attorneys fees arising from the negligent acts or omissions of ACADEMY, its employees, agents or students under this Agreement. ACADEMY shall not be liable for any claims, damages or attorneys fees arising from the negligent acts or omissions of COUNTY or its employees under this Agreement.

ACADEMY WILL DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS COUNTY, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, VOLUNTEERS, EMPLOYEES AND REPRESENTATIVES, FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS FOR LOSS AND DAMAGE TO PROPERTY OR INJURY OR DEATH TO PERSONS, INCLUDING COSTS, EXPENSES AND REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES, ARISING FROM THE ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF ACADEMY, ITS FACULTY OR STUDENTS. ACADEMY SHALL BE LIABLE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS PARAGRAPH FOR SUCH OBLIGATION, COSTS OR EXPENSES ONLY TO THE EXTENT THAT SUCH ACT OR OMISSION IS CAUSED BY THE FACULTY OR STUDENTS OF ACADEMY.

ADDITIONAL TERMS

- 21. Compensation benefits for this Agreement shall include \$25 total per EMT-Basic student to be paid by ACADEMY to the COUNTY. Compensation shall be paid to COUNTY within thirty (30) days from the date of the COUNTY'S invoice for payment.

ORDER FOR LOCAL OPTION ELECTION TO LEGALIZE THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

In accordance with Chapter 501 of the Texas Election Code, an Application for Local Option Election Petition to Legalize was filed with the Elections Administrator, Elections Department of Williamson County, on May 13, 2010.

On May 19, 2010, a Petition for Local Option Election to Legalize was issued by the Elections Administrator, Elections Department of Williamson County.

On June 16, 2010, signed petition pages were filed with the Elections Administrator, Elections Department of Williamson County. The number of signatures of qualified voters of the political subdivision needed to order the election is at least 4,815. The number of signatures submitted are 6,167. Pursuant to Sec. 501.031, Texas Election Code, a statistical sampling method was used to verify the petition signatures. We checked 1,456 signatures and 1,373 qualified as valid, a 94.3% success rate. Based on the statistical sampling method used, more than 5,500 signatures are projected as valid.

On this _____ day of July, 2010, the Commissioners Court of Williamson County, Texas, does hereby order that a special Local Option Election shall be held on November 2, 2010, for registered voters in the City of Georgetown, Texas. The purpose of the election is to vote for or against legalizing the sale of the alcoholic beverages set out in the issue recited in the Application and Petition. The issue to be voted on in the election is as follows:

The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

It is further ordered that the Election Day polling locations shall be open for voting from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. on Election Day as set forth in the attached <u>Exhibit "A"</u>.

It is further ordered that early voting by personal appearance be conducted each weekday that is not a state legal holiday from October 18, 2010, through October 29, 2010, as set forth in the Early Voting Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit "B".

The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (the Department), and <u>Commissioner's Court of Williamson County</u> (Contractor), enter into this Agreement (Contract) for the purpose of funding additional Department staff to benefit the children of Texas. The Department and the Contractor are the parties to this Contract. This Contract is authorized by the Texas Human Resources Code §40.056 and also by the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code.

- 2. Statement Of Services To Be Performed. The Department agrees to use the funds specified in Section 3 below to provide state employed positions specified in Attachment I, which is entirely incorporated as part of this Contract. The number and type of positions to be provided, and their essential duties, salary, fringe benefits, travel, and network costs are contained in Attachment I. Staff funded by this Contract will be in addition to basic staffing allocations for Commissioner's Court of Williamson County (Contractor). As state employees, the persons filling such positions will be supervised by the Department and will be required to abide by all Department work rules, policies, and procedures.
- 3. Payment for Services. In accordance with Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, Contractor will reimburse DFPS for services satisfactorily performed from appropriation items or accounts of the Contractor from which like expenditures would normally be paid, based upon vouchers drawn by the Contractor to DFPS. To reimburse the Department for the costs and expenses incurred for the DFPS persons filling the positions specified in Attachment I, the Contractor agrees to provide the Department an amount up to \$80,240 (the Contract Amount) in local funds or in state funds not from the Department. Contractor shall submit its payments of the Contract Amount in four quarterly installments payable to the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services within thirty (30) days of receiving an invoice from DFPS according to the following schedule. DFPS will transmit billing information representing its actual costs to the Contractor as follows:
 - A) First Federal Quarter of October, November, December will be billed by February 28, 2011
 - B) Second Federal Quarter of January, February, March will be billed by May 31, 2011
 - C) Third Federal Quarter of April, May, June will be billed by August 31, 2011
 - D) Fourth Federal Quarter of July, August, September will be billed by November 30, 2011.
- 4. **Percentage Used in Payment Calculation.** The percentage used in the initial calculation of the Contract Amount in Section 3 may vary during the billing process. THAT Williamson County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as the "County"); and the Williamson County Emergency Service District #1 an emergency service district created and described under Chapter 775 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (both being collectively referred to herein as the "ESD"), have entered into the following:

AGREEMENT

- 1. Pursuant to its power to provide financial assistance for fire protection in and for Williamson County, and its duty to protect the public health and welfare, the County agrees to pay to the ESD the sum of \$40,000.00 in two separate (2) payments. The first payment being made when the County has received a signed agreement accompanied by a detailed accounting of the prior year's expenditures of the County allotment. The second payment will be disbursed on or before September 30, 2010. All funds are to be used to defray the cost of equipment and labor required to provide the services described in Paragraph 2.
- 2. The ESD agrees to provide fire protection services within the ESD's district boundaries and in any area in the County when requested by any other fire company or emergency service district, or when dispatched by the County, and shall expend all of the amount set forth in Paragraph 1 for only these purposes during the calendar year 2010.
- 3. It is understood by the ESD that the County cannot commit funds for any future fiscal year, and that this Agreement does not, and cannot, commit the County to renew or repeat this Agreement unless approved by future action of the Williamson County Commissioners' Court.
- 4. It is understood and agreed that the County has no power to control or supervise the manner and means chosen by the ESD to carry out the services specified in Paragraph 2, and that the County shall have no liability for any intentional acts of the ESD which are not related to the provision of said services.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR PAYROLL SERVICES

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between Williamson County, Texas, hereinafter referred to as the "County," acting by and through its governing body, the Williamson County Commissioners Court and The Meadows at Chandler Creek Municipal Utility District (the "District"), a municipal utility district operating pursuant to Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code. The District and the County are referred to collectively herein as the "Parties".

RECITALS:

Pursuant to Texas Water Code Section 49.216, the District may contract with its own peace officers with the power to make arrests when necessary to prevent or abate the commission of any offense against the rules of the District when the offense or threatened offense occurs on any land, water, or easement owned or controlled by the District; any offense involving injury or detriment to any property owned or controlled by the District; and any offense against the laws of the state.

The District intends to retain and contract its own such Williamson County peace officers but has requested that County handle payroll matters relating to such contracted peace officers.

The predominant purpose of this Agreement is for the County to provide for payroll services on behalf of the District.

The parties stipulate that the purpose of this Agreement is the performance of governmental functions and services as set out in the Texas Government Code Section 791.003(3) (k) and (n).

The parties further covenant that all payments mandated by this Agreement do fairly compensate the County for the furnishing of the payroll services described herein.

NOW THEREFORE, The County and the District, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, mutually agree as follows:

I.

TERM

II.

PAYROLL SERVICES

- 2.1 The District authorizes the County to process all payroll for Williamson County peace officers that are providing law enforcement services for the District, as well as act as the District's reporting agent for the limited purpose of signing and filing payroll tax reports and returns and remitting payroll taxes to the appropriate Federal authorities.
- 2.2. The District acknowledges that it shall maintain a County coordinator that shall be responsible for coordinating, maintaining and reporting the number of hours worked per month by Williamson County peace officers within the District to the Williamson County Auditor's Office. Once the County's coordinator reports the number of hours worked by Williamson County peace officers within the District, the County shall process payroll for each peace officer and perform the payroll tax obligations set forth above. The District shall not be obligated to pay the County any fees for coordination services.
- 2.3 The County shall pay the Williamson County peace officers that provide services within the District's area according to the County's payroll policies and procedures and the District approves of such policies and procedures.
- 2.4 For purposes of payroll processing, the following amounts shall be paid and withheld, on behalf of the District, by the County as a part of County's payroll services hereunder:

Officer Hourly Compensation*:	\$	25.00	
Officer Worker's Compensation Coverage:	-	5%	W
*FICA shall be paid by the District.			

- 2.5 Each month, the County shall send the District a payroll report, which adequately sets forth all payroll and all tax matters from the prior month. The District shall, within ten (10) calendar days of receiving such report, reimburse County for all amounts of payroll and taxes that were due and paid by the County in the prior month. The payroll reimbursement shall be tendered to the Williamson County Auditor's Office, Attn: Finance Director, 710 Main Street, Suite 301, Georgetown, Texas 78626.
- 2.6 As a portion of the consideration of this Agreement, the District's payment of the amounts in Section 2.4 shall serve as a sufficient amount that will cover workers' compensation coverage for the off-duty Williamson County peace officer that is performing services for the District and the County shall be obligated to provide such workers' compensation coverage for such peace officers.

III.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 3.1 The District shall designate a District's liaison as its representative for the purpose of maintaining communication between the District and the County and its peace officers.
- 3.2 The Parties agree that the County is providing only administrative services in the form of payroll services and is not in any way providing any extra or additional law enforcement services to the District.
- The Parties agree that the District may contract off-duty Williamson County 3.3 peace officers pursuant Texas Water Code Section 49.216 pursuant to a separate agreement (a "Separate Agreement") by and between the District and off-duty Williamson County peace officers and that pursuant to the Separate Agreement, the Williamson County peace officers may, on behalf of the District, make arrests when necessary to prevent or abate the commission of any offense against the rules of the District when the offense or threatened offense occurs on any land, water, or easement owned or controlled by the District; any offense involving injury or detriment to any property owned or controlled by the District; and any offense against the laws of the state. The Parties agree that the County will not be a party to the Separate Agreement and, except as provided in Section 3.7, below, that such peace officer shall be acting as a contractor and/or agent of the District and not as an employee and/or agent of the County while the peace officer is performing services for the District under the Separate Agreement. Except as provided in Section 3.7, below, all Williamson County peace officers that provide such services to the District under a Separate Agreement will be acting in the course and scope of their contract with the District at all times and all issues relating to the scope, manners and/or means of performance by such peace officers, all of which shall be strictly between the peace officers and the District.
- 3.4 The undersigned Williamson County elected official (the "Elected Official") grants his/her consent to his/her peace officers to provide law enforcement services for the District while off-duty provided that such off-duty work does not interfere with the peace officers' duties as a full time employee of the Elected Official's office.
- 3.5 The District understands and agrees that if emergency circumstances arise during the time in which a Williamson County peace officer is providing off-duty law enforcement services for the District and such Williamson County peace officer must leave the District's area to respond to said emergency, the peace officer will be temporarily leaving the District's area and will not be paid by the District while responding to such emergency. When the emergency assignment is completed, the peace officer will return to the District's area and continue to provide the services contemplated by this Agreement and the District's obligation to pay for such services shall commence again upon the return of the peace officer.
- 3.6 The County shall provide auto liability insurance coverage for the County marked patrol car that is used by an off-duty Williamson County peace officer that is providing off-duty law enforcement services to the District.
- 3.7 The District shall be responsible for any liability that arises as a result of the peace officers' enforcement of District policies and regulations. In like manner, the County will

be liable for any liability that is covered by the workers' compensation coverage and auto liability insurance that is being provided by the County or for any liability that arises from the acts of the County's peace officers when such peace officers are enforcing state laws as a Texas peace officer.

IV.

VEHICLE AND SERVICES FEE

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR PAYROLL SERVICES AND DISTRICT SECURITY

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between **Williamson County**, **Texas**, hereinafter referred to as the "County," acting by and through its governing body, the Williamson County Commissioners Court and **Anderson Mill Limited District** (the "District"), a limited district operating pursuant to Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code. The District and the County are referred to collectively herein as the "Parties".

RECITALS:

Pursuant to Texas Water Code Section 49.216, the District may contract with its own peace officers with the power to make arrests when necessary to prevent or abate the commission of any offense against the rules of the District when the offense or threatened offense occurs on any land, water, or easement owned or controlled by the District; any offense involving injury or detriment to any property owned or controlled by the District; and any offense against the laws of the state.

The District intends to retain and contract its own such Williamson County peace officers but has requested that County handle payroll matters relating to such contracted peace officers.

The predominant purpose of this Agreement is for the County to provide for payroll services on behalf of the District.

The parties stipulate that the purpose of this Agreement is the performance of governmental functions and services as set out in the Texas Government Code Section 791.003(3) (k) and (n).

The parties further covenant that all payments mandated by this Agreement do fairly compensate the County for the furnishing of the payroll services described herein.

NOW THEREFORE, The County and the District, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, mutually agree as follows:

2.1 The District authorizes the County to process all payroll for Williamson County peace officers that are providing law enforcement services for the District, as well as act as the

- 2.3 The County shall pay the Williamson County peace officers that provide services within the District's area according to the County's payroll policies and procedures and the District approves of such policies and procedures.
- 2.4 For purposes of payroll processing, the following amounts shall be paid and withheld, on behalf of the District, by the County as a part of County's payroll services hereunder:

*FICA shall be paid by the District.		

- 2.5 Each month, the County shall send the District a payroll report, which adequately sets forth all payroll and all tax matters from the prior month. The District shall, within ten (10) calendar days of receiving such report, reimburse County for all amounts of payroll and taxes that were due and paid by the County in the prior month. The payroll reimbursement shall be tendered to the Williamson County Auditor's Office, Attn: Finance Director, 710 Main Street, Suite 301, Georgetown, Texas 78626.
- 2.6 As a portion of the consideration of this Agreement, the District's payment of the amounts in Section 2.4 shall serve as a sufficient amount that will cover workers' compensation coverage for the off-duty Williamson County peace officer that is performing services for the District and the County shall be obligated to provide such workers' compensation coverage for such peace officers.

III.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 3.1 The District shall designate a peace officer liaison as its representative for the purpose of maintaining communication between the District and the County.
- 3.2 The Parties agree that the County is providing only administrative services in the form of payroll services and is not in any way providing any extra or additional law enforcement services to the District.

- 3.3 The Parties agree that the District may contract off-duty Williamson County peace officers pursuant Texas Water Code Section 49.216 pursuant to a separate agreement (a "Separate Agreement") by and between the District and off-duty Williamson County peace officers and that pursuant to the Separate Agreement, the Williamson County peace officers may, on behalf of the District, make arrests when necessary to prevent or abate the commission of any offense against the rules of the District when the offense or threatened offense occurs on any land, water, or easement owned or controlled by the District; any offense involving injury or detriment to any property owned or controlled by the District; and any offense against the laws of the state. The Parties agree that the County will not be a party to the Separate Agreement and, except as provided in Section 3.7, below, that such peace officer shall be acting as a contractor and/or agent of the District and not as an employee and/or agent of the County while the peace officer is performing services for the District under the Separate Agreement. Except as provided in Section 3.7, below, all Williamson County peace officers that provide such services to the District under a Separate Agreement will be acting in the course and scope of their contract with the District at all times and all issues relating to the scope, manners and/or means of performance by such peace officers, all of which shall be strictly between the peace officers and the District.

When the emergency assignment is completed, the peace officer will return to the District's area and continue to provide the services contemplated by this Agreement and the District's obligation to pay for such services shall commence again upon the return of the peace officer.

Radio Equipment Transfer of Title

- 1. Grant Award On September 2, 2005, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) awarded a COPS Interoperable Communications Technology Program Grant #2005INWX0020 in the amount of \$6,000,000, subject to a \$2,000,000 local grant match requirement, to the City of Austin. This grant award was for the implementation of a public safety voice radio system in Williamson County ("Project"). The City of Austin and Williamson County ("County") provided funds to satisfy the local grant match.
- 2. The City of Austin and Williamson County, an Official Partner to the Grant Award, entered into a Public Safety Voice Radio Communications System Implementation Interlocal Agreement. The parties agreed that upon completion of the Project and the City of Austin's final acceptance, title to the COPS funded radio equipment installed on the Regional Communications System shall be transferred to Williamson County.
- 3. The Project is complete, and the County has accepted transfer of the equipment from the City of Austin.

Therefore, the County hereby transfers title to the COPS funded radio equipment installed on the Regional Communications System that is described on Exhibit "A" (Radio Equipment List) to the City of Round Rock, Texas. In consideration of the transfer, the City of Round Rock agrees not to sell or otherwise transfer the radio equipment described in Exhibit "A" except to the extent permitted by federal law.




