PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that suicide was the 10th leading cause of death in the U.S. in 2017, with the national rate per 100,000 increasing from 10.5 in 1999 to 14.0 in 2017, and

WHEREAS, while the average suicide rate across Texas is lower than 80% of other states, it remains a leading cause of death, particularly in young, otherwise-healthy individuals and Williamson County is no exception; and

WHEREAS, there were 57 reported deaths by suicide in Williamson County in 2017, with more than half occurring in individuals that were 40 years old or younger, including 7 of those that were between the ages of 10 and 20, and

WHEREAS, Williamson County community leaders recognizing that every life is precious and valuable, have worked on prioritizing suicide prevention goals and creating planning initiatives to reduce suicide in Williamson County, along with identifying "Behavioral Health, Stress and Well-being" as the number one public health priority in the Community Health Assessment, and

WHEREAS, Alan's Hope is "Dedicated to preventing suicides by promoting hope, awareness and support in Williamson County communities", striving to reduce the stigma of seeking help and is encouraging the use of the September "Selfcare Calendar" to promote healthy activities and communities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; that the Williamson County Commissioners Court hereby proclaims the month of September 2019 as "*Suicide Prevention Month*" and encourages everyone to save the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, 1-800-273-TALK (8255) in their phones, to be ready to help if co-workers, friends or family are in need.
