

IN THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, The Williamson County Commissioner’s Court finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Williamson County, that the Williamson County Sheriff’s Office Victim Assistance Case Worker be operated for the fiscal year 2019; and

WHEREAS, Williamson County Commissioner’s Court agrees to provide applicable matching funds for the said project as required by the Criminal Justice Division General Victim Assistance Direct Services Program grant application; and

WHEREAS, Williamson County Commissioner’s Court agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, Williamson County Commissioner’s Court assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full.

WHEREAS, Williamson County Commissioner’s Court designates Honorable Dan A. Gattis, Williamson County Judge as the grantee’s authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Williamson County Commissioner’s Court approves submission of the grant application for the Williamson County Sheriff’s Office Victim Assistance Case Worker to the Office of the Governor.
